EXPLOSIVE SUBSTANCES ORDER, 1921.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 17 of the Emergency Regulations (No. 2), 1921, I hereby Order as follows:—

1. A person having in his possession any explosive substance shall keep the same in a secure place approved by the Chief Constable, and shall, if so required by the Chief Constable, remove all or any part of such explosive substance to any place specified by such Chief Constable.

APPENDIX.

- (a) The insurance undertakings of all persons or bodies of persons whether corporate or unincorporate and whether established within or without the United Kingdom engaged in the United Kingdom in the granting of insurances under contract.
- (b) The insurance undertakings of all persons or bodies of persons whether corporate or unincorporate engaged in the United Kingdom in the administration of any system of insurance established by Act of Parliament.

- (c) Persons employed by or under the Crown; and
- (d) Persons in the employment of Insurance Committees established under the National Insurance Acts, 1911 to 1920.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 17TH MAY 1921.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 and the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Application Order of 1917 (No. 2) shall not apply to the move-

ment of swine from the sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being a Swine-Fever Infected Place, if the swine are accompanied by a licence in the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the said Order of 1908, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the County of Herefordshire, and the following conditions, which shall be specified in the licence, are complied with:—

(i) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.

(ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

2. A copy of a licence issued under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

3. A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the above-mentioned Orders be treated as a licence under those Orders.

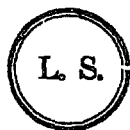

TRAMWAY BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the following Bye-laws were on the 10th day of May, 1921, made and sealed by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the county borough of Middlesbrough acting by the Town Council.

Bye-laws and Regulations made by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the county borough of Middlesbrough, as the Promoters of the Tramways for the time being belonging to them, with respect to such Tramways under the powers conferred upon them by the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Middlesbrough Corporation Act, 1919.

1.—The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all cars of the Tramways Department of the Corporation and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Bye-laws and Regulations.

Interpretation.

2.—Throughout these Bye-laws the word "Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the county borough of Middlesbrough; the word "Tramways" means the

tramway system and motor omnibus undertaking worked by the Corporation whether situate within the county borough of Middlesbrough or in any other district; the word "Car" means any carriage, car or motor omnibus run by the Tramways Department for the conveyance of passengers; the word "Conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation having charge of or helping in the charge of a car; the word "Driver" means any officer or servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive a car; and the expression "interior of a Carriage" shall not include the upper deck of covered carriages.

Entering and Leaving Cars.

3.—Every passenger shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the hindmost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise unless so directed by the conductor.

When a car stops, no person shall board the car until all passengers desiring to alight therefrom shall have done so.

Smoking and Spitting.

4.—No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, or cigar or cigarette, in the interior of any car, and no person shall spit in, on, from or against any car.

Musical Instruments.

5.—No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any car, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

Contagious, &c., Disease.

6.—A person affected with any dangerous, contagious or infectious disorder or disease shall not enter or mount upon any car, nor shall any clothing or other articles likely to spread any contagious or infectious disease be placed by any person on any car, and any such person, clothing or other article found in or upon any car shall be removed from the car by or under the direction of the conductor.

Intoxicated Person.

7.—A person in a state of intoxication shall not enter or mount upon any car, and if found in or upon any car shall leave the car immediately on being requested to do so by the conductor.

Obscene or Offensive Language.

8.—No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any car, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

Nuisances.

9.—No person shall commit any nuisance in, on, or against any car, tramway station, waiting-room, or premises used in connection with the Corporation's tramways.

Damage to Car.

10.—No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the cushions or the linings, or place his feet upon or lie upon any seat or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any car, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage, any car.

Any person acting in contravention of this Bye-law shall, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, be liable to pay the amount of any damage so done.

Objectionable Persons.

11.—No person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a car, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the car or the dress or clothing of any passenger, nor any person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to any passenger, shall be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any car, and may be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon any car.

No such person shall enter in or upon any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and if any such person be found in or upon any car, he shall, on the request of the conductor, leave such car upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned. Provided that on cars specially run for artisans, mechanics and daily labourers no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on a car under the provisions of this Bye-law, on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

Payment of Fares.

12.—Each passenger shall, upon demand, and whether the fare shall have been demanded or not, before leaving the car, pay to the conductor or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, the fare legally demandable for the journey.

Tickets.

13.—Each passenger, when tickets are issued, shall, as and when requested so to do, show his ticket to the conductor or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, and shall also when requested so to do by the conductor or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

Luggage.

14.—No passenger shall bring on to any car any luggage other than his own personal luggage, which shall be placed by the passenger in such position on the car as shall be directed by the conductor.

No person shall bring on to any car luggage of a size or bulk, which in the opinion of the conductor, is likely to cause inconvenience, hindrance or annoyance to passengers.

Unauthorised Travelling.

15.—No person except a passenger or intending passenger, or any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty shall mount or enter a car, and no passenger or other person, except such officer or servant as aforesaid, shall hold or hang on by or to the dashboard, or steps, or any other part of a car. No passenger or other person shall sit on or lean against the outside rails on the upper deck of any car. No passenger or other person, not being a servant of the Corporation, shall stand or sit on any platform or stairs of any car, or

stand on the upper deck thereof. No person or passenger shall, except with the permission of the conductor, stand on the lower deck of any car when seating accommodation is available, either on the upper or lower deck of the car. If no seating accommodation is available, either on the upper deck or on the lower deck, no person or passenger shall mount or enter or remain on the car when warned by the conductor not to do so. Any person offending against this Bye-law shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

Full Number of Passengers.

16.—When any car contains in the interior thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car is provided in such interior, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain therein, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained.

When any car contains on the upper deck thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car is provided on such upper deck, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount or remain thereon.

Entering or Leaving Car in Motion.

17.—No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave any car in motion.

Dogs.

18.—No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any car except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any car in breach of this Bye-law shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

Firearms, &c.

19.—No person shall travel in or on any car with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument, or implement of any material or substance which may be dangerous or offensive to the passengers.

Interference with Driver or Conductor.

20.—No person, other than the conductor or driver or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controller, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, or any part of a car or its equipment, and no person other than the conductor or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty shall signal a car to start.

Obstruction.

21.—No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any car, or wilfully obstruct or impede any conductor, driver or other servant of the

Corporation acting in the performance of his duty upon or in connection with any car or tramway.

22.—If at any time a car becomes disabled or in any way damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to complete their journey by the next available car.

Conductors and Drivers to Enforce Bye-laws.

23.—Every conductor and driver of a car shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Bye-laws, and prevent the breach thereof.

Posting of Bye-laws.

24.—There shall be placed and kept in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use a

printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

Penalty.

25.—Any person offending against, or committing a breach of any of the Bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Operation.

26.—These Bye-laws shall come into force on the 1st day of August, 1921.
