PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in Council, bearing date the 15th day of February, 1909, and entitled the Eastern African Protectorates (Court of Appeal) Order in Council, 1909, a Court, called His Majesty's Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa, was constituted for the hearing and determining of appeals from His Majesty's Courts in the East Africa, Uganda, and Nyasaland Protectorates:

And whereas by an Order of His Majesty in Council, bearing date the 21st day of January, 1914, and entitled the Eastern African Protectorates (Court of Appeal) Amendment Order in Council, 1914, provision was made for the hearing and determining of appeals from His Britannic Majesty's Court for Zanzibar by His Majesty's said Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa:

And whereas by an Order of His Majesty in Council bearing date the 11th day of June, 1920, and entitled the Kenya (Annexation)

Order in Council, 1920, it was provided that certain of the territories formerly comprised in the East Africa Protectorate should be annexed to and form part of His Majesty's Dominions and should be known as the Colony of Kenya:

And whereas by an Order of His Majesty in Council bearing date the 13th day of August, 1920, and entitled the Kenya Protectorate Order in Council, 1920, provision was made for the peace, order and good government of the territories formerly comprised in the East Africa Protectorate other than those annexed and included in the Colony of Kenya as aforesaid, and it was provided that the territories within the limits of the said Order should be known and described as the Protectorate of Kenya:

And whereas by the said last recited Order it was provided that the Courts then or thereafter established in the said Colony should have in respect of matters occurring within the Protectorate, so far as such matters were within the jurisdiction of His Majesty, the same jurisdiction, civil and criminal, original and appellate, as they respectively possessed from time to time in respect of matters occurring within the Colony:

And whereas by an Order of His Majesty in Council bearing date the 27th day of June, 1921, and entitled The Kenya Colony Order in Council, 1921, it is provided that there shall be a Court of Record styled His Majesty's Supreme Court of Kenya, with full jurisdiction, civil and criminal, over all persons and over all matters in the Colony:

And whereas the said Colony is a British Settlement within the meaning of the British Settlements Act, 1887:

And whereas by Treaty, grant, usage, sufferance and other lawful means His Majesty has power and jurisdiction within the Uganda and Nyasaland Protectorates, the Protectorate of Kenya, the Zanzibar Protectorate, and the Tanganyika Territory:

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made as to the constitution of His Majesty's Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the British Settlements Act, 1887, the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the "Eastern African Court of Appeal Order in Council, 1921," and shall extend to the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, the Uganda Protectorate, the Nyasaland Protectorate, the Zanzibar Protectorate, and the Tanganyika Territory (in this Order referred to as "the said territories").

2. A Court shall be, and is hereby, constituted, called His Majesty's Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa (in this Order referred to as "The Court of Appeal") which shall be a superior Court of Record and shall, subject to the provisions of this Order, have jurisdiction to hear and determine appeals (including reserved questions of law) from the Courts of the said territories in all causes and matters in which under any law for the time being in force in any of the said territories respectively an appeal lies to the Court of Appeal. The said Court in the exercise of its appellate jurisdiction shall have full power to determine any question and to pass any Decree, Judgment, or Order the determining or the passing of which may appear necessary to the said Court for the purpose of doing justice in the cause or matter before it.

3. The process of the Court of Appeal shall run throughout the said territories, and any Judgment, Decree, or Order of the Court of Appeal shall have full force and effect in every such territory, and shall be executed and enforced by a Court in such territory in like manner as if it were an original Judgment, Decree, or Order of the Court from which the appeal is brought, and, for all purposes of, and incidental to, the hearing and determination of any appeal within its jurisdiction, the Court of Appeal shall have all the power, authority, and jurisdiction vested in the Court from which the appeal is brought.

4. In the hearing and determining of an appeal from any territory the substantive law to be applied shall be the substantive law in operation in that territory.

5. The Court of Appeal shall have a seal bearing the style of the Court and a device approved by His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies (in this Order referred

to as "the Secretary of State") and until such a seal is provided the stamp and seal at present used by His Majesty's Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa may be used instead thereof.

6. The Judges of the Court of Appeal shall be the Judges and Acting Judges for the time being of the Supreme Court of Kenya, the Judges and Acting Judges for the time being of His Majesty's High Courts of the Uganda and Nyasaland Protectorates and the Tanganyika Territory, and the Judge, Assistant Judges and Acting Judges for the time being of His Britannic Majesty's Court for Zanzibar, and such other competent person or persons, if any, each being a member of the Bar of England, Scotland, or Ireland, of not less than five years' standing, as the Secretary of State may from time to time appoint.

7. The seniority of the members of the Court of Appeal shall be determined according to the instructions to be given from time to time by the Secretary of State.

8. For the purpose of the hearing and determining of appeals the Court of Appeal shall be duly constituted if it consists of not less than three Judges, but provision may be made by Rules of Court for the hearing and determining of interlocutory applications and of specified classes of cases by two Judges of the Court of Appeal.

9. A Judge of the Court of Appeal shall not sit as a Judge on the hearing of an appeal from any judgment or order made by himself or made by any Court if he was present and acting as a member of the Court at the time when the decision appealed from was made, or at the argument of the case decided.

10. The Court of Appeal may, in any case in which it appears to be expedient, call in the aid of one or more assessors specially qualified and hear such case wholly or partially with the assistance of such assessors.

The remuneration (if any) to be paid to such assessors shall be determined by the Court.

11. The Court of Appeal may sit at such places in any of the said territories as may be fixed by Rules of Court.

12. The Secretary of State may appoint a Registrar and such other officers of the Court of Appeal as may be necessary.

13.—(1) Three Judges of the Court of Appeal, one of whom shall be the President, shall have power to make Rules of Court with respect to all matters of practice and procedure relating to the exercise of its jurisdiction; such power shall include the power to rescind, revoke, amend or vary by Rule of Court any Rules of Court which may from time to time be in force.

(2) Rules of Court shall, after receiving the approval of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, have effect as if contained in this Order: provided that in case of urgency declared in the Rules the same shall take effect before such approval and shall continue to have effect until they have been disallowed, modified or altered by the Secretary of State and such disallowance, modification or alteration has been published by the Court of Appeal.

14. On the commencement of this Order the Eastern African Protectorates (Court of Appeal) Order in Council, 1909, and the Eastern African Protectorates (Court of Appeal) Amendment Order in Council, 1914, shall be repealed.

Provided as follows:—

(1) In all appeals and proceedings whatsoever which shall have been fully heard by the Court of Appeal established under the said Orders (in this Article referred to as "the former Court") and in which judgment shall not have been given, or having been given shall not have been signed, drawn up or otherwise perfected at the commencement of this Order, any judgment, decree, rule or order may be given or made, signed, drawn up or perfected respectively after the commencement of this Order in the name of the former Court by the Court of Appeal established by this Order, and shall take effect to all intents and purposes as if the same had been duly perfected before the commencement of this Order:

(2) Every judgment, decree, rule, or order of the former Court which shall have been duly perfected at any time before the commencement of this Order may be executed and enforced and, if necessary, amended or discharged by the Court of Appeal in the same manner as if it had been a judgment, decree, rule, or order of the said Court of Appeal.

(3) All appeals, matters and proceedings whatsoever, whether civil or criminal, which shall be pending in the former Court at the commencement of this Order shall be continued and concluded before the Court of Appeal according to the form and manner of procedure of the said Court of Appeal.

(4) All Rules of Court and other provisions made under the said repealed Eastern African Protectorates (Court of Appeal) Order in Council, 1909, shall be and remain in force throughout the said territories until otherwise provided under this Order.

15. This Order shall commence and have effect on such day as may be fixed by notification by the Secretary of State, published in the London Gazette.

And the Right Honourable Winston Spencer Churchill, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council bearing even date with this Order provision has been made as to the constitution of His Majesty's Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa for the hearing of appeals from the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, the Uganda Protectorate, the Nyasaland Protectorate, the Zanzibar Protectorate, and the Tanganyika Territory (in this Order referred to as "the said Territories")

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made for regulating appeals from His Majesty's Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa to His Majesty in Council:

It is hereby ordered by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of all the powers in that behalf in His Majesty

vested, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, as follows:

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the "Eastern African (Appeal to Privy Council) Order in Council 1921."

(2) On the commencement of this Order the Eastern African Protectorates (Appeal to Privy Council) Order in Council 1909, the Eastern African Protectorates (Appeal to Privy Council) Amendment Order in Council 1915, and the Eastern African Protectorates (Appeal to Privy Council) Amendment Order in Council (No. 2) 1915, shall be and the same are hereby revoked and repealed without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder.

2. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires:—

"Appeal" means Appeal to His Majesty in Council.

"His Majesty" includes His Majesty's heirs and successors.

"Judgment" includes decree, order, sentence, or decision.

"Court" means either the Full Court or one or more Judges of His Majesty's Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa according as the matter in question is one which under the Rules and Practice of His Majesty's Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa, properly appertains to a Full Court or to one or more Judges.

"Record" means the aggregate of papers relating to an Appeal (including the pleadings, proceedings, evidence and judgments) proper to be laid before His Majesty in Council on the hearing of the Appeal.

"Registrar" means the Registrar or other proper Officer having the custody of the Records in the Court appealed from;

"Month" means calendar month;

Words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular.

3. Subject to the provisions of this Order, an Appeal shall lie—

(a) as of right, from any final judgment of the Court, where the matter in dispute on the Appeal amounts to or is of the value of £650 sterling or upwards, or where the Appeal involves directly or indirectly some claim or question to or respecting property or some civil right amounting to or of the value of Rs. 10,000 or upwards; and

(b) at the discretion of the Court, from any other judgment of the Court, whether final or interlocutory, if, in the opinion of the Court, the question involved in the Appeal is one which, by reason of its great general or public importance or otherwise, ought to be submitted to His Majesty in Council for decision.

4. Where in any action or other proceeding no final judgment can be duly given in consequence of a difference of opinion between the Judges, the final judgment may be entered *pro forma* on the application of any party to such action or other proceeding according to the opinion of the Senior Member of the Court or in his absence of the Member of the Court next in seniority, but such judgment shall only be deemed final for purposes of an appeal therefrom, and not for any other purpose.

5. Applications to the Court for leave to appeal shall be made by motion or petition within 21 days in the case of applications from the Colony or Protectorate of Kenya or the

Uganda Protectorate, within three months in the case of applications from the Nyasaland Protectorate, within two months in the case of applications from the Zanzibar Protectorate and within two months in the case of applications from the Tanganyika Territory, from the date of the judgment to be appealed from, and the Appellant shall give the opposite party notice of his intended application.

6. Leave to appeal under Article 3 shall only be granted by the Court in the first instance—

(a) upon condition of the Appellant, within a period to be fixed by the Court, but not exceeding three months from the date of the hearing of the application for leave to appeal, entering into good and sufficient security, to the satisfaction of the Court, in a sum not exceeding Rs. 7,500 for the due prosecution of the Appeal, and the payment of all such costs as may become payable to the Respondent in the event of the Appellant not obtaining an order granting him final leave to appeal, or of the Appeal being dismissed for non-prosecution, or of His Majesty in Council ordering the Appellant to pay the Respondent's costs of the Appeal (as the case may be); and

(b) upon such other conditions (if any) as to the time or times within which the Appellant shall take the necessary steps for the purpose of procuring the preparation of the Record and the dispatch thereof to England as the Court, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, may think it reasonable to impose.

7. Where the judgment appealed from requires the Appellant to pay money or perform a duty, the Court shall have power, when granting leave to appeal, either to direct that the said judgment shall be carried into execution or that the execution thereof shall be suspended pending the Appeal, as to the Court shall seem just, and in case the Court shall direct the said judgment to be carried into execution, the person in whose favour it was given shall, before the execution thereof, enter into good and sufficient security, to the satisfaction of the Court, for the due performance of such Order as His Majesty in Council shall think fit to make thereon.

8. The preparation of the Record shall be subject to the supervision of the Court, and the parties may submit any disputed question arising in connection therewith to the decision of the Court, and the Court shall give such directions thereon as the justice of the case may require.

9. The Registrar, as well as the parties and their legal agents, shall endeavour to exclude from the Record all documents (more particularly such as are merely formal) that are not relevant to the subject matter of the Appeal, and, generally, to reduce the bulk of the Record as far as practicable, taking special care to avoid the duplication of documents and the unnecessary repetition of headings and other merely formal parts of documents; but the documents omitted to be copied or printed shall be enumerated in a list to be placed after the index or at the end of the Record.

10. Where in the course of the preparation of a Record one party objects to the inclusion of a document on the ground that it is unnecessary or irrelevant and the other party nevertheless insists upon its being included, the Record as finally printed (whether in any of the

said Territories, or in England), shall, with a view to the subsequent adjustment of the costs of and incidental to such document, indicate in the index of papers, or otherwise, the fact that, and the party by whom, the inclusion of the document was objected to.

11. The Record shall be printed in accordance with the Rules set forth in the Schedule hereto. It may be so printed either in any of the said Territories or in England.

12. Where the Record is printed in any of the said Territories the Registrar shall, at the expense of the Appellant, transmit to the Registrar of the Privy Council 40 copies of such Record, one of which copies he shall certify to be correct by signing his name on, or initialling, every eighth page thereof and by affixing thereto the seal of the Court.

13. Where the Record is to be printed in England the Registrar shall, at the expense of the Appellant, transmit to the Registrar of the Privy Council one certified copy of such Record, together with an index of all the papers and exhibits in the case. No other certified copies of the Record shall be transmitted to the Agents in England by or on behalf of the parties to the Appeal.

14. Where part of the Record is printed in any of the said Territories and part is to be printed in England, Articles 12 and 13 shall, as far as practicable, apply to such parts as are printed in the said Territory and such as are to be printed in England respectively.

15. The reasons given by the Judge, or any of the Judges, for or against any judgment pronounced in the course of the proceedings out of which the Appeal arises shall by such Judge or Judges be communicated in writing to the Registrar, and shall by him be transmitted to the Registrar of the Privy Council at the same time when the Record is transmitted.

16. Where there are two or more applications for leave to appeal arising out of the same matter, and the Court is of opinion that it would be for the convenience of the Lords of the Judicial Committee and all parties concerned that the Appeals should be consolidated, the Court may direct the Appeals to be consolidated and grant leave to appeal by a single order.

17. An Appellant who has obtained an order granting him conditional leave to appeal may at any time prior to the making of an order granting him final leave to appeal withdraw his Appeal on such terms as to costs and otherwise as the Court may direct.

18. Where an Appellant, having obtained an order granting him conditional leave to appeal, and having complied with the conditions imposed on him by such order, fails thereafter to apply with due diligence to the Court for an order granting him final leave to appeal, the Court may, on an application in that behalf made by the Respondent, rescind the order granting conditional leave to appeal, notwithstanding the Appellant's compliance with the conditions imposed by such an order, and may give such directions as to the costs of the Appeal and the security entered into by the Appellant as the Court shall think fit, or make such further or other order in the premises as, in the opinion of the Court, the justice of the case requires.

19. On an application for final leave to appeal, the Court may enquire whether notice or sufficient notice, of the application has been given by the Appellant to all parties concerned,

and, if not satisfied as to the notices given, may defer the granting of the final leave to appeal, or may give such other directions in the matter as, in the opinion of the Court, the justice of the case requires.

20. An Appellant who has obtained final leave to appeal shall prosecute his Appeal in accordance with the Rules for the time being regulating the general practice and procedure in Appeals to His Majesty in Council.

21. Where an Appellant, having obtained final leave to appeal, desires, prior to the dispatch of the Record to England, to withdraw his appeal, the Court may, upon an application in that behalf made by the Appellant, grant him a certificate to the effect that the Appeal has been withdrawn, and the Appeal shall thereupon be deemed, as from the date of such certificate, to stand dismissed without express Order of His Majesty in Council, and the costs of the Appeal and the security entered into by the Appellant shall be dealt with in such manner as the Court may think fit to direct.

22. Where an Appellant, having obtained final leave to appeal, fails to show due diligence in taking all necessary steps for the purpose of procuring the dispatch of the Record to England, the Respondent may, after giving the Appellant due notice of his intended application, apply to the Court for a certificate that the Appeal has not been effectually prosecuted by the Appellant, and if the Court sees fit to grant such a certificate the Appeal shall be deemed, as from the date of such certificate, to stand dismissed for non-prosecution without express Order of His Majesty in Council, and the costs of the Appeal and the security entered into by the Appellant shall be dealt with in such manner as the Court may think fit to direct.

23. Where at any time between the order granting final leave to appeal and the dispatch of the Record to England, the Record becomes defective by reason of the death or change of status of a party to the Appeal, the Court may, notwithstanding the order granting final leave to appeal, on an application in that behalf made by any person interested, grant a certificate showing who, in the opinion of the Court, is the proper person to be substituted or entered on the Record in place of, or in addition to, the party who has died, or undergone a change of status, and the name of such person shall thereupon be deemed to be so substituted or entered on the Record as aforesaid without express Order of His Majesty in Council.

24. Where the Record subsequently to its dispatch to England becomes defective by reason of the death or change of status of a party to the Appeal, the Court shall, upon an application in that behalf made by any person interested, cause a certificate to be transmitted to the Registrar of the Privy Council showing who, in the opinion of the Court, is the proper person to be substituted or entered on the Record in place of or in addition to the party who has died or undergone a change of status.

25. The case of each party to the Appeal may be printed either in any of the said Territories or in England and shall, in either event, be printed in accordance with the Rules set forth in the Schedule hereto, every tenth line thereof being numbered in the margin, and shall be signed by at least one of the Counsel who attends at the hearing of the Appeal, or by the

party himself if he conducts his appeal in person.

26. The Case shall consist of paragraphs numbered consecutively and shall state, as concisely as possible, the circumstances out of which the Appeal arises, the contentions to be urged by the party lodging the same, and the reasons of Appeal. Reference by page and line to the relevant portions of the Record as printed shall, as far as practicable, be printed in the margin, and care shall be taken to avoid, as far as possible, the reprinting in the Case of long extracts from the Record. The taxing officer, in taxing the costs of the Appeal, shall, either of his own motion or at the instance of the opposite party, inquire into any unnecessary prolixity in the Case, and shall disallow the costs occasioned thereby.

27. Where the Judicial Committee directs a party to bear the costs of an Appeal incurred in any of the said Territories such costs shall be taxed by the proper officer of the Court in accordance with the rules for the time being regulating taxation in the Court.

28. The Court shall conform with and execute any Order which His Majesty in Council may think fit to make on an appeal from a judgment of the Court in like manner as any original judgment of the Court should or might have been executed.

29. Nothing in this Order contained shall be deemed to interfere with the right of His Majesty, upon the humble Petition of any person aggrieved by any judgment of the Court, to admit his Appeal therefrom upon such conditions as His Majesty in Council shall think fit to impose.

30. This Order shall commence and have effect on such day as may be fixed by notification in the London Gazette by one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

And the Right Honourable Winston Spencer Churchill, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

I. Records and Cases in Appeals to His Majesty in Council shall be printed in the form known as Demy Quarto.

II. The size of the paper used shall be such that the sheet, when folded and trimmed, will be 11 inches in height and 8½ inches in width.

III. The type to be used in the text shall be Pica type, but Long Primer shall be used in printing accounts, tabular matter, and notes.

IV. The number of lines in each page of Pica type shall be 47 or thereabouts, and every tenth line shall be numbered in the margin.

WHEREAS by section 734 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is provided that where it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the government of any foreign country is desirous that any of the provisions of that Act which do not apply to the ships of that country should so apply and

there are no special provisions in the Act for that application, His Majesty in Council may order that such of those provisions as are in the Order specified shall (subject to the limitations, if any, contained therein) apply to the ships of that country and to the owners, masters, seamen and apprentices of those ships when not locally within the jurisdiction of the government of that country, in the same manner in all respects as if those ships were British ships:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the Governments of the several States hereinafter mentioned are desirous that the provisions of sub-section (1) of section 73 and sub-section (1) of section 74 of the said Act should apply to the ships of those States respectively:

And whereas the provisions of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers conferred upon Him by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

Sub-section (1) of section 73 and sub-section (1) of section 74 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, shall apply to the ships of the following States in India, namely, Travancore, Cochin, Baroda, Cambay, Sachin, Janjira, Junagadh, Porbandar, Bhavnagar, Nawanagar, Morvi and Cutch, and to the owners, masters, seamen, and apprentices of those ships, when not locally within the jurisdiction of the Governments of those States, in the same manner in all respects as if those ships were British ships, subject, however, to the limitation that those provisions shall not apply to such ships when in British territorial waters.

1. In paragraph 2 of the India Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1921, the words "eighteen months" shall be substituted for the words "six months."

2. This Order may be cited as the India Treaty of Peace (Austria) (Amendment) Order, 1921, and the India Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1921, and this Order, may be cited together as the India Treaty of Peace (Austria) Orders, 1921.

We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property in the Parish of Minster in the County of Kent now vested in us:

"And whereas each of the said Benefices of Chilton, Ashendon with Dorton and Wotton Underwood is now full, the Reverend Arthur Forbes Gerrard Fletcher being the present Incumbent of the said Benefices of Chilton and Ashendon with Dorton, and the Reverend Thomas Torrens being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Wotton Underwood:

"And whereas the said Arthur Forbes Gerrard Fletcher has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Chilton with Dorton if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Oxford (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council all that is in this Scheme contained under the three parts or headings hereinafter mentioned, as follows:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 17th and 18th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 84, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for apportioning the income of the

Benefice (being a Rectory) of Rothwell, in the County of Lincoln and in the Diocese of Lincoln, between that Benefice and two other Benefices, namely, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of East Halton and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Killingholme, which said last named two Benefices are also situate in the said County of Lincoln and in the said Diocese of Lincoln:

"Whereas the patronage of the said Benefice of Rothwell and also of the said two Benefices of East Halton and Killingholme is vested in the Right Honourable Charles Alfred Worsley, Earl of Yarborough:

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said two Benefices of East Halton and Killingholme are at present insufficiently endowed; and that the said Benefice of Rothwell has endowments of such an amount as that after the charge hereinafter recommended and proposed to be made shall have been placed upon the same endowments, the said Benefice of Rothwell will still be sufficiently endowed:

"And whereas the Right Reverend William Shuckburgh, Bishop of the said Diocese of Lincoln, has represented to us, and we are of opinion, that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the Parishes of East Halton and Killingholme by means of that apportionment of the income of the said Benefice of Rothwell which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Rothwell is now full, the Reverend George John Boissier being the Rector or Incumbent thereof:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln, acting as such Bishop (in testimony whereof he has affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Charles Alfred Worsley, Earl of Yarborough, acting as such Patron as aforesaid (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said George John Boissier, acting as such Rector or Incumbent as aforesaid (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and as from the day of the date upon which the union of the said Benefice of Rothwell and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Cuxwold, in the said County of Lincoln and in the said Diocese of Lincoln, shall take effect, all the tithe rent charges, glebe lands and all (if any) other the endowments which shall at the date of such union belong to the said Benefice of Rothwell, shall be charged and for ever thereafter chargeable with the annual sums or yearly charges hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, a clear annual sum or yearly charge of £60 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of East Halton and a clear annual sum or yearly charge of £60 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Killingholme, such annual sums or yearly charges to be as from the day aforesaid due and payable, to the Incumbents of the said two Benefices of East Halton and Killingholme respectively, and to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of either of the said two Benefices of East Halton and Killingholme or his representatives on the one hand and his successors in the same Incumbency on the other hand, and to be

receivable by the Incumbents in whose favour the same are charged respectively as aforesaid by equal quarterly payments, on the usual quarter days in every year.

"And we further recommend, and propose that the respective Incumbents for the time being of the said two Benefices of East Halton and Killingholme shall have the following powers for recovering the said rent charge of £60 per annum hereby proposed to be created in favour of the Benefice of which he is Incumbent as aforesaid (that is to say), power, if and whenever any part of the said rent charge shall at any time be unpaid for 21 days after any of the times appointed for the payment thereof (although there shall not have been any legal demand made thereof) to enter into the receipt of the endowments charged therewith, or any part thereof, and to receive and take the same until he shall thereby or otherwise be paid and satisfied, the same rent charge and the arrears thereof due at the time of such entry or afterwards to become due during his being in possession of the same premises together with all costs and expenses occasioned by the non-payment thereof, and for the purpose of collecting, receiving, and recovering such endowments or any of them, to use, exercise, and enjoy all such powers and remedies for collecting, recovering, and enforcing payment thereof, and of the annual sums payable for or towards the raising or making up the same, as may be statutorily exercised or exercisable by him under the law then in force.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lincoln.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for

England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Alban, South Norwood, situate in the New Parish (sometime District) of Saint John the Evangelist, Upper Norwood, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Canterbury:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Alban, South Norwood, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Upper Norwood, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Alban, South Norwood, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Alban, South Norwood.'

"And with the like consent of the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint Alban, South Norwood, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees or dues to be received in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings and burials should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being.

"Provided always that so long as the Reverend Henry Sutherland Dashwood Gill, Clerk in Holy Orders, the present Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Upper Norwood, shall continue to be such Vicar or Incumbent, all the fees which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization, or performance at the said Church of Saint Alban, South Norwood, situate as aforesaid shall be paid over by the Minister thereof to the said Henry Sutherland Dashwood Gill.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Alban, South Norwood, being:—

"All that part of the New Parish (sometime District) of Saint John the Evangelist, Upper Norwood, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Canterbury, which is bounded upon

all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the west by the New Parish of Saint Paul, Thornton Heath, upon the south, partly by the New Parish of Saint Saviour, Croydon, and partly by the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Croydon, upon the south-east by the New Parish of Saint Mark, South Norwood, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the north-east partly by the said New Parish of Saint Mark, South Norwood, and partly by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mark, South Norwood, from the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Upper Norwood, at the junction of Park Road with Whitehorse Lane, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Whitehorse Lane for a distance of $1\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Egerton Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Egerton Road for a distance of $8\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Parry Road, and continuing thence north-westward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line thereby crossing Ross Road and Grangewood Park for a distance of 18 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Grange Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Upper Norwood, from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Thornton Heath."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.
MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY.

We, Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the Lieutenant-Governor, the Bailiff and the States of the Island of Guernsey most humbly approach Your Majesty to renew on our behalf and that of the Inhabitants of the Island the expression of our devoted loyalty to Your Majesty, and to offer to Your Majesty and our Gracious Queen, as well as to Her Royal Highness the Princess Mary, our most heartfelt welcome on your deigning to visit our shores.

The Islands of this Bailiwick being situate in that part of the ancient Duchy of Normandy which still owes allegiance to the Crown of England are the oldest Dependency of Your Majesty's Realm, and we recall with pride and will ever emulate the firm loyalty which for centuries, and during the most trying periods of history, our ancestors ever evinced towards Your Majesty's illustrious predecessors, the Dukes of Normandy and Kings and Queens of England.

I thank you from My heart for the pledge. I congratulate you on the tenacious patriotism which has preserved through so many centuries your ancient customs and constitution. And I rejoice to think that your intense love of your own Island and its local institutions is combined with a sincere loyalty to the British Throne and the British Empire. I am well assured that the people of Guernsey in the future, as in the past, will bear their part in the common life of the Empire, and they will know how to adapt the spirit of their ancient and beloved institutions to the new demands of changing times and conditions. It is My earnest prayer that by the blessing of Divine Providence the labours of this industrious and loyal community may be crowned with ever-increasing happiness and prosperity.

While we greatly regret that it was not possible for Your Majesties to visit this part of Your Duchy, we desire most humbly and respectfully to approach Your Majesties with our

great satisfaction at Your Majesties' visit to the Channel Islands.

Both we and the inhabitants offer Your Majesties our most respectful duty and devotion, and Your gracious visit enables us to renew the assurance of our high attachment to Your Majesties and the Royal Family.

We most sincerely trust that the Almighty may pour His blessings on Your Majesties, and that You may be spared to enjoy a long and peaceful reign.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious answer:—

I thank you for your loyal and dutiful Address, and for the expression of your attachment to Me and to My House.

While I regret that it is impossible for Us in the limited time at Our disposal to pay a personal visit to your Island, I am glad to have this opportunity of meeting the representatives of the States of Alderney and of assuring them of My concern for the welfare of the Island and its people. I am sorry to learn that the important quarry industry has suffered severely from the war and the abnormal conditions of trade during the last two years; and I earnestly hope that a speedy revival of this industry may help to restore the prosperity of the Island.

I have learnt with much interest that your attention has lately been occupied with the question of re-organising the finances of the Island for the purpose more particularly of effecting improvements in the local educational system. It is impossible to exaggerate the importance of making adequate provision for the education of the young, and this applies with particular force to a small community isolated by the hand of nature from the great centres of activity. I trust that the result of this movement will be to ensure to every child in Alderney the means of so developing his natural powers as to fit him to take a share in the service of his Island home and of the Empire of which it forms a part.

CHIEF PLEAS OF SARK:

TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY:

We, the Seigneur, Sénéchal, Prevôt, Greffier and Tenants of the Island of Sark, forming the Court of Chief Pleas of the Island; a small parcel of Your Majesty's Duchy of Normandy, humbly desire to avail ourselves of this happy occasion to welcome Your Majesties to these parts, and to submit to Your Majesty and the Queen the heartfelt devotion and loyalty of all Your Majesty's faithful subjects in the Island of Sark.

We are proud to remember that the Island was originally granted by Queen Elizabeth to our first Seigneur, Heliex de Carteret, Seigneur of Saint Ouen, Jersey, on the 6th day of August, 1565, who brought over forty families to take possession of this Island and defend it for the Queen against all comers, which Island, following the description of the Letters Patent "by reason of its being waste and deserted, hath therefore during the same time, and is still, in time of war, a convenient place, access and cover to conceal and confederate our enemies attempting hostilities on our said Islands, and others our Dominions, and in time of peace, pirates, thieves and such like, endeavouring to lay wait for and plunder our beloved subjects."

We, the Tenants, who speak on behalf of all

Your Majesty's loyal subjects in the Island, are the direct descendants or assigns of the original settlers, and we feel exceedingly proud that from ancient times we the Chief Pleas of Sark, with the assent of the Seigneur, have been privileged to enact and carry out our own ordinances for the regulation of our own affairs, under which system we have remained content.

We, on behalf of all Your Majesty's loyal subjects in the Island, pray for the continued health and happiness of Your Majesty and the Queen, and the prosperity of Your Majesty's glorious reign.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious answer:—

I thank you heartily for the loyal and dutiful Address of the Chief Pleas of the Island of Sark and for your welcome to Myself and to The Queen. I am glad that this visit has afforded Me an opportunity of meeting not only the States of Guernsey, but representatives of all the Islands of the Bailiwick.

I have noted with interest the reference in your Address to the settlement of Sark by your first Seigneur. At a time when, in the picturesque language of the Charter which you have quoted, Sark was "a convenient place, access and cover to conceal and confederate" enemies or pirates, it presented few attractions, and never for a moment did de Carteret and his colonists think that their Island would become what it is to-day, the resort each year of thousands who seek to enjoy the rare beauty of its seas and coasts. We have good cause to congratulate ourselves on this change of conditions and all that it implies, and more particularly on that happy reshaping of our foreign relations which has enabled the peoples of insular and continental Normandy, so long separated and so often hostile, to reunite as allies and fellow soldiers in the same great cause.

I congratulate you on your devoted attachment to your ancient laws and customs. It is the duty of a free and progressive people to consider from time to time how far and in what direction its old institutions require modification to adapt them to the changing conditions of modern life, and I am glad, therefore, to learn that the Chief Pleas of Sark in consultation with my Lieutenant-Governor of the Bailiwick of Guernsey, have recently had under consideration the question of reform in the legislative and executive system of Sark. I trust that these deliberations may shortly issue in measures which will breathe new life and vigour into the ancient constitution of the Island and increase the happiness and well-being of My faithful subjects in Sark.

From time immemorial every Jerseyman owes service to the King on need arising for a call to arms. Throughout the Great War

This very day, Sire, by a most gracious act, Your Majesty has further added to the justifiable pride of the survivors of them who have fought for their country.

I thank you for your loyal and dutiful Address and for the warmth of the welcome which you have given to Me and to The Queen and to My Daughter. It is a pleasure to Us to come among My faithful subjects of Jersey and to see your beautiful Island for Ourselves; and I am confident that your anticipation that this visit will draw closer the bonds between Jersey and the British Throne will be abundantly fulfilled.

I set great value on that ancient and historic connection, and I am well aware that its unbroken maintenance for so many centuries is due above all to the constant and unswerving loyalty which has characterised the people of Jersey. They remained loyal to the British Crown when continental Normandy was lost; and nothing has ever succeeded in shaking the steadfast devotion of Jersey to its lawful Sovereign. I have observed with interest that the walls of the Royal Court still bear record to the impetuous gallantry with which the Jersey Militia repelled the invasion of 1781. Happily this is an exploit which cannot be repeated. The invaders of 1781 are now our friends and our Allies and as brothers in arms have fought side by side with us in the cause of the liberty of Europe.

In the far greater emergency which confronted us seven years ago the courage and loyalty of Jersey were as conspicuous, and their response to the call of patriotism as ready as when de Rullecourt's troops were for a moment masters of St. Heliers. I am delighted to learn that a United Services Fund Club is now in course of building in St. Heliers to provide a meeting place for all ex-

service men in Jersey. I am confident that the work of this club in fostering during peace the spirit of comradeship that existed in the field will prove of inestimable value not only to the members of the club but to the life of the whole Island.

We shall take away with Us most pleasant memories of Our visit to Jersey; and it is Our earnest hope and prayer that Our loyal subjects in this Island may long continue to be a united, prosperous and flourishing community.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

Provided that any other day not being Sunday may, by agreement in writing between an employer and a worker, be substituted in place of Saturday as the weekly short day, and in such case the normal number of hours on such substituted day shall be five and the normal number of hours on Saturday shall be nine.

Provided that all hours worked on Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—In lieu of the Overtime Rates at present in force and set out in the Notices R. (3), R. (11) and R. (13) issued by the Trade Board and dated 1st April, 1920, and 15th July, 1920, the Proposed Overtime Rates for Female and Male Workers, to apply in substitution for the minimum rates which would otherwise be applicable, in respect of all hours worked by a worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows:—

A.—For all Female Workers (other than Homeworkers) and for all Male Workers employed on Time Work.

(i) For the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Saturday, Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One and a-quarter times the Proposed General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-quarter.

(ii) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays and for all Overtime on Saturday, the Overtime Rate shall be One and a-half times the proposed General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-half.

(iii) For all time worked on Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be twice the proposed General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Double-time.

(iv) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-quarter times the proposed General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of Paragraphs (ii) and (iii) of Sub-section A of this Section.

B.—For certain classes of Female and Male Workers employed on Piece-Work.

Female and Male Workers (other than Female Homeworkers and other than Male Hand-Hacklers for whom General Minimum Piece-Rates are proposed in Part II. of this Schedule and other than Female and Male Workers employed in Hand Machine Braiding for whom general minimum Piece-Rates are proposed in the Trade Board's Notice R. (18)) employed on piece-work shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-Rates, each of which would yield in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker not less than the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate proposed, an amount equal to one quarter of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate proposed, one half of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate proposed, or the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate proposed according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Sub-section A of this Section if the worker had been employed on Time-Work, were Time-and-a-quarter, Time-and-a-half, or Double-time respectively.

C.—For Male Workers employed in Hand-Hackling on Piece-work for which General Minimum Piece-rates are proposed in Part II. of this Schedule.

(i) For the first two hours Overtime on any day except Saturday, Sunday, and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be the appropriate General Minimum Piece-rate proposed with the addition of 4d. per hour.

(ii) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Sunday, and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays and for all Overtime on Saturday, the Overtime Rate shall be the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rate proposed with the addition of 8d. per hour.

(iii) For all time worked on Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be the appropriate General Minimum Piece-rate proposed with the addition of 1s. 4d. per hour.

(iv) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the Overtime Rate shall be the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rate proposed with the addition of 4d. per hour, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of Paragraphs (ii) and (iii) of Sub-Section C of this Section.

SECTION III.—Notwithstanding anything contained in Sections I and II of this Part of this Schedule:—

Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on 5 days a week, the Overtime Rate shall only be payable on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.

(b) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall not be payable in the week on which attendance on Saturday is required until 50 hours have been worked.

PART IV.

The expression "Home-Worker" or "Out-Worker" means a worker who works in her own home, or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

PART V.

The respective Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919, as varied by the Trade Boards (Made-up Textiles) Order, 1920; that is to say, the making or remaking of (a) rope (including driving rope and banding), (b) cord (including blind and window cord, but excluding silk, worsted and other fancy cords), (c) core for wire ropes, (d) lines, (e) twine (including binder and trawl twine), (f) lanyards, (g) net and similar articles; the bleaching, teasing, hackling, carding, preparing and spinning of the materials required for the making or re-making of any of the articles (a) to (g) above, when carried on in the same factory or workshop as such making or re-making; the manufacture of packings, gaskins and spun yarns, when carried on in the same factory or workshop as the making or re-making of any of the articles (a) to (g) above; the braiding or splicing of articles made from rope, cord, twine or net, the mending of nets and the winding, twisting, doubling, laying, polishing, dressing, tarring, tanning, dyeing, balling, reeling, finishing, packing, despatching, warehousing and storing of any of the above articles, where these operations or any of them are carried on in a factory or workshop in which any of the articles (a) to (g) above are made or re-made; but excluding the making of wire rope (unless made in the same factory or workshop as hemp or similar rope or core for wire rope), and excluding the making of net in connexion with the lace curtain trade and the weaving of cloth; and excluding also the splicing or braiding of rope, twine or cord performed by hand or machine when incidental to or carried on in association with or in conjunction with the operations specified in paragraphs 1 and 2 of the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Made-Up Textiles) Order, 1920, or any other processes or operations which are specifically mentioned in such Appendix.

PART VI.

SECTION I.—The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions, other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The employment of Female Workers, Young Persons and Children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from 20th July, 1921. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, Rope, Twine and Net Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4. It is desirable that the Objections should state, precisely and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

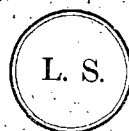

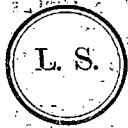

ABERDARE URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL
TRAMWAYS TRACKLESS TROLLEY
AND MOTOR OMNIBUS ROUTES.

JOINT CODE OF BYE-LAWS.

Bye-laws made by the Urban District Council of Aberdare under and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Aberdare Urban District Council Acts of 1911 and 1915.

1. Throughout these Bye-Laws the following words shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—

“Council” means the Urban District Council of Aberdare.

“Tramways” means the Tramways, the Trackless Trolley Routes, and the Motor Omnibus System now or hereafter worked by the Council.

“Car” means any carriage or car run upon the Tramways and Trackless Trolley Routes and any Motor Omnibus owned and used by the Council for the conveyance of passengers.

“Conductor” means any officer or servant of the Council having charge of, or helping in the charge of a car.

“Driver” means any officer or servant of the Council driving or helping to drive a car.

2. The Bye-Laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all cars of the Council, and to all places with respect to which the Council have power to make Bye-Laws and Regulations.

3. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a car by the hindmost or conductor's platform and not otherwise unless so directed by the conductor, provided that this Bye-Law shall not apply to any carriage which can with the approval of the Ministry of Transport be worked by one man in charge only.

When a car stops, no person shall board the car until all persons desiring to alight therefrom shall have done so.

4. No person shall smoke on the lower deck of any car or any compartment of a car not especially provided for that purpose. Any person offending against this Bye-Law is liable in addition to incurring the penalty below mentioned, to be summarily removed at the first opportunity from the car.

5. No person shall spit in, upon, from, or against any car.

6. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any car, play or perform

upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms, or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any car.

7. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any car, and if found in or upon any car shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

8. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any car, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any car, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

9. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice in or upon any car, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any car. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed in these Bye-laws and Regulations in addition to the liability to pay the amount of the damage done.

10. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of the car, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the car, or the dress, or clothing of any passenger, or a person, who, in the opinion of the conductor might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any car, and shall not enter or remain in or upon any car after having been requested by the conductor not to do so, and, if found in or on any car, shall, on request of the conductor, leave the car upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned. Provided that on cars specially run for artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers, no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on a car under the provisions of this Bye-law on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

11. Each passenger shall either on demand or before leaving the car, whichever shall first happen, pay to the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Council, the fare legally demandable for the journey.

12. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required to do so to the conductor or any duly authorised servant of the Council, and shall also when required to do so, either deliver up the ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

13. No passenger shall wilfully alter or deface the ticket, so as to render the number, or any material portion thereof, illegible.

14. No passenger shall use or attempt to use a ticket on any day for which such ticket is not available, or use a ticket which has already been used on a previous journey.

15. Any ticket for the time being issued by the Council in respect of fares, shall be available only for the cars on or for which it is issued (except in the case of transfer or season tickets), and no passenger after leaving any car for any purpose whatever shall be entitled to resume the journey on any other car without payment of a fresh fare from the point at which such journey is resumed except as provided for under Bye-law 31.

16. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer within the true meaning of the Acts of Parliament, relating

to the Council, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics or daily labourers.

17. No luggage, which is in the opinion of the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Council, from its size or otherwise unsuitable for conveyance in or upon a car, shall be taken in or upon such car. Any personal luggage carried by passengers shall be placed in such part of the car as the conductor or other duly authorized officer as aforesaid may direct.

18. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Council shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platform of any car or stand on the upper deck or sit on the outside rail on the upper deck, or on the guards or buffers of any car, and any person so doing shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

19. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall board a car, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of a car or travel therein otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers, except with the consent of the conductor.

20. When any car contains the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation is provided, no other person shall enter or remain in or on the car except by the express permission of the conductor.

21. No person shall enter, mount or leave, or attempt to enter, mount or leave any car in motion.

22. No person shall take a dog or other animal in or on any car except they be small and can be carried in the lap, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. Any such dog or other animal taken into or found on any car in contravention of this regulation shall be removed by the person in charge thereof immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the discretion of the conductor.

23. No person shall enter, get upon or travel in or on any car with loaded firearms or with any article, instrument or implement which may be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.

24. No person other than the conductor or driver shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord or any part of a car or its equipment.

25. No person shall ring, or cause to be rung, any of the signal bells upon any car, so as to effect the unnecessary stoppage of any car or signal a car to start.

26. No person afflicted with any infectious or contagious disease shall board, enter or travel on any car, or attempt to do so.

27. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Council in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any car or tramway of the Council.

28. The conductor shall enforce these Bye-Laws and Regulations and prevent the breach thereof to the best of his ability.

29. Any person offending or committing a breach of any of these Bye-Laws or Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding forty shillings for each and every offence.

30. There shall be placed and kept in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use a

printed copy of these Bye-Laws and Regulations.

31. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or in any way damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon request of the conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available car the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or damaged car.

32. Any person who shall commit, whilst in or upon any car, any breach of these Bye-Laws and Regulations shall, if the offence is continued, be liable in addition to incurring the penalty hereinbefore provided, to be immediately removed from the car by or under the direction of the conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to claim its return.

33. From and after the date of these Bye-Laws and Regulations coming into force, the Bye-Laws and Regulations made by the Council which came into force on the sixteenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, shall be repealed.

34. These Bye-Laws shall come into force on the 1st day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.
