**MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS VARIED) FOR
 MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS OTHER THAN
 HOME-WORKERS. EFFECTIVE AS FROM 12TH
 SEPTEMBER, 1921.**

Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 18th September, 1921.

General Minimum Time-Rates.

A. For all Male Workers (other than Home-workers):—

- (1) Certain special classes of workers of 21

years of age and over—rates ranging from 1s. 3d. to 1s. 7½d. per hour.

[See Part I, Section I (1), (2), (3) of the Schedule below.]

(2) All other Male Workers of 21 years of age and over, 1s. 1½d. per hour.

(3) Male Workers under 21 years of age (according to age). See Part I, Section I (5) of the Schedule below.

B. For all Female Workers (other than Home-workers and other than Workers employed in Carding Hooks and Eyes or Snap Fasteners):—

(1) Workers of 18 years of age and over employed as Charge Hands (as specified in Part I, Section II (1) of the Schedule below), 8¾d. per hour.

(2) All other Female Workers of 18 years of age and over, 8d. per hour.

(3) Female Workers under 18 years of age (according to age). See Part I, Section II (2) of the Schedule below.

Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates.

(1) All Female Workers (other than Home-workers and other than those employed in Carding), 8¾d. per hour.

(2) Female Workers (other than Home-workers) of 18 years of age and over employed in Carding (other than Carding Hooks and Eyes or Snap Fasteners), 8¾d. per hour.

Overtime Rates. See Part III of the Schedule below.

The rates in full as legally enforceable are set out in detail in the Schedule below.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

General Minimum Time-Rates (as varied) for Male and Female Workers (other than Home-workers).

SECTION I.—All Male Workers (other than Home-workers):—

(1) Workers of 21 years of age and over who are employed as Pin Makers, 1s. 7½d. per hour.

(2) Workers of 21 years of age and over who are employed as Hairpin Machinists, Hook and Eye Makers, Machine Blackers or Automatic Machinists (including Snap Fastener Machinists), 1s. 5½d. per hour.

(3) Workers of 21 years of age and over who are employed as Blackers (other than Machine Blackers), Electro-Platers, Whiteners or Wire-Straighteners, 1s. 3d. per hour.

(4) All other Male Workers of 21 years of age and over, 1s. 1½d. per hour.

(5) Workers of 20 and under 21 years of age, 1s. per hour.

Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age, 10d. per hour.

Workers of 18 and under 19 years of age, 8d. per hour.

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, 7d. per hour.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, 6d. per hour.

Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, 5½d. per hour.

Workers under 15 years of age, 4d. per hour.
