GERMAN REPARATION RECOVERY (No. 3) ORDER, 1921, DATED 15TH APRIL, 1921, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE.

The Board of Trade, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Section 5 of the German Reparation (Recovery) Act, 1921, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, upon the recommendation of a Committee constituted under Section 5 of the said Act, hereby make the following Order:—

(1) This Order may be cited as the German Reparation Recovery (No. 3) Order, 1921.
(2) Any article of the following description

(2) Any article of the following description if imported into the United Kingdom before the 15th day of May, 1921, shall be exempt from the provisions of the said Act, that is to say, any article in respect of which it is proved to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs and Excise

(a) that such article is imported in pursuance of a contract entered into prior to the 8th day of March, 1921, and

(b) that such article left the place from which it was consigned to the United Kingdom prior to the 8th day of April, 1921.

GERMAN REPARATION RECOVERY (No. 4) ORDER, 1921, DATED 15th April, 1921, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE.

The Board of Trade, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Section 5 of the German Reparation (Recovery) Act, 1921, and of all other powers enabling them in that

behalf, upon the recommendation of a Committee constituted under Section 5 of the said Act, hereby make the following Order:—

(1) This Order may be cited as the German Reparation Recovery (No. 4) Order, 1921. (2) Any article of the following description

(2) Any article of the following description if imported into the United Kingdom prior to the 15th day of May, 1921, shall be exempt from the provisions of the said Act, that is to say, any article in respect of which it is proved to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs that the physical possession and property therein had passed to a foreign Government other than the German Government prior to the 8th day of March, 1921, and that such article is imported for the purposes of being treated and sold on behalf of such foreign Government.

GERMAN REPARATION RECOVERY (No. 5) ORDER, 1921, DATED 15TH APRIL, 1921, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE.

The Board of Trade, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by section 5 of the German Reparation (Recovery) Act, 1921, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, upon the recommendation of a Committee constituted under Section 5, sub-section (2), of the said Act, hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the German Reparation Recovery (No. 5) Order, 1921

Reparation Recovery (No. 5) Order, 1921.

2. As respects articles of the description set out in the Schedule hereto the proportion of the value of the goods payable to the Commissioners of Clustoms and Excise under the provisions of the said Act shall be reduced from 50 per cent. to 5 per cent.

# THE SCHEDULE.

Any article in respect of which it is proved to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs that such article, or the principal parts or contents thereof, cannot be produced and worked elsewhere than in Germany, and that such article is produced in and exported from Germany to the United Kingdom by a Company or Companies producing similar articles in Germany and exporting such articles therefrom to the United Kingdom before the 8th day of March, 1921, and in which not less than 90 per cent. of the capital is, and was prior to the said date, owned by British nationals.

EMERGENCY POWERS ACT, 1920.

COAL (EMERGENCY) SUPPLEMENTARY DIREC-TIONS, 1921, DATED APRIL 14TH, 1921, GIVEN BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER THE EMER-GENCY REGULATIONS, 1921.

The Board of Trade, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the Emergency Regu-

lations, 1921, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby direct as follows:

1. The supply and acquisition of coal for consumption or otherwise in any dwelling house or in a building adjacent to or connected with a dwelling house and occupied or used as part thereof, or in any premises used or occupied for residential purposes, shall be subject to the provisions contained in these Directions.

2. No coal may be supplied or acquired for consumption or otherwise in any premises within the scope of these Directions unless a permit in writing shall first have been issued by the local authority or its duly authorised officer, prescribing the quantity of coal that may be supplied and acquired and specifying the premises and the consumer for which and

by whom such quantity may be acquired.

3. No coal in excess of half-a-hundredweight may be supplied or acquired in any one week under the provisions of the last preceding Article, unless the local authority or its duly authorised officer shall certify that the supply and acquisition of a certain specified greater quantity is justified by exceptional circumstances and the nature of such exceptional circumstances is stated in writing upon any permit for such supply and acquisition: Provided that it shall be lawful for one hundredweight of coal to be so supplied and acquired in any one week in respect of that and the next succeeding week together.

4. The operation of Articles 3, 4 and 5 of the Coal (Emergency) Directions, 1921, is hereby suspended until further notice, and these Directions shall be substituted therefor during such suspension and shall be read as though they formed part of the said Coal (Emergency) Directions, 1921, and as though Part VIII thereof were incorporated with these Directions.

5. These Directions may be cited as the Coal (Emergency) Supplementary Directions, 1921, and shall come into force on the 15th day of April, 1921.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF TRADE DATED 16TH April, 1921, prescribing the Qualifica-TIONS OF SURVEYORS FOR THE PURPOSES OF Sections 20 and 21 of the Coal Mines Act, 1911 (1 & 2 GEO. 5, c. 50).

In pursuance of the power conferred upon them by the Coal Mines Act, 1911, under the provisions of the Mining Industry Act, 1920, the Board of Trade hereby prescribe that, for the purposes of Sections 20 and 21 of the firstmentioned Act, a surveyor must hold a certificate from the Board for Mining Examinations or from an Institution approved by the Board of Trade, to the effect-

i) that he is at least 21 years of age;

(ii) that he has had practical experience

in the surveying of Mines

(a) for at least 4 years, or

(b) for at least 2 years and that he has received an approved Diploma or taken an

approved Degree; or (c) for at least 2 years and that he has passed satisfactorily a full course of instruction in surveying at an Institution approved as aforesaid; or

(d) for at least 2 years and that he served in His Majesty's Forces during the European War for a period of at least one

(iii) that he is competent

(a) to make an accurate survey of the workings of a mine and to connect such survey with a surface survey;

(b) to make accurate levellings; and (c) to plot accurately surveys and

levellings;

(iv) that he has given satisfactory evidence of his sobriety and general good conduct.

The Orders of the Board of Trade dated 21st January, 1921, and 23rd February, 1921, prescribing the qualifications of Surveyors, are hereby revoked, provided that any certificate of qualifications thereunder which is in force immediately before the date of this Order shall be deemed to be a certificate of qualifications under this Order.

(b) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, and held subject to compliance with the conditions contained in this section, or has made an application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a Female Learner on her first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such learner being continued thereafter at her employment, the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

Provided that, notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this section, a person shall not be deemed to be a Learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

SECTION II.—The Retail Branch of the Trade is that branch of the Trade specified in Part IV. of this Schedule in which it is the usual practice for the employer to supply the garment direct to the wearer.

#### PART IV.

The above proposed minimum rates of wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in Scotland of the classes specified in Part I. of this Schedule who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the trade specified in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, dated 29th March, 1920,

as varied by the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920, that is to say: -

Inchidina:-

- (1) All operations or processes of cutting, making or finishing by hand or machine of dresses, non-tailored skirts, wraps, blouses, blouse-robes, jumpers, sports coats, neckwear, tea-gowns, dressing-gowns, dressing jackets, pyjamas, underclothing, underskirts, aprons, overalls, nurses' and servants' caps, juvenile clothing, baby-linen or similar non-tailored articles:
- (2) The making of field bonnets, sun-bonnets, boudoir caps or infants' millinery where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of any of the articles mentioned in paragraph (1) above.

(3)-

- (a) The altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of any of the above-mentioned articles;
- (b) The cleaning of any of the above-mentioned articles, where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of such garments;
- (4) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making, altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of such articles other than hand embroidery or hand-drawn thread work on articles made of linen or cotton or of mixed linen and cotton;
- (5) The following processes if done by machine:—thread drawing, thread clipping, top sawing, scalloping, nickelling and paring;
- (6) Laundering, smoothing, folding, ornamenting, boxing, packing, warehousing or other operations incidental to or appertaining

to the making, altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of any of the above-mentioned articles:

 $But \ excluding :-$ 

- (a) The making of knitted articles; the making of underclothing, socks and stockings, from knitted fabrics; and the making from knitted fabrics of articles mentioned in paragraphs (1) and (2) above, where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of the knitted fabrics;
- (b) The making of gloves, spats, gaiters, boots, shoes and slippers;

(c) The making of headgear, other than the

articles mentioned in paragraph (2) above;
(d) The branches of trade covered by the Trade Boards (Corset) Order, 1919;
(e) The making of rubberised or oilskin

garments;

- (f) The making of women's collars and cuffs and of nurses' stiff washing belts where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of men's or boys' shirts or collars;
- (g) Warehousing, packing and other similar operations carried on in shops mainly engaged in the retail distribution of articles of any description that are not made on the premises;

And excluding also any processes or operations included in the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 18th April, 1921. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secre-tary of the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Trade Board (Scotland), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

- (2) If in respect of any animal the conditions of a licence granted under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Landing at certain Landing Places of Cattle not intended for Slaughter.

- 1.—(1) Notwithstanding the provisions of the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Order of 1921 (No. 7), Cattle not intended for slaughter shipped from Ireland may, subject to the provisions of this Article, and not otherwise, be landed at any Landing Place for Irish animals described in the Schedule hereto.
- (2) Cattle so landed shall be subject to the provisions of the Animals (Landing from Ireland) (Consolidation and Amendment) Order of 1914, except that the animals shall not be moved from the Landing Place until the ex-piration of fourteen days after the landing of the last animal at the landing place, and then only in accordance with the following provisions of this Order.
- (3) The removal of any animal from the Landing Place must be authorised by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry.
- (4) Each animal moved with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry shall be moved to a place of detention specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and isolated, under the super-

vision of a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority from other animals for a period of seven days after the date of its arrival unless it is previously slaughtered in the place of detention.

(5) Animals moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route, and as far as practicable by railway, and during such movement shall not be permitted to come in contact with animals not being moved under this Article.

Condition of Landing at any Landing Place.

2. The landing of any animals under this Order must be authorised by the Superintendent or person in charge of the Landing Place.

#### Provision as to Marking.

3. An animal shall not be moved from the Landing Place unless before the movement is commenced it is marked by and at the expense of the owner or his agent by the clipping of a broad arrow A about six inches long, on the left hind-quarter.

#### Provisions as to licences.

4.-(1) Where animals are moved with a licence under this Order the licence shall forthwith, after completion of the movement, be delivered up to an Inspector of the Local Authority, or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District, by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

(2) A movement licence granted under this Order shall be in force for four days, inclusive

of the day of issue.

(3) A copy of a licence under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the licence to the Clerk of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of detention is situate.

Movement from Landing Place subject to other Orders and to Regulations.

5.—Nothing in this Order or in any Order relating to the landing or movement of animals brought from Ireland shall be deemed to authorise the movement of an animal in contravention of any other Order of the Minister or of a Regulation of a Local Authority.

#### Offences.

6.—(1) If any animal shall be removed in contravention of this Order or is not isolated as hereby required, the owner thereof, and the owner and the lessee and the occupier of the Landing Place, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the owner and person in charge of the animal which is not so isolated, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, before the expiration of the period of detention, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark on any animal affixed under this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

#### Commencement.

7. This Order shall come into operation on the eighteenth day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty-one.

To authorize the Company to carry on the undertaking of the Reigate Company when transferred to them and to make gas and work up and convert the residual products of gas on the lands hereinafter referred to for such period as may be prescribed by the Order and for those purposes to maintain and use the works of the Reigate Company on those lands and also to continue, erect, construct, lay down, provide, maintain, alter, improve, extend, renew and use or discontinue gasholders, works, apparatus and conveniences for the storage of gas and such residual products and to store gas and residual products on those lands. ## RABIES.

The following Districts are subject to restrictions imposed by Order of the Minister in connection with Rabies. In these Districts dogs are required to be muzzled, and the movement of dogs out of such Districts is prohibited, except by licence of the Minister and subject to quarantine:—

#### (1) A District comprising: -

In the administrative county of Berks:

The boroughs of New Windsor, Newbury, Maidenhead, Wallingford and Wokingham, the petty sessional divisions of Maidenhead, Wokingham, Reading, Newbury (including its detached part but except the parishes of Welford, East Shefford and Great Shefford), Ilsley, and Wallingford, and the parishes of Chaddleworth, Remenham, Winkfield, Clewer Without, Sunninghill, Sunningdale, and Old Windsor.

In the administrative county of Oxford:

The borough of Henley-on-Thames, the petty sessional divisions of Henley, and Watlington, and the parishes of Thame, Kingsey, Tetsworth and Attington.

In the administrative county of Buckingham:
