The following Statute made by the Governing Body of University College, Oxford, on the 27th day of May, 1921, and sealed on the 30th day of June, 1921, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877."

Ex parte the Master and Fellows of the College of the Great Hall of the University, commonly called University College, in the University of Oxford.

STATUTE to amend the Ordinance in relation to the Travelling Fellowships of the Foundation of Dr. John Radcliffe, being Appendix I. of the Statutes made by the University of Oxford Commissioners acting in pursuance of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877; and subsequently from time to time legally amended, duly enacted at an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Master and Fellows of University College being the Governing Body of the said College, specially summoned for the purpose and holden on Saturday, April 23rd, 1921, and by adjournment on Fridays, May 6th, and 27th, and passed by the unanimous votes of those present, and voting, and now with the consent of the University as signified by Decree of Convocation of Tuesday, June

14th, 1921, submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council.

Whereas under the existing Ordinance in relation to the Travelling Fellowships of the Foundation of Dr. John Radcliffe forming Appendix I. to the Statutes of the College it is provided that there should be three such Fellowships of the annual value of £200 at least tenable for three years from the day of election; and further that any Radcliffe Travelling Fellow who after his election shall spend more than one year and six months in the whole within the United Kingdom shall thereupon vacate his Fellowship:

And whereas £200 is now an inadequate stipend for the purposes of the Radcliffe Travelling Fellowships and the tenure of the Fellowships for three years appears to be unnecessarily and inconveniently prolonged and a Fellowship of £300 tenable for two years with a pro rata reduction of the period of residence abroad is likely to prove a more effective and acceptable encouragement to study and research in Medical Science:

Now, therefore, we, the Master and Fellows of the College of the Great Hall of the University commonly called University College, in the University of Oxford, in virtue of the powers conferred upon us by section 54 of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and by Statute XI. of the Statutes of the College and all other powers enabling do alter and

amend the said Ordinance in the following manner:—

1. In clause I. we strike out the word "three" before the words "Fellowships to be called" and substitute therefor the word "two."

2. In clause 2 we strike out the words "two hundred pounds at least" and substitute therefor the words "three hundred pounds," and we strike out the word "three" before the word "years" and substitute therefor the word "two."

3. In clause 3 we strike out the word "above" before the words "named degree" and substitute therefor the word "last."

4. In clause 4 we strike out the words "two months before the expiration of the second year after the election of each Fellow" and substitute therefor the words "year by year," and we strike out the word "him" before the words "to the electors" and substitute therefor the words "each Fellow."

5. In clause 7 we strike out the words "one year and six months" and substitute therefor the words "nine months."

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Magdalen College, Oxford, on the 1st day of June, 1921, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

STATUTE to amend the existing Statutes of Magdalen College, in the University of Oxford, duly made at a General Meeting of the President and Fellows especially summoned for this purpose on the 1st day of June, 1921, and passed at that Meeting by the votes of two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, and submitted to His Majesty the King in Council.

Statute for Magdalen College made by the College under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877.

Preliminary.

This Statute is supplementary to the existing Statutes of the College, that is to say, the Statutes dated the 16th day of June, 1881, and the 1st day of July, 1881, made for the College by the University of Oxford Commissioners (hereinafter referred to as the Statutes of 1881), as altered by the Statutes dated the 10th day of August, 1888, the Statutes dated the 7th day of March, 1899, the Statutes dated the 15th day of September, 1902, the Statutes dated the 10th day of May, 1905, the Statutes dated the 31st day of May, 1910, the Statutes dated the 4th day of May, 1911, the Statutes dated the 24th day of June, 1913, the Statutes dated the 13th day of July, 1915, and the Statutes dated the 13th day of October, 1920, made by the College under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877.

It is hereby provided that any charges (including any increase of existing charges) imposed or authorized to be imposed on the revenues of the College, whether for College or for University purposes, by this amending Statute made by the College on June 1, 1921, and subsequently approved by His Majesty in Council, shall, in the event of any deficiency of the revenues of the College in any year, be postponed to any charges for University purposes imposed or authorized by any Statute in force on Nov. 30, 1919, and not subsequently repealed, or made by the College on or before Nov. 30, 1919, and subsequently approved by His Majesty in Council.

MAGDALEN COLLEGE.

Alteration of Statutes.

President.

In the clause numbered 2 of the Statutes of 1913 as to the President the words from "Any pension payable" to the end of the clause shall be struck out and the following words substituted:—

"Any pension payable to a retiring President under this Clause shall be paid out of Corporate Revenue."

Fellows.

1. The clause numbered 8 of the Statutes of 1920 as to Fellows and Fellowships shall be struck out and the following new clause shall be substituted:—

8. "Subject to any express provision in these Statutes, the value of all Fellowships shall not be less than £200 a year for each Fellowship, but the President and Fellows may at a Stated General Meeting, by a majority of not less than two-thirds of the votes of those present and voting, increase the value of any Fellowship, other than that of a Fellow by Examination, to a sum not exceeding £300 a year for each Fellowship."

2. In the clause numbered 32 of the Statutes of 1920 as to Fellows and Fellowships the words "£900 a year, exclusive of fees" shall be struck out in both places where they occur, and the following words shall, in each case, be substituted:—

"£1,200 a year exclusive of fees and of any further sum to which the person so elected shall be entitled under the Statute as to Income Tax."

3. In the clause numbered 48 of the Statutes of 1920 as to Fellows and Fellowships the words "£500 per annum" shall be struck out and the words "£600 a year" shall be substituted.

4. In the clause numbered 43 of the Statutes of 1920 as to Fellows and Fellowships the words "£200 per annum" shall be struck out and the words "£300 a year" shall be substituted.

5. In the Statutes of 1881 in clause 2 of Section XVII "Supplemental and Temporary Clauses" the words "£230 per annum" shall be struck out and the words "£400 per annum" shall be substituted.

Official Fellowships.

At the end of Clause IV, Section 4 (b) of the Statute of 1913 as to Tutorial Board, Tutors and Tuition Fund the following sub-clause shall be added and it is hereby enacted as follows:—"When less than 12 Official Fellowships are held by Deans, Tutors, or Lecturers of the College, the emoluments of any vacant Official Fellowships (including the sum

of £100 payable under clause 5 below to Tutors or Lecturers holding Official Fellowships) or such part of them as the College may from time to time decide, may, if the College so determine, be paid into the Tuition Fund so long as such Official Fellowships are vacant, provided that the total number of Official Fellowships held or treated as vacant under this Clause be not more than 13."

Pensions.

These Statutes are supplementary to the existing Statutes of the College and nothing therein provided shall be affected save in so far as it is necessary to give effect to the following enactments, that is to say:

1. Clause I (c) is hereby repealed and in its stead the following is hereby enacted:—

"No pension payable to a Tutor, Lecturer, or Domestic Bursar shall exceed the sum of £500 a year, and no pension payable to a Bursar of Estates shall exceed £600. Notwithstanding any of the conditions as to assessment and qualification set forth in this Statute or elsewhere the President and Fellows may at a General Meeting specially summoned, by a majority of not less than two-thirds of the votes of those present and voting, authorize payment to the ex-Tutors who are under the Statute of 1915 in receipt of pensions at the time of this Supplementary Statute of a further sum equivalent to 25 per cent. of the pensions payable to them under that Statute and to the ex-Bursar who is under the Statute of 1915 in receipt of a pension at the time of this Supplementary Statute of a further sum equivalent to 50 per cent. of the pension payable to him under the Statute of 1915."

2. In Clause I (h), instead of the words "£1,000 a year" shall be substituted the words "£1,500 a year."

3. In Clause I (i), after the words "Corporate Revenue of the College" shall be inserted the words "also to include, if the College shall so determine, any annual remuneration paid to him by another College in respect of services rendered by him as Tutor or Lecturer at that College with the sanction of the Tutorial Board, provided that such services do not qualify him for any pension provided by that College."

4. In Clause II (a), for the words "£200 a year" shall be substituted the words "£250 a year."

Grammar Schools.

1. In the clause numbered 3 of the Statutes of 1881 as to Grammar Schools the words "and no Fee shall be payable by them, or by the College on their behalf, for such instruction" shall be struck out.

2. The clause numbered 4 of the Statutes of 1881 as to Grammar Schools shall be repealed and the following new clause shall be substituted:—

"4. The appointment and dismissal of the Master and the Usher shall be vested in the President and Fellows upon the recommendation of the School Committee."

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE.

REMOVAL OF DIFFICULTIES (INSURANCE INDUSTRY SPECIAL SCHEME) ORDER, 1921.

The Unemployment Insurance (Removal of Difficulties) (Insurance Industry Special Scheme) Order, 1921, dated 30th June, 1921, made by the Minister of Labour under the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920 (10 & 11 Geo. 5, c. 30).

Whereas by Section 45 of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as the Act) it is among other things enacted that if any difficulty arises with respect to the constitution of special schemes made under Section 18 of the Act the Minister of Labour (hereinafter referred to as the Minister) with the consent of the Treasury may by order do anything which appears to him necessary or expedient for the constitution of such schemes, and that any such order may modify the provisions of the Act so far as may appear necessary or expedient for carrying the Order into effect.

And whereas in accordance with the provisions of Section 18 of the Act a Special Scheme called the Insurance Industry Unemployment Insurance Scheme (hereinafter referred to as the Scheme) has been made by an association of employers and employees in that industry.

And whereas the Scheme provides, among other things, that the Scheme shall come into force on the 4th day of July, 1921, and that for the purpose of determining the amount of out-of-work benefit to which under the Scheme a person insured thereunder is entitled after the 2nd day of July, 1922, the contributions paid in respect of him under the general provisions of the Act between the 8th day of November, 1920, and the day on which the Scheme comes into force shall be deemed to have been paid in respect of him under the Scheme, and that no account shall be taken of any unemployment benefit which may have been received by such person under the general

provisions of the Act between the two last mentioned days.

And whereas by reason of the provisions of sub-section (10) of Section 18 of the Act the sum necessary to provide for out-of-work benefit in respect of the contributions aforesaid cannot be paid into the body charged with the administration of the Scheme unless the Scheme comes into force on or before the 4th day of July, 1921.

And whereas the Scheme has been approved by a Special Order called the Unemployment Insurance (Insurance Industry Special Scheme) Order, 1921, made on the 24th day of June, 1921, by the Minister in exercise of the powers conferred on him by Section 18 of the Act.

And whereas by reason of sub-section (2) of Section 36 of the Act the said Special Order cannot come into force until it has been laid before each House of Parliament for a period of not less than twenty days during which the House is sitting.

And whereas it is not possible for the said periods of twenty days to elapse before the 4th day of July, 1921.

And whereas by reason of the premises a difficulty has arisen with respect to the constitution of the Scheme.

Now, therefore, the Minister by virtue of the powers hereinbefore recited and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf doth hereby with the consent of the Treasury make the following Order:—

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-section (2) of Section 36 of the Act the Insurance Industry Unemployment Insurance Scheme approved by the Unemployment Insurance (Insurance Industry Special Scheme) Order, 1921, dated 24th June, 1921, shall come into force on the 4th day of July, 1921, and the said Special Order shall come into force as a Provisional Special Order on the said 4th day of July, 1921.

Provided that if before the expiration of the twenty days during which the said Special Order is laid before each House of Parliament under the said sub-section either of those Houses presents an Address to His Majesty against the Order or any part thereof it shall thenceforth be void, but without prejudice to the validity of anything previously done thereunder or to the making of any new Order.

2. This Order may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance (Removal of Difficulties) (Insurance Industry Special Scheme) Order, 1921.

- (iii) Packing, unpacking, despatching, warehousing, portering, time-keeping, storing, stock-keeping;

but excluding the manufacture of boxes, canisters, or other containers.

In accordance with the Regulations with respect to the Constitution and Proceedings of the above-mentioned Trade Board, dated 11th July, 1921, the Trade Board shall consist of:—

Female Workers in Retail Bespoke Dress-
making effective as from 11th July, 1921.*

Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days the rates become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 17th July, 1921.

General Minimum Time-Rates.

Fully qualified Bodice, Skirt, Gown or Blouse Hands as defined in Part I, Section 1 (1) of the Schedule below, 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour.

Qualified Bodice, Skirt, Gown or Blouse Hands as defined in Part I, Section 1 (2) of the Schedule below, 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour.

All other Female Workers (except Learners and Homeworkers), 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour.

Homeworkers as defined in Part IV, Section 2 of the Schedule below, 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour.

Learners employed under conditions laid down by the Trade Board. See Part I, Section 2 below.

Piece-work Basis Time Rates.

Fully qualified Bodice, Skirt, Gown or Blouse Hands as defined in Part I, Section 1 (1) of the Schedule below, 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour.

Qualified Bodice, Skirt, Gown or Blouse Hands as defined in Section 1 (2) of the Schedule below, 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour.

All other Female Workers (except Homeworkers), 9½d. per hour.

Homeworkers as defined in Part IV, Section 2 of the Schedule below, 9½d. per hour.

Overtime Rates.—See part III of the Schedule below.

PART I.

General Minimum Time-Rates as varied for Female Workers in the Retail Bespoke Dressmaking Branch of the Trade.

SECTION I.

(1) Fully qualified or Senior Bodice, Skirt, Gown, or Blouse Hands, that is, Workers of 21 years of age and over:—

(a) Who have fulfilled the Learnership conditions set out in Part I, Section II (d) below, and have had not less than three years' subsequent experience in the retail bespoke dressmaking branch of the trade; and

(b) Who take bodices, skirts, gowns or blouses direct from the fitter in any establishment in which a fitter who does no making up is employed, and makes them up without supervision other than the general super-

vision of the fitter or of the workroom foreman or forewoman, 10½d. per hour.

(2) Qualified or Junior Bodice, Skirt, Gown or Blouse Hands, that is, workers of 19 years of age and over:—

(a) Who have fulfilled the Learnership conditions set out in Part I, Section II (d) below, and have had not less than one year's subsequent experience in the Retail Bespoke Dressmaking branch of the trade; and

(b) Who take bodices, skirts, gowns or blouses direct from the fitter in any establishment in which a fitter who does no making up is employed, and makes them up under the supervision of the fitter or the workroom foreman or forewoman, 9½d. per hour.

(3) (i) All other Female Workers (except Learners and Homeworkers) employed in the Retail Bespoke Dressmaking Branch of the Trade, 8½d. per hour.

(ii) Homeworkers employed in the Retail Bespoke Dressmaking Branch of the Trade, 8½d. per hour.

SECTION II.

(a) Learners as defined in Part IV, and employed in the Retail Bespoke Dressmaking Branch of the Trade under conditions laid down in Part IV of this Schedule.

(b) The General Minimum Time-Rates for Learners under 14 years of age shall be 6s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., 1½d. per hour, and from the age of 14 years they shall be entitled to the amount shown in Column I above as if they had commenced at 14.

(c) The advances to be given to Learners shall become due as from the first Monday in January and July of each year, the Learner being entitled to her first advance from the first Monday in January or July as the case may be, provided that she has been in the trade at least three months.

(d) A Learner shall cease to be a learner, and be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to her under Section I of this Part of this Schedule upon the fulfilment of the conditions appropriate to her as set out below:—

Age of entering upon Employment and Conditions.

Under 15 years of age the completion of not less than 3 years' employment in the Retail

Bespoke Dressmaking Branch of the trade, and the attainment of the age of 18 years.

15 and under 16 years of age the completion of not less than 2 years' employment in the Retail Bespoke Dressmaking Branch of the trade and the attainment of the age of 18 years.

16 years of age and over the completion of 2 years' employment in the Retail Bespoke Dressmaking Branch of the trade.

Provided that in determining the age of entry and the length of employment, all service prior to the age of 14 shall be disregarded.

PART II.

Piece-work Basis Time-Rates as varied for Female Workers in the Retail Bespoke Dressmaking Branch of the Trade.

SECTION I.

(1) Fully qualified Bodice, Skirt, Gown or Blouse hands as defined in Part I, Section I (i) above, 11½d. per hour.

(2) Qualified Bodice, Skirt, Gown or Blouse

hands as defined in Part I, Section I (2) above, 10½d. per hour.

(3) (i) All other female workers (except Homeworkers) employed in the Retail Bespoke Dressmaking Branch of the Trade, 9½d. per hour.

(ii) Homeworkers employed in the Retail Bespoke Dressmaking Branch of the Trade, 9½d. per hour.

SECTION II.

In the case of all Workers of the classes specified in this Part of this Schedule employed on Piece-work, each Piece-Rate paid shall be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker, not less than the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate as set out above.

In determining whether any Piece-Rate satisfies the above-mentioned condition, regard must be had only to the earnings of ordinary workers, *i.e.*, workers of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question and not to the earnings of workers of less than ordinary skill and experience, *e.g.*, learners and infirm workers.

PART III.

Overtime Rates as Varied for Female Workers in the Retail Bespoke Dressmaking Branch of the Trade (all ages).

SECTION I.

In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trades Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board hereby declare the normal number of hours of work in the Trade to be as follows:—

In any week	48
On any day other than Saturday (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays ...	9

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays and hours worked on Saturday or the weekly short day substituted therefor (subject to the provisions set out below) shall be regarded as Overtime, to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.

The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker of the classes specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows:—

A.—For workers employed on Time Work:—

(1) On any day other than Saturday (or the weekly short day substituted therefor) Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays:—

(a) For the first two hours of overtime, One-and-a-quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter.

(b) For overtime, after the first two hours of overtime, One-and-a-half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-half.

Provided that where it is the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week, the Overtime Rates specified in paragraphs A. (1) (a) and A. (1) (b) of this Section shall not be payable on any day (other than Saturday or the weekly short day

substituted therefor, Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays) until the number of hours worked exceeds 9½ and 11½ respectively.

(2) On Saturday (or the weekly short day substituted therefor) in respect of:—

(a) That class of worker who customarily attends on six days a week:—

For all overtime worked after the first five hours, One-and-a-half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-half.

Note.—During the first five hours worked on Saturday (or the weekly short day substituted therefor) the Minimum Rate applicable for this class of worker is the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate set out in Part I. of the Schedule to this Notice.

(b) That class of worker who customarily attends on five days a week:—

(i) For the first two hours of Overtime (that is to say, for the first two hours worked on Saturday or the weekly short day substituted therefor), One-and-a-quarter Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-quarter.

(ii) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime, One-and-a-half times the General Minimum Time-rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-half.

Provided that any other day (not being Sunday) may be substituted for Saturday as the weekly short day, and on such substituted short day Overtime Rates shall be applicable, as specified above, and the Overtime Rates shall not be payable on Saturday until 9 hours have been worked.

(3) On Sundays and customary public and statutory holidays:—

For all time worked, Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Double-Time.

Note.—The Overtime Rates set out in Sub-Sections (1), (2) and (3) of this Section are payable as provided above, in respect of all hours of Overtime worked on any day, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

(4) Where it is, or may become, the established practice of an employer to require attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime as set out in this Section shall apply to workers in like manner as if in the provisions of this Schedule as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday" and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."

(5) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48: One-and-a-quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (1) (b), (2) (a) (ii), (2) (b) and (3) of this Section.

Provided that where it is the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall not be payable in the week on which attendance on Saturday is required until 50 hours have been worked.

B. For workers employed on Piece-work:—

(i) All female workers in the Retail Bespoke Dressmaking Branch of the Trade employed on Piece-work shall receive in respect of each hour of overtime worked, in addition to piece-rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker, not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-rate applicable:—

(a) An amount equal to one-quarter of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-rate;

(b) An amount equal to one-half of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-rate; or

(c) An amount equal to the full amount of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-rate,

according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of paragraph (A) of this Section, if the worker had been employed on Time-work, were:—

(a) Time-and-a-quarter;

(b) Time-and-a-half; or

(c) Double Time, respectively.

Note.—The hours which Female Workers, Young Persons and Children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshops Acts, and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART IV.

SECTION I.

A Female Learner is a worker who:—

(a) Is employed by an employer who provides her with reasonable facilities for practically and efficiently learning one of the branches of the Retail Bespoke Dressmaking Branch of the trade carried on by the employer, or the various processes involved in the making of any of the articles specified in the definition of that Branch of the trade set out in Section II of Part V of this Schedule; and

(b) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board and held subject to compliance with conditions specified in this Section, or has made application for such certificate or registration, which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a Learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a Female Learner on her first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such Learner being continued thereafter at her employment, the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

SECTION II.

A Homemaker is a worker who works in her own home or in any place not under the control or management of the employer.

PART V.

SECTION I.

Subject to the provisions of the Trade Board Acts the respective minimum rates set out in

this Schedule apply to all workers in England and Wales of the classes specified in this Schedule in respect of all time during which they are employed in the Retail Bespoke Dressmaking branch of the trade as defined in Section II below:—

SECTION II.

The Retail Bespoke Dressmaking Branch of the Trade is that branch of the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing trade specified in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour dated 24th November, 1909 (as varied by the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920) as set out below, in which the employer supplies the garment direct to the individual wearer and employs the worker direct.

The trade as specified in the above-mentioned Regulations is as follows:—

Those branches of the Women's Clothing Trade that are engaged in the making of Non-Tailored Garments, namely, the making from textile or knitted fabrics of (a) non-tailored wearing apparel (other than handkerchiefs) worn by women and girls, or by children without distinction of sex, or (b) boys' ready-made washing suits or sailor suits, where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of garments to be worn by women or girls or by children without distinction of sex; *Including:—*

(1) All operations or processes of cutting, making, or finishing by hand or machine of dresses, non-tailored skirts, wraps, blouses, blouse-ropes, jumpers, sports-coats, neckwear, tea-gowns, dressing-gowns, dressing-jackets, pyjamas, underclothing, underskirts, aprons, overalls, nurses' and servants' caps, juvenile clothing, baby-linen, or similar non-tailored articles;

(2) The making of field bonnets, sun-bonnets, boudoir caps or infants' millinery, where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of any of the articles mentioned in paragraph (1) above;

(3) (a) The altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of any of the above-mentioned articles;

(b) The cleaning of any of the above-mentioned articles, where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of such garments;

(4) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making, altering, repairing, renovating, or re-making of such articles other than hand embroidery or hand drawn-thread work on articles made of linen or cotton or of mixed linen and cotton;

(5) The following processes if done by machine: Thread-drawing, thread-clipping, top-sewing, scalloping, nickelling and paring;

(6) Laundering, smoothing, folding, ornamenting, boxing, packing, warehousing or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the making, altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of any of the above-mentioned articles; *But excluding:—*

(a) The making of knitted articles; the making of underclothing, socks and stockings, from knitted fabrics; and the making from knitted fabrics of articles mentioned in paragraphs (1) and (2) above, where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of the knitted fabrics;

(b) The making of gloves, spats, gaiters, boots, shoes and slippers;

(c) The making of headgear, other than the articles mentioned in paragraph (c) above;

(d) The branches of trade covered by the Trade Boards (Corset) Order, 1919;

(e) The making of rubberised or oilskin garments;

(f) The making of women's collars and cuffs and of nurses' stiff washing belts where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of men's or boys' shirts or collars;

(g) Warehousing, packing and other similar operations carried on in shops mainly engaged in the retail distribution of articles of any description that are not made on the premises; *And excluding also:—*

(h) Any processes or operations included in the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Shirt-making) Order, 1920.

PART VI.

SECTION I.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages are to be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of the Minimum Rates.

Signed by order of the Trade Board and in pursuance of an Order of the Minister of Labour confirming the minimum rates as varied by the Trade Board and set out above and specifying the 11th day of July, 1921, as the date from which they should become effective.

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION
OF ASSISTANTS IN THE BRITISH MUSEUM
(NATURAL HISTORY).

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. *Age.*—Candidates must have attained the age of 22, and shall as a rule not exceed the age of 26 on the 1st April of the year in which the competition is held, but in special circumstances candidates above 26 may be admitted with the approval of the Treasury and the Civil Service Commissioners.

2. *Nationality.*—Candidates must be natural-born British subjects, and born of a father also a natural-born British subject, provided that exception may be made in the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, and provided that exception may be made to the latter condition of the rule in the case of candidates who have served in His Majesty's Armed Forces during the War.

3. *Military Service.*—Until further order preference will be given to candidates who have served in His Majesty's Forces in the War.

4. *Publicity.*—The Trustees of the British Museum will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which they desire to fill on any one occasion, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

5. *Application.*—Application shall be made in the first instance to the Director of the British Museum (Natural History), who, after examining the candidates' credentials and a personal interview, will submit the names of such candidates as appear to have the requisite qualifications for any of the existing or prospective vacancies to the Principal Trustees for approval of their candidature. Candidates thus approved shall be submitted to the Civil Service Commissioners, who if dissatisfied with the number or quality of candidates for any vacancy may require further search to be made for qualified candidates.

6. *Education.*—Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have received such systematic education, general or technical, or general and technical together, as

in their opinion fits them for the post. Candidates thus recommended and approved shall be submitted to a qualifying examination in English, arithmetic and general knowledge.

7. *Health and Character.*—Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

Until further order, and other things being equal, preference will be given by the Selection Board to candidates who are debarred from active employment by a physical impairment due to the War, and not of a nature to interfere with the discharge of ordinary administrative duties.

8. *Competitions.*—Candidates who have been admitted to and have passed the Qualifying Examination will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, and their decision will be final. The Selection Board shall be nominated by the Commissioners in consultation with the authorities of the Department, who shall be represented on the Selection Board, and one of the Commissioners shall be the Chairman. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidate's record of experience and education, any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by any candidate as having direct knowledge of his work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidate as shown at his interview; and on their estimation of all the above evidence they will frame their decisions.

9. *Warning.*—Any attempt on the part of a candidate to enlist support for his application through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify him for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the University, in the Forces or otherwise.

10. *Fee.*—Every candidate before entry to the Qualifying Examination shall pay the regulation fee of £6.

THE ROADS ACT, 1920.

COUNTY BOROUGH OF CHESTER.

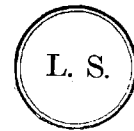
