

ber, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, in Great Britain, for the branches of trade specified in the Trade Boards (Boot and Shoe Repairing) Order, 1919, hereby give Notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they Propose to Vary the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for certain classes of male and female workers as set out in the Schedules to the Notices issued by the Trade Board and dated 15th November, 1919, and 12th April, 1920, the proposed Minimum Rates of Wages being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

*Proposed Variation of General Minimum Time-Rates for Certain Classes of Male Workers.*

*General Minimum Time-Rates at present Fixed.*

A. For Male Workers (as specified in Part I of the Schedule to the Notice issued by the Trade Board and dated 15th November, 1919):—

1. For Workers of 21 years of age and upwards, 65s. per week of 48 hours:
2. For Workers of 20 years and under 21, 45s. per week of 48 hours.
3. For Workers of 19 years and under 20, 37s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.
4. For Workers of 18 years and under 19, 32s. per week of 48 hours.
5. For Workers of 17 years and under 18, 27s. per week of 48 hours.
6. For Workers of 16 years and under 17, 22s. per week of 48 hours.

B. For Male Workers employed on Surgical work (as specified in Part IV of the Schedule to the Notice issued by the Trade Board and dated 12th April, 1920), 2s. per hour.

*Variation Proposed.*

SECTION I.—For Male Workers (other than the classes of workers specified in Sections II and III of Part I of this Schedule, and in paragraphs (a), (b), and (c) of the Proviso to Section I of Part V of this Schedule), 72s. per week of 48 hours.

SECTION II.—For Male Learners (other than Male Indentured Apprentices as specified in paragraph (c) of the Proviso to Section I of Part V of this Schedule), as defined in Section I of Part IV of this Schedule:—

Workers of 20 years and under 21 years of age, 50s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 19 years and under 20 years of age, 37s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 18 years and under 19 years of age, 32s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 17 years and under 18 years of age, 27s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 16 years and under 17 years of age, 22s. per week of 48 hours.

NOTE.—The General Minimum Time-Rates at present effective for Male Workers of 16 and under 21 years of age shall cease to apply to Male Workers other than Learners, as defined in Section I of Part IV of this Schedule, on and after the date on which the General Minimum Time-Rates set out in this Schedule become effective.

SECTION III.—For Male Surgical Boot-Makers as defined in Section II of Part IV of this Schedule), 2s. per hour.

PART II.

*Proposed Variation of General Minimum Time-Rates for certain Classes of Female Workers.*

*General Minimum Time-rates at present Fixed.*

A. For Female Workers (as specified in Section I (a) of Part II of the Schedule to the Notice issued by the Trade Board and dated 12th April, 1920):—

1. For Workers of 21 years of age and upwards, 65s. per week of 48 hours.
2. For Workers of 20 years of age and under 21 years of age, 45s. per week of 48 hours.
3. For Workers of 19 years of age and under 20 years of age, 37s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.
4. For Workers of 18 years of age and under 19 years of age, 32s. per week of 48 hours.
5. For Workers of 17 years of age and under 18 years of age, 27s. per week of 48 hours.
6. For Workers of 16 years of age and under 17 years of age, 22s. per week of 48 hours.

B. For Female Workers employed on Surgical work (as specified in Section II of Part II of the Schedule to the Notice issued by the Trade Board and dated 12th April, 1920), 2s. per hour.

*Variations Proposed.*

SECTION I.—For Female Workers (other than workers employed in a productive department on Patching Machines and Female Surgical Boot-makers as defined in Section II of Part IV of this Schedule):—

1. For Workers of 21 years of age and upwards, 72s. per week of 48 hours.
2. For Workers of 20 years of age and under 21 years of age, 50s. per week of 48 hours.
3. For Workers of 19 years of age and under 20 years of age, 37s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.
4. For Workers of 18 years of age and under 19 years of age, 32s. per week of 48 hours.
5. For Workers of 17 years of age and under 18 years of age, 27s. per week of 48 hours.
6. For Workers of 16 years of age and under 17 years of age, 22s. per week of 48 hours.

SECTION II.—For Female Surgical Boot-makers (as defined in Section II of Part IV of this Schedule), 2s. per hour.

NOTE.—No variation is proposed in respect of the Minimum Rates at present effective for Female Workers employed in a Productive Department on Patching Machines.

PART III.

*Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates for all Male and Female Workers (other than Workers employed on Piece-work to which General Minimum Piece-Rates are applicable).*

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board propose to declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and all hours worked on Saturdays (subject to the provisions set out below)
