2. Article 2 of the Census Order, 1920, shall be read as though the 19th day of June, 1921, were therein substituted for the 24th day of April, 1921.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Oriel College, Oxford, on the 26th day of May, 1921, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877."

A STATUTE to amend certain Statutes made by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 (40 and 41 Vict., c. 48), and approved by the Queen in Council on the 3rd day of May, 1882, in relation to Oriel College, in the University of Oxford (as amended by a Statute made by the Provost and Fellows of the said College on the 18th day of April, 1884, and approved by the Queen in Council on the 27th day of January, 1885, as further amended by a Statute made by the Provost and Fellows of the said College on the 25th day of April, 1917, and approved by the King in Council on the 16th day of January, 1918, and as further amended by a Statute made by the Provost and Fellows of the said College on the 12th day of November, 1919, and approved by the King in Council on the 13th day of August, 1920), duly made at a General Meeting of the said Provost and Fellows, specially summoned for the purpose, held on the 26th day of May, 1921, and passed at such meeting by the votes of two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, and submitted to His Majesty the King in Council.

Whereas by Statute III, 17, as made by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and approved by the Queen in Council on the 3rd day of May, 1882, in relation to Oriel College, in the University of Oxford (as amended by a Statute made by the Provost and Fellows of the said College on the 18th day of April, 1884, and approved by the Queen in Council on the 27th day of January, 1885, as further amended by a Statute made by the Provost and Fellows of the said College on the 25th day of April, 1917, and approved by the King in Council on the 16th day of January, 1918, and as further amended by a Statute made by the Provost and Fellows of the said College on the 12th day of November, 1919, and approved by the King in Council on the 13th day of August, 1920), it was enacted as follows:—

" 17. Each Ordinary Fellow shall be entitled to receive the annual stipend of £200 out of the Corporate Revenues, clear of Income Tax as hereinafter provided, but inclusive of all allowances save as hereinafter mentioned "

And whereas by Statute III, 22, as made by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and approved by the Queen in Council on the 3rd day of May, 1882, in relation to Oriel College, in the University of Oxford, it was enacted as follows:—

" 22. Any Ordinary Fellow who shall vacate his Fellowship under Clause 18 or Clause 19 may, nevertheless, if he shall then be qualified for election under Clause 21, be re-elected to his Fellowship in the manner and under the conditions specified in that clause; and any person who shall have been elected under Clause 21, or re-elected under this clause, shall be capable of re-election from time to time in like manner: Provided that the whole number of persons holding Fellowships under the powers conferred by this and the last preceding clause, or either of them, shall not exceed three at any one time "

And whereas the Provost and Fellows are of opinion that it is desirable to amend the said Statutes in manner hereinafter appearing:

We, the said Provost and Fellows of the said College do hereby, in exercise of the powers given to us by the 54th Section of the said Act, alter Statute III, 17, by substituting for the existing clause the following clause:—

" 17. Each Ordinary Fellow shall be entitled to receive out of the Corporate Revenues clear of Income Tax as hereinafter provided, but inclusive of all allowances save as hereinafter mentioned, such annual stipend, being not less than £200 and not more than £300, as the Provost and Fellows may, from time to time, determine,"

and Statute III, 22, by substituting for the word " three " the word " five," and by adding at the end the words " exclusive of persons employed in educational work in the College."

The following Addresses were presented to the King on Monday, the 6th instant, on the occasion of the opening by His Majesty of Southwark Bridge:—

**CITY OF LONDON.**

To  
THEIR MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTIES THE  
KING AND QUEEN.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTIES,

We, Your Majesties' most dutiful and loyal subjects, the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Commons of the City of London in Common Council assembled, desire to offer to Your Majesties an expression of our devotion to Your Royal House, and our heartfelt gratitude for Your so graciously consenting to attend here to-day to open this Bridge.

The deep interest which Your Majesties have ever taken in all that tends to the improvement of the Metropolis, and the anxious solicitude with which Your Majesties have watched over the prosperity of this City, render Your Majesties' visit amongst us on this occasion especially welcome and appropriate, whilst this day's proceedings furnish yet another example of the historical connection which our City has always had with the Sovereigns of this Realm.

The old Southwark Bridge, which the present Bridge replaces, was built by a private Company, and opened in 1819 under the toll system, and laboured under a handicap of heavy gradients. In the year 1864 the Bridge was opened toll free in return for a money payment made by the Corporation to the Company, and in 1867 the Corporation purchased the Bridge from the Company for the sum of £200,000.

The chief features of the new Bridge are:—

The easier gradient, which on the City Approach has been reduced from an average of about 1 foot in 22 to an average of about 1 foot in 40.

Five arches in place of three, bringing Southwark into alignment with London and Blackfriars Bridges, and so improving the navigation of the River.

The lowering of the crown of the Bridge some 7 feet.

The increase in the width of the Bridge from 42 feet to 55 feet.

The erection of the Bridge has cost the sum of £375,000, the whole of which large amount has been provided by the Bridge House Estates Committee of the Corporation out of the funds under their care and management, and without any cost to the ratepayers.

We trust that this improvement will relieve existing congestion, and that the traffic of the Metropolis will be greatly facilitated by means of the new Bridge.

In conclusion, we devoutly pray that Your Majesties, secure in the affection of Your people, may long be spared to preside over the destinies of this great Empire.

*To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious answer:—*

I thank you very sincerely for your loyal and dutiful Address, and for the hearty welcome with which you have greeted the Queen and myself.

It gives me much pleasure to be here to-day for the purpose of opening the new Southwark Bridge. I set great value upon that historic connection between the Throne and the City to which your Address makes reference, and the welfare and prosperity of the citizens of London are, and always will be, very near to my heart.

The purpose for which we are now met is one which bears very directly upon the welfare of London. It has been said that civilisation is communications, and anyone who helps to render traffic between the City and the rest of the Metropolitan area easier and quicker confers a benefit not only upon his fellow citizens, but upon the trade of the Kingdom and the Empire. Nowhere in the world is there a traffic problem equal in difficulty and importance to that which is presented by the site and construction of the City of London and the necessities of its work.

Every day more than a million of people have to be brought into this famous square mile and taken out of it again, and provision must be made for an immense circulation of goods between warehouses, factories and railway stations. One of the chief difficulties in the smooth working of this huge traffic is the division of London into two parts by the Thames. This would have appeared a strange paradox to our ancestors. For many centuries they could rest content with one bridge because they regarded the river not as a barrier, but as the main highway of the City. The gradual increase in the number of the Thames bridges is the most conspicuous mark of that process of evolution which has changed the complete and self-contained City of former centuries into what it is to-day, the heart and brain of a vast organism extending over hundreds of square miles.

I have heard with interest that the new Southwark Bridge, like the other bridges within the City, has been provided by the Bridge House Estates Committee of the Corporation, and that its whole cost has been met from their funds. The bridge is not only a contribution of high value towards the solution of that traffic problem of which I spoke just now, but also a noteworthy addition to the architectural features of the City. I feel that the City of London and the whole Metropolitan area must recognise a deep and lasting obligation to the generosity and public spirit of the ancient benefactors who laid the foundations of the Bridge House Estates Fund and to the prudent and far-sighted administration which has used the Fund to such good purposes.

We, your Majesty's most loyal and dutiful subjects The Mayor, Aldermen and Councillors of the Metropolitan Borough of Southwark, humbly approach your Majesty with the dutiful homage of ourselves and the community we represent and desire to express the great gratification with which your Majesty's visit to our ancient and historic Borough is regarded by the inhabitants.

We gladly avail ourselves of this great privilege of welcoming your Majesty and your Royal Consort on this the third visit to our Borough since your Majesty's accession to the throne of this Realm.

We recall with gratification the fact that Southwark has been greatly honoured in the past by its associations with the doings and destinies of the Sovereigns of this realm.

James I. of Scotland (the Poet King) was married at the Cathedral Church to Joan, niece of Cardinal Beaufort. At our local Church of St. George the Martyr, King Henry V. sought the Divine Blessing when setting out for his victorious campaigns in France, and it was also within our ancient Borough that your Royal namesake His Majesty King George I. was received upon his accession to the British Throne. Many of us still remember with pride the visits to our Borough of your Majesty's illustrious Father, King Edward VII. and revered Grandmother, Queen Victoria, of blessed memory, both of whom graciously received from our predecessors in the Council similar tributes of respect to that which we now offer to your Majesty.

It is a matter of great satisfaction to our inhabitants that your Majesty has once more evinced your deep interest in all that concerns the welfare of your subjects by your presence in our midst to-day for the purpose of opening the new Bridge on the site of Southwark Bridge as another means of facilitating industrial, commercial and personal intercourse between your Majesty's subjects south of the Thames and the capital City of the Empire.

We humbly commend your Majesty and your Royal Consort to that Divine Providence which watches over the destinies of Sovereign and subject alike, and we earnestly pray that your Majesty may long be spared to rule over this great Empire to the promotion of the best interests of which your Majesty's efforts have ever been directed.

I thank you for your loyal Address, and I am grateful for your prayers and good wishes. I am touched by your reference to My Father and Grandmother, and I am glad to learn that you retain so vivid a recollection of their visits. I recall with pleasure my own previous visits to your ancient Borough at the beginning of My reign, and it is a great satisfaction to Me to be with you again to-day on the occasion of a ceremony which is of so much interest and importance, both to the whole Metropolitan area, and more particularly to the people of Southwark.

We can all understand and sympathise with that pride in your long and honourable municipal history which breathes through your Address. Southwark was the earliest offshoot thrown out by the original City, the first step in that vast process of expansion which has caused London to overflow its Roman walls for miles on every side. It owed its beginning and its early celebrity to its position at the head of the Bridge which connected London with the South of England and the Continent of Europe. From those early times until to-day its communications with the City have been, and still are, of the first importance to its civic and commercial life.

In olden times Southwark was an accepted scene of State ceremonial and splendour, and it still retains, in the changed circumstances of to-day, its own importance in the life of modern London. The growth of its commerce and the character of its industry make adequate intercourse with the City and with London north of the Thames of vital interest to its citizens. It is My earnest hope that the new Southwark Bridge may fulfil its object of facilitating traffic between your Borough and its northern neighbours, and may foster and increase its trade and prosperity.

We, your Majesties' loyal and devoted subjects, the Corporation of Wardens of the Parish of St. Saviour, Southwark, crave leave to humbly offer to your Majesties our heartfelt greetings and cordial welcome on the occasion of your progress through our ancient parish in connection with the re-opening of Southwark Bridge to the convenient use and advantage of your people.

It may please Your Majesties to be reminded that the Monks of Southwark were the builders of London Bridge, in the immediate vicinity, in the tenth century.

We are proud of the ancient and ecclesiastical character of our Corporation, which originated in Letters Patent granted by His Majesty King Henry VI., in the twenty-seventh year of his reign, to certain of our parishioners, for the formation of a corporate body of Wardens as a perpetual guild or fraternity in honour of the assumption of the Virgin Mary, their duties amongst others being the care of the Collegiate Church of St. Saviour (the Cathedral of to-day), which, with its history of a thousand years, has been described as the finest mediæval building in London after Westminster Abbey.

We also remember with pride the many associations of England's Royal House with Southwark, but particularly we recollect with profound gratitude the interest displayed by the late King Edward VII. and the well-beloved Queen Alexandra in the elevation of our Church to the dignity of a Cathedral, their presence at the dedication ceremony giving great satisfaction to the dwellers in this portion of the great Metropolis of the Empire over which you exercise beneficent sway.

The rich legacy of literary fame to which this neighbourhood is heir is well known to your Majesties, but may we be permitted to mention our connection with the great cause of education which your Majesties have so closely at heart; Dulwich College and the great University of America being erected upon foundations laid three centuries ago, respectively, by Edward Alleyn and John Harvard, both of this parish.

May we also be permitted to remind your Majesties that the Bible declared by the great and good Queen Victoria to be the secret of England's greatness, was first issued in our language in this country from the press of a Southwark printer in the Hospital of St.

Thomas, which, founded here by our pious churchmen, flourishes to-day in the great institution opposite to the Houses of Parliament.

We are glad of this occasion to declare our unswerving loyalty to your Throne, and we pray that a settled peace within the Empire and the World at large for many years to come may afford to your Majesties joy and happiness through a long and prosperous reign.

The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than two o'clock (Saturday twelve o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 26 of the Finance Act, 1915, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

#### EXPLOSIVE SUBSTANCES ORDER (No. 2), 1921.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 17 of the Emergency Regulations (No. 3), 1921, I hereby order as follows:—

1. A person having in his possession any explosive substance shall keep the same in a secure place approved by the Chief Constable, and shall, if so required by the Chief Constable, remove all or any part of such explosive substance to any place specified by such Chief Constable.

2. This Order shall apply to the County of Warwick, including the Boroughs situated within that County.

3. This Order shall not apply to small-arms ammunition except where notice that it applies

is given to the person having the ammunition in his possession by the Chief Constable.

4. This Order may be cited as the Explosive Substances Order (No. 2), 1921.

DESTRUCTIVE INSECTS AND PESTS ORDER OF  
1921.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, orders as follows:—

*Commencement.*

1. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of October, nineteen hundred and twenty-one.

*Definitions.*

2. In this Order:—“The Minister” means the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries; “Inspector” means an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries; and the expression “plant” shall, where the context permits, include tree and shrub, and the fruit, seeds, tubers, bulbs, layers, cuttings or other parts of a plant.

*Restriction on Importation of Plants.*

- 3.—(1) The landing in England or Wales from any country, other than Scotland, Ireland and the Channel Islands, of any of the plants mentioned in the First Schedule of this Order is prohibited unless each package or consignment thereof has attached thereto, or is accompanied by, a copy certificate as set out in paragraph 2 (a) of the Third Schedule hereto.

- (2) The importer of any plant the landing of which is regulated by this Article shall comply with the Regulations set out in the Third Schedule hereto.

- (3.) This Article shall not apply to any plant the landing of which is authorised by a general licence issued by the Minister or by a special licence issued by an Inspector, or to a consignment of a plant to the Minister for experimental or scientific purposes.

*Powers of Entry.*

4. An Inspector may, upon production if so required of his appointment or authority, enter any premises and examine any plant on such premises which has been landed in England or Wales from any country except as aforesaid, or on which he has reason to believe that an insect or pest mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Order exists or has recently existed.

*Precautions to be adopted in case of Disease.*

- 5.—(1) An Inspector may at any time and from time to time by a Notice served on the occupier of premises on which he has reason to believe that there is any plant attacked with any insect or pest mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Order, require him to adopt such measures for prevention of the spread of the insect or pest as are specified in the Notice.

- (2) A Notice under this Article may prescribe the time within which the adoption of any measure thereby prescribed shall be completed.

*Power to deal with living specimens of Insects or Pests.*

6. No person shall land, sell, or offer for sale a living specimen of any insect or pest mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Order, except with the written permission of the Minister, and an Inspector may, by a Notice served on any person having in his possession or under his charge any such living specimen, require him to adopt such measures for the prevention of the spread of the insect or pest as are specified in the Notice.

*Service of Notices, etc.*

- 7.—(1) For the purpose of this Order a Notice shall be deemed to be served on any person if it is delivered to him personally or left for him at his last known place of abode or business or sent through the post in a letter addressed to him there; and a Notice purporting to be signed by an Inspector shall be *prima facie* evidence that it was signed by him.

- (2) A copy of every Notice served and of every special licence issued under this Order shall be sent to the Minister by the Inspector by whom the Notice or special licence is signed.

*Information to be given as to Diseased Plants or parts thereof.*

8. Every person who has or has had in his possession or under his charge any plant which is attacked by any insect or pest mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Order, and every person who as auctioneer, salesman, or otherwise has sold or offered for sale any such plant shall, if so required in writing by the Minister or an Inspector, give to the Minister or Inspector all such information as he possesses as to the persons in whose possession or under whose charge the plant is or has been; provided that any information given under this Article shall not be available as evidence against the person giving the same in any prosecution under this Order, except in respect of an alleged failure to comply with this Article.

*Offences.*

9.—(1) Every person shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, who does any act in contravention of this Order or the Regulations in the Third Schedule to this Order or any Notice served on him under this Order, or fails to do any act which he is required to do by this Order or the said Regulations or any such Notice.

(2) This Article does not apply to the landing or attempted landing of anything in contravention of this Order, the penalty for which is provided by section one of the Destructive Insects Act, 1877, as amended by the Destructive Insects and Pests Act, 1907.

*Revocation of Orders.*

10. The Destructive Insects and Pests Order of 1910, the Destructive Insects and Pests Order of 1914, Article 9 of the American Gooseberry Mildew Order of 1919, and the American Gooseberry Mildew (Importation of Fruit) Order of 1919 are hereby revoked.

*Application of the Order.*

11. This Order shall apply to England and Wales.

*Short Title.*

12. This Order may be cited as the DESTRUCTIVE INSECTS AND PESTS ORDER OF 1921.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE IMPORTATION OF PLANTS, OR PARTS THEREOF, INTO ENGLAND AND WALES.

1. *Nature of Contents of Packages to be Declared.*

Each package must have attached thereto a label showing the exact nature of the plants, or parts thereof, contained in the package. This may be part of the copy certificate of inspection, if preferred.

2. *Inspection and Certification as a Condition of Entry.*

(a) In the case of an importation of plants, or parts thereof, from a country where a recognised service of plant inspection is maintained, each package must have attached thereto or be accompanied by a copy certificate issued at the time of packing, by a duly authorised official of the country from which it is exported, stating the date of inspection (which must be not more than thirty days prior to the date of shipment) and that the plants, or parts thereof, covered by the certificate have been thoroughly inspected by him or under his direction, and found, or believed to be, healthy and free from the injurious insects and pests mentioned in the Second Schedule to the Order. In the case of potatoes, other than "new potatoes," the copy certificate must also declare that Wart Disease has not occurred on the place where the potatoes were grown, nor within 500 yards thereof (approximately  $\frac{1}{2}$  kilometre). For the purpose of these Regulations the expression "new potatoes" means potatoes landed on or before the thirty-first day of July in the year in which they have been lifted. New potatoes must be accompanied by a declaration in writing by the exporter or importer thereof that they have been lifted in the current year.

An Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries may open and examine the contents of any package imported into England or Wales, notwithstanding the fact that the package may have attached thereto or be accompanied by the duly authorized copy certificate.

(b) In the case of an importation of plants, or parts thereof, from a country where no recognised service of plant inspection is maintained, and in the case of a package of plants, or parts thereof, to which a copy certificate as above mentioned is not attached, or which is not accompanied by such copy certificate, the

plants, or parts thereof, will be detained until they have been examined by an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, either at the port of entry or at a suitable place designated by the Inspector, and found to be healthy and free from the insects and pests mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Order.

Any imported plants, or parts thereof, which, on inspection, are found to be unhealthy or attacked by any insect or pest mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Order, and which, in the judgment of the Inspector, cannot be cleaned by disinfection or other treatment, shall, with the packing and package, either be destroyed or returned to the country of exportation by the importer thereof.

When disinfection or other treatment of the plants, or parts thereof, is allowed, it shall be carried out by the importer, and under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, either at the port of entry or at a suitable place designated by the Inspector, and no part of the consignment shall be delivered to the importer without the written consent of the Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries. All charges for storage, cartage and labour incident to inspection and disinfection, other than the services of the Inspector himself, shall be paid by the importer.

3. Exporters in foreign countries should send, at the time of issue, the original certificate together with particulars setting out the number of packages, nature of plants or parts thereof, name of vessel by which they are consigned, port of entry, and the approximate date of arrival at the port of entry, to the Horticulture Division, Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, 4, Whitehall Place, London, S.W. 1.

4. The restrictions on landing imposed by the Order and these Regulations do not apply to plants, or parts thereof, the landing of which is authorised by a general licence issued by the Minister or by a special licence issued by an Inspector, or to consignments of plants, or parts thereof, to the Minister for experimental or scientific purposes.

5. Plants or parts thereof will not be deemed to be healthy which are attacked by any insect or pest mentioned in the Schedule and the Note to the Sale of Diseased Plants Order of 1921.

*Note.*—Any Article landed in contravention of the Order is liable to forfeiture under the Customs Acts, and the offender is liable to the penalties imposed by those Acts on persons importing prohibited Articles.

SALE OF DISEASED PLANTS ORDER OF 1921.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Destructive Insects and Pests

Acts, 1877 and 1907, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, orders as follows:—

*Definitions.*

1. In this Order:—“The Minister” means the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries; “the Ministry” means the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries; and “Inspector” means an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries or of the Local Authority as the case may be.

The expression “Local Authority” means as regards any district the local authority for the district under, the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914.

The expression “plant” shall include tree and shrub, and the seeds, tubers, bulbs, layers, cuttings, or any other parts of a plant.

*Prohibition of Sale of Diseased Plants, &c.*

2. No person shall sell or offer for sale or cause to be sold or offered for sale for planting, any plant substantially attacked by any insect or pest mentioned in the Schedule to this Order.

*Information to be given as to Diseased Plants.*

3. Every person who has or has had in his possession or under his charge, and every person who as auctioneer, salesman, nurseryman, or otherwise has sold or offered for sale, any plant substantially attacked by any insect or pest mentioned in the Schedule to this Order, shall, if so required in writing by the Minister or by the Local Authority or by an Inspector, give the Minister or the Local Authority or the Inspector, as the case may be, all such information as he possesses as to the person in whose possession or under whose charge such plant is or has been; provided that any information given under this Article shall not be available as evidence against the person giving the same in any prosecution under this Order, except in respect of an alleged failure to comply with this Article.

*Powers of Entry.*

4. An Inspector may, upon production if so required of his appointment or authority, enter any premises on which he has reason to believe that an insect or pest mentioned in the Schedule to this Order exists or has recently existed, and examine any plant on such premises.

*Action to be taken to prevent Spread of Disease.*

5. Any auctioneer, salesman, nurseryman, or other person, on becoming acquainted or being informed by an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority, that he has in his possession or under his charge any plant substantially attacked by an insect or pest mentioned in the Schedule to this Order shall take steps to prevent the sale or movement of such plant except under the authority of an Inspector.

*Penalties.*

6. Every person shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, who—

(1) sells or offers for sale or causes to be sold or offered for sale for planting any plant

substantially attacked by any insect or pest mentioned in the Schedule to this Order; or

(2) fails to take such steps as are required under Article 5 of this Order, or fails to give information as required by Article 3; or

(3) wilfully obstructs or impedes any Inspector when acting under this Order.

*Notification of Order.*

7. This Order shall be published by the Local Authority in accordance with any direction given by the Minister.

*Application of the Order.*

8. This Order shall apply to England and Wales.

9. This Order may be cited as the SALE OF DISEASED PLANTS ORDER OF 1921.

10. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of October, 1921.
