

such purpose and sale, and to make any incidental provisions.

To cancel the memorandum and articles of association of the Limited Company.

To prescribe the consideration for such transfer or vesting, and to provide that the same may be wholly or partly stock or shares or cash of the Company, and to require trustees and others to accept such last-mentioned stock or shares or cash of the Company for stock and shares of the Limited Company, and to make provision as to the debts and liabilities of and moneys due or accrued due to the Limited Company.

To authorise the Company to maintain, alter, improve, renew or discontinue gasworks and plant for manufacturing, and to manufacture and store gas and residual and manufactured products upon the lands following in the urban district of Oakengates, in the county of Salop, and to deal in such products. The said lands are:—

Lands belonging or reputed to belong to and occupied by the Limited Company, containing by admeasurement 3 acres 3 roods 8 perches 10 yards or thereabouts at Oakengates, in the parish of Wombridge and county of Salop, bounded on the north by premises belonging or reputed to belong to Emily Edkins, Charles Owen and Ernest Moore; on the west by the Great Western Railway (Shrewsbury to Birmingham branch), on the south by premises belonging or reputed to belong to the Trustees of Wombridge Parish Schools, Richard Lawrence Corbett and William Onions, and on the east by the road from Oakengates to Wombridge.

To empower the Company to create and issue new shares and stock and debenture stock (redeemable or not), and to borrow further money, and to attach to such shares and stock or any class thereof such dividends, interest, priorities or rights as may be found desirable, and to provide for a standard price and the calculation of dividends in relation to sales on a thermal unit or other basis, to amend any provisions in the Wellington (Salop) Gas Act, 1903, relating to dividends, capital or borrowing, to allow authorised ordinary capital to be issued as preference capital, and to allow any capital or loan capital to be raised on redeemable securities.

To authorise the payment of pension or other allowances or benefits to officers and servants, special purposes, reserve and other funds.

To make new provisions as to meetings, voting, proxies, joint holders, directors, notice of nomination of directors or opposition to their re-election and as to their election and re-election and powers, and contracts by them, their number and qualification, increase of directors, managing directors, accounts and auditors, remuneration of secretary and auditors, interim dividends, closing registers and notices to and by the Company.

To extend the limits within which the Company are authorised to supply gas, and to authorise them to supply gas within the following limits (that is to say):—

The parishes and places of Wellington, Wrockwardine Wood, Wombridge, Shifnal, Littlehall and Dawley, in the county of Salop, or such parts thereof as are bounded by an imaginary line drawn as follows, viz.:—

From the railway bridge near Oakengates, on the road leading from Oakengates to

Wrockwardine Wood, along the south side of the Coalport branch of the London and North Western Railway to the railway bridge over the road leading from Wombridge to Oakengates, thence in a south-westerly direction along the south side of the said railway to a point distant 440 yards from the last-mentioned bridge; thence in a straight line to the public house known as the "Unicorn Inn," being No. 107, Holyhead Road, at Potters Bank, near Ketley; thence across the Holyhead Road and along the south side of the road leading to Red Lake, Mossey Green, and Malins Lee Hall; from Malins Lee Hall in a straight line to the group of three houses known as 13, 15 and 17, Malins Lee; thence in a straight line to a point where the Naird Lane joins the Holyhead Road; thence in a straight line to a point at Limekiln Bank, on the north side of Watling Street Road, 210 yards east of the centre of the gateway of St. George's Vicarage; thence in a straight line to a point on the road leading from St. George's to Donnington opposite two dwelling houses, known as "Erindale" and "Nyth," and thence in a straight line to the first mentioned railway bridge.

To confirm and to authorise the Company to maintain and use any works laid down by them beyond their existing limits of supply.

To make further provision as to price or prices of gas, gas for power, public lighting, the construction and placing of pipes and fittings and bye-laws, exemption of fittings from seizure, entry on premises, removal of fittings, relief from penalties, cutting off and re-connecting supplies and expense thereof, pipes for ancillary purposes and in non-dedicated streets, supplies in bulk, licences and patents, notices and relief from obligation to or conditions of supply.

To authorise the Company to apply for powers to supply electricity, and to apply their funds in and to obtain further capital powers by such applications, and to apply their funds in the exercise of powers granted thereunder.

To incorporate and apply, with or without modification, any provisions of the Gas Works Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1871, the Companies Clauses Acts, 1845 and 1889, and to repeal or amend any provisions of the Wellington (Salop) Gas Act, 1903, and any other Act or Order affecting the Company.

Any local or other public authority, company or person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the Draft Order may do so by registered letter addressed to the Secretary, Board of Trade, Great George Street, London, S.W. 1, and despatched on or before the 7th day of October, 1921.

Any such objection shall state: (a) the specific grounds of objection; (b) the omissions, additions or modifications asked for.

A copy of the objection shall be forwarded to the applicants for the Order or their Agents, at the same time as it is sent to the Board of Trade.

A copy of the Draft Order and of the Map have been deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Salop and with the Clerk of the Shropshire County Council, the Shire Hall, Shrewsbury; with the Clerk to the Wellington Urban District
