GEORGE R.I.

HEREAS by the Emergency Powers Act, 1920, it is enacted that if it appears to Us that any action has been taken or is immediately threatened by any persons or body of persons of such a nature and on so extensive a scale as to be calculated, by interfering with the supply and distribution of food, water, fuel, or light, or with the means of locomotion, to deprive the community, or any substantial portion of the community, of the essentials of life, We may, by proclamation, declare that a state of emergency exists:

And whereas on the thirtieth day of April last, We did, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, declare by proclamation, in pursuance of the said Act, that a state of

emergency existed:

And whereas it is enacted by the said Act that no such proclamation shall be in force for more than one month, without prejudice to the issue of another proclamation at or before the end of that period:

And whereas the continued cessation of work

in Coal Mines does, in Our opinion, constitute a state of emergency within the meaning of

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the said Act, We do, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby declare that a state of emergency exists.

TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England on Friday, the 3rd June, 1921, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Act, 1919, to the amount of £55,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any date from Monday, the 6th June, to Saturday, 11th June, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the

Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London

Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The person whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than two o'clock (Saturday twelve o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 26 of the Finance Act, 1915, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from

tendering for these Bills.

8. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES AS VARIED FOR FEMALE WORKERS.

Effective as from 23rd May, 1921.*

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, and the Trade Boards (Women's Clothing) Order, 1919, as varied by the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920, for the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Trade, as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, and dated 20th November, 1919, having given due notice on 20th December, 1920, of Proposal to Vary General Minimum Time Rates, Piece Work Basis Time-Rates, and Overtime Rates for Female Workers, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, THAT THEY HAVE VARIED the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece Work Basis Time-Rates, and Overtime Rates for Female Workers set out in the Schedule of their Notice dated 19th April, 1920, and that the Minimum Rates of Wages as varied are as shown in the Schedule set out below.

And the Trade Board FURTHER GIVE NOTICE that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order dated 17th May, 1921, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Minimum Rates of Wages as varied by the Trade Board and specifying 23rd May, 1921*, as the date from which such Minimum Rates of Wages shall become effective.

* Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 29th May, 1921.

Provided that in the event of any Female Worker being employed for the first time as a Cutter, Trimmer or Fitter-up at or over the age of 19 years, the rate to be paid during the first two months of her employment shall be 1d. per hour less than the General Minimum Time-Rate appropriate to her age as set out in Sub-Section (b) of this Section.

(i) The General Minimum Time-Rate for learners under 14 years shall be 2¼d, per hour. Such learners shall from the age of 14 be entitled to the amounts shown in Column I. above, all employment prior to that age being disregarded.

(ii) The advances to be given to learners commencing under 21 years of age shall become due as from the first Monday in January and July of each year, the learner being entitled to her first advance on the first Monday in January or July, as the case may be, provided that she has been in the trade at least three months.

(iii) A learner shall cease to be a learner and be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to her under Section I. of Part I. of this Schedule upon the fulfilment

of the following conditions:

(iv) No female learner shall be held to be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate under Section I. of Part I. of this Schedule until she has attained the age of 18 years, notwithstanding any employment she may have had. Provided that in determining the age of entry and the length of employment, all service prior to the age of 14 shall be disregarded.

(b) Learners who are occupied wholly or mainly in:—(a) Fitting-up, (b) Hooking-up material composed solely of Cotton or Linen to be used in making overalls and other

PART II.

Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for Female Workers.

Female Workers (other than Cutters, Trimmers and Fitters-up, as specified in Section I. (b) of Part I. of this Schedule, and other than Learners occupied in Fitting-up and Hooking-up, as specified in Section II. (b) of Part I. of this Schedule):—

(a) Workers other than Home-workers,11d. per hour.

(b) Home-workers, 11d. per hour.

In cases where a worker is employed on Piece-work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 11d. per hour to an ordinary worker: Provided that in determining as to whether any Piece-Rate satisfies this condition, regard shall be had to the earnings of Workers other than Learners only.

PART III.

Overtime Rates for Female Workers (All Ages).

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board hereby declare the Normal Number of Hours of Work in the trade to be as follows:—

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays and hours worked on Saturday (subject to the provisions set out below) shall be regarded as Overtime, to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker in excess of the declared Normal Number of Hours shall be as follows:—

(A) For Female Workers employed on Time Work:—

(1) On any day other than Saturdays, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays:—

(a) For the first two hours of Overtime, One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Quarter.

(b) For Overtime, after the first two hours of Overtime, One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Half.

Provided that where it is the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week, the Overtime Rates specified in paragraphs A (1) (a) and A (1) (b) of this Section shall not be payable on any day (other than Saturday, Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays) until the number of hours worked exceeds $9\frac{1}{2}$ and $11\frac{1}{2}$ respectively.

(2) On Saturday in respect of :-

(a) That class of worker who customarily attends on five days a week:—

(i.) For the first two hours of Overtime (that is to say, for the first two hours worked on Saturday), One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Quarter.

(ii.) For the second two hours of Overtime, One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Half.

(iii.) For Overtime after the first four hours of Overtime, Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Double-time.

(b) That class of worker who customarily

attends on six days a week:-

For all Overtime worked after the first five hours, One-and-a-Half Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Half.

Note.—During the first five hours worked on Saturday, the Minimum Rate applicable for the class of workers specified in paragraph (2) (b) is the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate set out in Part I. of this Notice.

(3) On Sundays and Customary Public

and Statutory Holidays: -

For all time worked, Twice the General Minimum Time-Rates otherwise applicable, i.e., Double-Time.

Note.—The Overtime Rates set out in Subsections (1), (2) and (3) of this Section are payable as provided above, in respect of all hours of Overtime worked on any day, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

(4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, One-and-a-Quarter Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (1) (b), (2) (a) (ii.) and (iii.) (2) (b), and (3) of this Section.

Provided that where it is the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall not be payable in the week on which attendance on Saturday is required until 50 hours have been worked.

- (5) Where it is, or may become, the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime as set out in this Section shall apply to workers in like manner as if in the provisions of this notice as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday" and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."
- (B) For Female Workers employed on Piece-Work:—
 - (1) Female Workers employed Cutters, Trimmers and Fitters-up as defined in this Notice, employed on Piecework, and all Female Learners employed on Piece-work, shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked. in addition to Piece-Rates each of which would yield in the circumstances of the case to an Ordinary worker not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate applicable (or where no Piece-work Basis Time-Rate has been fixed not less than the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable), an amount equal to One-Quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, or to the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate ac-

cording as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of paragraph (A) of this Section if the worker had been employed on Time-Work, were Time-and-a-Quarter, Time-and-a-Half, or Double-Time respectively.

(2) All other Female Workers employed

on Piece-work shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-Rates, each of which would yield in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary worker not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate applicable, an amount equal to One-Quarter of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate Piecework Basis Time-Rate, or the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of paragraph (A) of this Section if the worker had been employed on Time-Work, were Time-and-a-Quarter, Time-and-a-Half, or Double-Time respectively.

-The hours which Female Workers, Young Persons and Children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshops Acts, and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART IV.

For the purpose of this Notice the follow-

ing definitions shall apply:

Section I.—Cutters, Trimmers and Fittersup are workers who are substantially occupied in one or more of the following processes, that is to say:-

(a) Marking-in or marking-up cloth or linings, or other materials.

(b) Laying-up, hooking-up or folding

cloth or linings, or other materials.
(c) Cutting cloth or linings or other materials.

(d) Trimming, that is, the process as ordinarily carried on of cutting and assembling together the linings and fittings of garments.

(e) Dividing, that is, the process as ordinarily carried on by Cutters or their Assistants, of dividing, parting or separating the parts of garments after being cut, and of assembling them into suitable bundles for

making up.

(f) Fitting-up, that is, a process between that of cutting and that of sewing, basting, or machining, which consists of preparing and fitting accurately the various parts of the garment before being basted, sewn or machined, such work of preparing and fitting being always done by shears or knives or other cutting appliances; sewing, basting or machining forming no part or process of fitting-up.

Section II.—A female learner is a worker who:

(a) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning any branch or process of the trade by an employer who provides the learner with reasonable facilities for such learning; and

(b) Has received a certificate, or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made an application for such certificate or registration, which has been duly acknowledged and is still under considera-Provided that the certification or registration of a learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a female learner on her first employment, in the branch or branches of the trade described in Part V. of this Schedule, without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such learner being continued. thereafter at her employment, the probation period shall be included in her period of Îearnership.

Provided that notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, a person shall not be deemed to be a learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes and is not in the employ-

ment of her parent or guardian.

expression "Home-III.—The worker" means a worker who works in her own home, or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

PART V.

The above respective Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all female workers in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the above-mentioned Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, dated 20th November, 1919, that is to say:

Women's, girls', and children's Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring, and all Women's, Girls', and Children's Retail Bespoke Tailoring carried on in a factory where garments are made up for three or more retail establishments, and any other branch of women's, girls', and children's tailoring which is not included within the scope of the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board.

Including:-

(1) All operations and processes of cutting, making, or finishing by hand or machine of coats, costumes, tailored skirts, coat-frocks, mantles, service clothing, or similar garments made by tailoring pro-

(2) (a) The altering, repairing, renovating, or re-making of any of the above-mentioned tailored garments, except where in-cluded within the scope of the Retail Be-

spoke Tailoring Trade Board;
(b) The cleaning of such garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the altering, repairing, renovating, or re-making of the garments;

(3) The lining with fur of any of the above-mentioned garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with

the making of such garments;

(4) (a) All processes of embroidery or de-corative needlework where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making, altering, repairing, renovating, or re-making of any of the above-mentioned tailored garments other than hand-embroidery or hand-drawn thread work on garments made of linen or cotton or of mixed linen and cotton;

(b) The following processes if done by machine, namely, thread-drawing, threadclipping, top-sewing, scalloping, nickelling, and paring;

(5) Warehousing, packing, and all other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the above-mentioned branches of

tailoring.

But excluding:—

(1) Those branches of women's or girls' Bespoke Tailoring and all operations or processes covered by the Trade Boards (Tailoring) Order, 1919;

(2) The making of headgear;

(3) The making of rubberised or oilskin

garments;

(4) Warehousing, packing, and other similar operations carried on in shops mainly engaged in the retail distribution of articles of any description that are not made on the premises.

PART VI.

Section I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

Section II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made, or that may be made, between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES AS VARIED FOR MALE WORKERS. Effective as from 23rd May, 1921.*

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, and the Trade Boards (Women's Clothing) Order, 1919, as varied by the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920, for the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Trade, as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 20th November, 1919, having given due notice on 20th December, 1920, of Proposal to Vary General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male Workers, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE THAT THEY HAVE VARIED the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male Workers, set out in the Schedule of their Notice dated 19th April, 1920, and that the Minimum Rates of Wages as varied are as shown in the Schedule set out below.

And the Trade Board FURTHER GIVE NOTICE that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order dated 17th May, 1921, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Minimum Rates of Wages as varied by the Trade Board and specifying 23rd May, 1921,* as the date from which such Minimum Rates of Wages shall become effective.

* Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 29th May, 1921.

Provided that workers who commence employment in the trade at or over the age of 19 shall receive for a period of 12 months a General Minimum Time-Rate of 38s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., 9½d. per hour. Provided also that this General Minimum Time-Rate shall be increased by 6s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., 1½d. per hour, in the case of any such worker who is 22 years of age or over. Workers to whom the first proviso applies shall, on the expiration of 12 months' employment in the trade, receive such General Minimum Time Rates as they may be entitled to under the provisions of this Schedule.

SECTION II.

In cases where a worker is employed on piece work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary worker an amount not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate applicable as set out in Section I. above. Provided that in determining as to whether any piece-rate satisfies this condition, regard shall be had to the earnings of workers of 22 years of age and over only.

Note.—The employment of children under 14 years of age is subject to the provisions of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART II.

Overtime Rates for Male Workers (All Ages).

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3
(1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board hereby declare the Normal Number of Hours of Work in the trade to be as follows:—

Section II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours, shall be as follows:

(A) For Male Workers employed on Time

Work.

(1) On any day other than Saturdays, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays:

(a) For the first two hours of Overtime, One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable,

Time-and-a-quarter.

(b) For Overtime, after the first two hours of Overtime, One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Half.

Provided that where it is the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week, the Overtime Rates specified in paragraphs A. (1) (a), and A (1) (b) of this Section shall not be payable on any day (other than Saturday, Sunday, and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays) until the number of hours worked exceed 9½ and 11½ respectively.

(2) On Saturday in respect of:

(a) That class of worker who customarily attends on five days a week:

(i.) For the first two hours of Overtime (that is to say, for the first two hours worked on Saturday), One-and-a-Quarter Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Quarter.

(ii.) For the second two hours of Overtime, One-and-a-Half Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Half.

(iii.) For Overtime after the first four hours of Overtime, Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Double-Time.

(b) That class of worker who custom-

arily attends on six days a week: For all Overtime worked after the first five hours, One-and-a-Half Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Half.

Note.—During the first five hours worked on Saturday, the Minimum Rate applicable for the class of workers specified in paragraph 2 (b) is the appropriate General Minimum Time Rate set out in Part I of this

(3) On Sundays and Customary Public

and Statutory Holidays:

For all time worked, Twice the General Minimum Time-Rates otherwise applicable, i.e., Double-Time.

Note.—The Overtime Rates set out in Sub-Sections (1), (2) and (3) of this Section are payable as provided above in respect of all hours of Overtime worked on any day, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48,

(4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, One-and-a-Quarter Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (1) (b), (2) (a) (ii.), and (iii.), (2) (b), and (3) of this Section.

Provided that where it is the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall not be payable in the week on which attendance on Saturday is required until 50 hours have been worked.

(5) Where it is, or may become, the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime as set out in this Section shall apply to workers in like manner as if in the provisions of this notice as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday," and the word "Saturday." ''iSunday ''

(B) For Male Workers employed on Piece-

(i.) Male Workers of 22 years of age and over employed on Piece-work shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-Rates, each of which would yield in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate applicable, an amount equal to One-Quarter of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate Time-Rate, Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, or the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of paragraph (A) of this Section if the worker had been employed on Time-Work, were Timeand-a-Quarter, Time-and-a-Half, or Double Time respectively.

(ii.) Male Workers under 22 years of age employed on Piece-work shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-Rates, each of which would yield in the circumstances of the case to an Ordinary worker not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate applicable, an amount equal to One-Quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, or to the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of paragraph (A) of this Section if the worker had been employed on Time-work, were Time-and-a-Quarter, Time-and-a-Half, or Double-Time

respectively.
Note.—The hours which Young Persons and Children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshops Acts, and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act,

1920.

PART III.

Section I.—For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions shall apply:

(a) A Measure Cutter is a person who is capable of taking a complete set of measures and of cutting any garment for a female person from model, patterns and sketches:

(b) A Cutter (other than a Measure Cutter or Knife Cutter or Knifeman) is a

person who is employed in:

(i) Marking-in or marking-up cloth or linings or other materials;

(ii) Laying-up, hooking-up or folding cloth or linings or other materials;

(iii) Cutting cloth or linings or other

materials; and

(iv) Dividing; that is, the process ordinarily carried on by Cutters or their assistants of dividing, parting, or separating the parts of garments after being cut and of assembling them into suitable bundles for making-up.

(c) A Knife Cutter or Knifeman is a person who is wholly or mainly employed on Band, Electric or Hand Knife processes.

(d) A Fitter-up is a person who is employed in Fitting-up; that is, a process between that of outting and that of sewing, baisting or machining, which consists of preparing or fitting accurately the various parts of the garment before being baisted, sewn or machined, such work of preparing or fitting being always done by shears or knives or other cutting appliances, sewing, baisting or machining forming no part or process of fitting-up.

fitting-up.

(c) A Tailor is a person who is employed in sewing by hand in the process of making

a garment or portion of garment.

(f) A Presser is a person who is employed in Pressing-off by hand or by machine.

(g) A Machinist is a person who is employed in Machining other than as a Plain Machinist as defined in Sub-Section (j) of this Section and is capable of machining any garment throughout.

(h) A Passer is a person who is employed in examining garments, either in the processes of being made up or upon their com-

pletion.

(i) An Under-Presser is a person who is employed in pressing processes other than

Pressing-off.

(j) A Plain Machinist is a person who is employed in the process of making-up Plain Sleeves, Facings, Linings, Inside Pockets, Quilting and Padding.
 (k) A Warehouseman is a person em-

(k) A Warehouseman is a person employed wholly or mainly upon one or more of the following operations, viz., the assembling, keeping, storing, and distributing of stock, but excluding such operations included in the definitions of a Packer or Porter.

(1) A Packer is a person employed wholly or mainly upon the operation of packing goods and materials, but excluding such operations included in the definitions of a

Porter or Warehouseman.

(m) A Porter is a person employed wholly or mainly upon one or more of the following operations, viz., unpacking, moving, loading or unloading of goods or materials, but excluding such operations included in the definitions of a Packer or Warehouseman

PART IV.

The respective minimum rates of wages set out in this Schedule shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all male workers in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in a branch of the trade specified in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour dated 20th November, 1919, that is to say:—

Women's, Girls' and Children's ready-made and wholesale bespoke tailoring, and all women's, girls' and children's retail bespoke tailoring carried on in a factory where garments are made up for three or more retail establishments, and any other branch of women's, girls' and children's tailoring, which is not included within the scope of the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board;

Including:

(1) All operations and processes of cutting, making or finishing by hand or machine of coats, costumes, tailored skirts, coat-frocks, mantles, service clothing or similar garments made by tailoring processes;

(2) (a) The altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of any of the above-mentioned tailored garments, except where included within the scope of the Retail

Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board;

(b) The cleaning of such garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of the garments;

(3) The lining with fur of any of the above-mentioned garments, where carried out in association with or in conjunction with

PART III.

Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers (other than Home-Workers).

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board Propose to Declare for the purpose of the application of the proposed Overtime Rates set out in Section II. of this Part of this Schedule the Normal Number of Hours of Work in the Trade to be as follows:—

In any week 48
On Saturday 5

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—Overtime Rates calculated on the proposed Minimum Rates of Wages specified in Parts I. and II. of this Schedule in the manner specified below, shall apply in substitution for the proposed minimum rates set out in Parts I. and II. of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked in excess of the normal number of hours of work in the trade proposed to be declared by the Trade Board as set out in Section I. of this Part of this Schedule, that is to say:—

- (a) Male and Female Workers Employed on Time-Work:—
 - (1) For all hours worked on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be twice the General Minimum Time Rate applicable, i.e., Double Time.

Provided that the said Overtime Rate shall not apply—

- (i) In respect of time worked on Good Friday in the case of workers who are given Easter Tuesday as a holiday in lieu of Good Friday; or
- (ii) In respect of time worked on Easter Tuesday in the case of workers who are given Good Friday as a holiday in lieu of Easter Tuesday.
- (2) For all hours worked in excess of five on Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall be one-and-a-quarter times the general minimum time-rate applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraph (1) of sub-section (a) of this section.
- (3) For all hours worked in excess of 48 in any week, the Overtime Rate shall be one-and-a-quarter times the general minimum time-rate applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraph (1) of sub-section (a) of this section.
- (b) Female Workers employed on Piecework:—

Female Workers employed on Piecework shall receive, in respect of each hour worked in excess of 48 hours in any week, in addition to payment at Piece-Rates. each of which would yield, in the circum-

stances of the case, at least 8\frac{3}{4}d. per hour to an Ordinary Worker, the sum of 1d. per hour.

PART IV.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers specified in Parts I and II above in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Button-making) Order, 1919, that is to say:—

The manufacture of buttons, buttonmoulds, upholsterers' buttons or upholsterers' button-headed nails (excluding the shanks), from any material by the processes of cutting, sawing, stamping, pressing, turning, drilling, fancying, grinding, barrelling, polishing, japanning, lacquering, dyeing, colouring, painting, varnishing, sewing, crocheting or the covering of button moulds;

Including-

- (a) The manufacture of studs, links, or parts thereof, from any material other than metal, where such manufacture is carried on in association with or in conjunction with button-making, so as to provide a common or interchangeable form of employment for workers;
- (b) The manufacture of shanks for buttons where carried on in association with or in conjunction with button-making;
- (c) The carding of any of the above articles, wherever carried on;
- (d) All despatching, packing, warehousing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of any of the above articles;

But excluding-

- (e) The manufacture of wooden button moulds;
- (f) The covering of button moulds where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of wearing apparel.

Provided that the above Proposed Minimum Rates shall not apply to Home-Workers.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from 24th May, 1921. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Button-making Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

PROPOSAL TO FIX AND TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE APPRENTICES IN THE CIGAR SECTION OF THE TRADE.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918. for the branches of trade specified in the Trade Boards (Tobacco) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NO l'ICE as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, THAT THEY PROPOSE TO FIX General Minimum Time-Rates, Guaranteed Time-Rates, General Minimum Piece-Rates and Overtime Rates for certain classes of Male and Female Apprentices and TO VARY the Overtime Rates at present in force and set out in the Schedule to their Notice dated 12th May, 1921, and effective under an Order of the Minister of Labour, dated 9th May, 1921, in their application to Certain Classes of Male and Female Apprentices, the proposed Minimum Rates of Wages together with Certain General Minimum Time Rates already in force which will remain unaffected by these Proposals being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

The Minister of Labour has given his consent to the Notice of Proposal to Vary being given.

SECTION III:--

(a) The above general minimum time rates are for a week of 48 hours, and, except as set out below, are subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours

of employment in any week is less than 48.

(b) Provided that in the case of whole time workers employed by the week or longer period, where the number of hours customarily worked per week in the Establishment agreed between the employer and worker is less than 48;

(i) the weekly wage payable and applicable shall be not less than that set out above;

(ii) the weekly wage payable and applicable shall be subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours of employment is less than the number customarily worked in the Establishment:

(iii) the weekly wage payable and applicable shall be subject to a proportionate increase according as the number of hours of employment up to 48 (not being hours to which overtime rates are applicable as set out in Part III below) is greater than the number customarily worked in the Establishment.

Note.—Proviso (b) does not apply in cases where the number of hours worked per week in the Establishment is less than 48 by reason of systematic short time being worked.

PART III.

ProposedProposed Overtime RatesandVariation of Overtime Rates for Male and Female Apprentices in the Cigar Section of the Trade.

Section I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the Normal Number of Hours of Work in the Trade to be as follows:

In any week On any week-day (other than Saturday) .. • • • On Saturday ...

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

Section II.—The Trade Board propose that the Minimum Rates for Overtime to apply to Male and Female Apprentices in the Cigar Section of the Trade, whether engaged on Time-Work or on Piece-Work in respect of hours worked by the Apprentice in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows:

(1) For the First Two Hours' Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable.

(2) For Overtime after the First Two Hours of Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be Oneand-a-Half times the Minimum Rate other-

wise applicable.
(3) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the Mini-

mum Rate otherwise applicable.

(4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 of this Section.

The Overtime Rate shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds nine, or in the case of Saturday exceeds five, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

Provided that:-

Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on five days a week, the Overtime Rates shall only be payable on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.

Note.—The hours which Female Workers, Young Persons and Children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART IV.

For the purpose of the application of the Minimum Rates of Wages set out in Part I. of this Schedule, an Apprentice is defined as a worker who:—

(a) Is employed during the whole of his or her time in accordance with the provisions of this Schedule under an Indenture (duly stamped) for a period of five years in the form prescribed by the Trade Board as set out in Part V. of this Schedule; and

(b) Has been registered with the Trade Board in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made an application for such registration, which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration.

Provided that the registration may be cancelled if the other conditions of apprenticeship are not complied with; and

- (c) Is employed under conditions where the employment of Apprentices is limited as follows:
 - (a) In the case of Apprentices to Cigar Making: One Apprentice to every three Journeyworkers who have been in the Service of the employer as Cigar Makers throughout the period of 6 months prior to the date of Application for Registration.
 - (b) In the case of Apprentices to Cigar Sorting and/or Bundling:
 - 1 Apprentice to not less than 5 Journeyworkers in the service of the employer as Cigar Sorters and/or Bundlers, throughout the period of 6 months prior to the date of Application for Registration.
 - 2 Apprentices to 7 such Journey-workers.
 - 3 Apprentices to 14 such Journey-workers,
 - 4 Apprentices to 20 such Journey-workers.

And thereafter one additional Apprentice may be employed for every additional 5 such Journeyworkers.

PART V.

Form of Indenture of Apprenticeship.

The form of Indenture of Apprenticeship referred to in paragraph (a) of Part IV. of this Schedule is as follows:—

This Indenture made the day of between of a minor of the age of years (hereinafter called the "Apprentice") of the first

after called the "Apprentice" of the first part, of the parent or guardian of the Apprentice (hereinafter called the "Guardian") of the second part, and of (hereinafter called the "Employer") of the third part:

Witnesseth that it is hereby mutually covenanted, declared and agreed as follows:

1. The Guardian hereby with the consent of the Apprentice puts and places the Apprentice and the Apprentice hereby with the consent of the Guardian freely and voluntarily puts places and binds self as Apprentice to the Employer to learn the art of* upon the terms and conditions following, that is to say:—

2. The term of service shall be five years from the day of 19, unless determined as hereinafter mentioned.

3. The Employer shall pay to the Apprentice every week during the said term wages in accordance with the appropriate scale of wages as fixed and as varied from time to time for Apprentices by the Tobacco Trade Board (Great Britain).

4. The Apprentice shall during the said term diligently apply self to the work given to to do and shall faithfully serve the Employer and keep all his secrets and obey all the lawful commands of the Employer and shall not do any damage to the Employer's property or business or waste spoil or destroy lend or dispose of his goods or property or absent self from work without the previous consent of the Employer but shall in all things conduct with propriety, diligence and sobriety as a good and faithful Apprentice towards the Employer.

5. The Employer shall during the said term unless determined as hereinafter mentioned provided the Apprentice shall properly conduct self and perform and observe the covenants, terms and conditions herein contained, use his best endeavours to teach and instruct or cause the Apprentice to be taught and instructed in the said art of as practised by the said Employer

at his said establishment.

6. The Employer shall supply the Apprentice forthwith upon the execution of these presents a true copy of this Indenture.

7. Where in the opinion of the Employer the work performed by the Apprentice is unsatisfactory it shall be returned to h for alteration and the minimum rates applicable under the Determinations of the Tobacco Trade Board (Great Britain) shall not be payable in respect of such work. Provided that where work is accepted by or on behalf of the employer it shall be paid for at the appropriate minimum rates as fixed by the Trade Board and made effective under the Trade Boards Acts.

8. In consideration of the premises the Guardian covenants and agrees with the Employer that the Apprentice shall honestly and diligently serve the Employer as his

Apprentice during the term aforesaid, and perform and observe the terms and conditions, covenants, provisos and agreements on the part of the Apprentice herein contained, and that h Guardian, h Executors or Administrators will at h or their own expense find and provide the Apprentice with good and sufficient board, lodging, clothing, washing and medical attendance, and all other necessaries during the said term.

9. Should the Apprentice be incapacitated by illness or other cause (save as hereinafter mentioned) from attending to h duties during any portion of the said term exceeding one week at any one time the period of such incapacity shall not be reckoned in the period of years, but shall be made good and served in addition thereto, and the expression "the said term" whenever herein appearing shall be deemed if the context requires or admits it to include such additional period.

10. In case the Apprentice shall during the said term commit any breach of the provisions of the fourth clause hereof, or be guilty of any insubordination or of misconduct, or, being a female, shall contract matrimony during the said term, or in case

Guardian or any other persons with whom shall reside, shall, while shall be residing with them, sell or deal in or be interested in tobacco without the consent in writing of the Employer, or, if the Apprentice shall carry on or be concerned or interested in or about any business, trade or occupation other than that of the Employer, without the like consent, it shall be lawful for the Employer, without notice, to determine and put an end to the Apprenticeship hereby created, and to dismiss the Apprentice forthwith without making any payment in lieu of Notice, and thereupon the said Apprenticeship shall cease and determine.

receipt of the potatoes, and shall not dispose of the potatoes except with the permission of the Minister or of an Inspector of the Ministry

(2) The declaration required by this Article

- (a) In the case of seed potatoes of an approved immune variety:—A declaration signed by, or on behalf of, the consignor or the person by me the potatoes are brought into England or Wales, correctly stating the serial number the certificate of purity issued in respect of the relative growing crop by the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland; or
- (b) In the case of other seed potatoes (i.e., including potatoes of approved immune varieties from crops in respect of which certificates of purity have not been issued):

A declaration signed by, or on behalf of, the consignor or the person by whom the potatoes are brought into England or Wales, correctly stating the reference number allotted by the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland to the certificate, issued not more than nine months prior to the date of importation, in respect of the locality in which the potatoes were grown to the effect that, so far as the Department are aware, Wart Disease has not occurred therein.

Production of Declarations and Information to be given.

3. Every person who has or has had in his possession or under his charge, and every person who as auctioneer, salesman, or otherwise has sold or offered for sale, any seed potatoes grown in Ireland shall, if so required in writing by the Minister or an Inspector, give the Minister or the Inspector, as the case may be, all such information as he possesses as to the persons in whose possession or under whose charge they are or have been, and shall produce for examination by an Inspector the declaration (if any) in his possession prescribed by Article 2 of this Order relating to the potatoes and any records or invoices relating to the sale or purchase of potatoes; provided that any information given under this Article shall not be available as evidence against the person giving the same in any prosecution under this Order, except in respect of an alleged failure to comply with this Article.

Powers of Entry.

4. An Inspector, upon production if so required of his appointment, may for the purpose of enforcing this Order enter any land and any premises and examine any potatoes thereon.

Offences.

5. Every person shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, who does any act in contravention of this Order, or fails to do any act which, by this Order or any notice served on him under this Order, he is required to do.

Definitions.

6. In this Order:—
"Minister" and "Ministry" mean the Minister and Ministry of Agriculture and

"Inspector" means, where context permits, an Inspector of the Ministry or an Inspector appointed by the Local Authority and approved by the Minister.
