The following Amendments to the Statutes of Queen's College, Oxford, made by the Governing Body of the College on the 8th June, 1921, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

Whereas it is expedient to change the title of The Hastings Exhibitions and The Hastings Exhibitioners into the title of The Hastings Scholarships and Scholars.

And also to provide that the aggregate income of two emoluments held together within the College shall be raised to £130.

And further that a consequential rearrangement of the order in the Statutes shall be made.

The College, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and of any other power enabling it, at a General Meeting of the Governing Body, specially summoned for the purpose, and after due notice, held upon the 8th day of June, 1921, by the unanimous vote of the persons present and voting, made the following amendments to a Statute made by the University Commissioners for the Queen's College, Oxford, and ordered them to be submitted to His Majesty in Council, to be dealt with as provided by the said Act:

In the College Statutes, Title II., "A Statute for the Queen's College, Oxford, concerning the exhibitions within the College."

In Sectio. 1, Clause 1, entitled "Exhibitions in General," delete the words "and subject also to the provisions for the regulation of the Hastings Exhibitioners."

In Sectio. II., "The Hastings Exhibitions," wherever the word "Exhibition" or "Exhibitions" occurs, substitute the word "Scholarship" or "Scholarships," and whenever the word "Exhibitioner" or "Exhibitioners" occurs, substitute the word "Scholar" or "Scholars."

Ibid. Clause 12. For "One hundred and ten pounds per annum" substitute the words "One hundred and thirty pounds per annum."

In College Statutes, Title III., after the figure III., add the figure "1. The Scholars and Bible Clerks."

At the end of the Sectio, after Clause 13, add the Title "2. The Hastings Scholars," and then follows the whole of the Title II., Sectio. II., as amended, formerly called "The Hastings Exhibitions."

The College Seal was affixed upon the thirteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

1. The following Rule shall be substituted for Rule 11 of the Business Names Rules, 1917:—

Fees.

11. The fees to be paid to the Registrar under the Act are to be as follows:—

(a) On a Statement of Particulars required by Section 3 of the Act the sum of five shillings, and such fee shall cover the issue of one certificate of registration.

(b) On any Statement of Particulars required by the Schedule to the Act when such particulars are not furnished with the Statement of Particulars required by Section 3 of the Act the sum of five shillings, and such fee shall cover the issue of one certificate of registration.

(c) On a statement of any change within the meaning of Section 6 of the Act the sum of five shillings, and such fee shall cover the issue of one certificate of the registration of such statement.

(d) By any person inspecting under the provisions of Section 16 of the Act the documents filed by the Registrar, the sum of one shilling for each inspection.

(e) On the application of any person requiring under the provisions of Section 16 of the Act a certificate of registration of any firm, individual or corporation or a certified copy of or extract from any registered statement the sum of two shillings for a certificate of registration, and for each certified copy or extract the sum of sixpence for each folio of seventy-two words, or in Scotland for each sheet of two hundred words.

(f) By any person appealing to the Board of Trade from a decision of the Registrar the sum of one pound.

2. These Rules may be cited as the Business Names Rules, 1921, and shall come into operation on the first day of July, 1921.

C. For the purpose of this Notice a "learner" is any person, other than a male person of over 21 years of age, who is employed under conditions which, in the circumstances of the case, afford a reasonable prospect of advancement to the General Minimum Time-Rate for workers other than learners.

PART II.

Proposed Piece-work Basis Time-Rate for Female Workers of 18 Years of Age or Over.

The Piece-work Basis Time-Rate for all female workers of 18 years of age or over shall be 9d. per hour.

In the case of all Female Workers of 18 years of age or over employed on Piece-work, each Piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 9d. an hour to an Ordinary worker, i.e., a worker of ordinary skill and experience.

PART III.

Proposed Variation of the Overtime Rates for All Female and Male Workers.

Overtime Rates calculated on the proposed Minimum Rates of Wages specified in Parts I. and II. of this Schedule, in the manner set out in Part II. of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice, H. (8), dated 30th July, 1920, shall apply in substitution for the proposed Minimum Rates of Wages specified in Parts I. and II. of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked by a worker, whether employed on time-work or on piece-work, in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice, dated 30th July, 1920, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

The above proposed minimum rates of wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made for the payment of wages in excess of the minimum rates.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals to Vary and Fix which may be lodged with them within two months from 18th June, 1921. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, Hollow-Ware Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Pin, Hook and Eye and Snap Fastener Trade, as specified in the Trade Boards (Pin, Hook and Eye and Snap Fastener) Order, 1919, having given due notice on 9th November, 1920, of Proposal to Vary the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates fixed and set out in the Schedule to their notice dated 9th November, 1920, hereby give notice that they have varied the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates fixed and set out in their notice dated 9th November, 1920, in their application to certain classes of Male and Female Workers specified in the Schedule hereto, and that the Minimum Rates of Wages as varied are as shown in the Schedule set out below, which is

incorporated herewith. The Trade Board also give notice that they have fixed a General Minimum Time-Rate for Home-workers as shown in the Schedule set out below, which is incorporated herewith.

The Trade Board further give notice that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order dated 13th June, 1921, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Minimum Rates of Wages as varied and as fixed by the Trade Board, and specifying 20th June, 1921,* as the date from which such Minimum Rates of Wages shall become effective.

* NOTE.—Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 26th June, 1921.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

General Minimum Time-Rates for Certain Classes of Male and Female Workers.

SECTION I:—*Female Workers.*

For all Female Workers of 18 years of age and over who are employed as Charge Hands with the duty of being responsible for all work and order in the particular section of which they have charge, 10d. per hour.

SECTION II:—*Male Workers.*

(a) For all Male Workers of 21 years of age and over who are employed as Pin Makers, 1s. 10d. per hour.

(b) For all Male Workers of 21 years of age and over who are employed as Hairpin-Machinists, Hook and Eye Makers, Machine-Blackers or Automatic Machinists (including Snap Fastener Machinists), 1s. 8d. per hour.

(c) For all Male Workers of 21 years of age and over who are employed as Blackers (other than Machine-Blackers), Electroplaters, Whiteners or Wire-straighteners, 1s. 5d. per hour.

PART II.

Overtime Rates for Certain Classes of Male and Female Workers.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (i) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows—

In any week	47
On Saturday	4½

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and on Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime for the classes of Male and Female Workers specified in Part I of this Notice in respect of all hours worked by a worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the trade shall be as follows:—

A.—Workers employed on Time-work:—

(a) For all hours worked on Sundays and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable—i.e., Double-Time.

(b) For all hours worked in excess of 4½ on Saturday, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable—i.e., Time-and-a-Half, notwithstanding that the total number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 47.

(c) For all hours worked in excess of 47 in any week, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable—i.e., Time-and-a-Quarter for the first 10 hours; and One-and-a-Half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Half thereafter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the Provisions of paragraphs (a) and (b) of this Part of this Section.

B.—Workers employed on Piece-work:—

A worker employed on Piece-work shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker, not less than the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate as set out in Part I of this Notice, a sum equivalent to the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, to One-Half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, or to One-Quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would be payable under the Provisions of Part A of this Section, if the worker were employed on Time-work, were Double-Time, or Time-and-a-Half, or Time-and-a-Quarter, respectively.

NOTE.—The hours which Female Workers, Young Persons and Children are allowed to work are subject to the Provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART III.

General Minimum Time-Rate for Home-workers.

SECTION I.

For all Home-workers ... 7½d. per hour.

In the case of all Home-workers employed on Piece-work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 7½d. per hour to an Ordinary Worker—i.e., a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question.

SECTION II.

For the purpose of this Part of this Notice the expression "Home-worker" means a worker who works in his or her own home or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

PART IV.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in Great Britain of the classes specified in Parts I and III of this Notice in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Pin, Hook and Eye and Snap Fastener) Order, 1919, that is to say:—

The manufacture of pins, hairpins, hooks and

(e) The manufacture of steel hatpins or shanks for steel toilet pins, wherever carried on.

The Proposed Minimum Rates for Overtime for all Female Workers (other than Home-Workers) employed in Carding Hooks and Eyes or Snap Fasteners, in respect of all hours worked in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the trade, as specified in Section I of this Part of this Schedule, shall be as follows:—

A.—Female Workers employed on Time-Work:—

(a) For all hours worked on Sundays and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Double-Time.

(b) For all hours worked in excess of 4½ on Saturday, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Half, notwithstanding that the total number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 47.

(c) For all hours worked in excess of 47 in any week, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter for the first ten hours, and One-and-a-Half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Half, thereafter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the Provisions of Paragraphs (a) and (b) of this Sub-Section.

B.—Female Workers employed on Piece-Work:—

A Female worker employed on Piece-Work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked in addition to Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of

the case, to an Ordinary worker, not less than the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, as set out in Part III of this Notice, a sum equivalent to the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, to One-Half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, or to One-Quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate, which would be payable under the Provisions of Part A of this Section, if the Worker were employed on Time-Work, were Double-Time, or Time-and-a-Half, or Time-and-a-Quarter, respectively.

NOTE.—The hours which Female Workers, Young Persons and Children are allowed to work are subject to the Provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART V.

The above Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the Provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in Great Britain (except Home-Workers) in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Pin, Hook and Eye and Snap Fastener) Order, 1919, that is to say:—

The manufacture of pins, hairpins, hooks and eyes, haircurlers, snap fasteners, or safety pins, from the following metals in wire or sheet form:—

Aluminium, copper, iron, lead, steel, tin, zinc or alloys of any two or more of the above metals;

Including:—

- (a) The capping of safety pins;
- (b) The operation of pin sticking;
- (c) Packaging, boxing or carding of any of the above articles wherever carried on;
- (d) Packing, despatching, warehousing or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of any of the above articles;

but excluding:—

- (e) The manufacture of steel hatpins or shanks for steel toilet pins, wherever carried on.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall not apply to Home-Workers.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from the 18th June, 1921. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, The Pin, Hook and Eye and Snap-Fastener Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

MINIMUM RATES (AS VARIED BY AN ALTERATION OF THE CONDITIONS ATTACHING THERETO) FOR MALE APPRENTICES IN THE BONE BRUSH SECTION OF THE TRADE.

Effective as from 21st June, 1921.*

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Brush and Broom Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Brush and Broom) Order, 1919, having given due notice on 31st January, 1921, of Proposal to Vary as therein shown (by an alteration in the conditions attaching thereto) the Minimum Rates at present fixed and set out in the Notice M. (16) issued by the Trade Board and dated 18th October, 1920, in their application to Male Apprentices in the Bone Brush Section of the Trade, hereby give notice that they have varied the Minimum Rates at present fixed and set out in their Notice M. (16) dated 18th October, 1920, in their application to Apprentices in the Bone Brush Section of the Trade as specified in Section IV of Part I of the Schedule to the said Notice M. (16) by providing in Part III (b) of the said Schedule that:—

In cases where the number of Journeymen who have been in the service of the employer in the branch or branches of trade to which the Apprentice is bound throughout the period of 12 months prior to the date of application for Registration has been:—

- (a) 5 and under.
- (b) From 6 to 10.
- (c) From 11 to 15.
- (d) From 16 to 20.
- (e) From 21 to 25.

The Registration and employment of Male Workers as Apprentices at the Minimum Rates set out in Section IV of Part I of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice M. (16) dated 18th October, 1920, shall be limited to:—

- (a) 1 in lieu of 2 as at present provided.
- (b) 2 in lieu of 4 as at present provided.
- (c) 3 in lieu of 6 as at present provided.
- (d) 4 in lieu of 8 as at present provided.
- (e) 5 in lieu of 10 as at present provided.

And, thereafter, one additional Apprentice (in lieu of two as at present provided) may be employed for every additional five or fewer than five such Journeymen.

And the Trade Board further give Notice that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order, dated 20th June, 1921, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Variation by the Trade Board, and specifying 21st June, 1921,* as the date from which such Variation shall become effective.

* NOTE.—Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages

at intervals not exceeding seven days, the Variation shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in no case later than 27th June, 1921.

THE COLONIAL AUXILIARY FORCES
OFFICERS' DECORATION WARRANT.

GEORGE R.I.

GEORGE THE FIFTH by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India: To all to whom these Presents shall come Greeting:

WHEREAS Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, did, by Royal Warrant dated the 18th day of May, 1899, institute and create a decoration entitled: "The Colonial Auxiliary Forces Officers' Decoration" (hereinafter referred to as "the Decoration") to be awarded to Commissioned Officers of Our Colonial Auxiliary Forces in recognition of long and meritorious service, and did lay down rules and ordinances for the governance of the same, which rules and ordinances were subsequently amended by Royal Warrant dated the 3rd day of August, 1902:

AND WHEREAS WE desire to recognise specially the meritorious service of Officers of Our Dominion and Colonial Auxiliary Forces during the late war:

And whereas We also deem it expedient to promulgate new rules and ordinances in substitution for those contained in the aforesaid Royal Warrants:

NOW THEREFORE We do hereby declare that the rules and ordinances heretofore in force shall be abrogated, cancelled and annulled, and We are pleased to make, ordain and establish the following rules and ordinances in substitution for the same, which shall from henceforth be inviolably observed and kept:—

Firstly.—It is ordained that the Decoration shall, as heretofore, consist of a chased oval band of silver having thereon the words "Colonial Auxiliary Forces," and in the centre the Imperial Cypher in silver gilt; the whole surmounted by the Imperial Crown in silver gilt.

Secondly.—It is ordained that the Decoration shall be worn after all British War Medals, suspended from the left breast, by a green riband of one inch and a-half in width, from a silver brooch.

Thirdly.—It is ordained that the Decoration may be worn by Us, Our Heirs and Successors, Kings and Queens Regnant of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland; and it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, to confer the Decoration upon any of the Princes of the Royal Family of Great Britain and Ireland.

Fourthly.—It is ordained that the Decoration shall be conferred on duly qualified Commissioned Officers of all authorized Auxiliary Military Forces (*i.e.*, other than Permanent Forces) of Our Dominions, Colonies and Dependencies (except India) and of countries under Our protection (hereinafter referred to as Protectorates), whether designated as Militia or Volunteers or otherwise.

Fifthly.—It is ordained that the period of service requisite to qualify for the Decoration shall be 20 years' commissioned service; that half the time served in the ranks of the aforesaid Auxiliary Military Forces (including India) or in the ranks of the Territorial Force of Great Britain or Volunteer Force which existed before 1st April, 1908, shall be reckoned as qualifying service; and that Service on the West Coast of Africa shall reckon two-fold as qualifying service.

Sixthly.—It is ordained that Commissioned Service rendered wholly in the Auxiliary Forces of one or more Dominion, Colony or Protectorate; or partly in the Auxiliary Forces of one or more Dominion, Colony or Protectorate, partly in the Territorial Force of Great Britain, or partly in any Naval or Military Volunteer Force of any part of Our Empire (except service since 4th August, 1914, in the Volunteer Force of Great Britain raised under the Volunteer Acts, 1863-1916), shall be reckoned as qualifying service for the Decoration.

Seventhly.—It is ordained that service on the Permanent Staff of the Auxiliary Forces of Our Dominions, Colonies, Dependencies or Protectorates by members of the Permanent Forces shall not reckon as qualifying service for the Decoration.

Eighthly.—It is ordained that service qualifying for the Decoration shall also count towards the qualifying service necessary for "The Territorial Officers' Decoration," and *vice versa*.

Ninthly.—It is ordained that an officer of the Auxiliary Forces of one of Our Dominions, Colonies, Dependencies or Protectorates who during the late war actually served, or accepted the obligation of serving, beyond the boundaries of the Dominion, Colony, Dependency or Protectorate, shall reckon all embodied service as an officer on the active list two-fold as qualifying service towards the requisite 20 years, whether such service was in Our Naval Forces, Our Military Forces, or Our Air Forces.

Provided that nothing in this Royal Warrant shall permit service to count more than two-fold towards the award of the Decoration.

Tenthly.—It is ordained that an officer of the Auxiliary Forces of one of Our Dominions, Colonies, Dependencies or Protectorates who during the late war actually served, or accepted the obligation of serving, beyond the boundaries of the Dominion, Colony, Dependency, or Protectorate, shall reckon all embodied service in the ranks on the active list as full qualifying service towards the requisite 20 years, whether such service was in Our Naval Forces, Our Military Forces, or Our Air Forces.

Eleventhly.—It is ordained that a recipient of the Decoration shall be permitted to wear with it any "Colonial Auxiliary Forces Long Service Medal" which may have been awarded to him, provided that he has completed the full qualifying service required for both the Medal and the Decoration.

Twelfthly.—It is ordained that the Decoration shall be conferred under such regulations as to grant, forfeiture, restoration, and other matters, in amplification of these Our rules and ordinances, as may with Our approval signified through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, be issued from time to time by the Governors-General, Governors or officers administering the government of Our Dominions, Colonies, or Protectorates, as the case may be.

Lastly.—We reserve to Ourselves, Our Heirs and Successors full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting, or dispensing with these rules and ordinances, or any part thereof, by a notification under Our Royal Sign Manual.

Given at Our Court at *St. James's*, this 9th day of *June*, 1921, in the twelfth year of Our Reign.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 18TH JUNE 1921.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Application of Part I. of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920.

1. (1) Part I. (Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of a Movement Area) of the Sheep

(Double Dipping) Order of 1920 is hereby applied to the Area described in the Schedule hereto, hereinafter referred to as "the Area."

(2) This article shall come into operation on the eighteenth day of July, and shall cease to operate on the first day of September, nineteen hundred and twenty-one.

Restrictions on Exposure of Sheep at Markets, &c., within the Area during the Period from 18th July to 31st August.

2. Sheep on any premises in the Area shall not (except as hereinafter provided) be permitted to enter, or be exposed for sale or exhibition in, any market, fairground, saleyard, or place of exhibition in that Area during the period from 18th July to 31st August in the current year, unless they have within twenty-eight days before the date of entry or exposure been dipped twice on separate dates with an interval of not less than ten and not more than fourteen days between the two dates, and are accompanied by a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, stating that the sheep have been so dipped, and the dates of dipping, and that since the second dipping the sheep have been kept separate as far as practicable while in the Area from other sheep not so dipped.

Special Provision as to Fat Sheep for immediate Slaughter.

3. Where an Inspector of a Local Authority is satisfied that any sheep in his District in the Area are intended for immediate slaughter and that it is impracticable or inexpedient that the same should in accordance with this Order be dipped before exposure for sale or exhibition, he may, subject to any directions by the Local Authority, by licence authorise the movement of the sheep to any market, fairground, saleyard, or place of exhibition in the Area, subject to such conditions (if any) as are inserted in the licence, and thereupon the sheep may, in accordance with such licence and conditions, be exposed for sale in the market, fairground, saleyard, or place of exhibition free from any restrictions imposed by any Order of the Minister relating to Sheep Scab or Sheep Dipping; provided that an Inspector of a Local Authority shall not issue any such licence for movement to premises in the District of another Local Authority unless the consent of such Local Authority, either generally or in the particular instance, has been previously obtained.

Offences.

4. If a sheep is permitted to enter or is exposed for sale in any market, fairground, saleyard, or place of exhibition, in contravention of this Order, the occupier of the premises, and the owner and person in charge of the sheep, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(i) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.

(ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

2. A copy of a licence issued under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District

in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

3. A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the above-mentioned Orders be treated as a licence under those Orders.
