TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England on Friday, the 2nd September, 1921, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914 to 1919, to the amount of £50,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any date from Monday, the 5th September, to Saturday, the 10th September inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given

for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than two o'clock (Saturday twelve o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 26 of the Finance Act, 1915, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

**MIXED ARBITRAL TRIBUNAL
BETWEEN THE BRITISH EMPIRE AND
AUSTRIA.**

The following announcement is made by the
Board of Trade:—

In pursuance of Article 256 of the Treaty
of St. Germain-en-Laye, the Mixed Arbitral
Tribunal between the British Empire and
Austria has been constituted, and is about to
commence work in London. The President is
Mr. B. C. J. Loder, LL.D., Judge of the
Supreme Court of the Netherlands, the British
Member is Mr. Heber Hart, K.C., LL.D.,
and the Austrian Member Dr. jur Paul Ham-
merschlag.

An important part of the work of the
Tribunal will be to decide upon claims in re-
spect of debts under Section III of Part X
of the Treaty where a difference arises between
British and Austrian Nationals or between the
British and Austrian Clearing Offices. It has
also jurisdiction under Section IV ("Property,
Rights and Interests"), Section V ("Con-
tracts, Prescriptions, Judgments"), Section
VI ("Mixed Arbitral Tribunal"), and Section
VII ("Industrial Property") of Part X of
the above Treaty.

By the Treaty the High Contracting Parties
have agreed that their courts and authorities
shall render to the Tribunal direct all the
assistance in their power, particularly as re-
gards transmitting notices and collecting
evidence; and they have also agreed to regard
the decisions of the Tribunal as final and con-
clusive and to render them binding upon their
nationals.

Statutory effect has been given to the provi-
sions of the Treaty in this country by an Order
in Council of the 13th August, 1920 (Statutory
Rules and Orders, 1920, No. 1613).

The British Government has provided head-
quarters for the Tribunal at Winchester House,
21, St. James's Square, S.W. 1. Mr. Claud
Mullins, Barrister-at-Law, is the British Secre-
tary.

hereby make the following Order:—

1. Clause 11 of the Explosives in Coal Mines
Order of the 1st September, 1913 (c), as
amended by subsequent Orders made under the
said section, shall be further amended as
follows:—

The period during which the non-
detonating explosives named in the Second
Schedule to that Order are included in the
term "permitted explosives" shall be ex-
tended to the 31st December, 1923.

2. This Order may be cited as "The Ex-
plosives in Coal Mines Order of the 24th
August, 1921."

**GENERAL WASTE MATERIALS RECLA-
MATION TRADE BOARD (GREAT
BRITAIN).**

**PROPOSAL TO FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES
FOR FEMALE AND CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE
WORKERS.**

In accordance with Regulations made under
Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by
the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October,
1918, the Trade Board established in Great
Britain under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and
1918, for the Branch of the Trade specified in
the Trade Boards (Waste Materials Reclama-
tion) Order, 1920, which is covered by the
Regulations made by the Minister of Labour
and dated 27th August, 1920, with respect to
the General Waste Branch of the Waste
Materials Reclamation Trade, hereby give
notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade
Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to Fix
General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work
Basis Time-Rates, Guaranteed Time-Rates for
Piece-Workers, and Overtime Rates for Female

Workers and General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male Workers of 21 years of age or over and to declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade for the purpose of the application of the Overtime Rates, as set out below.

PART I.

Female Workers.

A. Waste Paper and Paper Stock Materials Section of the Trade (as hereinafter defined).

SECTION I.—Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates for Female Workers and Guaranteed Time-Rates for Female Piece-Workers.

(NOTE.—As regards the application of the Guaranteed Time-Rates see Section I of Part V of this Notice.)

Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates and Guaranteed Time-Rates.

Workers under 14½ years of age,
14s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 3½d. per hour.
Workers of 14½ and under 15 years of age,
15s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 3¾d. per hour.
Workers of 15 and under 15½ years of age,
17s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 4¼d. per hour.
Workers of 15½ and under 16 years of age,
19s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 4¾d. per hour.
Workers of 16 and under 16½ years of age,
21s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 5¼d. per hour.
Workers of 16½ and under 17 years of age,
23s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 5¾d. per hour.
Workers of 17 and under 17½ years of age,
25s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 6¼d. per hour.
Workers of 17½ and under 18 years of age,
27s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 6¾d. per hour.
Workers of 18 years of age or over,
30s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 7¼d. per hour.

1. Provided that in the case of workers of 14½ years of age and upwards and under 18 years of age the rate applicable to a worker of any particular age as set out in the foregoing Table shall only become payable on the first pay-day in January or July, as the case may be, corresponding with or next following the date on which the worker attains such age, the rate payable until such half-yearly pay-day being that applicable under the Table to a worker of the next lower age group.

2. Provided also that in the case of a worker who has had less than three months' experience in the operations of sorting or grading of Waste-Paper or Paper Stock Materials, and who:—

(a) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning such operations by an employer who provides the learner with reasonable facilities for such learning; and

(b) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board or has made application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration;

the minimum rate payable to her during the period required to complete such first three months of experience shall be 1d. per hour less than that otherwise applicable to her under the foregoing provisions.

SECTION II.—Proposed Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate for Female Piece-Workers.

Female Workers of all ages, 8½d. per hour.

(NOTE.—As regards the application of the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, see Section II (a) of Part V of this Notice.)

SECTION III.—Proposed Overtime Rates.—The Proposed Overtime Rates for Female Workers employed in this section of the trade whether engaged on Time-Work or on Piece-Work are as set out in Part III of this Notice.

SECTION IV.—For the purpose of this Notice the Waste Paper and Paper Stock Materials Section of the Trade is defined to be that Section of the Trade specified in Part IV of this Notice which is engaged in:—

(a) The sorting or grading of Waste Paper or Paper Stock Materials in or in connection with any establishment or business or branch or department in which such sorting and grading is the sole or main business of that establishment, or business or branch or department.

(b) The operations of receiving, packing, compressing, teagling, craning, despatching or warehousing when carried on in association with or in conjunction with any of the operations referred to in Clause (a).

B.—Woollen Rag or Woollen and Worsted Waste Materials Section of the Trade (as hereinafter defined).

SECTION I.—Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates for Female Workers and Guaranteed Time-Rates for Female Piece-Workers.

(NOTE.—As regards the application of the Guaranteed Time-Rates, see Section I of Part V of this Notice.)

22s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 5¼d. per hour.
Workers of 16½ and under 17 years of age,
24s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 6d. per hour.
Workers of 17 and under 17½ years of age,
27s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 6¾d. per hour.
Workers of 17½ and under 18 years of age,
30s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 7¼d. per hour.
Workers of 18 years of age or over,
33s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 8¼d. per hour.

1.—Provided that in the case of workers of 14½ years of age and upwards and under 18 years of age the rate applicable to a worker of any particular age as set out in the foregoing Table shall only become payable on the first pay day in January or July, as the case may be, corresponding with or next following the date on which the worker attains such age, the rate payable until such half-yearly pay day being that applicable under the Table to a worker of the next lower age group.

2.—Provided also that in the case of a worker who has had less than three months' experience in the operations of sorting or grading Woollen Rag or Woollen and Worsted Waste Materials, and who is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning such operations by an employer who provides the learner with reasonable facilities for such learning, the Minimum Rate payable to her during the period required to complete such first three months of experience shall be 1d. per hour less than that otherwise applicable to her under the foregoing provisions.

SECTION II.—Proposed Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for Female Piece-Workers.

Female Workers of all ages, 9½d. per hour.
(NOTE.—As regards the application of the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates, see Section II (a) of Part V of this Notice.)

SECTION III.—Proposed Overtime Rates.—The Proposed Overtime Rates for Female Workers in this section of the Trade, whether engaged on Time-Work or on Piece-Work, are as set out in Part III of this Notice.

SECTION IV.—For the purpose of this Notice the Woollen Rag or Woollen and Worsted Waste Materials Section of the Trade is defined to be that Section of the Trade specified in Part IV of this Notice which is engaged in:—

(a) The sorting or grading of Woollen Rags or Woollen and Worsted Waste Materials in or in connection with any establishment or business, or branch or department.

(b) The operations of receiving, packing, compressing, teagling, craning, despatching or warehousing when carried on in association with or in conjunction with any of the operations referred to in clause (a).

- Workers of 17 and under 17½ years of age, 24s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 6d. per hour.
- Workers of 17½ and under 18 years of age, 26s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 6½d. per hour.
- Workers of 18 years of age or over, 28s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 7d. per hour.

Provided that, in the case of workers of 14½ years of age and upwards, and under 18 years of age, the rate applicable to a worker of any particular age, as set out in the foregoing Table, shall only become payable on the first pay day in January or July, as the case may be, corresponding with or next following the date on which the worker attains such age, the rate payable until such half-yearly pay day being that applicable under the Table to a worker of the next lower age group.

SECTION II.—Proposed Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate for Female Piece-Workers.

Female Workers of all ages, 8d. per hour.

(NOTE.—As regards the application of the

Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, see Section II (a) of Part V of this Notice.)

SECTION III.—Proposed Overtime Rates.—The Proposed Overtime Rates for Female Workers in this section of the Trade, whether engaged on Time-Work or on Piece-Work, are set out in Part III of this Notice.

PART II.

Male Workers of 21 Years of Age or Over.

SECTION I.—Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates for Male Workers of 21 years of age or Over.

(a) Who are employed in that branch of the trade specified in Part IV of this Notice which is engaged in the collecting, sorting, grading, or breaking of scrap iron or other scrap metal where the collecting, sorting or grading of other waste materials is not carried out to a substantial extent in connection therewith, 53s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 1s. 1¼d. per hour.

(b) Who are employed in any other branch of the trade specified in Part IV of this Notice, 48s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 1s. per hour.

SECTION II.—Proposed Overtime Rates.—The proposed overtime rates for male workers of 21 years of age or over are set out in Part III of this Notice.

PART III.

Overtime Rates. Male Workers of 21 Years of Age or Over and Female Workers.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board propose to declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

	Hours.
In any week	48
On any day (other than Saturday) ...	8¾
On Saturday	4¼

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays, on Customary Public Holidays, or on Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The proposed Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over, or by a Female Worker, whether engaged on Time-Work or on Piece-Work, in excess of the declared normal number of hours, shall be as follows:—

1. On any day other than Sundays, Customary Public Holidays and Statutory Holidays:—

(a) For the first two hours' Overtime, one-and-a-quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter.

(b) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime, one-and-a-half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Half.

2. On Sundays, on Customary Public Holidays, and on Statutory Holidays:—For all time worked, twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Double-Time.

3. In any week:—For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, one-and-a-quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter, except in so far as

higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of Sub-Sections 1 (b) and 2 of this Section.

4. The Overtime Rates set out in Sub-Sections (1) and (2) of this Section are payable in respect of all hours of Overtime worked on any day, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

NOTE.—The hours which Female Workers, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART IV.

The above proposed respective Minimum Rates of Wages shall, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, apply, as specified above, to all Male Workers of 21 years of age or over and to all Female Workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in the General Waste Branch of the Waste Materials Reclamation Trade, as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, dated 27th August, 1920, that is to say:

1. The collecting, sorting, or grading of the following materials:—

Rags, waste paper, paper stock, woollen, worsted, cotton, jute, flax, hemp or other textile waste, textile clippings or cuttings, used bags, sacks or sacking, scrap rubber, scrap iron, or other scrap metal, fur cuttings, rabbit skins, bones or fat, used tins, broken glass or earthenware.

2. The collecting, sorting or grading of the following articles when collected, sorted or graded in association with or in conjunction with the collecting, sorting or grading of the waste materials specified above:—

Discarded clothing (including head-gear or foot-gear), discarded textile articles, old ropes, used bottles or used jars.

3. The following operations when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the collecting, sorting or grading of any or all of the waste materials specified in 1 above:—

The ripping of worn cloths for rags, the picking of old ropes, the trimming of paper salvage, the washing of used bottles or used jars, the washing of used tins, the breaking of scrap metal, the drying of rabbit skins, the making or repairing of sacks or bags, the willowing, pulling, scouring, carbonising, or putting down mixings of textile waste.

4. The operations of receiving, packing, compressing, teagling, craning, despatching, or warehousing when carried on in association with or in conjunction with any of the above-mentioned operations.

But excluding:—

(a) Any of the above-mentioned operations when carried on in the establishment in which waste materials are produced or in which they are used as raw materials for further manufacture.

(b) The making or repairing of sacks or bags when carried on in a factory or workshop engaged solely or mainly in the making or repairing of sacks or bags.

(c) The collecting, sorting, grading or drying of rabbit skins when carried on in an establishment in which such operations are the main or principal business, or when carried on in association with or in conjunction with any business, establishment, branch or department engaged in the manufacture of hatters' furs.

(d) (i) The collecting, sorting, or grading of cotton waste when carried on in an establishment in which such operations are the main or principal business.

(ii) Any of the operations included in paragraphs 1, 2, 3 and 4 above (other than the operations specified in paragraph (d) (i) above) when carried on, in, or in association with or in conjunction with any establishment of the kind specified in sub-paragraph 1 above.

PART V.

General Provisions:—

SECTION I.—The Guaranteed Time-Rates for Piece-Workers set out in Part I above are for the purpose of securing to workers employed on Piece-Work a minimum rate of remuneration on a Time-Work basis, and such workers shall be entitled to be paid not less than the Guaranteed Time-Rate applicable to a worker of her age as set out in the before-mentioned Parts of the Schedule, in any case where her earnings on Piece-Work are less than such sum.

SECTION II.—(a) The Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates set out in Part I above are applicable to the workers specified therein as follows, that is to say, that where a worker is employed upon Piece-Work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary worker not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable. (b) In the case of Male Workers of 21 years of age or over employed on Piece-Work each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case to an Ordinary worker not less than the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable. (c) In determining whether any Piece-Rate satisfies these conditions, regard must be had only to the earnings of ordinary workers, *i.e.*, workers of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question, and not to the earnings of workers of less than ordinary skill and experience, *e.g.*, learners and infirm workers.

SECTION III.—The Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions, other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION IV.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made for the payment of wages in excess of the Minimum Rates.

The Trade Board further give notice that the above Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages for Female Workers are in substitution for the Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages set out in the Notice D B (1) issued by the Trade Board dated 3rd January, 1921, which is hereby withdrawn.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals to Fix which may be lodged with them within two months from 24th August, 1921. Such Objections should be

in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address) and should be sent to the Secretary, General Waste Materials Reclamation Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF CHEMISTS, CLASS II, IN THE GOVERNMENT LABORATORY.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. *Age.*—Candidates must have attained the age of 23 and must not exceed the age of 30 on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part. A candidate born on the governing date would be admitted on the day he attained the age of 23, but not on the day on which he attained 30.

2. *Nationality.*—A candidate must be a natural-born British subject, and born of a father also a natural-born British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, and provided that exception may be made as to the father in the case of candidates who have served in His Majesty's Armed Forces between 4 August, 1914, and 11 November, 1918.

3. *Military Service.*—Until further order preference will be given to candidates who have served in His Majesty's Forces between 4 August, 1914, and 11 November, 1918.

4. *Publicity.*—The Government Chemist will take such steps as he thinks appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which he desires to fill on any one occasion, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

5. *Application.*—Application shall be made to the Government Chemist, who, after a scrutiny of the candidates' credentials, will submit the names of such candidates as appear to have the requisite qualifications for any of the existing or prospective vacancies to the Civil Service Commissioners, who, if dissatisfied with the number or quality of candidates for any vacancy, may require further search to be made for qualified candidates.

Candidates must possess a degree or diploma of a standard not lower than a second class honours degree at a university, and must have had two years' post-graduate experience in chemical work. They should have a working knowledge of technical French and German.

6. *Health and Character.*—Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

Until further order, and other things being equal, preference will be given by the Selection Board to candidates who are debarred from active employment by a physical impairment due to the War and not of a nature to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the post.

7. *Competition.*—Candidates who pass the scrutiny under Regulation 5 will be admitted to (a) an interview before a Selection Board and (b) a written examination in English. The Selection Board shall be nominated by the Commissioners in consultation with the authorities of the Department who shall be represented upon it, and if practicable one of the Commissioners shall be the Chairman. The

Selection Board will take into consideration the candidate's record of experience and education, any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by the candidate as having direct knowledge of his work in the past, and the candidate's scientific knowledge and his personal qualities as shown at the interview; and on their estimation of all the above evidence they will frame their decisions, which will be final. The Selection Board will arrange the candidates in order of merit, and the vacancies will be filled by the appointment of the candidates in order from the list, subject to their passing the examination and satisfying the Commissioners that they are eligible in all respects.

8. *Warning.*—Any attempt on the part of a candidate to enlist support for his application through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify him for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the University, in the Forces, or otherwise.

9. *Fee.*—A fee of £5 will be required from each candidate attending the Competition.

EPIZOOTIC ABORTION ORDER OF 1921.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts,

1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Prohibition of Exposure in Markets, &c.

1. It shall not be lawful for any person to expose or cause to be exposed in any market, fairground, or saleyard, a cow or a heifer which to his knowledge, or according to information furnished to him, has calved prematurely within the two months immediately preceding such exposure.

Prohibition of Sale without Notification.

2. It shall not be lawful for any person to sell, or cause to be sold, a cow or heifer which to his knowledge, or according to information furnished to him, has calved prematurely within the two months immediately preceding such sale unless before the sale he shall have given to the purchaser notice in writing of such premature calving.

Prohibition of Service without Notification.

3. It shall not be lawful for any person to send or cause to be sent to any bull for service a cow or heifer which to his knowledge, or according to information furnished to him, has calved prematurely within the two months immediately preceding, unless before the service he shall have given notice in writing of such premature calving to the owner of the bull.

Prohibition of Turning out on Common or Unfenced Land or of Grazing on Highway.

4. It shall not be lawful for any person (a) to cause or permit to be turned out on any common or uninclosed land, or in a field or other place insufficiently fenced, or in a field or other place adjoining a highway (unless that field or place is so fenced or situate that cattle therein cannot stray or graze along the highway), or (b) to cause or permit to graze on pasture being on the sides of a highway, a cow or a heifer which to his knowledge, or according to information furnished to him, has calved prematurely within the two months immediately preceding such turning out or such grazing.

Offences.

5. If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order, the owner and person in charge of the animal in respect of which, as the case may be, the same is done, or omitted to be done, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

6. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Revocation.

7. The Epizootic Abortion Order of 1920 is hereby revoked, and any Regulation made by a Local Authority under that Order shall cease to operate.

Commencement.

8. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of October, nineteen hundred and twenty-one.
