## Revocation.

1. The Glasgow (Merklands Wharf) Order of 1921 (No. 3) is hereby revoked.

Definition of Irish Animals Landing Place.

2. All that space at Merklands situate in the county of Lanark which is coloured green on the plan sealed by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries for the purposes of this Order, and deposited at the Ministry, is hereby defined as a Landing Place for Irish Animals.

Definition of Foreign Animals Wharf.

- 3. All that space at Merklands situate in the county of Lanark which is coloured red on the plan referred to in Article 2 of this Order is hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Wharf for the purposes of the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and any Order of the Minister thereunder.
- This Order may be cited as the Glasgow (MERKLANDS WHARF) ORDER OF 1921 (No. 4).
