And whereas the said Regulations have been further amended by Order in Council dated the 22nd day of April, 1921.

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Order in Council of the 22nd day of April, 1921, shall extend to the Isle of Man.

WHEREAS by Treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, His Majesty the King has jurisdiction in China:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by "The Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890," or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The China (Amendment) Order in Council, No. 3, 1920," and shall be read as one with "The China Order in Council, 1904" (hereinafter called the "Principal Order"), and with any Order amending the same, and the provisions of Art. 170 of the Principal Order shall in particular apply to this Order.

2. Every person subject to the criminal jurisdiction of the Court who has acted, is acting, or is about to act in a manner prejudicial to the public safety, or to the defence, peace or

security of His Majesty's Dominions, or of any part of them, shall be guilty of a grave offence against the Principal Order, and may, in addition to, or in lieu of, any other punishment, be ordered to give security for good behaviour or to be deported.

3. Every person subject to the criminal jurisdiction of the Court who prints, publishes, or offers for sale any printed or written newspaper or other publication containing seditious matter, or has in his possession with intent to publish or distribute any such newspaper or other publication, shall be guilty of a grave offence against the Principal Order, and may, in addition to, or in lieu of, any other punishment, be ordered to give security for good behaviour or to be deported.

4. In addition and without prejudice to any powers which the Court may possess to order the exclusion of the public from any proceedings, if, in the course of the trial of a person for an offence under this Order, application is made by the prosecutor, in the interests of national safety, that all or any portion of the public should be excluded during any part of the hearing, the Court may make an order to that effect, but the passing of sentence shall in any case take place in public.

5. Article 2 (1) of "The China and Corea (Amendment) Order in Council, 1909," and the whole of "The China (War Powers) Order in Council, 1917," are hereby repealed, but this repeal shall not (a) affect the past operation thereof or any right, title, obligation or liability thereunder; or (b) interfere with the institution or prosecution of any legal proceeding thereunder.

6. This Order is in substitution for "The China (Amendment) Order in Council, 1920," which has not taken effect and is hereby revoked.

And the Right Honourable George Nathaniel, Earl Curzon of Kedleston, K.G., &c., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.

EMERGENCY POWERS ACT, 1920.

**THE WATER-GAS (EMERGENCY) ORDER, 1921,
DATED THE 4TH DAY OF MAY, 1921, MADE BY
THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER THE EMERGENCY
REGULATIONS (No. 2), 1921.**

The Board of Trade, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the Emergency Regulations (No. 2), 1921, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby order as follows:—

1. The owners of every undertaking for the supply of gas possessing the means of making gas from steam and coke, including the making of carburetted water-gas, shall, as from the date of this Order, utilise such means to the fullest possible extent for the purpose of supplying water-gas to meet the permissible requirements of their customers.

2. No coal shall be utilised for the manufacture of coal-gas in any such undertaking as aforesaid, and no coal-gas shall be supplied from any such undertaking, unless and until the permissible requirements of customers of the undertaking shall first have been met to the fullest possible extent by the manufacture and supply of water-gas as in the last-preceding clause provided.

3. The supply and consumption of water-gas shall be subject to the same restrictions as are imposed by the Coal (Emergency) Directions, 1921, and the Coal (Emergency) Supplementary (No. 2) Directions, 1921, upon the supply and consumption of coal-gas, and the expression "permissible requirements" in this Order means the quantity of gas that may so be supplied and consumed.

4. It shall be the duty of every owner of any undertaking to which this Order applies and of every officer and servant of any such owner, and, where the owners are a company, of every director of the Company, to comply with this Order, and any person failing so to comply shall be guilty of an offence against the Emergency Regulations (No. 2), 1921.

5. The expression "customer" in this Order means any person obtaining gas from any undertaking to which this Order applies, and includes the owner of any such undertaking.

6.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Water-Gas (Emergency) Order, 1921.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to an Act of Parliament, and as if this Order were an Act of Parliament.

**THE COAL (EMERGENCY) SUPPLEMENTARY
(No. 3) DIRECTIONS, 1921.**

The Board of Trade, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the Emergency Regulations (No. 2), 1921, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby direct as follows:—

1. As from the date of these Directions, Article 1 of the Coal (Emergency) Supplementary (No. 2) Directions, 1921, shall apply only to townships or boroughs of which the population is not less than 5,000, and shall be amended so that for the figures and words "50 per cent." therein there shall be substituted the figures and words "25 per cent."

2. Subject always to the proviso in Article 27 of the Coal (Emergency) Directions, 1921, hereinafter called the Principal Directions, no gas or electricity shall be supplied or consumed in any district for the purpose of lighting any street or highway, or for any other public lighting, save as in the last preceding Article authorised.

3. The owner or owners of any generating station supplying power to any tramway or light railway where such power is generated by the use of coal shall forthwith and so long as these Directions remain in operation restrict the daily supply of any such power in connection with the tramway or light railway to a quantity not exceeding 75 per cent. of the average daily quantity used in the week ended the 9th April, 1921, and no greater quantity of any such power than may be supplied as aforesaid shall be used for the purpose of any tramway or light railway undertaking.

4. It shall be the duty of every owner of any generating station or tramway or light railway undertaking to which the last preceding Article applies and of every officer and servant of any such owner and, where the owners are a company, of every director of the company to comply with the directions given in the said Article, and any person failing so to comply shall be guilty of an infringement of these Directions.

5. Any infringement of these Directions shall be an offence against the Emergency Regulations (No. 2), 1921.

6. These Directions may be cited as the Coal (Emergency) Supplementary (No. 3) Directions, 1921, and shall be read with the Principal Directions and any Directions supplementary thereto as though they formed part thereof.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF ASSISTANTS IN THE BRITISH MUSEUM.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. *Age.*—Candidates must have attained the age of 22, and shall as a rule not exceed the age of 26 on the 1st April of the year in which the competition is held, but in special circumstances candidates above 26 may be admitted with the approval of the Treasury and the Civil Service Commissioners.

2. *Nationality.*—Candidates must be natural-born British subjects, and born of a father also a natural-born British subject, provided that exception may be made in the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, and provided that exception may be made to the latter condition of the rule in the case of candidates who have served in His Majesty's Armed Forces during the War.

3. *Military Service.*—Until further order preference will be given to candidates who have served in His Majesty's Forces in the War.

4. *Publicity.*—The Trustees of the British Museum will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which they desire to fill on any one occasion, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

5. *Application.*—Application shall be made in the first instance to the Director of the British Museum, who, after examining the candidates' credentials and a personal interview, will submit the names of such candidates as appear to have the requisite qualifications for any of the existing or prospective vacancies to the Principal Trustees for approval of their candidature. Candidates thus approved shall be submitted to the Civil Service Commissioners, who if dissatisfied with the number or quality of candidates for any vacancy may require further search to be made for qualified candidates.

6. *Education.*—Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have received such systematic education, general or technical, or general and technical together, as in their opinion fits them for the post. Candidates thus recommended and approved shall be submitted to a qualifying examination in English, Arithmetic and General Knowledge.

7. *Health and Character.*—Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

Until further order, and other things being equal, preference will be given by the Selection Board to candidates who are debarred from active employment by a physical impairment due to the War, and not of a nature to interfere with the discharge of ordinary administrative duties.

8. *Competitions.*—Candidates who have been admitted to and have passed the Qualifying Examination will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will recommend for the vacancies existing those candi-

dates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, and their decision will be final. The Selection Board shall be nominated by the Commissioners in consultation with the authorities of the Department, who shall be represented on the Selection Board, and one of the Commissioners shall be the Chairman. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidate's record of experience and education, any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by any candidate as having direct knowledge of his work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidate as shown at his interview; and on their estimation of all the above evidence they will frame their decisions.

9. *Warning.*—Any attempt on the part of a candidate to enlist support for his application through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify him for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work whether at school, at the University, in the Forces or otherwise.

10. *Fee.*—Every candidate before entry to the Qualifying Examination shall pay the regulation fee of £6.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 3RD MAY 1921.)

YORKSHIRE (WEST RIDING) (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1921.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. Parts I and IV of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order," are hereby applied to the District described in the First Schedule hereto, which shall be a Scheduled District for the purposes of that Order.

Movement within the Scheduled District.

2.—(1) Where an Inspector of the Ministry considers it necessary or expedient, after inquiry, that an animal in the Scheduled

District should be permitted to be moved within the Scheduled District as often as occasion may require between different parts of the same farm, he may, notwithstanding any prohibition of movement contained in the principal Order, authorise such movement by an Occupation Licence, and the Inspector may insert in the licence such conditions as he may consider necessary or desirable for the purpose of preventing the animals referred to in the licence from coming into contact with any other animals.

(2) If in respect of any animal the conditions of a licence granted under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof shall each, according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Movement into Certain Boroughs for Immediate Slaughter.

3. Part II of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920 is hereby applied to the several boroughs described in the Second Schedule hereto.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the YORKSHIRE (WEST RIDING) (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1921.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 4TH MAY 1921.)

ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND)
ORDER OF 1921 (No. 10).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

PART I.

Revocation of Existing Order.

1. The Animals (Landing from Ireland) Order of 1921 (No. 9) is hereby revoked.

Regulation of Landing.

2. Cattle, sheep, goats or swine brought from Ireland shall not be landed in Great Britain except in accordance with the provisions of the Animals (Landing from Ireland) (Consolidation and Amendment) Order of 1914 as amended by this Order.

PART II.

Landing for Slaughter within Certain Landing Places.

3.—(1) Cattle, sheep, goats or swine shipped from any port in Ireland which is mentioned in the First Schedule to the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Consolidation and Amendment Order of 1914, may be landed at the landing places defined by Orders of the Minister as landing places for Irish animals at the ports of Bristol, Glasgow and Manchester, but only for the purpose of slaughter within the landing place.

(2) The landing of any animals under this Article must be authorised by the Superintendent or person in charge of the landing place.

(3) Animals so landed shall be subject to the provisions of the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Consolidation and Amendment Order of 1914, except that the animals shall not be moved from the landing place, and shall be

slaughtered therein within seventy-two hours after their landing.

Special Provisions as to Animals Destined for Manchester Irish Animals Landing Place.

4. Animals, if intended to be landed at the Manchester Irish Animals Landing Place under this Order, shall not be carried through the Eastham lock until they have been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry and unless and until the Inspector certifies that his examination and information do not show that there is, or during the voyage has been, an animal on board affected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

PART III.

Landing at certain Landing Places of Cattle not intended for Slaughter.

5.—(1) Cattle not intended for slaughter shipped from Ireland may, subject to the provisions of this Article, and not otherwise, be landed at the Landing Places for Irish animals at the ports of Ayr, Fishguard and Heysham.

(2) The landing of any animals under this Article must be authorised by the Superintendent or person in charge of the Landing Place.

(3) Cattle so landed shall be subject to the provisions of the Animals (Landing from Ireland) (Consolidation and Amendment) Order of 1914, except that the animals shall not be moved from the Landing Place until the expiration of seven days after the landing of the last animal at the landing place, and then only in accordance with the following provisions of this Order.

(4) The removal of any animal from the Landing Place must be authorised by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, subject to such conditions as shall be prescribed therein.

(5) Each animal moved with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry shall be moved to a place of detention specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and isolated, under the supervision of a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority, from other animals for a period of seven days after the date of its arrival unless it is previously slaughtered in the place of detention.

(6) Animals moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route, and as far as practicable by railway, and during such movement shall not be permitted to come in contact with animals not being moved under this Article.

Provision as to Marking.

6. An animal shall not be moved from the Landing Place unless, before the movement is commenced it is marked by and at the expense of the owner or his agent by the clipping of a broad arrow ↑ about six inches long, on the left hind-quarter.

Provisions as to Licences.

7.—(1) Where animals are moved with a licence under this Order the licence shall forthwith, after completion of the movement, be delivered up to an Inspector of the Local Authority, or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District, by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

(2) A movement licence granted under this

Order shall be in force for four days, inclusive of the day of issue.

(3) A copy of a licence under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the licence to the Clerk of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of detention is situate.

Movement from Landing Place subject to other Orders and to Regulations.

8.—Nothing in this Order or in any Order relating to the landing or movement of animals brought from Ireland shall be deemed to authorise the movement of an animal in contravention of any other Order of the Minister or of a Regulation of a Local Authority.

PART IV.—GENERAL.

Offences.

9.—(1) If any animal shall be landed or removed in contravention of this Order or is not isolated or slaughtered as required by this Order or by the conditions of a licence granted thereunder, the owner thereof, and the owner and the lessee and the occupier of the Landing Place, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the landing or movement, and the owner and person in charge of the animal which is not so isolated or slaughtered, and the owner and the charterer, and the master of the vessel from which the same is landed, as the case may be, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, before the expiration of the period of detention, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark on any animal affixed under this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

10. This Order shall come into operation at mid-day on the fifth day of May, nineteen hundred and twenty-one.

Short Title.

11. This Order may be cited as the ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND) ORDER OF 1921 (No. 10).
