

ing any one passenger; any additional child, irrespective of age, accompanying such passenger shall pay the full ordinary fare.

*Tickets.*

12. Each passenger shall show his ticket when required so to do to the conductor or other servant of the Corporation, acting in the performance of his duty, and shall also when required so to do by the conductor or other servant of the Corporation, acting in the performance of his duty, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

Tickets shall not be transferable, and shall only be available by the omnibus on which they are issued.

*Luggage.*

13. No passenger shall bring on to any omnibus any luggage other than his own personal luggage, and any such personal luggage shall be placed by the passenger in such position on the omnibus as shall be directed by the conductor, and shall not exceed 14 lbs. in weight.

In no case shall any luggage be put upon or occupy any part of a seat or be of a form or description or character to annoy or inconvenience any other passenger.

*Travelling on Steps, Etc.*

14. No passenger or other person, not being a servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, shall be permitted to travel or ride on the steps or platforms of any omnibus, or, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained, stand in or on any omnibus.

No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or board any omnibus, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any omnibus or, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained, travel in any omnibus otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

*Full Number of Passengers.*

15. When any omnibus contains the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof painted in or on or attached to the omnibus, is provided, no additional person, not being a servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, shall enter, board or remain in or on any such omnibus, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained.

*Entering or Leaving an Omnibus when in Motion.*

16. No person shall enter, board or leave, or attempt to enter, board or leave any omnibus in motion.

*Dogs.*

17. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any omnibus, except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any omnibus, after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any omnibus in breach of this bye-law, shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the omnibus, immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such

request may be removed by, or under the direction of, the conductor.

*Firearms, Etc.*

18. No person shall enter, board or travel in or on any omnibus with loaded firearms or any explosive substance, or with any article, instrument or implement, or any material or substance which may, in the opinion of the conductor, be dangerous or offensive to the passengers.

*Interference with the Conductor or Driver.*

19. No person, other than the conductor, driver or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, or any part of an omnibus or its equipment.

*Obstruction.*

20. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any conductor, driver or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, upon or in connection with any omnibus.

*Disabled Omnibuses.*

21. If at any time an omnibus becomes disabled, or in any way damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available omnibus the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or damaged omnibus.

*Conductors and Drivers to Enforce Bye-laws.*

22. Every conductor and driver shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these bye-laws and prevent the breach thereof; and if any such conductor or driver fails to enforce the same as aforesaid he shall be deemed to have committed a breach thereof.

*Removal of Persons Infringing Bye-laws.*

23. Any person who shall commit, whilst in or on any omnibus, any breach of these bye-laws shall, if the offence is continued, be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be immediately removed from the omnibus by or under the direction of the conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare he shall not be entitled to claim its return.

*Penalty.*

24. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

*Copy of Bye-laws to be kept in Omnibuses.*

25. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each omnibus in use a printed copy of these bye-laws.

*Operation.*

26. These bye-laws shall come into force on the first day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.
