Piece-Rates for Male Workers for Pan Work as proposed in the Trade Board's Notice M. (23) dated 2nd August, 1921.)

PART V.

Proposed Overtime Rates and Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates.

Overtime Rates calculated on the proposed Minimum Rates set out in Parts I, II, III & IV of this Schedule, in the manner set out in

Part IV of the Schedule to the Notice M. (10) issued by the Trade Board and dated 28th May, 1920, shall apply in substitution for the rates set out in Parts I, II, III & IV of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the Schedule to their Notice M. (10) dated 28th May, 1920, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART VI.—Definitions.

(a) *Female Pan Hands.*

For the purpose of the application of the Minimum Rates specified in Parts I, II, III & V of this Schedule, a Female Pan Hand shall be defined as a Female Worker of any age who performs the operation of pan-setting with or without the operations of boring and/or trimming.

(b) *Female Pan-Setting Learners.*

For the purpose of the application of the Minimum Rates set out in Section II of Part III of this Schedule, a pan-setting learner is defined as being a female worker (of any age) who:—

(a) is employed during the whole of her time in accordance with the provisions of this Schedule under an Agreement for a period of two years in the form prescribed by the Trade Board as set out in Part VII of this Schedule. Provided that no worker shall be permitted to serve more than one period of two years as a pan-setting learner at the minimum rates fixed by the Trade Board and in accordance with the conditions laid down by the Trade Board from time to time.

(b) has been registered with the Trade Board in accordance with Rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made application for such registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration.

Provided that:—

(i) The Registration may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

(ii) An employer may employ a worker at the special rates and under the special conditions for pan-setting learners without registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks; but in the event of the worker being continued thereafter at her employment as a pan-setting learner the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

PART VII.

Form of Agreement prescribed by the Trade Board for Female Pan-Setting Learners.

For the purpose of the application of the Minimum Rates set out in Part III of this Schedule a female pan-setting learner shall be employed under an agreement in the following form:—

Memorandum of Agreement made this
day of between
(hereinafter referred to as "the Employers")
of the one part and (herein-

after referred to as "the Learner") of the other part.

Whereas the Learner is desirous of being trained in the branch of the Brush and Broom Trade known as the operation of "Pan-Setting" and the Employers being engaged in the said trade are willing to give her such training.

Now it is hereby mutually agreed as follows:—

1. The Learner will enter and continue in the service of the Employers and they will receive and retain her in their service as a Learner for the period of two years from the date of this Agreement subject nevertheless to the provisions for earlier determination contained in Clause 5 hereof.

2. During the said term of service the Learner will apply herself diligently to learn the said operation and will faithfully serve the Employers and obey their lawful commands and they on their part will cause her to be well and sufficiently instructed in the said operation.

3. The Employers will pay to the Learner wages in accordance with the current rates of wages applicable to female learners employed as "Pan-Setters" as fixed from time to time by the Brush and Broom Trade Board (Great Britain) subject however to this proviso that if the Learner shall at any time be absent from her duties (whether by reason of sickness or any other cause whatsoever) without the consent of the Employers the Learner shall not be deemed to be employed for the period of such absence and shall not be entitled to any wages for such period. The wages payable to the Learner under this agreement shall be deemed to accrue from hour to hour.

4. Subject to the provisions of this Agreement the working hours and conditions of the said service shall be those applying to the women operatives at the factory of the Employers for the time being.

5. If the Learner wilfully disobeys any lawful order of the Employers or otherwise wilfully misconducts herself towards the Employers or those in their employment it shall be lawful for the Employers to discharge the Learner from their service and absolutely determine this Agreement.

6. If either of the parties hereto desires for any reason to determine this Agreement before the expiration of the said period of two years or in the event of any dispute arising involving allegations of unsuitability or of failure to apply herself diligently to learn the said operation on the part of the Learner or of failure on the part of the Employers to cause her to be well and sufficiently instructed in the said operation or of wrongful exercise by the Employers of their power to dismiss the Learner under Clause 5 hereof which cannot be settled between the parties hereto, the Employers and the Learner hereby mutually agree that the matters in dispute shall stand referred in the first instance to the Brush and Broom Trade Board (Great Britain) with a view to effecting a settlement thereof.

7. On the due completion of the said term of service this Agreement shall be given by

the Employers to the Learner with a Certificate, endorsed thereon and signed by or on behalf of the Employers, that the said term of service has been duly served.

PART VIII

SECTION I.—The respective Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers (including Home-workers) of the classes specified in this Schedule in respect of any time during which they are employed in Great Britain, in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Brush and Broom) Order, 1919, that is to say, the manufacture of brushes (other than feather brushes) or brooms;

Including the following operations, where all or any of them are carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of such brushes or brooms:—

(a) The drafting, dressing, or mixing of bass, whisk, or similar fibres, or animal bristles or hair, and the working of wood, bone, ivory or celluloid;

(b) All finishing, warehousing, packing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of such brushes or brooms;

But excluding the following operations:—

The sawing and turning of wood as a preliminary operation to the manufacture of such brushes or brooms, the making of metal parts, and the mounting of brushes with metal or tortoiseshell backs.

Provided that nothing in this Schedule shall apply to female apprentices or female learners employed under an Indenture or Written Agreement, respectively entered into prior to 31st January, 1921, and providing for the proper instruction of the apprentice or learner in the operation or branch of work known as pan-setting.

SECTION II.—The proposed Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorized by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION III.—The Proposed Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule are without prejudice to Workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

PART IX.

The Trade Board further give notice that the proposals contained in this Schedule are in substitution for the proposals contained in the Schedule to the Notice M. (21) issued by the

Trade Board, and dated 10th June, 1921, which is hereby withdrawn.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from 20th August, 1921. REGULATIONS UNDER SECTION 9 (1).

BOROUGH OF SOUTHAMPTON.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Southampton;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the power to make such Regulations has been transferred to the Minister of Transport;

And whereas the Town Council of the Borough of Southampton have applied for the issue of a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force as herein-after mentioned:

Now, therefore, the Minister of Transport, in pursuance of the powers given to him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding

ten miles per hour shall, during the period of twelve months from the date on which these Regulations come into operation, apply and have effect as regards all the roadways which lie within the limits comprising the London and South Western Railway Company's Dock Estate at Southampton and to which the public are, or may be, granted access.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the thirty-first day of August, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

**ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.**

(DATED 21ST AUGUST 1921.)

**ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND)
ORDER OF 1921 (No. 16).**

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Prohibition of Landing except for Slaughter
within Landing Place.*

1.—(1) Cattle, sheep, goats or swine shipped from Ireland shall not, unless and until it is otherwise ordered by the Minister, be landed after the date hereof at any port or place in Great Britain except in accordance with the following provisions of this Order.

(2) Cattle, sheep, goats or swine shipped from any port in Ireland which is mentioned in the First Schedule to the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Consolidation and Amendment Order of 1914, except the port of Dublin, may after the date hereof be landed at any landing place defined by Order of the Minister as a landing place for Irish animals, but only for the purpose of slaughter within the landing place.

(3) The landing of any animals under this Order must be authorised by the Superintendent or person in charge of the landing place.

(4) Animals so landed shall be subject to the provisions of the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Consolidation and Amendment Order of 1914, except that the animals shall not be moved from the landing place and shall be slaughtered therein within ninety-six hours after their landing.

*Special Provision as to Animals destined for
Manchester Irish Animals Landing Place.*

2. Animals, if intended to be landed at the Manchester Irish Animals Landing Place under this Order shall not be carried through the Eastham Lock until they have been examined

by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry and unless and until the Inspector certifies that his examination and information do not show that there is, or during the voyage has been, an animal on board affected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

3. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

4. If any animal shall be landed or moved in contravention to this Order, or is not slaughtered as hereby required, the owner thereof and the owner and the lessee and the occupier of the place of landing, and the person causing, directing or permitting the landing or movement, and the owner and person in charge of the animal which is not so slaughtered, and the owner and the charterer, and the master of the vessel from which the same is landed as the case may be, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as the ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND) ORDER OF 1921 (No. 16).

In the administrative county of Carmarthen.

The parishes of Quarter Bach, Llanddeusant, Myddfai, Llangadock, and Llandilo-Fawr Rural (except its detached part).

Bute.—An Area comprising the holdings known as Nether Ardrosedale, Ballycaul, Upper Ardrosedale and Dunalunt, in the parish of North Bute, in the county of Bute.

Carmarthen.—See under Brecknock.

Inverness.—(1) An Area comprising the islands known as the Outer Hebrides (except the islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay, and Boreray), in the county of Inverness.

(2) An Area in the county of Inverness,

comprising the islands known as Skye or Inner Hebrides.

Kent.—The administrative counties of Kent and East Sussex.
