Provided always, and it is hereby declared that this prohibition shall not apply to any such goods as are imported under a licence given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such licence.

To provide for the transfer to and the vesting in the Company of the Gas Undertaking of the Southborough Council, including certain lands and hereditaments forming part of that undertaking, together with plant, distributing mains, services, street lamps, stoves, machinery, pipes, apparatus, meters, fixtures, fittings and appliances, together with the gas business of the Southborough Council, and the rights, powers and privileges of the Southborough Council in connection with the said gas undertaking, the benefit of actions and the benefit and liability of contracts, and, if thought fit, to confirm and give effect to any agreement made or to be made between the Company and the Southborough Council with reference to the transfer of the said gas undertaking to the Company.

To provide for the continuance of and the transfer to and exercise by the Company of the powers conferred upon the Southborough Council by the Southborough Local Board (Gas) Act, 1892, of maintaining, altering, improving, enlarging, extending and renewing or

discontinuing gasworks, retorts, gas-holders, condensers, receivers, purifiers, drains, sewers, mains, pipes, meters, lamps, lamp-posts, burners, machinery and other works, apparatus and conveniences upon the lands hereinafter described, being part of the lands described in the first schedule to the said Act of 1892, viz.:—

Certain lands in the borough of Tunbridge Wells and county of Kent, 3 roods 3½ poles or thereabouts in extent, belonging to the Southborough Council, and now used by them in connection with the storage and distribution of gas, bounded on the north and northeast by the North Farm-road, on the northwest by the Tunbridge Wells and Hastings line of the South Eastern Railway Company, on the south-west by land belonging to the Southborough Council, and on the south-east by land belonging to the mayor, aldermen and burgesses of the borough of Tunbridge Wells,

together with the powers conferred by the said Act of 1892 upon the Southborough Council of making and storing gas and manufacturing, selling, providing, supplying and dealing in coke, tar, pitch, asphaltum, ammoniacal liquor, sulphate of ammonia, lime and all other products or residuum of any materials employed in or resulting from the manufacture of gas.

To make such provision as may be necessary or expedient with reference to actions, arbitrations or other proceedings in relation to the gas undertaking of the Southborough Council which are or may be pending or existing at the date of the transfer of the said gas undertaking to the Company and for the continuance, prosecution and enforcement thereof.

To make provision with reference to agreements, contracts, conveyances, deeds and other instruments affecting the Southborough Council in respect of the said gas undertaking and the enforcement or carrying into effect thereof and to make provision with reference to the collection, recovery and enforcement of rents, charges and other sums and debts payable or accruing, due or becoming payable to the Southborough Council in respect of the said gas undertaking.

To make provision with reference to the admirsion of books and documents in respect of the said gas undertaking as evidence, and to make all such other provisions as may be necessary for the purposes of or incidental to the carrying into effect of the transfer of the said gas undertaking to the Company.

To provide that agreements, contracts, conveyances, deeds or other documents made or entered into by the Southborough Council after the 9th December, 1920, shall not be binding upon the Company unless made or entered into with the consent in writing of the Company.

To provide that as from the date of the transfer to the Company of the said gas undertaking the powers of borrowing money conferred upon the Southborough Council by Section 20 of the said Act of 1892 shall cease to be exerciseable.

To make provisions with reference to the laying down of mains and pipes and the execution of other works by the Company so far as the same affect the railways of the South-Eastern Railway Company within the Southborough urban district or the portions of parishes hereinbefore described, and to repeal or to reenact with modifications or amendments the

provisions of Section 11 (For Protection of the South-Eastern Railway Company) of the said Act of 1892.

To authorize agreements between the Company and any other Company and any local authority, body or person with respect to the supply of gas in bulk beyond the limits of supply of the Company, and to authorize the carrying into effect, alteration or rescission of such agreements.

To relieve the Company from penalties for insufficiency of pressure in the gas supplied by them in cases of unavoidable cause or accident.

To authorize the Company to apply to the purposes of the proposed Order and to the general purposes of their Undertaking any sums of money which they have already raised or are authorized to raise.

To enact all such provisions as may be deemed necessary or expedient for effecting the purposes aforesaid or any of them.

To incorporate with the intended Order, with or without modification or amendment, or to exempt the Company from all or some of the provisions of the Gas Works Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1871, and to repeal, alter, amend or extend the provisions, or some of the provisions, of the Southborough Gas Order, 1891, scheduled to and confirmed by the Gas and Water Orders Confirmation Act, 1891, and the Southborough Local Board (Gas) Act, 1892, and any other Act or Order relating to or affecting the Southborough Council or the Gas Undertaking of that Council, and the Tunbridge Wells Gas Act, 1864, and any other Act or Order relating to or affecting the Company, and in particular to repeal the unrepealed provisions of the said Order of 1891, Section 4, of the said Confirmation Act of 1891 and Sections 3 to 18 inclusive and 34, 35, 36 and 38 of the said Act of 1892.

Any local or other public authority, company or person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the draft Order may do so by registered letter addressed to the Secretary, Board of Trade, Great George-street, London, S.W. 1; and despatched on or before the 29th day of April, 1921. Any such objection shall state:—

- (a) the specific grounds of objection, and
- (b) the omissions, additions or modifications asked for.

A copy of the objection must be forwarded to the applicants for the Order or their Agents at the same time as it is sent to the Board of Trade.

A copy of the draft Order, a map showing the existing and proposed limits of supply of the Company, and the situation of the existing and proposed works, together with a plan of the lands hereinbetore described, have been deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Kent, at his office at Maidstone; with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of East Sussex, at his office at Lewes; with the Clerk to the Kent County Council, at his office at Maidstone; with the Clerk to the East Sussex County Council, at his office at Lewes; with the Town Clerk of the Borough of Tunbridge Wells, at his office at the Town Hall, Tunbridge Wells; with the Clerk to the Urban District Council of Southborough, at the Council offices, Southborough; and with the Clerk to the Urban District Council of Sevenoaks, at the Council offices, Sevenoaks.

And also comprising:—
The county borough of Reading.
