**TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY
BILLS.**

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England on Friday, the 22nd July, 1921, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914 to 1919, to the amount of £50,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any date from Monday, the 25th July, to Saturday, the 30th July inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than two o'clock (Saturday twelve o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 26 of the Finance Act, 1915, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

BRITISH NATIONALITY AND STATUS OF ALIENS ACTS, 1914 AND 1918.

In the Matter of Steve Krotoschinski.

Revocation of Certificate of Naturalization.

Whereas I am satisfied that the certificate of naturalization numbered 15611, granted to Steve Krotoschinski, on the 11th February, 1907, is revocable under the provisions of Section 7 (2) (d) of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914, and that the continuance of the certificate is not conducive to the public good,

Now, therefore, by this Order made in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by Section 7 of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914, I revoke the said certificate; and I direct such revocation to have effect from the date hereof; and I further order the said certificate to be given up and cancelled.

The KING has been pleased, by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, to confer the dignity of a Viscount of the said United Kingdom upon the Right Honourable William James, Baron Pirrie, K.P., and the heirs male of his body lawfully begotten, by the name, style and title of Viscount Pirrie, of the City of Belfast.

The KING has been pleased to award the Albert Medal to Lieutenant Ian William Galbraith, M.C., 19th Lancers (Fane's Horse), and to Subadar-Major Ellaya, 1/88th Carnatic Infantry, in recognition of their gallantry in saving life at St. Thomas' Mount Arsenal, Madras, in June of last year.

On the night of June 18th, 1920, a dangerous fire broke out at the Arsenal at St. Thomas' Mount, and the flames, 20 ft. high, had reached a spot within 5 yards of which a large quantity of aerial bombs were stacked. Lieutenant Galbraith superintended the removal

of the bombs for nearly three-quarters of an hour, remaining until the last bomb had been removed, and he set a splendid example to the Troops by his gallantry and perseverance. Four thousand of these bombs were stored in the Arsenal, and an explosion would have resulted in heavy loss of life.

Subadar-Major Ellaya, with 43 men of "C" Company, took a prominent part in the work of removing the bombs which were lying close to the flames. He was the first member of his Regiment to arrive on the scene, and he too set a fine example to the men under him by carrying away the bombs and continuing to do so until ordered to another duty by his Commanding Officer. The work he performed in removing the bombs exposed him to very great danger.

The KING has been pleased to award the Albert Medal to No. 723 Sepoy Raghu Nandan Singh, 2nd/150th Indian Infantry, in recognition of his gallantry in saving life near Piazza Raghza in July of last year.

On the 25th July, 1920, whilst moving the picquet bomb store near Piazza Raghza, Sepoy Raghu Nandan Singh noticed that the fuze of a bomb was burning. He called to his comrades to take shelter and taking the bomb out of the box attempted to throw it clear of the picquet. The bomb hit the parapet and burst. By his prompt, clear-headed action, he undoubtedly saved the lives of his comrades by preventing the bomb exploding among and detonating the other bombs.

COAL MINES ACT.

THE EXPLOSIVES IN COAL MINES ORDER OF THE 27TH JUNE, 1921.

In pursuance of the power conferred upon them by Section 61 of the Coal Mines Act, 1911 (a), and under the provisions of the Mining Industry Act, 1920, the Board of Trade hereby make the following Order:—

(1) The Explosives in Coal Mines Order of the 1st September, 1913 (b), as amended by the Explosives in Coal Mines Orders of subsequent dates, shall be amended and shall take effect as if the explosives named and defined in the Schedule to this Order were named and defined in the First Schedule to that Order, and in all respects as if the Schedule to this Order formed part of the First Schedule to that Order.

(2) So much of the First Schedule to the Explosives in Coal Mines Order of the 14th November, 1919 (c), as relates to the Explosive Samsonite No. 2 is hereby repealed.

(3) This Order may be cited as the Explosives in Coal Mines Order of the 27th June, 1921.

(6) That each cartridge, in addition to any marking required in the Third Schedule to this Order, shall also be clearly marked with the words "Not more than 24 ounces in any one shot-hole"; and

(7) That in addition to the marking on the outer package required by an Order of the Secretary of State, made under the Explosives Act, 1875, and in force for the time being, such outer package shall bear the words "As defined in the List of Permitted Explosives"; and, further, that each inner package shall be clearly marked with the words "Permitted Explosive, to be used only with not less than No. 6 detonator," and also with the name of the explosive, the name of the manufacturer, the date and place of manufacture, and the nature and proportion of the ingredients.

FLAX AND HEMP TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY AND FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Flax and Hemp Trade, as specified in the Trade Boards (Flax and Hemp) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates at present fixed and set out in the Schedule to their Notice dated 30th July, 1920, for Male and Female Workers, and TO FIX a Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate for Male Hose-Pipe Weavers employed on Power or Hand Looms, a Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate for Female Workers, General Minimum Piece-Rates for Male Canvas Weavers and General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Female Workers of 18 years of age and over who have had less than six months' experience in the trade, the proposed Minimum Rates of Wages being as shown in the Schedule set out below :—

SECTION II.—In the case of Male Hose-Pipe Weavers employed on Power or Hand Looms on Piece-Work each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 1s. 4d. per hour to an ORDINARY WORKER, i.e., a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question.

...and the other is the fact that the system is not yet fully operational.

(b) In all other cases "a week" means a week of 48 hours.

(a) In the case of the workers referred to in Section I (a) of this Part by the number of hours per week customarily worked by the class in question ;

(b) In all other cases by 48.

PART VI.

Proposed General Minimum Piece-Rates.

Quality of Canvas.

Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable,
i.e., Time-and-a-half:

Provided that in the case of workers who, in accordance with the practice of the establishment, attend for nine hours per day on five days of the week, and for three hours on Saturday, the Overtime Rate fixed by Sub-Section (3) (a) of this Section shall not be payable in respect of the first quarter of an hour in excess of 8 $\frac{3}{4}$ hours, but shall be payable thereafter till 11 hours have been worked, and the Overtime Rate payable fixed by Sub-Section (3) (b) of this Section shall apply in respect of all hours worked after 11 hours.

Provided also that to workers who, in accordance with the practice of the establishment, attend only on five days a week, the said rates fixed by Sub-section (3) (a) of this Section shall not be payable in respect of the first three-quarters of an hour in excess of 8½ hours, but shall be payable thereafter until 11½ hours have been worked; and the said rate fixed by Sub-Section (3) (b) of this Section shall be payable for all time worked in excess of 11½ hours.

Provided also that in the case of workers who, in accordance with the practice of the establishment, attend for 8½ hours or less on the five days Monday to Friday inclusive, the Overtime Rate fixed by Sub-Section (2) of this Section shall not be payable in respect of the first quarter of an hour in excess of 4½ hours on Saturday, but shall be payable thereafter.

(4) For all time worked in any week in excess of 48 hours One-and-a-quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, 'Time-and-a-quarter', except where a higher amount is payable in respect of Overtime under Sub-Sections (1), (2) and (3) (b) of this Section with regard to Overtime Rates.

SECTION III.—All Male and Female Workers employed on Piece-work:—

(a) All Female Workers employed on Piece-work shall receive in respect of each hour of

(2) For all time worked in excess of 4½ hours on Saturday, One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-half.

(2) (a) For the first two hours worked in excess of $8\frac{1}{2}$ hours on any other day, One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-quarter.

(b) For all time worked in excess of 10³ hours, One-and-a-half times the General

Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, One-half of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-rate, or One-quarter of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable if the worker had been employed on Time-work were Double-time, Time-and-a-half, or Time-and-a-quarter respectively.

(b) Male Hose-Pipe Weavers employed on Piece-work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-rate specified in Part IV. of this Schedule, the Piece-work Basis Time-rate, One-half of the Piece-work basis Time-rate, or One-quarter of the Piece-work Basis Time-rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable if the Worker had been employed on Time-work were Double Time, Time-and-a-half, or Time-and-a-quarter respectively.

(c) Male Canvas Weavers employed on Piece-work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to the General Minimum Piece-rate applicable, as set out in Part VI. of this Schedule, or where no General Minimum Piece-rate has been fixed and made effective, to Piece-rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker not less than the appropriate General Minimum Time-rate, the appropriate General Minimum Time-rate, one-half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-rate, or One-quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable if the worker had been employed on Time-work were Double Time, Time-and-a-half, or Time-and-a-quarter respectively.

(d) All other Male Workers employed on Piece-work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker not less than the appropriate General Minimum Time-rate, the appropriate General Minimum Time-rate, One-half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-rate, or One-quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable if the worker had been employed on Time-work were Double Time, Time-and-a-half, or Time-and-a-quarter respectively.

Note.—The hours which female workers, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART VIII.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male and Female Workers in Great Britain, in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Flax and Hemp) Order, 1919, namely:—

The preparing, spinning and weaving (a) of scutched flax, (b) of hemp, (c) of a mixture of

scutched flax and any other fibre, or (d) of a mixture of hemp and any other fibre.

Including:—

(1) The preparing and spinning of waste reclaimed at any stage; and

(2) All packing, despatching, warehousing, storing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the above-mentioned work;

But excluding:—

(1) The calendering, bleaching, dyeing or finishing of any of the above-mentioned materials; and

(2) The preparing or spinning of materials required for the making or re-making of (a) rope (including driving rope and banding), (b) cord (including blind and window cord, but excluding silk, worsted, and other fancy cords), (c) core for wire ropes, (d) lines, (e) twine (including binder and trawl twine), (f) lanyards, (g) net and similar articles when such spinning or preparing is carried on in the same factory or workshop as the said making or re-making; and

(3) The making or repair of sacks or bags; and also

(4) The weaving of carpets, rugs and mats.

PART IX.

SECTION I.—The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to Workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

PART X.

The Trade Board further give notice that the Notice F.H. (3) issued by the Trade Board, dated 31st August, 1920, proposing to vary and fix minimum rates of wages for certain classes of male and female workers and the Notice F.H. (4) dated 23rd December, 1920, proposing to fix a piece-work basis time-rate and to vary overtime rates for male hose-pipe weavers employed on power or hand looms are withdrawn.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals to Vary and Fix, which may be lodged with them within two months from 12th July, 1921. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address) and should be sent to the Secretary of the Flax and Hemp Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4. It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

Provided that in determining the age of entry and the length of employment all service prior to the age of 14 shall be disregarded.

SECTION II.

The General Minimum Time Rates for all Female Workers employed in the Wholesale Cloth Hat and Cap Making Branch of the Trade (other than Female Learners) as defined in Part III. of this Schedule, shall be the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to workers other than Learners set out in Section I. (a) of Part I. of the Schedule to the Notice H.M.S. (2) issued by the Trade Board and dated 23rd September, 1920, viz., 8½d. per hour.

PART II.

Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates for Female Learners employed in the Wholesale Cloth Hat and Cap Making Branch of the Trade.

Overtime Rates, calculated on the Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages specified in Section I (b) of Part I of this Schedule in the manner specified in Part III. of the Schedule to the Notice, H.M.S. (2) issued by the Trade Board and dated 23rd September 1920, shall apply, in substitution for the Proposed rates set out in Section I. Provided that the certification or registration of a learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a female learner on her first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such learner being continued thereafter at her employment the probation

period shall be included in her period of learnership.

Provided that, notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, a person shall not be deemed to be a learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

PART IV.

The above Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Act, to all Female workers in Scotland who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in the Wholesale Cloth Hat and Cap Making Branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Board's (Hat, Cap and Millinery) Order, 1919, and set out in Part V. of the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice, dated 23rd September, 1920.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from 13th July, 1921. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address) and should be sent to the Secretary of the Hat, Cap and Millinery Trade Board (Scotland), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

(1) Part I (Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of a Movement Area) of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order," is hereby applied to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto, which shall be a Movement Area for the purposes of that Order.

(2) This article shall come into operation on the first day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty-one, and shall cease to operate on the fifteenth day of September, nineteen hundred and twenty-one.

Application of Part II of Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920.

2. Part II (Double Dipping of Sheep in a Double Dipping Area) of the Principal Order is also hereby applied to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto, which shall also be a Double Dipping Area for the purposes of that Order.

Period Prescribed as Double Dipping Period.

3. The dates between which all sheep in the Area described in the First Schedule hereto are to be dipped within the Area by the owner or person in charge of the sheep under and in accordance with Part II of the Principal Order are hereby fixed to be the first day of August and the fifteenth day of September, nineteen hundred and twenty-one.

Revocation

4. The Order described in the Second Schedule to this Order is hereby revoked on the first

day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty-one; Provided that, as from the twelfth day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-one, such parts of the parish of Kenmore as are not described in the First Schedule hereto shall cease to form part of any Movement Area for the purposes of the Principal Order.
