ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 3RD MAY 1921.)

YORKSHIRE (WEST RIDING) (FOOT-
AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF
1921.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. Parts I and IV of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order," are hereby applied to the District described in the First Schedule hereto, which shall be a Scheduled District for the purposes of that Order.

Movement within the Scheduled District.

2.—(1) Where an Inspector of the Ministry considers it necessary or expedient, after inquiry, that an animal in the Scheduled

District should be permitted to be moved within the Scheduled District as often as occasion may require between different parts of the same farm, he may, notwithstanding any prohibition of movement contained in the principal Order, authorise such movement by an Occupation Licence, and the Inspector may insert in the licence such conditions as he may consider necessary or desirable for the purpose of preventing the animals referred to in the licence from coming into contact with any other animals.

(2) If in respect of any animal the conditions of a licence granted under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof shall each, according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

*Movement into Certain Boroughs for
Immediate Slaughter.*

3. Part II of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920 is hereby applied to the several boroughs described in the Second Schedule hereto.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the YORKSHIRE (WEST RIDING) (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1921.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Scheduled District.

A District comprising—

In the administrative county of the West Riding of Yorkshire, the boroughs of Batley, Brighouse, Morley and Ossett; the petty sessional divisions of Saddleworth, West Morley (except the parishes of Midgley, Luddenden Foot, Sowerby Bridge, Norwood Green and Coley, Shelf, and Queensbury), Upper Agbrigg, Dewsbury, Lower Agbrigg (except the parishes of Snydale, Ackton, Normanton, Newland with Woodhouse Moor, Altofts, and Methley), and Staincross (except the parishes of Brierley, Great Houghton, Little Houghton, Darfield, Billingley, Wombwell, and Hoyland Nether), and the parishes of Bradfield, Stocksbridge, Gildersome, Drighlington, Hunsworth, and Cleckheaton;

In the administrative county of Derby:

The detached parts of the petty sessional division of Bakewell, and the parishes of Derwent and Hope Woodlands (*excluding its detached part*); and such part of the parish of Charlesworth as lies to the north of the main road from Glossop to Sheffield; and

In the administrative county of Chester:

The parish of Tintwistle;

And also comprising—

The county boroughs of Barnsley, Dewsbury, Huddersfield and Wakefield.
