

vested in him under the Seeds Act, 1920, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby authorises all persons concerned to sell in England and Wales, Wheat, Barley, Oats and Rye for Seed, on or before the 30th day of November of the year in which the seed is harvested, without declaring the particulars required by the Act to the purchaser at or before the time of sale or delivery, provided that such particulars are declared in writing to the purchaser either in an invoice of the seeds, or in some other form, within one calendar month of the sale.

**ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.**

(DATED 6TH SEPTEMBER 1921.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. The provisions of the Sheep Scab Order of 1920 shall not apply to the owner, occupier or person in charge of the premises described in the Schedule hereto, or to the said premises, or to any sheep thereon, whilst this Order remains in force.

2. The exemption contained in the preceding Article shall be subject to the following conditions:—

(a) No sheep other than those to be used for the experiments shall be kept in either of the Fields described in the Schedule hereto;

(b) No sheep shall be grazed or kept in any field, enclosure, shed or other place immediately adjoining the said Fields; and

(c) No sheep shall be moved out of the said Fields except by licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, and then only for the purpose of being moved in a float direct to a slaughterhouse, where it shall be detained until slaughtered.

(d) No dung, fodder, litter or other thing that has been in contact with sheep in the said Fields shall be moved from or out of the said Fields without a licence of an Inspector of the Ministry, and no such licence shall be granted unless the dung, fodder, litter or other thing has been disinfected to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

3. This Order shall remain in force from the date hereof until the Minister is satisfied that the premises are no longer required to be used in connection with experiments in the dipping of sheep, and notifies the occupier of the premises to that effect.

4. The Order of the Minister dated 13 October, 1920 (No. 363), is hereby revoked.

SCHEDULE.

The following fields on the premises of Richard Cooper, Bart., M.P., at Billington Manor, Leighton Buzzard, in the administrative county of Bedford, namely:—

1. A field comprising about 8½ acres, known as the Shed Field.

2. A field comprising 6.538 acres, which joins the Shed Field at its most northerly extremity, and which lies wholly to the north of the said Shed Field.

**ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.**

(DATED 7TH SEPTEMBER 1921.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 and the Norfolk (Swine-Fever) Order of 1915 shall not apply to the movement of swine from the sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being a Swine-Fever Infected Place, if the swine are accompanied by a licence in the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the said Order of 1908 granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Norfolk, and the following conditions, which shall be specified in the licence, are complied with:—

(i) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and elsewhere, and shall be there detained kept separate from all other swine twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence, in the Form C set forth in said First Schedule, to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.

(ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from other swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered
