By the KING. A PROCLAMATION

FOR CALLING OUT MEN OF CLASS B OF THE ROYAL FLEET RESERVE.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by the fourth section of the Royal Naval Reserve (Volunteer) Act, 1859, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for Us on such occasions as We shall deem fit (the occasion being first communicated to Parliament if Parliament be sitting or declared in Council and notified by Proclamation if Parliament be not sitting or in being) to order and direct that the Volunteers under that Act, or so many or such part of them as We may deem necessary, shall be called into actual service:

And whereas by the Naval Reserve Act, 1900, the Admiralty are authorised to raise and keep up a new division, commonly known as the Royal Fleet Reserve, of the force raised under the said first recited Act in addition to the men raised under that Act, and such new division is liable to be called out as part of the Royal Naval Reserve under the said fourth section of the said Act of 1859:

And whereas by the first section of the Naval Reserve (Mobilisation) Act, 1900, amending the said Act of 1859, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for Us where We order and direct that Volunteers under that Act shall be called into actual service to authorise the Admiralty to give and, when given, to revoke or vary such directions as may seem necessary or proper for calling out all or any of the said Volunteers as the occasion may require:

And whereas We have communicated to Parliament that owing to the state of Public Affairs and the demands upon Our Naval Forces for the protection of the Empire an occasion has arisen for ordering and directing as in the said first mentioned Act provided:

We do, by this Our Proclamation, order and direct that Volunteers under the said Naval Reserve Act, 1900, who belong to Class B of the Royal Fleet Reserve, shall be called into actual service.

And We do hereby authorise the said Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty to give and, when given, to revoke or vary, such directions as may seem necessary or proper for calling out all or any of the said Volunteers belonging to Class B of the Royal Fleet Reserve as the occasion may require.

WHEREAS by the Reserve Forces Act, VV 1882, it is, amongst other things, enacted that in case of imminent national danger or of great emergency it shall be lawful for Us by Proclamation, the occasion having first been communicated to Parliament if Parliament be then sitting, to order that the Army Reserve shall be called out on permanent service; and by any such Proclamation to order a Secretary of State from time to time to give and when given to revoke or vary such directions as may seem necessary or proper for calling out the forces or force mentioned in the Proclamation or all or any of the men belonging thereto:

And whereas the present state of public affairs and the threatened dislocation of the life of the community occasioned by the existing strike in the coal mines and its threatened extension to the railway and transport services of the country have, in Our opinion, constituted a state of great emergency within the meaning of the said Act, and We have communicated the

same to Parliament:

Now, therefore, We do, in pursuance of the Reserve Forces Act, 1882, hereby order that Our Army Reserve be called out on permanent service, and We do hereby order the Right Honourable Sir Worthington Laming Worth-ington-Evans, Baronet, one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, from time to time to give and, when given, to revoke or vary such directions as may seem necessary or proper for calling out Our Army Reserve or all or any of the men belonging thereto.

HEREAS by the Army Act it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Us in case of imminent national danger or of great emergency by Proclamation, the occasion being first communicated to Parliament, if Parliament be then sitting, to order from time to time that all or any soldiers who would otherwise be entitled in pursuance of the terms of their enlistment to be transferred to the Reserve shall continue in Army Service, and such soldiers shall accordingly continue in Army Service for the same period for which they might be required to serve if they had been transferred to the Reserve and called out for permanent service by a Proclamation issued by Us under the enactments relating to the Reserve:

And whereas the present state of public affairs and the threatened dislocation of the life of the community occasioned by the existing strike in the coal mines and its threatened extension to the railway and transport services of the country have, in Our opinion, constituted a state of great emergency within the meaning of the said Act, and We have communicated the same to Parliament:

Now, therefore, We do, in pursuance of the said Act, hereby order that all soldiers who on or after this date would otherwise be entitled in pursuance of the terms of their enlistment to be transferred to the Reserve shall continue in Army Service until legally discharged or transferred to the Army Reserve:

And We do hereby order Our Army Council to give all necessary directions herein accordingly.

HEREAS by the Reserve Forces Act, 1882, as applied to the Air Force Reserve, and to the officers and men thereof, by The Air Force Reserve (Application of Enactments) (No. 1) Order, 1918, it is, amongst other things, enacted that in case of imminent national danger or of great emergency, it shall be lawful for Us by Proclamation, the occasion having first been communi-cated to Parliament, if Parliament be then sitting, to order that the Air Force Reserve shall be called out on permanent service; and by any such Proclamation to order a Secretary of State from time to time to give and, when given, to revoke or vary such directions as may seem necessary or proper for calling out the force mentioned in the Proclamation or all or any of the men belonging thereto:

And whereas the present state of public affairs and the threatened dislocation of the life of the community occasioned by the existing strike in the coal mines and its threatened extension to the railway and transport services of the country have, in Our opinion, constituted a state of great emergency within the meaning of the said Act, and we have communicated the

same to Parliament:

Now, therefore, We do, in pursuance of the Reserve Forces Act, 1882, hereby order that the Air Force Reserve be called out on permanent service, and We do hereby order the Right Honourable Frederick Edward Guest, one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, from time to time to give and, when given, to revoke or vary such directions as may seem necessary or proper for calling out the Air Force Reserve or all or any of the men belonging thereto.

HEREAS by the Air Force Act it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Us in case of imminent national danger or of great emergency by Proclamation, the occasion being first communicated to Parliament, if Parliament be then sitting, to order from time to time that all or any airmen who would otherwise be entitled in pursuance of the terms of their enlistment to be transferred to the Air Force Reserve shall continue in Air Force Service, and such airmen shall accordingly continue in Air Force Service for the same period for which they might be required to serve if they had been transferred to the Air Force Reserve and called out for permanent service by a Proclamation issued by Us under the enactments

relating to that Reserve:

And whereas the present state of public affairs and the threatened dislocation of the life of the community occasioned by the existing strike in the coal mines and its threatened extension to the railway and transport services of the country have, in Our opinion, constituted a state of great emergency within the meaning of the said Act, and We have commu-

nicated the same to Parliament:

Now, therefore, We do, in pursuance of the said Act, hereby order that all airmen who on or after this date would otherwise be entitled in pursuance of the terms of their enlistment to be transferred to the Air Force Reserve shall continue in Air Force Service until legally discharged or transferred to the Air Force

And We do hereby order the Air Council to give all necessary directions herein accordingly.

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize us, at our discretion, to issue as from the 1st January, 1921, payment of First Lieutenants' allowance of 1s. 6d. a day in respect of the Senior Officers' ships of the Central Reserve at each of the three Home Ports, and Machinery allowance to the Engineer Officers borne for charge of machinery of the vessels of the Central Reserve.

ing, viz.:—
"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and
Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been, an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Section 2 of the Naval Pensions Act, 1884, it is enacted that any reference in the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, to a pension or Naval Pension, or to money payable by the Admiralty, shall be construed to include a Naval Pension and a Greenwich Hospital Pension, Gratuity and Allowance within the meaning of the Greenwich Hospital Acts, 1865 to 1883, and any sum due on account of such a

pension, gratuity, or allowance:

"And whereas by Section 3 of the Naval
Pensions Act, 1884, it is enacted that a provision of any Order in Council made in pursuance of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, or of the Greenwich Hospital Acts, 1865 to 1883, respecting the restoration in whole or in part of any forfeited pension shall have effect notwithstanding any Act or law relating to the forfeiture of a pension on

conviction for crime:

"And whereas by Article 1973 of the Regulations for the Government of Your Majesty's Naval Service certain restrictions, conditions and provisions were directed in respect of pensions payable to Petty and Non-Commissioned Officers, Seamen, Marines and Boys in such Service:

"And whereas it has been brought to notice that the provision therein regarding the power of restoration of a pension forfeited for misconduct, or on conviction of felony, has not been specifically sanctioned by Order in been specifically sanctioned by

Council:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to empower us at our discretion to restore any pension that may have been, or may hereafter be, forfeited for misconduct or on conviction of felony, either at the original amount or at such lower rate as may be thought fit; and that this power may be made retrospective as from the date on which the Naval Pensions Act, 1884, became operative.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

WHEREAS by the Restoration of Order in Ireland Act, 1920, it is provided that where it appears to His Majesty in Council that owing to the existence of a state of disorder in Ireland the ordinary law is inadequate for the prevention and punishment of crime or the maintenance of order, His Majesty in Council may issue regulations under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the restoration and maintenance of order in Ireland, and as to the powers and duties for that purpose of the Lord Lieutenant and the Chief Secretary and of members of His Majesty's Forces and other persons acting on His Majesty's behalf, and in particular regulations for the special purposes thereinafter mentioned:

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 13th day of August, 1920, His Majesty was pleased to make regulations under the said Act:

And whereas it was provided by the regulations so made that the principal regulations and the supplemental regulations therein mentioned might be cited collectively as the Restoration of Order in Ireland Regulations:

Restoration of Order in Ireland Regulations:
And whereas it was provided by the regulations so made that copies of the Restoration of Order in Ireland Regulations, printed under the authority of His 'Majesty's Stationery Office, might be printed containing the principal regulations and the supplemental regulations, and that in such print the supplemental regulations other than the Second Schedule should be inserted after Regulation 66 of the principal regulations, and should be numbered accordingly:

And whereas the Restoration of Order in Ireland Regulations have been printed and numbered in the manner authorized and directed by the said regulations:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that owing to the present state of disorder in Ireland the ordinary law is inadequate for the prevention and punishment of crime and the maintenance of order:

And whereas the Restoration of Order in Ireland Regulations have been amended by various subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said regulations in the manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following amendments shall be made in the said regulations:—

1. Regulation 81 shall be amended as follows:—

In paragraph (a) of sub-section (1)

thereof, for the word "or" there shall be substituted the words "either absolutely or except in such circumstances or on such conditions as may be specified in the order; or"

2. The following new regulation shall be inserted after Regulation 84:—

"85. (1) If it appears to the Lord Lieutenant that the taking of the census for Ireland in the manner and at the time prescribed by the Census (Ireland) Act, 1920, would be prejudicial to the restoration or maintenance of order in Ireland, he may by order countermand or postpone the taking of the same.

the same.

"(2) If the Lord Lieutenant makes an order postponing the taking of the census, he may, if he thinks fit, by the same or any subsequent order fix a census day in lieu of the census day fixed by the said Act, and in that event the said Act shall apply for the purposes of the postponed census, with the substitution of the census day fixed by the said order for the twenty-fourth day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty-one."

3. Copies of the Restoration of Order in Ireland Regulations printed under the authority of His Majesty's Stationery Office after the date of this Order, may be printed with the additions and variations directed to be made by this Order and with the paragraphs and regulations numbered in accordance with such direction, and those regulations shall be construed as if they had at the date of this Order been made with such additions and variations.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 17th day of February, 1921, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of two neighbouring Benefices, that is to say, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Ashbury and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Compton Beauchamp, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Berks and in the Diocese of Oxford:

Oxford:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Hubert Murray. Bishop of Oxford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Ashbury and Compton Beauchamp duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Oxford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Oxford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices

based upon the terms recommended in the said

Report:
"And whereas the said Benefice of Compton Beauchamp is now full, the Reverend Charles Sidney Pepys being the present Incumbent thereof, and the said Benefice of Ashbury is at present vacant:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Oxford (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:

"1. That the said Benefice of Ashbury and the said Benefice of Compton Beauchamp shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Ashbury with Compton Beauchamp,' but the Parishes of the said

Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the two said Benefices shall be then vacant, the said union shall take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of his Benefice; and if neither of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of either of the said two Benefices if the Incumbent at that time of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his Benefice and the then Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall become the first Incumbent of the United Bene-

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Ashbury shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of

the United Benefice.
"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present and nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Compton Beauchamp having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Ashbury having the right upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every

alternate turn thereafter.
"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Act or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been published locally in the manner prescribed in the Statutory Rules made under the said Act and also transmitted in the manner so prescribed to the Patrons affected, together with a Notice in each case requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time so prescribed:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas neither of the two Benefices affected by the said Scheme is situate in a City or Municipal Borough;

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Jute Trade in Great Britain as specified in the Trade Boards (Jute) Order, 1919, hereby give Notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they Propose to Vary the General Minimum Time Rates for Male workers and for certain classes of Female workers at present fixed and set out in the Notice J. (2) issued by the Trade Board and dated 3rd June, 1920, the proposed variations, which in all cases except that of certain Female Weaving

Learners are a reduction of 20 per cent., being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

Proposed Variation of General Minimum Time Rates for all Male Workers.

General Minimum Time Rates at Present Fixed.

For Workers of 21 years of age and over, 50s. per week of 48 hours.

For Workers of 18 and under 21 years of age, 45s. per week of 48 hours.

For Workers of 16 and under 18 years of age,

28s. per week of 48 hours. For Workers under 16 years of age, 22s. per week of 48 hours.

General Minimum Time Rates Proposed.

For Workers of 21 years of age and over, 40s. per week of 48 hours.

For Workers of 18 and under 21 years of age, 36s. per week of 48 hours.

For Workers of 16 and under 18 years of age, 22s. 5d. per week of 48 hours.

For Workers under 16 years of age, 17s. 7d. per week of 48 hours.

PART II.

Proposed Variation of General Minimum Time Rates for all Female Workers except (a) Spinners (other than Orra (or Spare) Spinners); (b) Orra (or Spare) Spinners of 18 years of age and over; (c) Spinning Shifting Mistresses.

General Minimum Time Rates at Present Fixed.

For Workers of 18 years of age and over, 32s. per week of 48 hours.

For Workers of 16 and under 18 years of age, 28s. per week of 48 hours.

For Workers under 16 years of age, 22s. per week of 48 hours.

General Minimum Time Rates Proposed.

For Workers of 18 years of age and over, 25s. 7d. per week of 48 hours.

For Workers of 16 and under 18 years of age, 22s. 5d. per week of 48 hours.

For Workers under 16 years of age, 17s. 7d. per week of 48 hours.

Provided that in lieu of the proposed General Minimum Time Rates as set out above Female Weaving Learners as defined in this Schedule. shall receive during one (and not more than one) period of learnership which shall not exceed two months, a General Minimum Time Rate of 14s. 5d. per week of 48 hours.

Provided that in cases where a Weaving Mistress has immediate responsibility for the instruction of not more than one Female Weaving Learner, the General Minimum Time Rate of 14s. 5d. per week of 48 hours set out above shall only apply where the Weaving Mistress is paid by the employer in respect of such responsi-bility, the sum of not less than 5s. per week in addition to her own earnings on piecework.

Note.—The method of remuneration prescribed in the foregoing proviso for a Weaving Mistress who has immediate responsibility for the instruction of not more than one Female Weaving Learner shall not apply in cases where a Weaving Mistress is engaged in instructing Learners of Weaving under a group system of instruction.

PART III.

The proposed General Minimum Time Rates set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule are weekly rates based on a week of 48 hours and are subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 48.

PART IV.

For the purpose of this Notice a Female Weaving Learner shall be deemed to mean a Female Worker who is:

(a) Definitely and effectively learning weaving under the immediate instruction of

a Weaving Mistress; and

(b) Employed under conditions such that she shall cease to be employed on time work and shall be employed on piece work at the earliest date practicable.

PART V.

The respective proposed General Minimum Time Rates set out in this Schedule shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male and Female workers in Great Britain of the classes specified in this Schedule, in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Jute) Order, 1919, that

The preparing, spinning or weaving (a) of jute or (b) of jute and any other fibre, except

flax or hemp.

Including-

(1) The preparing and spinning of waste

reclaimed at any stage, and
(2) All packing, despatching, warehousing, storing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the abovementioned work; but

Excluding-

(1) The calendering, bleaching, dyeing or finishing of any of the above-mentioned

materials, and

(2) The preparing or spinning of materials required for the making or re-making of (a) rope (including driving rope and banding), (b) cord (including blind and window cord, but excluding silk, worsted and other fancy cords), (c) core for wire ropes, (d) lines, (e) twine (including binder and trawl twine), (f) lanyards, (g) net and similar articles, when such preparing or spinning is carried on in the same factory or workshop as the said making or re-making; and

(3) The making or repair of sacks or bags:

and also

(4) The weaving of carpets, rugs or mats.

PART VI.

Section I.—The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

Section II.—The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall be without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from 11th April, 1921. Such Objections

The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 and the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Application Order of 1917 (No. 1) shall not apply to the movement of swine from the sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being a Swine-Fever Infected Place, if the swine are accompanied by a licence in the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the said Order of 1908, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the City of Bristol, and the following conditions, which shall be specified in the licence, are complied
 - (i) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.

(ii) The swine shall be moved by the

nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

- (iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest policestation in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.
- 2. A copy of a licence issued under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.
- 3. A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the above-mentioned Orders be treated as a licence under those Orders.

Movement within the Scheduled District.

2. (1) Where an inspector of the Ministry considers it necessary or expedient, after in-

quiry, that an animal in the Scheduled District should be permitted to be moved within the Scheduled District as often as occasion may require between different parts of the same farm, he may, notwithstanding any prohibition of movement contained in the principal Order, authorise such movement by an Occupation Licence, and the inspector may insert in the licence such conditions as he may consider necessary or desirable for the purpose of preventing the animals referred to in the licence from coming into contact with any other

(2) If in respect of any animal the conditions of a licence granted under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof shall each, according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
