(2) For the purpose of this Order the expression "overtime employment" is defined to be:—

- (a) all employment on a Sunday;
- (b) all employment in excess of 6½ hours on a Saturday;
- (c) all employment in excess of 8½ hours on any other day;
- (d) all employment in excess of 50 hours in any week (excluding Sunday).

(3) Provided that for the purpose of determining whether any particular employment is overtime employment regard shall be had to the total period of the worker's employment, whether such employment is on harvest work or otherwise.

AGRICULTURAL WAGES BOARD  
(ENGLAND AND WALES).

VARIATION OF THE DETERMINATION OF THE VALUE OF BOARD AND LODGING AS A BENEFIT OR ADVANTAGE IN PEMBROKE, CARMARTHEN AND CARDIGAN.

The values at which the provision by an employer for a workman employed by him of the benefits and advantages specified in the Order

of the Agricultural Wages Board (England and Wales), dated the 6th September, 1918, may be reckoned as part payment of wages in lieu of payment in cash for the purpose of any minimum rates of wages fixed under the above Act, have been varied by the Wages Board as from the 30th May, 1921, as regards the value at which the provision by an employer for a male workman employed by him of board and lodging may be reckoned for this purpose, in the area of the District Wages Committee for Pembroke, Carmarthen and Cardigan so as to provide that such values shall be as follows:—
