

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 10TH MAY 1921.)

CHESHIRE (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DIS-
EASE) ORDER OF 1921 (No. 5).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. The Cheshire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1921 is modified in the manner hereinafter appearing.

2. The Scheduled District for the purposes of that Order shall be the district described in the First Schedule hereto.

3.—(i.) The Area described in the Second Schedule hereto is hereby declared to be a Prohibited Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Order."

(ii.) Part III. of the principal Order shall apply to the Scheduled District.

(iii.) The provisions of Article 2 of the Cheshire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1921 shall continue to apply to the Prohibited Area, and the provisions of Article 6 of the "principal Order" shall be read and have effect subject to this modification.

4. The Cheshire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1921 (No. 4) is hereby revoked.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the eleventh day of May, nineteen hundred and twenty-one.

6. This Order may be cited as the CHESHIRE (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1921 (No. 5), and shall be read with the Cheshire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1921.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Contracted Scheduled District.

A district comprising the parishes of Bromborough, Poulton-cum-Spital, Lower Bebington, Higher Bebington, Thornton Hough, Brimstage, Storeton and Prenton, in the administrative county of Chester.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Prohibited Area.

An area comprising such portions of the parishes of Poulton-cum-Spital, Lower Bebington, Higher Bebington, Brimstage and Storeton, in the administrative county of Chester, as lie within the following boundary namely:—

Commencing at the point where Bracken Lane crosses the Storeton Quarries Railway

near Higher Bebington, and proceeding thence in a westerly direction along Bracken Lane, and continuing in a south-westerly direction along Red Hill and the footpath, thence to Brimstage Lane, and along Brimstage Lane to its junction with the main road at Brimstage, thence in easterly and south-easterly directions along the road *via* Brimstage Bridge to the Poulton-cum-Spital parish boundary near Clatterbridge Workhouse, thence in a south-easterly direction along that boundary to Poulton Hall Road, thence in north-easterly, north-westerly and northerly directions along Poulton Hall Road, Poulton Road and Church Road to Kirket Lane, thence in a generally westerly direction along Kirket Lane, Cross Lane, Heath Road, Teehey Lane and Bracken Lane to the point of commencement.

ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL
IN ENGLAND.

Whereas by the 21st section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, and section 3 of the Ministry of Health Act, 1919, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Minister of Health, may from time to time alter registration sub-districts:—

And whereas it is expedient, in order that Watford Urban District may be wholly included within one registration sub-district, that the part of Watford urban parish, which, prior to the 1st April last, the date when Ministry of Health Order No. 66995 took effect, formed part of Watford rural parish, should be transferred from Abbots Langley sub-district of Watford Registration District to Watford sub-district of the same registration district;

2. Now, therefore, I, Sylvanus Percival Vivian, Registrar-General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the first-mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Minister of Health, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of June, nineteen hundred and twenty-one.
