IMPERIAL PREFERENCE.

REGULATIONS AS TO THE PROPORTION OF VALUE RESULTING FROM LABOUR WITHIN THE BRITISH EMPIRE.

In pursuance of Section 8 of the Finance Act, 1919 (9 & 10 Geo. 5, ch. 32), the Board of Trade hereby make the following Regulations:—

In the Regulations dated the 6th August, 1919, relating to the proportion of value resulting from labour within the British Empire, there shall be substituted in paragraph (5) thereof for the words "proportion of fuel, supervision and other factory expenses" the following words, namely, "factory overhead charges."
