

Acts, to all workers of the classes specified in the Schedule to this Notice in Great Britain, in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Boot and Shoe Repairing) Order, 1919, that is to say, the repairing, wherever carried on, of boots, shoes, slippers, and all kinds of leather footwear, including the making of Bespoke Handsewn, rivetted, or pegged leather footwear, but excluding the manufacture of leather footwear on a large scale, the repairing of saddlery and leather goods other than leather footwear, and the retailing of leather footwear.

Provided that the Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Part I of the Schedule to this Notice shall not apply to the following classes of Male Workers:—

(a) Foremen and Managers as specified in Part II of the Schedule to the Notice issued by the Trade Board and dated 13th May, 1920.

(b) Male Workers employed in operating Power Sole-Stitchers, Blake or Richardson Machines, and Male Workers employed as Pressmen and responsible for Cutting and Costing, all as specified in Part I of the Schedule to the Notice issued by the Trade Board and dated 4th September, 1920.

(c) Male Indentured Apprentices as specified in Section I of Part I of the Schedule to the Notice of Proposal issued by the Trade Board and dated 1st February, 1921.

SECTION II.—The Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from 26th March, 1921. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.
