MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS VARIED) FOR FEMALE: WORKERS IN THE LAUNDRY TRADE IN GREAT BRITAIN (EXCLUDING THE ADMINIS-TRATIVE COUNTY OF CORNWALL AND THE ORKNEY AND SHETLAND ISLANDS)

Effective as from 30th May, 1921.\*

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for that branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Laundry) Order, 1919, as Varied by the Trade Boards (Women's Clothing) Order, 1919, the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920, and the Trade Boards (Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods) Order, 1920, having given due notice on 4th November, 1920, of Proposal to

Vary the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piecework Basis Time-Rates, Guaranteed Time-Rates for Piece-workers, and Overtime Rates for Female Workers as set out in their Notice W. (5), also dated 4th November, 1920, hereby give notice, that they have Varied the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-work Basis Time-Rates, Guaranteed Time-Rates for Pieceworkers and Overtime Rates in their application to Female Workers other than female workers employed in the Administrative County of Cornwall and in the Orkney and Shetland Islands, the Minimum Rates of Wages as Varied being as shown in the Schedule set out below, which is incorporated here- $\mathbf{with}.$ 

The Trade Board further give notice, that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order, dated 27th May, 1921, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Minimum Rates as Varied by the Trade Board, and specifying 30th May, 1921,\* as the date from which such rates shall become effective.

\* Note.—Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 5th June, 1921.

## SCHEDULE.

Minimum Rates of Wages (as Varied) for Female Workers in the Laundry Trade in Great Britain (excluding the Administrative County of Cornwall and the Orkney and Shetland Islands).

## PART I.

Female Workers other than those Specified in Part II of this Schedule.

SECTION I .- General Minimum Time-Rates.

Workers under 15 years of age, 13s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., 3½d. per hour.

Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, 17s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., 4½d. per hour.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, 21s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., 5½d. per hour.

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, 26s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., 6½d. per hour.

Workers of 18 years of age and over, 32s.

Workers of 18 years of age and over, 32s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., 8d. per hour.

Provided that:

(a) The Minimum Rate for Workers of 16 and under 18 years of age who have had less than six months' experience in the laundering of articles of any description or the processes and operations incidental thereto in any laundry which is carried on by way of trade or for the purpose of gain or which is carried on as ancillary to another business shall be:

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, 17s. per week of 48 hours, i.e.,  $4\frac{1}{4}$ d. per hour. Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, 22s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., 5½d. per hour.

(b) The Minimum Rate for Workers of 18 years of age and over who have had less than 12 months' experience in the branches of trade specified in paragraph (a) above shall be:

During the period of employment required to complete the 1st six months of such experience, 26s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., 6½d. per hour.

During the period of employment required to complete the 2nd six months of such experi-
