**W**HEREAS it is provided by the Government of Ireland Act, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as the Act), that the Act shall, except as expressly provided, come into operation on the appointed day, and that the appointed day for the purposes of the Act shall be the first Tuesday in the eighth month after the month of December, 1920 (being the month in which the Act was passed), or such other day, not more than seven months earlier or later, as may be fixed by Order of His Majesty in Council either generally or with reference to any particular provision of the Act, and that different days may be appointed for different purposes and different provisions of the Act:

And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the 24th day of March, 1921, appointed days were fixed for the purposes of the provisions of the Act, other than the provisions thereby excepted (hereinafter referred to as the excepted provisions):

And whereas the excepted provisions include the provisions of section forty-four of the Act, being provisions relative to the Lord Chancellor of Ireland:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Government of Ireland (Lord Chancellor of Ireland) Order, 1921.

2. The twenty-seventh day of June, 1921, is hereby fixed to be the appointed day for the purposes of the provisions of section forty-four of the Act.

**W**HEREAS by the British Settlements Act, 1887, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty the King in Council from time to time to establish all such laws and institutions and constitute such courts and officers and make such provisions and regulations for the proceedings in the said Courts and for the administration of justice as may appear to His Majesty in Council to be

necessary for the peace, order and good government of His Majesty's subjects and others within any British Settlement:

And whereas by the Kenya (Annexation) Order in Council, 1920, the territories comprised in the East Africa Protectorate as specified in the East Africa Order in Council, 1902, save and excepting only such territories therein included as form part of the dominions of His Highness the Sultan of Zanzibar were annexed to and now form part of His Majesty's dominions and are known as the Colony of Kenya:

And whereas the said Colony is a British Settlement within the meaning of the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the British Settlements Act, 1887, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Kenya Colony Order in Council, 1921." The limits of this Order are the territories defined in the Kenya Colony and Protectorate (Boundaries) Order in Council, 1921, as included in the Colony of Kenya. The said territories are in this Order referred to as "the Colony."

2.—(1) All rights of His Majesty in or in relation to any Crown lands shall vest in and may be exercised by the Governor for the time being in trust for His Majesty.

(2) The Governor may make grants or leases of any Crown lands or may permit them to be temporarily occupied on such terms and conditions as he may think fit, subject to the provisions of any Ordinance.

(3) "Crown lands" shall mean all public lands in the Colony which are for the time being subject to the control of His Majesty, and all lands which shall have been acquired by His Majesty for the public service or otherwise howsoever and shall include all lands occupied by the native tribes of the Colony and all lands reserved for the use of the members of any native tribe.

3. All Ordinances, Proclamations, Regulations, Rules, or other public notifications shall be published in the Official Gazette of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, and also in such other manner, if any, as the Governor may direct in the case of any particular notification.

4.—(1) There shall be a Court of Record styled His Majesty's Supreme Court of Kenya (in this Order referred to as "the Supreme Court") with full jurisdiction, civil and criminal, over all persons and over all matters in the Colony.

(2) Subject to the other provisions of this Order, such civil and criminal jurisdiction shall, so far as circumstances admit, be exercised in conformity with the Civil Procedure and Penal Codes of India and the other Indian Acts which are in force in the Colony at the date of the commencement of this Order and subject thereto and so far as the same shall not extend or apply shall be exercised in conformity with the substance of the common law, the doctrines of equity and the statutes of general application in force in England on the 12th day of August, 1897, and with the powers vested in and according to the procedure and practice observed by and before Courts of Justice and Justices of the Peace in England according to their respective jurisdiction and

authorities at that date save in so far as the Civil Procedure and Penal Codes of India and the other Indian Acts in force as aforesaid and the said common law doctrines of equity and the statutes of general application and the said powers, procedure and practice may at any time before the commencement of this Order have been or hereafter may be modified, amended or replaced by other provisions in lieu thereof by or under the authority of any Order of His Majesty in Council, or by any Ordinance or Ordinances for the time being in force in the Colony.

Provided always that the said common law doctrines of equity and the statutes of general application shall be in force in the Colony so far only as the circumstances of the Colony and its inhabitants permit and subject to such qualifications as local circumstances render necessary.

(3) The Supreme Court shall sit at such place or places as the Governor may appoint.

(4) The Supreme Court shall have a Seal bearing the style of the Court and a device approved by the Secretary of State; until such seal is provided the seal of the present High Court of East Africa may be used.

5. The Supreme Court shall be a Court of Admiralty and shall exercise admiralty jurisdiction in all matters arising on the high seas or elsewhere or upon any lake or other navigable inland waters or otherwise relating to ships and shipping.

6.—(1) Courts subordinate to the Supreme Court, and Courts of special jurisdiction, may be constituted by or under the provisions of any Ordinance as occasion requires.

(2) Provision may be made by Ordinance for the hearing and determining of appeals from any such Court by the Supreme Court or otherwise.

7. In all cases civil and criminal to which natives are parties, every Court (a) shall be guided by native law so far as it is applicable and is not repugnant to justice and morality or inconsistent with any Order in Council or Ordinance, or any regulation or rule made under any Order in Council or Ordinance; and (b) shall decide all such cases according to substantial justice without undue regard to technicalities or procedure and without undue delay.

8. If any sentence of death is pronounced by the Supreme Court a copy of the evidence shall be transmitted to the Governor, and the sentence shall not be carried into effect until confirmed by him.

9. Subject to the provisions of any Ordinance, the Supreme Court may, with the approval of the Governor, make rules for regulating the practice and procedure of the Supreme Court and of all other Courts which may be established in the Colony.

The power to make rules under this Article shall include (a) a power to fix fees and scales of remuneration, and (b) a power to regulate the conditions on which persons may be admitted to practice as advocates or solicitors in the Courts of the Colony.

At the first available opportunity after any such rules are made, the Governor shall transmit an authenticated copy thereof to the Secretary of State.

10.—(1) A court under this Order shall not exercise any jurisdiction in any proceeding whatsoever over the Governor or his official or other residences, or his official or other property.

(2) This Article shall not operate in bar of any proceeding against the Governor in his official capacity where it is sought to establish any liability of the Government of the Colony.

11. On the commencement of this Order the following Orders in Council shall cease to apply to the Colony, that is to say:—

The East Africa Order in Council, 1902.  
The East Africa Order in Council, 1906.  
The East Africa Order in Council, 1907.  
The East Africa Order in Council, 1911.  
The East Africa Order in Council, 1912.  
The East Africa Order in Council, 1914.  
The East Africa Order in Council, 1915.  
The East Africa Order in Council, 1919.

Provided as follows:—

(1) Where other provision is not made by Ordinance, any law practice or procedure established by or under the said Orders and all acts of any legislature in India now in force in the Colony shall remain in force until such other provision is made.

(2) Every appointment of a Judge or other officer and every Court established and existing at the commencement of this Order shall, until other provision is made, continue to be as if this Order had not been passed.

(3) All legal proceedings begun under the said Orders and pending at the commencement of this Order shall be continued as if this Order had not been passed.

12. This Order shall commence and have effect as follows:—

(1) As to the making of any warrant or appointment, the framing of Ordinances and Rules of Procedure, the issue of instructions, and as to any other provisions necessary for bringing this Order into effect, immediately from and after the date of this Order.

(2) As to all other matters and provisions comprised and contained in this Order, immediately after this Order is first published in the Official Gazette of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, and the time of such publication shall be deemed to be the time of the commencement of this Order.

And the Right Honourable Winston Spencer Churchill, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**W**HEREAS by an Order in Council bearing date the 11th day of August, 1902, and entitled the East Africa Order in Council, 1902, the territories comprised in the East Africa Protectorate were defined:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 11th day of June, 1920, and entitled the Kenya (Annexation) Order in Council, 1920, the territories comprised in the East Africa Protectorate, save and excepting only such territories therein included as form part of the dominions of His Highness the Sultan of Zanzibar, were annexed to and now form part of His Majesty's dominions and are known as the Colony of Kenya:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 13th day of August, 1920, and entitled the Kenya Protectorate Order in Council, 1920,

it is provided that the territories comprised in the East Africa Protectorate other than those so annexed as aforesaid shall be known as the Protectorate of Kenya:

And whereas it is desirable that the territories referred to in the said Orders in Council shall be more particularly defined:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Kenya Colony and Protectorate (Boundaries) Order in Council, 1921.

2. The limits of this Order are the territories comprised in the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya which include the following:—

(1) The territories comprised in the Protectorate of Kenya are bounded on the East by the Indian Ocean, on the North by the northern branch of the Tana River, on the West by a line following the line of coast at a distance of 10 sea miles from high-water mark, and on the South by the Tanganyika Territory. The Protectorate of Kenya includes Kau and Kipini, the Island of Lamu, and the Station of Kismayu with a radius landward of 10 sea miles, and all adjacent islands between the rivers Uмба and Tana.

(2) The territories comprised in the Colony of Kenya are bounded on the East by the Protectorate of Kenya and the Indian Ocean, on the North-East by the Juba river and the South-Western boundary of the Italian sphere, on the North by the Abyssinian frontier, on the West by the Uganda Protectorate and Lake Victoria Nyanza and on the South by Tanganyika Territory, and includes all adjacent islands between the Rivers Tana and Juba and in Lake Victoria Nyanza.

3.—(1) The Governor may, with the approval of the Secretary of State by Proclamation, divide the territories within the limits of this Order into Provinces or Districts in such manner and with such sub-divisions as may be convenient for purposes of administration describing the boundaries thereof and assigning the names thereto.

(2) If a question arises whether any place is or is not within any Province or District and such question does not appear to be determined by any such Proclamation or other evidence it shall be referred to the Governor and a certificate under his hand and seal shall be conclusive on the question and judicial notice shall be taken thereof.

And whereas the said Act and Regulations have been amended by certain other Acts and Regulations, which Acts and Regulations have been extended to the Isle of Man by Orders in Council, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Regulations have been further amended by Order in Council dated the 24th day of March, 1921:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Order in Council of the 24th day of March, 1921, shall extend to the Isle of Man.

**W**HEREAS by Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by Section 2 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, it is (amongst other things) provided that, if a majority of the whole Council of a Borough agree to petition, and the Council thereupon petition, the King for the alteration of the number and boundaries of the Wards of the Borough, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, from time to time, by Order in Council, to fix the number of Wards into which the Borough shall be divided, and that the Borough shall be divided into that number of Wards, and that where an Order in Council has been so made the Secretary of State shall appoint a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for determining the boundaries of the Wards and apportioning the Councillors among them:

And whereas a majority of the whole Council of the Borough of Croydon did, on the 11th day of October, 1920, agree to petition, and the Council of the said Borough thereupon petitioned, His Majesty for the alteration of the number and boundaries of the Wards of the said Borough:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 21st day of December, 1920, to fix the number of Wards into which the Borough of Croydon should be henceforth divided, and to order and direct that the number of the said Wards should be fourteen:

And whereas on the 10th day of January, 1921, the Right Honourable Edward Shortt, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did appoint Willoughby Jardine, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for determining the boundaries of such Wards, and for apportioning the Councillors of the said Borough among such Wards:

And whereas by Section 30 (5) of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, it is provided that, in case of alteration of Wards, the Commissioner shall so apportion among the altered Wards the Councillors for those Wards as to provide for their continuing to represent as large a number as possible of their former constituents:

And whereas the said Commissioner has accordingly prepared the following Scheme, dated the 16th day of March, 1921:—

“A line commencing at a point in the Borough Boundary at its junction with the centre of the Public Footpath or Bridle-way known as Green Lane, proceeding thence in a northerly and easterly direction along the said Borough Boundary, to and along Crown Lane, Crown Hill, Central Hill, Westow Hill, Church Road, Lansdowne Place, Fox Hill, crossing Auckland Road and Maberley Road and continuing to a point opposite the centre of the pathway on the north-west side of the South Norwood Lake, proceeding thence in a south-westerly direction along the said pathway to and crossing the grounds of the South Norwood Club, to and along the south-west side of the House and Premises known as No. 2 Auckland Road, to and along the centre of Auckland Road to and along the centre of the side of a proposed new Road to be called Spofforth Road (leading from Auckland Road to South Norwood Hill) to and along the centre of Ross Road to Wharnccliffe Road, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centres of Wharnccliffe Road and Grange Road to a point opposite the Public Footpath leading from Grange Road to Norbury Road, thence in a south-westerly and north-westerly direction along the centre of the said Footpath to and along the centres of Norbury Road, the north side of Beulah Crescent and along the centres of Osborne Road and Northwood Road to and along the Public Footpath or Bridle-way known as Green Lane to the point of commencement.

“(2) NORBURY WARD.

“A line commencing at a point in the Borough Boundary at its junction with the



centre of Galpins Road, proceeding thence in a northerly direction along the said Borough Boundary to a point at its junction with the Public Footpath or Bridle-way known as Green Lane, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of the said Green Lane, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of the new road to be called County Road to and crossing Norbury Avenue to and along the L.B. & S.C. Railway (Croydon and Balham line) to a point opposite the centre of Braemar Avenue to and along the centre of Braemar Avenue to and along the centre of Bridport Road to and along the centre of Warwick Road and crossing London Road, thence along the centre of Galpins Road to the point of commencement.

“(3) WEST THORNTON WARD.

“A line commencing at a point in the Borough Boundary at the junction of Mitcham Road and the Parliamentary Boundary between the North and South Divisions of the Borough, proceeding thence in a north-easterly direction along the said Borough Boundary to its junction with the centre of Galpins Road, thence along the centre of Galpins Road, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of London Road to and along the centre of Malvern Road, Beverstone Road and Colliers Water Lane to Brigstock Road, thence along the centre of Brigstock Road to and along the centres of Frant Road and Queen's Road to Pawson's Road, where it joins the Parliamentary Boundary between the North and South Divisions of the Borough, thence in a south-westerly direction along the said Boundary and the centre of Queen's Road to and along the centres of St. Saviour's Road, Cameron Road and Campbell Road to London Road and along the centre of London Road to Canterbury Road, thence along the centres of Canterbury Road and Mitcham Road to the point of commencement.

“(4) BENSAM MANOR WARD.

“A line commencing at a point in Queen's Road at the junction with Pawson's Road and on the Parliamentary Boundary between the North and South Divisions of the Borough, proceeding thence in a north-westerly direction along the centres of Queen's Road, Frant Road and Brigstock Road, to and along the centre of Colliers Water Lane to and along the centre of Beverstone Road, thence along the centre of Malvern Road to and along the centre of London Road to Warwick Road, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centres of Warwick Road to and along Bridport Road to and along Braemar Avenue to the L.B. & S.C. Railway (Croydon and Balham Line), thence in a south-easterly direction along the said Railway to Whitehorse Road where it joins the aforesaid Parliamentary Boundary, thence in a south-westerly direction along the said Boundary through the centres of Whitehorse Road to and along Pawson's Road to the point of commencement.

“(5) THORNTON HEATH WARD.

“A line commencing at a point in Whitehorse Road on the Parliamentary Boundary between the North and South Divisions of the Borough and at the junction of the L.B. & S.C. Railway (Croydon and Balham Line), proceeding thence in a north-westerly direction along the said Railway to a point opposite the centre of the new Road to be called County Road, thence in a north-easterly direction to

and along the centre of the said Road to and crossing Parchmore Road, thence along the centre of Northwood Road to Osborne Road, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centres of Osborne Road, north side of Beulah Crescent and Norbury Road to and along, in a north-easterly direction, the Public Footpath leading from Norbury Road to Grange Road, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centres of Grange Road to and along Wharncliffe Road and Canham Road, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centres of Whitehorse Lane and Whitehorse Road to the point of commencement.

“(6) SOUTH NORWOOD WARD.

“A line commencing at a point in the Borough Boundary at its junction with the centre of Harrington Road, proceeding thence in a south-westerly direction along the centres of Harrington Road, Portland Road, to and along the centres of Stanger Road and Clifford Road to Norwood Junction Station on the L.B. & S.C. Railway, thence along the said Railway (London and South Croydon Line) (part of which is on the Parliamentary Boundary between the North and South Divisions of the Borough) to a point on the Croydon and Balham Line of the said Railway, 575 yards or thereabouts (measured in a southerly direction) from Selhurst Railway Bridge, thence in a north-westerly direction along the said Croydon and Balham Line and the said Parliamentary Boundary to Whitehorse Road, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centres of Whitehorse Road and Whitehorse Lane to and along Canham Road to and along Ross Road to and crossing South Norwood Hill to and along the centre of the side of a proposed new Road to be called Spofforth Road (leading from South Norwood Hill to Auckland Road) thence along Auckland Road to and along the south-eastern boundary of the House and Premises known as No. 2 Auckland Road and crossing the grounds of the South Norwood Club, to and along the centre of the pathway on the north-west side of the South Norwood Lake to the Borough Boundary thence in a south-easterly direction along the Borough Boundary to the point of commencement.

“(7) WOODSIDE WARD.

“A line commencing at a point in the Borough Boundary at the eastern end of the Parliamentary Boundary between the North and South Divisions of the Borough and at the intersection of the S.E. & C. Railway (Mid-Kent Line) with the said Borough Boundary, proceeding thence in a south-westerly direction along the said Parliamentary Boundary and Railway to a point 450 yards or thereabouts from Addiscombe Road Station thence in a north-westerly direction along the said Parliamentary Boundary and on the north-east side of White's Mineral Water Manufactory to Morland Road, thence following the line of the old Norbury Brook (now culverted) at the rear of the premises on the east side of Jesmond Road, the south-western Boundary of a Building Estate, and the north-eastern side of the Davidson Road Council Schools to and crossing Davidson Road to the L.B. and S.C. Railway (London and South Croydon Line) at a point 41 yards or thereabouts south-west of the Norwood Fork Signal Box, thence in a north-easterly direction along the said Railway to Norwood Junction Station, thence in an

easterly direction along the centres of Clifford Road, Stanger Road, Portland Road to and along Harrington Road to the Borough Boundary, thence in a south-easterly direction along the said Borough Boundary to the point of commencement.

“(8) EAST WARD.

“A line commencing at a point in the Borough Boundary at the east end of the Parliamentary Boundary between the North and South Divisions of the Borough and at the intersection of the S.E. and C. Railway (Mid-Kent Line) proceeding thence in a southerly direction along the said Borough Boundary to Coombe Road, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Coombe Road, to Coombe Road Bridge over the L.B. and S.C. Railway (London and South Croydon Line), thence in a northerly direction along the said Railway to East Croydon Bridge at the junction of George Street and Addiscombe Road, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Addiscombe Road to Outram Road, thence in a northerly direction along the centres of Outram Road, Nicholson Road to and crossing Grant Road, thence along the south-western ends of Capri Road and Dalmally Road to and crossing the S.E. and C. Railway at a point 450 yards or thereabouts from Addiscombe Road Station, where it joins the Parliamentary Boundary between the North and South Divisions of the Borough, thence in a north-easterly direction along the said Railway and Parliamentary Boundary to the point of commencement.

“(9) ADDISCOMBE WARD.

“A line commencing at a point on the L.B. and S.C. Railway (London and South Croydon Line) 41 yards or thereabouts south-west of the Norwood Fork Signal Box and on the Parliamentary Boundary between the North and South Divisions of the Borough, proceeding thence in a south-easterly direction across the said Railway and Sidings to Davidson Road, thence following the line of the Old Norbury Brook (now culverted) along the north-east side of Davidson Road Council Schools and premises, the south-west side of a Building Estate, to and along the rear of the premises on the east side of Jesmond Road to Morland Road and along the north-east Boundary of White's Mineral Water Manufactory to and crossing the S.E. and C. Railway at a point 450 yards or thereabouts from Addiscombe Road Station, thence crossing the south-western ends of Dalmally Road and Capri Road to and crossing Grant Road, thence along the centres of Nicholson Road and Outram Road to Addiscombe Road, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Addiscombe Road to East Croydon Bridge at the junction of Addiscombe Road and George Street, thence in a north-easterly direction along the L.B. and S.C. Railway (London and South Croydon Line) to the point of commencement.

“(10) WHITEHORSE MANOR WARD.

“A line commencing at a point in Cameron Road at the Junction Road with Lodge Road and on the Parliamentary Boundary between the North and South Divisions of the borough, proceeding thence in a north-easterly direction along the said Boundary and the centre of St. Saviour's Road, Queen's Road to and along Pawson's Road and Whitehorse Road to the

L.B. and S.C. Railway at the Whitehorse Road Bridge (Croydon and Balham Line), thence in a south-easterly direction along the said Boundary and Railway to a point 575 yards or thereabouts from Selhurst Railway Bridge, thence in a south-westerly direction along the said Railway (Croydon and Epsom Line) to St. James' Road, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centres of St. James' Road and Lodge Road to the point of commencement.

“(11) BROAD GREEN WARD.

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Henry Luke, Bishop of Chester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said Benefice of Rainow with a portion of the said Benefice of Saltersford cum Kettleshulme and further to inquire into and report upon an union of the said Benefice of Taxal with the remaining portion of the said Benefice of Saltersford cum Kettleshulme duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Chester and therein recommended the severance from the said Benefice of Saltersford cum Kettleshulme of so much of the Benefice and New Parish of Saltersford cum Kettleshulme as is included in the township of Kettleshulme, and the union of the portion so severed to the contiguous Benefice and Parish of Taxal, and therein further recommended the union of the remaining portion of the said Benefice of Saltersford cum Kettleshulme to the neighbouring Benefice of Rainow, and the terms for effecting the said two unions and the said Bishop of Chester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefices of Rainow and Taxal are now full, the Reverend Edward Hamer Hughes Davies being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Rainow, and the Reverend Samuel Evans being the present Incumbent of Taxal, and the said Benefice of Saltersford cum Kettleshulme is now vacant:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Henry Luke, Bishop of Chester (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That a portion of the said Benefice of Saltersford cum Kettleshulme, that is to say so much of the said New Parish of Saltersford cum Kettleshulme as is included in and forms part of the township of Kettleshulme shall be severed from the remaining portion of the same New Parish of Saltersford cum Kettleshulme, and for the purpose of the union of such severed portion with the Benefice and Parish of Taxal as hereinafter recommended and for the purpose of the union of the remaining portion of the said Benefice of Saltersford cum Kettleshulme with the Benefice and New Parish of Rainow as hereinafter recommended such severed portion of the Benefice of Saltersford cum Kettleshulme shall be deemed to be a separate Benefice and Parish.

"3. That the Church of the Parish of Rainow shall be the Parish Church of the United Benefice of Rainow with Saltersford and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Rainow shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish of Rainow with Saltersford.

"4. That the severed portion of the said Benefice of Saltersford cum Kettleshulme and the said Benefice of Taxal shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Act provided, under the style of 'The United Benefice of Taxal with Kettleshulme.'

"5. That with the consent of the said Edward Hamer Hughes Davies testified by his signing this Scheme (1) the severance of the portion of the Benefice of Saltersford with Kettleshulme and the union of the severed portion with the Benefice of Taxal and (2) the union of the remaining portion of the said Benefice of Saltersford with Kettleshulme with the Benefice of Rainow shall, if the said Benefice of Taxal be then vacant, take effect upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, or if the said Benefice of Taxal be not then vacant, then the said severance and unions shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Taxal.

That upon the said unions taking effect the whole of the glebe lands at present belonging to the said Benefice of Saltersford cum Kettleshulme shall become and be part of the endowments of the said United Benefice of Rainow with Saltersford, and all other the endowments at present belonging to the said Benefice of Saltersford cum Kettleshulme (including the Parsonage House and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith) shall become and be part of the endowments of the said United Benefice of Taxal with Kettleshulme.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to

the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been published locally in the manner prescribed in the Statutory Rules made under the said Act and also transmitted in the manner so prescribed to the Patrons affected together with a Notice in each case requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas neither of the two Benefices affected by the said Scheme is situate in a City or Municipal Borough:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chester.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of one undivided moiety of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure



(hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Healing, in the County of Lincoln and in the Diocese of Lincoln:

"Whereas the said undivided moiety of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Healing is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in Edward Shuldham Chesney, of Number 51, South King Street, Manchester, Solicitor:

"And whereas the said Edward Shuldham Chesney is desirous that the whole of the said undivided moiety of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Healing now vested in him as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Manchester for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend William, now Bishop of Manchester, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness he, the said William, Bishop of Manchester, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend William Shuckburgh, now Bishop of Lincoln, has also executed this Scheme in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Healing which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or district in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Healing:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), and with the consent of the said Edward Shuldham Chesney (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said William, Bishop of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole of the said undivided moiety of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Healing now vested in him, the said Edward Shuldham Chesney as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said William, Bishop of Manchester, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said William, Bishop of Manchester, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

The following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the Urban District Council of Acton, in the county of Middlesex, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:—

Whereas by the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885, it is enacted that where a Petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to the Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter, the said Committee of Council may settle a Scheme for the purposes in the said Acts named and containing such provisions as are in the said Acts particularised.

And whereas in the month of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, certain Inhabitant Householders of the Urban District of Acton, in the county of Middlesex, petitioned His Majesty the King praying for the grant of a Charter of Incorporation.

And whereas the said Petition for a Charter was referred to the Committee of Council, and it was proposed by the Charter to create the Urban District of Acton hereinafter described a Municipal Borough, and to extend to such Borough, and to the inhabitants thereof, all the powers, privileges and provisions of the Municipal Corporations Acts.

And whereas under and by virtue of the Local Government Act, 1858, the Local Board for the District of Acton (hereinafter called "the Local Board") was in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six constituted and became invested with various powers and duties, and the Local Board was constituted the Urban Sanitary Authority for the Local Government District of the Parish of Acton with twelve elective Members.

And whereas under and by virtue of the Local Government Act, 1894, the Local Board became the Urban District Council for the Urban District of Acton (hereinafter called "the District Council"), and the number of Members was increased from 12 to 15.

And whereas under and by virtue of the Public Health (Interments) Act, 1879, construed as one with the Public Health Act, 1875, the Acton Local Board as the Local Authority for the Urban District of Acton acquired land and constructed and maintained

a Cemetery and the District Council as such Local Authority as aforesaid are the owners in fee simple of certain lands within the District of the said Council, which said lands (in part) are laid out and used for the purposes of a Cemetery.

And whereas tables of fees duly allowed and approved in accordance with the provisions of the Burial Acts are now in force within the District of the said Council.

And whereas by an Order dated the 9th day of March, 1906, and finally approved on the 8th day of May, 1906, the Middlesex County Council divided the District of Acton into four Wards named "North-East Ward," "North-West Ward," "South-East Ward," and "South-West Ward," and increased the numbers of Members of the District Council from 15 to 16.

And whereas by an Order dated the 1st day of October, 1909, and finally approved on the 18th of February, 1910, the Middlesex County Council altered the boundaries of the said four Wards of the District of Acton and increased the number of members of the District Council from 16 to 24.

And whereas the Education Act, 1902, has come into operation in the District of Acton, and the District Council thereof is now the Local Education Authority within the said District for the purposes of Part III. of the said Act, and a Scheme for the constitution of an Education Committee (revoking a previous Scheme made by the District Council) was made by the District Council on the 9th day of September, 1910, and was approved by the Board of Education on the 11th day of October, 1910.

And whereas the Local Government Board under and by virtue of Sections 33 and 34 of the Local Government Act, 1894, have made the following Orders affecting the District (that is to say):—

(a) On the 4th day of March, 1897, an Order conferring upon the District Council the power of appointing Overseers of the poor for the Parish of Acton.

(b) On the 7th day of April, 1897, an Order transferring to the District Council the power of appointing and revoking the appointment of Assistant Overseers for the said Parish and conferring upon the District Council the powers of a Parish Council under paragraphs (c. I.) and (c. III.) of Sub-Section (1) of Section 6, and paragraph (d) of Sub-section (1) of Section 8 of the said Act of 1894.

(c) On the 7th day of November, 1899, an Order conferring upon the District Council the powers of a Parish Council under paragraphs (h) and (i) of Sub-Section (1) of Section 8 of the said Act of 1894.

(d) On the 7th day of April, 1897, an Order under Section 34 of the said Act of 1894 conferring upon the District Council the powers of the Vestry under the third and fourth Sections of the Poor Rate Assessment and Collection Act, 1869.

(e) On the 3rd day of April, 1903, an Order conferring on the District Council the powers of a Parish Council under paragraph (a) of Sub-Section (1) of Section 8 of the said Act of 1894.

And whereas the County Council of Middlesex, by an Order dated the 25th day of April, 1895, and made under Section 23, Sub-section

6, of the Local Government Act, 1894, directed that the Councillors for the Urban District of Acton should retire together on the 15th day of April, 1898, and in every third year thereafter, which said Order or direction was rescinded by an Order of the Middlesex County Council, dated the 7th day of August, 1915, directing that one-third of the Members of the Council retire every year.

And whereas the County Council of Middlesex, by an Order dated the 25th day of April, 1918, and made in pursuance of the "Representation of the People Act, 1918," divided the County into Polling Districts and appointed Polling Places.

And whereas the following Acts have been adopted by the Local Board and by the District Council, and are now in force within the District of the District Council, that is to say:—

1. The Infectious Diseases (Notification) Act, 1889; adopted on the 3rd of December, 1889.

2. The Infectious Diseases (Prevention) Act, 1890, adopted on the 7th day of November, 1893.

And whereas by an Order of the District Council, dated the 16th day of January, 1912, and approved by the Local Government Board on the 25th day of January, 1912, the Infectious Diseases (Notification) Act, 1889, was made applicable in the District of the Council to the infectious diseases of Acute Polyomyelitis and Cerebro-Spinal Fever.

And whereas by an Order of the Minister of Health, dated the 17th day of February, 1921, Section 50 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, which relates to the Provision of an Ambulance, was declared to be in force in the Urban District of Acton.

And whereas by the London County Council (Acton Sewage) Act, 1898, provision was made to prevent or regulate the discharge of Sewage into the Metropolitan Main Drainage System for the District of Acton.

And whereas by the Acton Improvement Act, 1904, further powers were conferred on the District Council with regard to the supply of electricity and the improvement, health, local government and finance of the District and other purposes.

And whereas by the Acton Sewage Act, 1905, the District Council were authorised to construct and maintain sewerage and sewage outfall works and to make further provisions for the admission of sewage into the Metropolitan Main Drainage System.

And whereas by the Acton Electric Lighting Order, 1891 (confirmed by the Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation (No. 4) Act, 1891), the Acton Local Board were granted certain powers as to Electric Lighting.

And whereas by the Metropolitan Electric Supply Company (Acton District) Act, 1905 (after reciting an Agreement dated 20th February, 1904, between the Metropolitan Electric Supply Company Limited and the District Council for the supply of Electrical energy in bulk to the District Council), empowered the Company to enter into and carry into effect Agreements with the District Council with respect to the supply of electrical energy.

And whereas by the Metropolitan Electric Supply Company (Various Powers) Act, 1905, the Company were authorised to sell and transmit electric energy to authorised distributors within the County of Middlesex, including the District of Acton.

And whereas by the Metropolitan Electric Supply Company (Acton District) Act, 1911 (confirming an Agreement dated 22nd November, 1910, made between the District Council and the Metropolitan Electric Supply Company, Limited, for the transfer of their Electrical Undertaking to the Company for a term of 42 years from the 31st March, 1911) the Electrical Undertaking of the District Council was transferred to the Metropolitan Electric Supply Company, Limited, upon terms and for the period and subject to the conditions and stipulations mentioned therein.

And whereas, under the provisions of the Shops Act, 1912, the District Council have from time to time made certain Closing, Half-holiday and other Orders, which (where necessary) were confirmed by one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

And whereas the County Council of Middlesex have made certain Bye-laws for the good rule and government of the Administrative County of Middlesex, and the same are now in force in the Urban District of Acton.

And whereas, by the Acton Education (Compulsory Purchase) Order, 1919, which was confirmed by the Board of Education so far as it relates to land marked "A.1" in the Schedule, on the 8th November, 1920, the District Council, being the Local Education Authority, put in force the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of land otherwise than by agreement.

And whereas the District Council is a Local Authority within the meaning of the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885.

And whereas this Scheme was, before being settled by the Committee of Council, referred for consideration to His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, to the Minister of Health, to the Board of Trade, to the Minister of Transport, and to the Board of Education.

And whereas it is expedient that a Scheme should be made and settled containing the provisions hereinafter set forth.

Now, therefore, pursuant to the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby direct, order and declare as follows:—

#### *Preliminary Provisions.*

1. This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as "The Borough of Acton Scheme, 1921."

2. The Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Acton are in this Scheme referred to as "The Corporation."

#### *Commencement of Scheme.*

3. This Scheme, when confirmed, shall come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough created by the said Charter, and this Scheme shall be construed and applied as if it had been dated and confirmed by Parliament or Order in Council on the day before the day of the said first meeting, and everything thereunder shall be done and had accordingly. This date is hereinafter referred to as "the commencement of this Scheme." So far as may be necessary this Scheme shall operate retrospectively.

4. From and after the commencement of this Scheme the Municipal Borough created by the said Charter shall be placed within the jurisdiction of the Corporation acting by the Council of the Borough as the Sanitary Authority of the said Borough.

5. The District Council, their powers, duties, rights, obligations and privileges, shall continue and be deemed to have continued to exist until the commencement of this Scheme, unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the grant of the said Charter or the creation of the said Borough. From and after the commencement of this Scheme the District Council shall be, and the same is hereby, abolished, and the powers, duties, rights, obligations and privileges thereof shall cease and determine.

6. The Tables of fees duly allowed and approved in accordance with the provisions of the Burial Acts shall continue in force in regard to the Cemetery until the same are repealed, varied, revised or altered by the Council of the Borough, with such approval as is required by law.

7. All the jurisdiction, powers, rights, duties and property vested in or possessed by the District Council, or by any person or body in trust for them or any of their members as such (and not otherwise dealt with or transferred by or under any part of this Scheme) shall vest in the Corporation and shall be exercised, held and applied for the Municipal and Public purposes of the said Borough.

8. The hereinbefore recited Orders of the Local Government Board under Sections 33 and 34 of the Local Government Act, 1894, dated respectively the 4th day of March, 1897, 7th day of April, 1897, 7th day of November, 1899, and 3rd day of April, 1903, shall

continue in force and effect in the Borough and in favour of the Corporation as fully as they have been in the Urban District of Acton and in favour of the Acton Urban District Council.

9. All duties and liabilities which immediately before the commencement of this Scheme attached to and were enforceable against the District Council or the property thereof, shall attach to and be enforceable against the Corporation.

10. Any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy in respect of any debt, liability, penalty or forfeiture due to or incurred by or on behalf of the District Council before the commencement of this Scheme may be continued, prosecuted or enforced by or against the Corporation.

11. The term "property" in this Scheme means and includes all property real and personal, and all things in action and all right of common and commonable rights and rights to toll, and all franchises, privileges and rights which have any pecuniary value, and all charters, records, deeds, books, and documents and all rights and all claims to relief and all rights to avoid contracts or otherwise, and includes any estate or interest legal or equitable in or in respect of any property so defined.

12. The District Fund and General District Rate of the Borough of Acton shall for all purposes whatsoever (subject to the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, with respect to the Borough Fund and Borough Rate and Watch Rate respectively) take the place of and be substituted for the District Fund and General District Rate respectively of the District Council, and all sums of money respectively payable to, from or out of, and all liabilities charged upon or attaching to the District Fund and General District Rate of the said Urban District shall (subject as aforesaid) be paid to, from, or out of, and shall be charged upon the said District Fund and General District Rate of the said Borough respectively.

and under any other Statute, Order, Bye-law, Regulation, Power or Authority shall pass to devolve upon, be exercisable by or against, vested in or attached to the Corporation acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the Borough, and from and after the commencement of this Scheme, the Corporation shall be and continue the legal successors of the Urban District Council of Acton for all purposes. The Town Clerk of the Borough shall be substituted for and perform the duties of the Clerk to the District Council.

14. Any Bye-laws, Orders and Regulations under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875, and the Incorporated Acts and provisions, the Education Acts, the Dairies, Cowsheds and Milkshops Order, the Shops Act, and any other Public General Act or Local Act and any Table of Fees and charges under the Burial Acts, and any other Local or Public General Act in force within the Urban District of Acton at the commencement of this Scheme, shall, unless duly repealed, revoked or varied, continue in force and have operation in the Borough in like manner and with like effect, as if the Corporation, acting by the Council and their Officers, and the Borough, were referred to therein instead of the Local Board or the District Council (as the case may be) and their Officers and the District. Provided always that the bye-laws with respect to New Streets and Buildings and with respect to Slaughter-houses in force in the Urban District shall be continued in force in the Borough for a period of two years only after this Scheme has come into operation unless repealed before the expiration of that period.

15. The Bye-laws for the good rule and government of the Administrative County of Middlesex so far as they are in force in the Urban District of Acton shall continue in force and be enforced within the Municipal Borough of Acton until the expiration of two years from the commencement of this Scheme, or until other Bye-laws for good rule and government made by the Corporation shall have come into force, whichever shall first occur.

16. As soon as may be convenient after the commencement of this Scheme, the Council of the Borough shall prepare and submit to the Board of Education a Scheme for an Education Committee for the Borough, in accordance with the provisions of Section 17 of the Education Act, 1902.

17. Until such Scheme shall have been approved by the Board of Education, the members of the Education Committee of the District Council who are in office immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall be deemed to have been appointed, and shall be the Education Committee for the Borough of Acton.

18. As soon as the Scheme of the Borough Council shall have been approved by the Board of Education, the Education Committee appointed by the District Council shall be dissolved and cease to exist.



*Saving for Rates, &c.*

19. Notwithstanding the incorporation of the Borough and the provisions of this Scheme, all rates, assessments, Orders, Apportionments, Notices, compositions, charges, mortgages, contracts, leases, conveyances, deeds, documents, acts, matters and things made, entered into, given or done, before the commencement of this Scheme, by, to or with reference to the District Council, shall be as good, valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for, against and with reference to the Corporation as if the same had been done, entered into, or done by, to or with reference to the Corporation instead of the District Council, and may be proceeded on or enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the Corporation instead of the District Council had been party or privy to the same and had been named or referred to therein.

20. In case any Officer of the District Council who shall have been employed by the District Council shall not be employed by the Council of the said Borough, nor offered by the said Council a position in their employ of a similar character and of an equal value to that formerly held by him, he shall be entitled to be paid by way of compensation for the loss of his position out of the funds of or under the control of the Corporation acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority for the said Borough, and the amount to be paid in each case shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of Section 120 of the Local Government Act, 1888, and Sub-sections (1) to (7), inclusive, of that Section, shall apply as if they formed part of this Scheme, with the substitution of the words "Borough Council" for "County Council" and "this Scheme" for "this Act," and with such other modifications as are necessary to make them applicable hereto.

21. Provided, nevertheless, that if any such Officer be so employed by the said Corporation and discharged by them (otherwise than for misconduct) within four years of the commencement of this Scheme he shall be entitled to compensation in the same manner as if he had not been employed by the said Corporation. Provided that the term "Officer" shall include only persons employed by the said Council whose salaries or emoluments are payable at intervals of not less than one month and no other persons.

22. The accounts of the District Council and their officers shall be made up to the date of the commencement of this Scheme, and shall be (as soon as conveniently may be) audited by the District Auditor in like manner, and subject to the like powers, duties, provisions and right of appeal as if the Charter had not been granted and the provisions of Sections 247 and 250 of "The Public Health Act, 1875" as amended by the "District Auditors' Act, 1879," and any regulations duly issued by the Local Government Board or the Minister of Health with respect to the audit of accounts of Local Boards or Urban District Councils and of their officers shall apply to such audit; and the provisions of this Scheme with respect to the District Council shall be construed so as to admit of such exceptions as may be necessary to enable such audit to be duly made, but such exceptions shall be strictly limited in time, extent, character and operation to the

purposes of such audit; any money certified to be due from any person by the District Auditor at such audit shall be paid by such person to the Treasurer of the Borough.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE  
EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF TYPIST  
IN THE CIVIL SERVICE.

*\*\* These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.*

1. The limits of age for this situation are 18 and 28. If an Examination begins in one of the first four months of any year Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st day of January in that year. If an Examination begins in one of the second four months of any year Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st day of May in that year. If an Examination begins in one of the last four months of any year Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st day of September in that year.

In reckoning age for competition, persons who have served in any civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

Persons transferred to situations in the Post Office from a Telephone Company or Municipal Telephone Undertaking, on the absorption of such Company or Undertaking by the Post Office, may reckon, as if it were service in a situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, their continuous service in the Post Office, as well as so much of their previous continuous service in the Telephone Company or Undertaking (or in any Telephone Company or Municipal Telephone Undertaking previously absorbed by it) as was rendered in situations for which a Civil Service Certificate is ordinarily required.

2. At each Examination the number of Candidates to be selected will be such as may from time to time be fixed.

3. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—

- (a) That they are unmarried or widows.
- (b) That they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

No person will be eligible who is not a natural-born British subject, and the child of a father also a natural-born British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of a person serving in a civil situation to

which she was admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. Persons who have entered upon or completed a course of education or training for the occupation of teacher, on account of which grants are payable from the Exchequer, will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with the rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:—

- 1. English.
- 2. Arithmetic.
- 3. Typewriting.
- 4. One of the following:—French, German, Shorthand.

*No Candidate will be regarded as qualified who does not pass to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners in English and in Typewriting.*

The Civil Service Commissioners may, at their discretion, restrict the examination in Typewriting to such a number of Candidates at the head of the list resulting from the marks awarded for the work in the other subjects as they may think fit. The marks awarded for Typewriting to the Candidates examined in that subject will be added to the marks awarded to those same Candidates for their work in the three other subjects. The examination in Typewriting, as well as the examination in the other subjects, will be held at such times and places as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.

6. It will rest with the Civil Service Commissioners to determine the Departments to which the successful Candidates shall be assigned. In making the assignments the Commissioners will be guided by the requirements of the public service and will consult, so far as possible, the wishes of Departments for the assignment of particular Candidates who have served under them. Subject to these conditions, the wishes of Candidates will, where possible, be respected.

7. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

8. A fee of five shillings will be required from every Candidate attending the Examination.

The Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination will be held in London, Edinburgh and Dublin, under the foregoing Regulations, commencing on the 21st September, 1921.

No person will be admitted to Examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 11th August, an application, in the Candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

## GLASGOW (MERKLANDS WHARF) - ORDER OF 1921 (No. 3).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf hereby orders as follows:—

### *Revocation.*

1. The Glasgow (Merklands Wharf) Order of 1921 (No. 2) is hereby revoked.

### *Definition of Irish Animals Landing Place.*

2. All that space at Merklands situate in the county of Lanark which is coloured green on the plan sealed by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries for the purposes of this Order, and deposited at the Ministry, is hereby defined as a Landing Place for Irish Animals.

### *Definition of Foreign Animals Wharf.*

3. All that space at Merklands situate in the county of Lanark which is coloured pink on the plan referred to in Article 2 of this Order is hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Wharf for the purposes of the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and any Order of the Minister thereunder.

4. This Order may be cited as the GLASGOW (MERKLANDS WHARF) ORDER OF 1921 (No. 3).

### PRESTON CORPORATION ELECTRICITY SUPPLY.
