TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England on Friday, the 29th July, 1921, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877; the National Debt Act, 1889; and the War Loan Acts, 1914 to 1919, to the amount of £60,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any date from Tuesday, the 2nd August, to Saturday, 6th August inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the

amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than two o'clock (Saturday twelve o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 26 of the Finance Act, 1915, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

ROPE, TWINE AND NET TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

The Rope, Twine and Net Trade Board (Great Britain) have issued a Notice of Proposal to Vary the General Minimum Piece Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers employed in Hand Machine Braiding at present fixed and set out in the Schedule to their Notice R. (12) dated 10th August, 1920, and effective under the Order of the Minister of Labour dated 7th August, 1920, by a reduction of approximately 10½ per cent. in the General Minimum Piece Rates.

The Trade Board have also issued a Notice of Proposal to reduce by approximately 6 per cent. the General Minimum Piece Rates for Female Homeworkers at present in force and set out in the Schedule to their Notice R. (15) dated 30th September, 1920, and effective under an Order of the Minister of Labour dated 30th September, 1920.

Copies of the Notices setting out the rates in full can be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Trade Board at the address specified below.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to their Proposals to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from 20th July, 1921.
