Whereas We have deemed it expedient that a Commission should forthwith issue to inquire into the admission into the United Kingdom of live stock for purposes other than immediate slaughter at the ports; whether such admission would increase and cheapen the meat supply of the Country, and, if so, to what extent; and whether such admission is advisable, having regard to the necessity of protecting live stock bred in the Country from the introduction of disease and of restoring their numbers after the losses to which they have been subjected during or since the War:

Now know ye, that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability, have authorized and appointed, and do by these Presents authorize and appoint you, the said Robert Bannatyne, Viscount Finlay (Chairman); George Rankin, Baron Askwith; Sir Algernon Freeman Firth; Sir Arthur Everett Shipley, and Sir William Henry Peat to be Our Commissioners for the purposes of the said inquiry.

And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these Presents give and grant unto you, or any two or more of you, full power to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission; to call for information in writing; and also to call for, have access to and examine all such books, documents, registers and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever.

And We do by these Presents authorize and empower you, or any one or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid.

And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any two or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And We do further ordain that you, or any three or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time, if you shall judge it expedient so to do.

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you, your opinion upon the matter herein submitted for your consideration.

- (1) For the first two hours' overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Quarter.
- (2) For Overtime after the first twohours of Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory

Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be Oneand-a-Half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Half.

(3) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Double

(4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48 the Overtime Rate shall be Oneand-a-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 of this Section.

The Overtime Rate shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customany Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds nine, or in the case of Saturday exceeds five, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48. Provided that:-

Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on five days a week, the Overtime Rates shall only be payable on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.

Note.—The hours which Female Workers, Young Persons and Children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and to the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART II.

SECTION I.—The above Overtime Rates shall apply as provided above and subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in Great Britain who are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Tobacco) Order, 1919, that is to say, the manufacture of Tobacco, Cigars, Cigarettes, Cigarette Tubes and Snuff, including all preparatory processes, and including also the operations of storing, and store-keeping, boxing, packeting, labelling, parcelling and despatching and all other warehousing and packing operations incidental to the manufacture of any of the above-mentioned articles.

YORKSHIRE (WEST RIDING) (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1921 (No. 2).
