PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section (7) of section eighteen of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as the Act), that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, declare that the holders of the offices in the Executive of Northern Ireland named in the Order shall not be disqualified for being members of the Senate or House of Commons of Northern Ireland by reason of holding office under the Crown:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Parliament of Northern Ireland (Disqualification Removal) Order, 1921.

2. The holders for the time being of the offices in the Executive of Northern Ireland specified in the Schedule to this Order shall not be disqualified for being elected to, being, or sitting or voting as members of, the Senate of Northern Ireland or the House of Commons of Northern Ireland by reason of holding office under the Crown.

The office of Minister of Northern Ireland.

Any office, by whatever title designated, the holding whereof constitutes the holder a Minister of Northern Ireland by virtue of sub-section (4) of section eight of the Act.

The office of Parliamentary Secretary or Assistant Parliamentary Secretary of any department of the Government of Northern Ireland.

The office of Attorney-General for Northern Ireland.
