The Home Secretary gives notice, that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment of women of 18 years of age and over in connection with the manufacture of margarine at the works of Messrs. Jurgens, Ltd., Purfleet, on two day-shifts, subject to the conditions that no worker shall be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; that suitable cloakroom and messroom accommodation shall be provided; and that the Secretary of State may at any time require the occupier to make such special arrangements for the conveyance of workers living at a distance or otherwise for the welfare of such workers as may be necessary to prevent hardship.

COAL MINES ACT.

THE SAFETY LAMPS ORDER OF THE 20TH APRIL, 1921.

In pursuance of Section 33 of the Coal Mines Act, 1911, (a) and of the Mining Industry Act, 1920, (b) the Board of Trade hereby make the following Order:—

1. The types of safety lamps named and described in Part I of the Schedule to this Order are approved, until further order, for use in all mines to which the Coal Mines Act, 1911, applies, subject to the conditions specified in the Schedule.

2. The Schedules to previous Orders made under Section 33 of the Coal Mines Act, 1911, shall take effect subject to the amendments set forth in Part II of the Schedule to this Order.

3. This Order may be cited as "The Safety Lamps Order of the 20th April, 1921."
