Warfaw, October 26. N. S.

HE Baron Scarlati, Envoy Extraordinary from the Elector of Bavaria, arrived here the 24th in the Evening; The Queen lent one of her own Coaches to meet him, and gave him prefently a private Audience, and a publick one this morning; To the latter he was Conducted by the Captain of the Queen's Guards, and 20 Halbardiers, called Trabanti, with all other marks of Esteem and Respect, as well for his Person as Character. The Frontiers of this Kingdom, about Lembergh, are very much allarmed by the March of a great Body of Tatars, who, it's feared, will do much Mischief, before a sufficient Force

can be got together to oppose them.

Vienna, Octob. 31. Prince Lewis of Baden is shortly expected here from Germany, and General Caprara from Hungary 5 when a great Council of War will be held at this Court. to take fitting Resolutions concerning the Preparations to be made for the next Year. The Elector of Saxony continues still here; and tis discoursed, That he will affish the Emperor with a further number of his Forces against the next Campaign. The last Advices from the Frontiers say, The Turkish Troops are all gone to their Winter-Quarters, having left throng Garitons at Belgrade and Temeswaer; The Troops that lay near the last of these places, being design'd, as 'twas thought, to make an Inroad into Transilvania, are likewise separated; part have repassed the Danube, and the rest have taken their Quarters on the other side of that We have an account from Croatia, That the Parties which are frequently fent out by the Governor of that Country, do very much annoy the Enemy; and that they are now making Preparations for a confiderable Expedition.

Pembröke, November 6. On the 3d instant filed out of this Port His Majesty's Ships the liers, with their Convoy.

Lincoln, Play Prize, St. Malo, and Smirna Morchant, having under their Convoy the Merchant Ships that lately arrived here from Barbadoes, with divers other Vessels bound to Lordon, and other Ports. The 4th came in a Sloop belonging to Pensilvania, Iaden with To-bacco from Virginia; and this Evening arri-ved here His Majesty's Ship the Chester, from Plimouth.

Filmouth, November 7. On the 2d instant arrived here the Hudsons-Bay-Frigat, Nicholas Smithfeild Commander, from Hudfins Bay; she came out in Company of the Bonadventure, Seaford, and Dering, but was foon after separated from them in bad Weather. The 4th came in the Great Ruffell-Galley, bound to the Streights. Yesterday about 30 sail of Ships were feen off this place, plying to windward, the Wind at South-West. This morning sailed the Jolly, and Ruffell Galley; and in the afternoon about 70 fail appeared in the Offing, standing to the Eastward; which we believe to be the Fleet from Milford.

Plimeuth, November 8. On the 4th came in here a Dutch Ship from the East Indies, taken by the French, and retaken by a Guernsey-Privateer. Yesterday the Germoon brought in a small French Prize laden with Wine and Brandy; and this day arrived here His Maefty's Ship the Lincoln, with divers Merchant-

There has been Presented to His Majesty an Address of the President, Council and General Affembly of Barbadoes, in behalf of themselves and the rest of the Inhabitants of that Island; wherein they declare, That as they have already fincerely and unanimously subscribed the Association, for Defence of His Majesty's Royal Person and Government against all His Majesty's Enemies at home and abroad, so they deem it their further indispensable Duty by this their hearty Address, to Congratulate his Majesty's wonderful and happy Deliverance from the most barbarous and bloody Assaffination lately defigned of His Royal Person, by Execrable Villains and Monsters of Mankind, who are the Dishonor of the present, and will be the Horror and Detestation of suture Ages. And pray that the good Providence of God, which has so often covered His Royal Head in days of Battle, and has disappointed the dark and secret Plots of his Enemies, will still preserve His Majesty from all their wicked Defigns, for the Good and Comfort of his own Subjects, and all the Protestant Interest in Eurepe, of whole Deliverance from Popery and French Tyranny his Majesty has been the happy and glorious Instrument; and that His Majesty's Life may be long, and Succels and Vi-· Ctory may ever attend all His Royal Undertakings. A very Loyal Address has been likewife prefented to His Majesty on the same occasion, from the Grand Jury of the Island of Barbadoes.
