Messina, Ostob. r. N. S. This morning arrived here the Canterbury, with 4 other English Men of War, under the Command of Capt. Lake, in 23 days from Cadia; and having frop'd only to Water, proceeded this evening on their Voyage towards the Levant. The Anne Galley, Capt. Crem r, is arrived here from Seanderoon, in Company of 3. Dutch Ships, the Golden Rock from Scanderson, and the Fame and Concord from Smirna: Capt. Breom, Commander of the Philip and Mary Privateer, is come into this Port, from cruifing in the Levant, where he has taken several French Prizes. They write from Malta, that two French Men of War were feen lately cruifing off that Port.

Milan, Ostob. 27. On the 21th Instant died here

Turin, Offob. 28. The German Forces having received the first Payment for their Winter-Quarters, and Security given for the Remainder, are now marching in small Bodies out of the Milaneze: The French march from their Camp at Gandia in the same Proportions, and by the 7th of the next month all their Troops will have left the Milaneze; part of the Horse are to go to Winter-Quarters in Lorraine, and another part in Champagne. The French work still on the Demolishing of Pignerol; but at the same time are going to build another Fortress not far from thence, to awe the Duke of Savoy. Several Expresses are arrived here within these 3 or 4 days, with Advice of the March of a great Body of Tartars (some report their number to be 30000) towards the Frontiers of this Kingdom; and the last Letters said, they were advanced within 8 Leagues of the City of Lemberg; which occasioned a great Alarm in those Parts: Our Troops quartered thereabouts had been engaged in Skirmithes with some of the Enemy's Parties, and had taken about 100 Pris foners, and feveral Horses; but they were nor strong enough to make a Stand against their Main Body: And Orders have been hereupon fent, to draw a greater Force together, to oppose them. We have an Account from Lithuania, that part of the Forces of that Dutchy had confederated together against the Prince Sapiha, their General; who has aisembled 2000 Horse and Dragoons, to bring them

Vicinia, O seb. 51. Ine Letters from Hingary fpeak now of nothing elfe but the marching of the Treops to their Winter-Quarters; and confirm the Grand Viller's Return towards Asirianople. The German Forces that are coming back from Italy, will have Winter-Quarters effigued them in the Emperor's Hereditary Countries; and the next Summer part of them will be employed on the Rhine, and the rest in Hungary. The Envoy of Messen residing ar this Court, having made Overtures for a new Alliance between the Emperor, the Czar, and the Republick of Venice, against the Turks, His Imperial Majesty has appointed Commissioners to treat with him; and the Venetian Ambatlador has received a Power and Instru-Ctions for the same purpose. The last Letters from Effeck fay, that the Governor of Brod had fent out a Party of Hussars, who had made an Incursion into the Turkish Territories, and brought back a good Booty. The Imperialists have Thoughts of re-fortifying Moravitz, which was lately taken and demolished by the Enemy.

Francfort, Novemb. 7. Prince Lewis of Baden intends to go fuddenly to Vienna, to concert at that Court the Preparations for the next Cimpagne: And we are assured that the States of Franconia and Suabia intend to augment their Forces. The Wineer-Quarters between the Hessien and Palatin

Troops are not yet quite setled.

Hamburgh, Novemb. 9. The Conferences are continued about the Differences between Denmark and Holstein; and one of the main Points that employs the Ministers at present, is, to adjust the Dispute concerning the Helftein Troops that ferved on the Rhine this Summer, and are now returning home, and which the Danes will not allow to Winter in Holftein. Several Expedients have been proposed by the Mediators, butnone is yet agreed

Paris, Novimb. 9. The French King returned the 5th Instant to Fontain bleau, with the Princess of Savey, now called Durchess of Burgundy, whom he met the day before at Montangis. The Letters from the French Camp at Candia, in the Milaneze, of the 31th paft, tell us, that the March of the Tro-ps had been delayed for feveral days, by reafin of fome Difficulties arifog in the Buffiness of the Winreafin of some Difficulties arisen in the Business of the Winter-Quarters; but the same being adjusted, the force were marching off on both ides. They continue to fit out at Bress the Squadron to be commanded by the Sicur de Points. We have yet no News from Monsieur de Chassenaut. The Mareschals de Villerey and Boussers are daily expected from Flanders; and the Mareschal de Choiseul, from Germany.
