The Right Honourable David Alexander Edward the Earl of Crawford and Balcarres Chancellor of the Duchy and County Palatine of Lancaster with the advice and consent of Roger Bernard Lawrence Esquire, K.C. Vice-Chancellor of the said County Palatine of Lan-

caster and with the approval of the authority empowered to make Rules for the Supreme Court doth hereby in pursuance of the powers and authorities in that behalf given to him by the Chancery of Lancaster Acts 1850 to 1890 and in pursuance and execution of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf Order and Direct as follows:—

1. The fees and percentages prescribed by the Order as to Court Fees 1884 as amended by the Order as to Court Fees 1886 and the Order as to Court Fees 1920 shall be increased as follows:—

(a) The Court Fees for sealing a writ of summons for the commencement of an action or an originating summons shall be increased to One pound.

(b) All the other of such fees and percentages shall be increased by fifty per centum

and the said Orders as to Court fees shall accordingly be construed and take effect as if the said increased fees and percentages had been thereby fixed and appointed to be taken in the Court of Chancery of the County Palatine of Lancaster by the Registrars or other proper officers in money in lieu of the fees and percentages thereby prescribed.

2. This Order may be cited as "The Court Fees (Amendment) Order 1920," and shall come into operation on the first day of January 1921.

It is hereby certified under the Rules Publication Act 1893 that on account of urgency the Rules embodied in the above Order shall come into immediate operation and the said Rules shall come into operation on the first day of January 1921 as Provisional Rules.

TOY TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN). MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FIXED FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

*Effective as from 13th June, 1921.**

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Toy Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Toy) Order, 1920, having given due notice on the 6th November, 1920, of Proposal to Fix General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers, and to declare the Normal Number of Hours of Work in the Trade for the purpose of the application of the Overtime Rates, hereby give notice that they have Fixed General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers, and have declared the Normal Number of Hours of Work in the Trade for the purpose of the application of the Overtime Rates, and that the Minimum Rates of Wages as fixed and the declared Normal Number of Hours are as shewn in the Schedule set out below.

The Trade Board further give notice, that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order, dated 4th June, 1921, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Minimum Rates of Wages as fixed by the Trade Board, and specifying 13th June, 1921,* as the date from which such Minimum Rates of Wages shall become effective.

* NOTE.—Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in any case not later than 19th June, 1921.

Workers of 18 and under 19 years of age, 36s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 9d. per hour.

Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age, 44s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 11d. per hour.

Workers of 20 and under 21 years of age, 52s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 1s. 1d. per hour.

Workers of 21 years of age and over, 64s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 1s. 4d. per hour.

SECTION I (b).—*For Female Workers:*

Workers under 15 years of age, 12s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 3d. per hour.

Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, 16s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 4d. per hour.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, 20s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 5d. per hour.

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, 24s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 6d. per hour.

Workers of 18 and under 19 years of age, 30s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 7½d. per hour.

Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age, 31s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 7¾d. per hour.

Workers of 20 and under 21 years of age, 32s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 8d. per hour.

Workers of 21 years of age and over, 34s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 8½d. per hour.

Provided that a Male or Female Worker who enters the trade for the first time at the age of 16 years or over, whose employment is not of a casual, seasonal or temporary nature, and who cannot be suitably employed on piece-work, shall, until the expiry of two months' employment in the trade, be paid at a rate not less than three-quarters of the General Minimum Time-Rate which would otherwise be applicable under Section I (a) or I (b) above, according to his or her age.

SECTION II.—The General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Section I of this Part of this Notice for Workers under 21 years of age shall be payable subject to the proviso that such workers are employed under conditions which, in the circumstances of the case, offer a reasonable prospect of advancement to the General Minimum Time-Rate of 1s. 4d. per hour in the case of Male Workers and of 8¾d. per hour in

the case of Female Workers. Otherwise the General Minimum Time-Rate payable to workers under 21 years of age shall be 1s. 4d. per hour in the case of Male Workers and 8½d. per hour in the case of Female Workers, irrespective of age.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Section, this provision shall not operate in the case of workers whose employment is of a casual, seasonal or temporary nature.

PART II.

Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers employed on Time-Work.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board hereby declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any week	48
On any day other than Saturday	9	
On Saturday	5

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker employed on time-work in any branch of the Trade specified in Part III. of this Schedule in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows:—

For Male and Female Workers employed on Time-work:—

1. For the first two hours' overtime on any day except Saturday, Sunday or Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be one-and-a-quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, time-and-a-quarter.

2. For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all Overtime on Saturday, the Overtime Rate shall be one-and-a-half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, time-and-a-half.

3. For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, double-time.

4. For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48 the Overtime Rate shall be one-and-a-quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 of this Section.

Provided that:—

(a) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on 5 days a week, the Overtime Rate shall only be payable on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.

(b) Where a worker (*e.g.*, a worker of the Jewish Religion) is customarily employed on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime as set out above shall apply to such worker in like manner as if in the provisions of this part of this Notice as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday" and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."

NOTE.—The hours which female workers, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory

and Workshop Acts and to the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART III.

The above Minimum Rates shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male and Female Workers (including Homeworkers) in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Toy) Order, 1920; that is to say, the manufacture of articles intended for the amusement of children, including dolls, metal, wooden or other hard toys, soft toys, books made from textile materials, requisites for table games, bricks, blocks, puzzles, balls, Christmas crackers, Easter eggs, masks or drums,

including also—

(a) The assembling of parts of any of the above-mentioned articles;

(b) The operations of storing, boxing, packeting, labelling, or despatching, and all other warehousing or packing operations incidental to the manufacture of any of the above-mentioned articles;

but excluding—

(a) The manufacture of toys when carried on as a subsidiary branch of work in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of other articles, so as to form a common or interchangeable form of employment for the workers;

(b) The manufacture of sports requisites;

(c) The manufacture of toy perambulators, toy wheel barrows, toy scooters, nursery yachts, toy cycles, toy cars, toy horses, dolls' houses, or other similar toys when carried on as a subsidiary branch of work in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of perambulators, invalid carriages or folding push cars, so as to form a common or interchangeable form of employment for the workers;

(d) The manufacture from ceramic materials of dolls or dolls' parts, dolls' china, marbles or similar articles when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of other pottery;

(e) The making of articles from sugar confectionery;

(f) The making of hollow-ware, including boxes and canisters, from sheet iron, sheet steel or tinplate, or any operations incidental thereto.

PART IV.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be payable clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Health Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.

PART V.

Proposed Overtime Rates and Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates.

Overtime Rates calculated on the proposed Minimum Rates set out in Parts I, II, III and IV of this Schedule, in the manner set out in Part IV of the Schedule to the Notice M. (10) issued by the Trade Board, and dated 28th May, 1920, shall apply in substitution for the rates set out in Parts I, II, III and IV of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the Schedule to their Notice M. (10), dated 28th May, 1920, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART VI.—*Definitions.**(a) Female Pan Hands:—*

For the purpose of the application of the minimum rates specified in Parts I, II, III and V of this Schedule, a Female Pan Hand shall be defined as a Female Worker of any age who performs the operation of pan-setting with or without the operations of boring and/or trimming.

(b) Female Pan-Setting Learners:—

For the purpose of the application of the Minimum Rates set out in Section II of Part III of this Schedule, a pan-setting learner is defined as being a female worker (of any age) who:—

(a) is employed during the whole of her time in accordance with the provisions of this Schedule under an Agreement for a period of two years in the form prescribed by the Trade Board as set out in Part VII of this Schedule. Provided that no worker shall be permitted to serve more than one period of two years as a pan-setting learner at the minimum rates fixed by the Trade Board and in accordance with the conditions laid down by the Trade Board from time to time.

(b) has been registered with the Trade Board in accordance with Rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made application for such registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration.

Provided that:—

(i) The Registration may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

(ii) An employer may employ a worker at the special rates and under the special conditions for pan-setting learners without registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks; but in the event of the worker being continued thereafter at her employment as a pan-setting learner the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

PART VII.

Form of Agreement prescribed by the Trade Board for Female Pan-Setting Learners.

For the purpose of the application of the

Minimum Rates set out in Part III. of this Schedule a female pan-setting learner shall be employed under an agreement in the following form:—

Memorandum of Agreement made this day of _____ between _____ (hereinafter referred to as "the Employers") of the one part and _____ (hereinafter referred to as "the Learner") of the other part.

Whereas the Learner is desirous of being trained in the branch of the Brush and Broom Trade known as the operation of "Pan Setting" and the Employers being engaged in the said trade are willing to give her such training.

Now it is hereby mutually agreed as follows:—

1. The Learner will enter and continue in the service of the Employers, and they will receive and retain her in their service as a Learner for the period of two years from the date of this Agreement, subject nevertheless to the provisions for earlier determination contained in Clause 5 hereof.

2. During the said term of service the Learner will apply herself diligently to learn the said operation, and will faithfully serve the Employers and obey their lawful commands, and they on their part will cause her to be well and sufficiently instructed in the said operation.

3. The Employers will pay to the Learner wages in accordance with the current rates of wages applicable to female learners employed as "Pan-Setters" as fixed from time to time by the Brush and Broom Trade Board (Great Britain), subject, however, to this proviso that if the Learner shall at any time be absent from her duties (whether by reason of sickness or any other cause whatsoever) without the consent of the Employers, the Learner shall not be deemed to be employed for the period of such absence, and shall not be entitled to any wages for such period. The wages payable to the Learner under this agreement shall be deemed to accrue from hour to hour.

4. Subject to the provisions of this Agreement the working hours and conditions of the said service shall be those applying to the women operatives at the factory of the Employers for the time being.

5. If the Learner wilfully disobeys any lawful order of the Employers or otherwise wilfully misconducts herself towards the Employers or those in their employment it shall be lawful for the Employers to discharge the Learner from their service and absolutely determine this Agreement.

6. If either of the parties hereto desires for any reason to determine this Agreement before the expiration of the said period of two years or in the event of any dispute arising involving allegations of unsuitability or of failure to apply herself diligently to learn the said operation on the part of the Learner or of failure on the part of the Employers to cause her to be well and sufficiently instructed in the said operation or of wrongful exercise by the Employers of their power to dismiss the Learner under Clause 5 hereof which cannot be settled between the parties hereto the Employers and the Learner hereby mutually agree that the matters in dispute shall stand referred in the

first instance to the Brush and Broom Trade Board (Great Britain) with a view to effecting a settlement thereof.

7. On the due completion of the said term of service this Agreement shall be given by the Employers to the Learner with a certificate endorsed thereon and signed by or on behalf of the Employers that the said term of service has been duly served.

PART VIII.

SECTION I.—The respective Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers (including Home-workers) of the classes specified in this Schedule in respect of any time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Brush and Broom) Order, 1919, that is to say, the manufacture of brushes (other than feather brushes) or brooms;

Including the following operations, where all or any of them are carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of such brushes or brooms:—

(a) The drafting, dressing, or mixing of bass, whisk, or similar fibres, or animal bristles or hair, and the working of wood, bone, ivory, or celluloid;

(b) All finishing, warehousing, packing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of such brushes or brooms;

But excluding the following operations:—

The sawing and turning of wood as a preliminary operation to the manufacture of such brushes or brooms, the making of metal parts, and the mounting of brushes with metal or tortoiseshell backs.

Provided that nothing in this Schedule shall apply to female apprentices or female learners employed under an Indenture or Written Agreement respectively entered into prior to 31st January, 1921, and providing for the proper instruction of the apprentice or learner in the operation or branch of work known as pan-setting.

SECTION II.—The proposed Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION III.—The proposed Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

PART IX.

The Trade Board further give notice, that the proposals contained in the Schedule to the Notice M. (15) and in Section II (a) of Part I of the Schedule to the Notice M. (17) issued

by the Trade Board, and dated 18th October, 1920, and 23rd November, 1920, respectively, are hereby withdrawn, and further that the proposals contained in this Schedule are in substitution for the proposals contained in Parts I to VII inclusive of the Schedule to the Notice M. (19) issued by the Trade Board, and dated 31st January, 1921, which are also hereby withdrawn.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from 11th June, 1921. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Brush and Broom Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4. It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

ROAD VEHICLES.

THE HEAVY MOTOR CAR (AMENDMENT) ORDER, 1921, DATED MAY 19, 1921, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF TRANSPORT.

To the County Councils of the several Administrative Counties in the United Kingdom;—

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London in Common Council assembled;—

To the Councils of the several County Boroughs in England and Wales and Ireland;—

To the Councils of the Royal Parliamentary and Police Burghs in Scotland concerned;—

To the Councils of the several Metropolitan Boroughs;—

To the Urban District Councils of the several Urban Districts in England and Wales and Urban County Districts in Ireland;—

To the Rural District Councils acting as the Highway Authorities in Rural Districts in England and Wales;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by the Motor Car Acts, 1896 and 1903 (59 & 60 Vic., c. 36 and 3 Edw. 7, c. 36), provision was made with respect to the use of motor cars on highways, and in compliance with Section 1 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, which in the Motor Car Act, 1903, and in this Order is referred to as "the principal Act," a motor car must be under three tons in weight unladen, and a motor car with a vehicle drawn by it must not exceed in weight unladen four tons;

And whereas by Section 12 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted as follows: that is to say:—

"12.—(1) The Local Government Board by regulations made under section six of the principal Act may, as respects any class of vehicle mentioned in the regulations, increase the maximum weights of three tons and four tons mentioned in section one of that Act, subject to any conditions as to the use and construction of the vehicle which may be made by the regulations."

And whereas by Section 18 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that in the application of that Act to Scotland a reference to the Secretary for Scotland shall be substituted for a reference to the Local Government Board.

And whereas by Section 19 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that in the application of that Act to Ireland a reference to the Local Government Board for Ireland shall be substituted for a reference to the Local Government Board.

And whereas by the Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904 (S.R. & O., 1904, No. 1809), the Heavy Motor Car (Scotland) Order, 1905 (S.R. & O. 1905, No. 1) and the Heavy Motor Car (Ireland) Order, 1905 (S.R. & O. 1905, No. 71), the Local Government Board, the Secretary for Scotland and the Local Government Board for Ireland respectively made regulations with respect to the maximum weight of heavy motor cars.

And whereas by the Ministry of Transport Act, 1919 (9 & 10 Geo. 5, c. 50), and the Ministry of Transport (Ministry of Health Exception of Powers) Order, 1919 (S.R. & O. 1919, No. 1441), the Ministry of Transport (Secretary for Scotland Transfer and Exception of Powers) Order, 1920 (S.R. & O. 1920, No. 2122), and the Ministry of Transport (Local Government Board for Ireland Transfer and Exception of Powers) Order, 1919 (S.R. & O. 1919, No. 1942), the powers of the Ministry of

Health as successors to the Local Government Board, of the Secretary for Scotland, and of the Local Government Board for Ireland respectively, in relation to the subject matter of this Order, were transferred to the Minister of Transport.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers in that behalf vested in him the Minister of Transport hereby orders as follows:—

ARTICLE I. The Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904, the Heavy Motor Car (Scotland) Order, 1905, and the Heavy Motor Car (Ireland) Order, 1905, as respectively amended by subsequent Orders shall have effect as if in Article III of each of the said Orders the words "seven and a quarter tons" were substituted for the words "five tons" and the words "nine and three-quarter tons" were substituted for the words "six and a half tons," and as if in Article XVII. of each of the said Orders Sub-clause (a) thereof (which relates to heavy motor cars which belong to His Majesty the King) were omitted.

ARTICLE II. Nothing in this Order shall—

(a) affect the operation prior to the date of this Order of the regulations made in the Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904, the Heavy Motor Car (Scotland) Order, 1905, and the Heavy Motor Car (Ireland) Order, 1905, as respectively amended by subsequent Orders, or anything duly done or suffered under those regulations; or

(b) affect any right, privilege, obligation or liability acquired, accrued or incurred under those regulations; or

(c) affect any fine or punishment incurred in respect of a breach of those regulations; or

(d) affect any legal proceeding or remedy in respect of any such right, privilege, obligation, liability, fine or punishment:

and any such legal proceeding or remedy may be instituted, continued or enforced and any such fine or punishment may be imposed, as if this Order had not been made.

ARTICLE III.—This Order may be cited as the Heavy Motor Car (Amendment) Order, 1921.

ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND)
ORDER OF 1921 (No. 14).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

PART I.

Revocation of Existing Orders.

1. The Animals (Landing from Ireland) Orders of 1921 (Nos. 10 to 13) are hereby revoked.

Regulation of Landing.

2. Cattle, sheep, goats or swine brought from Ireland shall not be landed in Great Britain except in accordance with the provisions of the Animals (Landing from Ireland) (Consolidation and Amendment) Order of 1914 as amended by this Order.

PART II.

Landing for Slaughter within Certain Landing Places.

3.—(1) Cattle, sheep, goats or swine shipped from any port in Ireland which is mentioned in the First Schedule to the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Consolidation and Amendment Order of 1914, may be landed at the landing places defined by Orders of the Minister as landing places for Irish animals at the ports of Birkenhead, Glasgow and Manchester, but only for the purpose of slaughter within the landing place.

(2) The landing of any animals under this Article must be authorised by the Superintendent or person in charge of the landing place.

(3) Animals so landed shall be subject to the provisions of the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Consolidation and Amendment Order of 1914, except that the animals shall not be moved from the landing place, and shall be slaughtered therein within seventy-two hours after their landing.

Special Provision as to Animals Destined for Manchester Irish Animals Landing Place.

4. Animals, if intended to be landed at the Manchester Irish Animals Landing Place under this Order, shall not be carried through the Eastham lock until they have been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry and unless and until the Inspector certifies that his examination and information do not show that there is, or during the voyage has been, an animal on board affected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

PART III.

Landing at certain Landing Places of Cattle not intended for Slaughter.

5.—(1) Cattle not intended for slaughter shipped from Ireland may, subject to the provisions of this Article, and not otherwise, be landed at the Landing Places for Irish animals at the ports of Ayr, Bristol, Fishguard, Fleetwood, Greenock, Heysham, Holyhead and Silloth.

(2) The landing of any animals under this Article must be authorised by the Superintendent or person in charge of the Landing Place.

(3) Cattle so landed shall be subject to the provisions of the Animals (Landing from Ireland) (Consolidation and Amendment) Order of 1914, except that the animals shall not be moved from the Landing Place until the expiration of fourteen days after the landing of the last animal at the landing place.

PART IV—GENERAL.

Offences.

6. If any animal shall be landed or removed in contravention of this Order or is not slaughtered as required by this Order, the owner thereof, and the owner and the lessee and the occupier of the Landing Place, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the landing or movement, and the owner and person in charge of the animal which is not slaughtered, and the owner and the charterer, and the master of the vessel from which the same is landed, as the case may be, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

7. This Order shall come into operation on the thirteenth day of June, nineteen hundred and twenty-one.

Short Title.

8. This Order may be cited as the ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND) ORDER OF 1921 (No. 14).

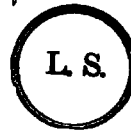

(2.) In the case of movement to the exhibition the licence shall be one granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the city of Newcastle-on-Tyne, or by some person specially authorised by the said Local Authority, and in the case of movement from the exhibition the licence shall be one granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate, and such place shall be specified in the licence.

2. A copy of a licence issued under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

3. A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the above-mentioned Orders be treated as a licence under those Orders.
