SUMMARY.

The foregoing list contains 127 cases, viz. :—8 American, 1 Austrian, 3 Belgian, 8 Czecho-Slovak, 5 Danish, 7 Dutch, 7 French, 7 German, 6 Italian, 8 Polish, 9 Roumanian, 33 Russian, 5 Swedish, 6 Swiss, and 14 of other Nationalities. 15 of the cases (including 2 American, 1 Belgian, 1 Austrian, 6 German, 1 Russian and 1 Swiss) are British-born widows. 54 of the cases (including 2 American, 4 Czecho-Slovak, 1 Danish, 3 French, 1 German, 3 Italian, 4 Polish, and 31 Russian) are men who have served in the British or Allied Forces during the War.
