## SUMMARY.

The foregoing list contains 86 cases, viz.:—7 American, 1 Austrian, 3 Czecho-Slovak, 5 Danish, 3 Dutch, 4 French, 4 German, 1 Hungarian, 7 Italian, 7 Polish, 32 Russian, 4 Swedish, 1 Swiss and 7 of other Nationalities. 10 of the cases (including 2 American, 1 French, 4 German, 2 Italian, and 1 Swedish) are British-born widows. 36 of the cases (including 2 American, 1 Austrian, 1 Czecho-Slovak, 1 Danish, 1 Hungarian, 2 Italian, 4 Polish, and 23 Russian) are men who have served in the British or Allied Forces during the War.
