#### TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 12th August, 1921, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914 to 1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any date from Monday, the 15th August, to Saturday, the 20th August, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a banker's draft on the Bank of England not later than two o'clock (Saturday twelve o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 26 of the Finance Act, 1915, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

## PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Paper Bag Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Paper Bag Trade) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they Propose to Vary the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers and the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for Female Workers at present fixed and set out in the Schedule to their Notice P. (5), dated 12th November, 1920, and effective under the Order of the Minister of Labour, dated 10th November, 1920, and that the proposed variations are as shown in the Schedule set out below.

In the case of Female Workers employed on piece-work each piece-rate paid shall be such as will yield in the circumstances of the case, not less than 8½d. an hour to an Ordinary Worker, i.e., a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the classes of work in question.

## PART IV.

Overtime Rates calculated on the Proposed Minimum Rates specified in Parts I, II and III of this Schedule in the manner specified in Part IV of the Schedule to the Trade Board's

Notice P. (5) dated 12th November, 1920, shall apply, in substitution for the Minimum Rates set out in Parts I, II and III of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in their Notice dated 12th November, 1920, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

## PART V.

The above Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Board's (Paper Bag Trade) Order, 1919, and as set out in Part VI of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice P. (5), dated 12th November, 1920.

NOTE.—The employment of Female Workers, Young Persons and Children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

The Trade Board will consider any objections

to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 3rd August, 1921. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address); and should be sent to the Secretary of the Paper Bag Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4. It is desirable that the objections should state precisely, and

so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

#### PROPOSAL TO VARY GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE WORKERS AND GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES AND OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with the Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, in Great Britain for the Broom and Brush Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Brush and Broom) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY in respect of certain classes of Male Workers the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates at present fixed and set out in the Schedule to their Notice M. (10) dated 28th May, 1920, and effective under the Order of the Minister of Labour dated 26th May, 1920, and to vary the General Minimum Piece-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male Workers other than apprentices and for Female Workers as fixed and as varied by the Trade Board and set out in their Notices M. (12), M. (13) and M. (14), dated 2nd September, 1920, and effective under Orders of the Minister of Labour dated 28th August, 1920, and in their Notice M. (20) dated 26th April, 1921, and effective under the Order of the Minister of Labour dated 20th April, 1921, and to vary the Minimum Rates for Male Apprentices as fixed and as varied by the Trade Board and set out in their Notices M. (16), M. (20) and M. (22) dated 18th October, 1920, 26th April, 1921, and 20th June, 1921, respectively, and effective under Orders of the Minister of Labour dated 15th October, 1920, 20th April, 1921, and 20th June, 1921, respectively, as shown in the Schedule set out below.

## PART III.

*Proposed Variation of Minimum Rates for Male Apprentices.*

The Trade Board propose to Vary the Minimum Rates for Male Apprentices at present in operation under the provisions of the Trade Board's Notices M. (16), M. (20) and M. (22) by providing that such rates shall apply in like manner as though a rate of 1s. 4½d. per hour were substituted in the provisions of such Notices for the rate of 1s. 5½d. per hour, and as though the proposed General Minimum Piece-Rates for Male Workers (other than Apprentices) provided in Section I of Part II of this Schedule were substituted for the General Minimum Piece-Rates at present in operation.

## PART IV.

*Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates.*

In lieu of the Overtime Rates at present in operation Overtime Rates calculated on the proposed minimum rates provided in Parts I, II and III of this Schedule shall apply in the manner set out in Part IV of the Trade Board's Notice M. (10) dated 28th May, 1920, in the case of Male workers (other than Apprentices) and Female Workers, and in the manner set out in Part II of the Trade Board's Notice M. (16) dated 18th October, 1920, in the case of Male Apprentices.

## PART V.

The proposed Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Act to all Male and Female Workers specified in this Notice (including Home-workers) in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Brush and Broom) Order, 1919, that is to say, the manufacture of brushes (other than feather brushes) or brooms, including the following operations, where all or any of them are carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of such Brushes or Brooms:—

(a) The drafting, dressing or mixing of bass, whisk or similar fibres or animal bristles or hair and the working of wood, bone, ivory or celluloid;

(b) All finishing, warehousing, packing or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of such Brushes or Brooms;

but excluding the following operations:—

The sawing and turning of wood as a preliminary operation to the manufacture of such brushes or brooms, the making of metal parts and the mounting of brushes with metal or tortoise-shell backs.

Provided that the rates shall not apply to workers employed as Carmen, Engineers, Powermen, Enginemen or Stokers.

Provided also that the Minimum Rates set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule shall not apply to:—

(i) Male Indentured Apprentices or Unbound Learners employed under an indenture or written agreement respectively entered into prior to the 1st January, 1920, and providing for the proper instruction of the apprentice or learner in one or more of

the operations or branches of work specified in Section I of Part I of this Schedule.

(ii) Male Indentured Apprentices employed under indentures in a form prescribed by the Trade Board and working under conditions laid down by the Trade Board.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above Proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from 3rd August, 1921. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Brush and Broom Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that the objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

#### REGULATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT AS NATURALIST ON THE SCIENTIFIC STAFF OF THE FISHERY BOARD FOR SCOTLAND.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. Application for appointment must be made to the Secretary of the Fishery Board for Scotland at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Fishery Board. When vacancies occur, the Fishery Board will cause notice to be given by advertisement in the

Press, which will include a statement of the last day fixed for the receipt of applications.

2. Candidates must be between 22 and 26 years of age on the last day fixed for the receipt of applications. If that date were the twenty-second anniversary of a candidate's birth he would be within the limits of age; if it were the twenty-sixth anniversary he would be beyond them: provided that he may deduct from his actual age any time during which he may have served in His Majesty's Forces between 4 August, 1914, and 11 November, 1918, inclusive.

3. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects, and the children of fathers also natural-born British subjects, provided that exception to the latter condition may be made in the case of a candidate who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces during the Great War.

4. Candidates must have studied science at a university and proceeded to a degree. Account will be taken of the ability indicated by the degree and of the suitability of the sciences studied to the work of a naturalist. The most suitable sciences are natural history, biology and chemistry.

5. The completed application forms will be scrutinised by the Fishery Board, and those candidates who appear to satisfy the conditions of these regulations will be interviewed by a Selection Board consisting of representatives of the Fishery Board and a representative of the Civil Service Commission. The Selection Board will prepare a list in order of merit of those candidates whom they consider suitable for appointment.

6. The necessary number of candidates will be appointed as Probationer Naturalists subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners that they fulfil all the conditions laid down in these regulations and are eligible in respect of health and character, and to the payment of a fee of £1 10s.

The Probationary period will be two years. If, during that period, a Probationer is found not to be suitable or satisfactory, the appointment may be terminated by three months' notice.

If the service is approved at the termination of the probationary period, a certificate of qualification for the establishment of the Probationer, who will then be required to pay £1 10s., the remaining part of the prescribed fee of £3, will be issued by the Civil Service Commissioners. Pension rights under the Superannuation Acts will then accrue as from the date of the original appointment.

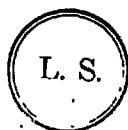

BYE-LAWS made by the Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Lincoln, being the promoters of the City of Lincoln Omnibus Undertaking under and in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Lincoln Corporation Act, 1915, at a Meeting of the City Council held in the Guildhall in the said City, on Tuesday, the 26th day of July, 1921.

*Interpretation of Clauses.*

1. Throughout these bye-laws the following words shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—

“Corporation” means the Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Lincoln.

“Omnibus” means any stage carriage belonging to the Corporation moved by mechanical power obtained from some internal source.

“Conductor” means any officer or servant of the Corporation having charge of or helping in the charge of an omnibus.

“Driver” means any officer or servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive an omnibus.

“Officer” means the Traffic Manager or any Tramway Inspector in the employ of the Corporation, or any Inspector of Public Carriages in the employ of the Corporation.

*Extent of Bye-laws.*

2. The bye-laws hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to every omnibus and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make bye-laws.

*Entering and Leaving Omnibuses.*

3. When an omnibus stops, no person shall board the omnibus until all passengers desiring to alight therefrom shall have done so.

*Smoking.*

4. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette in any part of an omnibus which may from time to time be set apart for the use of non-smokers.

*Gambling, etc.*

5. No person shall gamble or play any game of cards, or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms or subscriptions, or sell any article in or upon any omnibus.

*Musical Instruments.*

6. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any omnibus, play or perform upon any musical instrument, or make any other noise which may be objectionable to passengers.

*Contagious, etc., Disease.*

7. A person affected with any dangerous, contagious or infectious disorder or disease shall not enter or mount into or upon any omnibus.

*Intoxicated Persons, Obscene or Offensive Language or Conduct, Etc.*

8. No person while in or upon any omnibus, omnibus station or premises shall—

- (a) be in a state of intoxication; or
- (b) swear or use obscene or offensive or abusive language; or
- (c) spit or commit any nuisance; or
- (d) wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger; or
- (e) deposit remnants of food or fruit.

*Damage to Omnibus.*

9. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the seats, cushions, curtains or the linings, or remove or deface any bye-laws, number-plate, printed, painted or other notice or any advertisement in or on the omnibus, or mark, break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any omnibus, or touch, handle or interfere with any appliance in, under or about any omnibus. Any person acting in contravention of this bye-law shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these bye-laws, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

*Objectionable Persons.*

10. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of a conductor of an omnibus, soil or injure the seats, linings or cushions of the omnibus, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any omnibus, and may be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon any omnibus, and shall not enter into or upon any omnibus after being requested not to do so by the conductor, and if found in or upon any omnibus shall, on the request of the conductor, forthwith leave such omnibus upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned. Provided that on omnibuses specially run for artisans, mechanics and daily labourers no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on an omnibus, under the provisions of this bye-law, on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

*Payment of Fares.*

11. Each passenger shall upon demand pay to the conductor, or other servant of the Corporation, acting in the performance of his duty, the fare legally demandable for the journey, or for the stage thereof for which it be demanded, and accept a ticket therefor, and in any case before leaving the omnibus shall pay such fare whether demanded or not.

No child under five years of age, who is sitting on the lap of a passenger, shall be liable to pay a fare, provided that this provision shall apply only to one such child accompany-

ing any one passenger; any additional child, irrespective of age, accompanying such passenger shall pay the full ordinary fare.

#### *Tickets.*

12. Each passenger shall show his ticket when required so to do to the conductor or other servant of the Corporation, acting in the performance of his duty, and shall also when required so to do by the conductor or other servant of the Corporation, acting in the performance of his duty, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

Tickets shall not be transferable, and shall only be available by the omnibus on which they are issued.

#### *Luggage.*

13. No passenger shall bring on to any omnibus any luggage other than his own personal luggage, and any such personal luggage shall be placed by the passenger in such position on the omnibus as shall be directed by the conductor, and shall not exceed 14 lbs. in weight.

In no case shall any luggage be put upon or occupy any part of a seat or be of a form or description or character to annoy or inconvenience any other passenger.

#### *Travelling on Steps, Etc.*

14. No passenger or other person, not being a servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, shall be permitted to travel or ride on the steps or platforms of any omnibus, or, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained, stand in or on any omnibus.

No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or board any omnibus, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any omnibus or, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained, travel in any omnibus otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

#### *Full Number of Passengers.*

15. When any omnibus contains the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof painted in or on or attached to the omnibus, is provided, no additional person, not being a servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, shall enter, board or remain in or on any such omnibus, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained.

#### *Entering or Leaving an Omnibus when in Motion.*

16. No person shall enter, board or leave, or attempt to enter, board or leave any omnibus in motion.

#### *Dogs.*

17. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any omnibus, except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any omnibus, after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any omnibus in breach of this bye-law, shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the omnibus, immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such

request may be removed by, or under the direction of, the conductor.

#### *Firearms, Etc.*

18. No person shall enter, board or travel in or on any omnibus with loaded firearms or any explosive substance, or with any article, instrument or implement, or any material or substance which may, in the opinion of the conductor, be dangerous or offensive to the passengers.

#### *Interference with the Conductor or Driver.*

19. No person, other than the conductor, driver or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, or any part of an omnibus or its equipment.

#### *Obstruction.*

20. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any conductor, driver or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, upon or in connection with any omnibus.

#### *Disabled Omnibuses.*

21. If at any time an omnibus becomes disabled, or in any way damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available omnibus the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or damaged omnibus.

#### *Conductors and Drivers to Enforce Bye-laws.*

22. Every conductor and driver shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these bye-laws and prevent the breach thereof; and if any such conductor or driver fails to enforce the same as aforesaid he shall be deemed to have committed a breach thereof.

#### *Removal of Persons Infringing Bye-laws.*

23. Any person who shall commit, whilst in or on any omnibus, any breach of these bye-laws shall, if the offence is continued, be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be immediately removed from the omnibus by or under the direction of the conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare he shall not be entitled to claim its return.

#### *Penalty.*

24. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

#### *Copy of Bye-laws to be kept in Omnibuses.*

25. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each omnibus in use a printed copy of these bye-laws.

#### *Operation.*

26. These bye-laws shall come into force on the first day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.
