The following Areas are now "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part I of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920:—

Denbigh.—See under Merioneth.

Inverness.—(1) An Area comprising the islands known as the Outer Hebrides (except the islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay, and Boreray), in the county of Inverness.

(2) An Area in the county of Inverness, comprising the islands known as Skye or

Inner Hebrides.

Merioneth.—(1) An Area comprising the parishes of Llangelynin, Llanegryn, Towyn, Pennal, Tal-y-Llyn, and Llanfihangel-y-Pennant, and such portions of the parishes of Mallwyd, and Brithdir and Islaw'rdref, as lie to the south and west of the road from Cammaes, via Dinas, Mawddwy, Tynyclawdd, and Dolgelley to Llanelltyd; and

In the administrative county of Montgomery
The parishes of Llanwrin and Caereinion
Fechan (excluding its detached parts).

(2) An Area comprising:

In the administrative county of Merioneth.

Such portions of the parishes of Llangar and Llandrillo as lie to the east of the road running from Corwen via Cynwyd, Llandrillo and Blaen-y-cwm to its junction with the road running from Bala to Llangynog; In the administrative county of Montgomery.

Such portions of the parishes of Llangynog, Llanrhaiadr-ym-Mochnant, and Pennant as lie to the north, north-east and north-west of the road running from Bala via Llangynog, Penybont Fawr, to the village of Llanrhaiadr-ym-Mochnant; and

In the administrative county of Denbigh.

Such portions of the parishes of Llanrhaiadr-ym-Mochnant, Llanarmon Mynydd Mawr, Llansilin, and Llanarmon Dyffryn Ceiriog as lie to the north-west of the road running from Penybont Fawr through the village of Llanrhaiadr-ym-Mochnant via Llidiart and Cae Hir to the village of Llanarmon Dyffryn Ceiriog, but excluding that portion of the parish of Llanarmon Dyffryn which lies to the north and north-east of the River Ceiriog.

Montgomery.—See under Merioneth (1) and (2).

Ross and Cromarty.—An Area comprising the Island of Lewis, including the smaller islands adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

Sussex (East).—See under Kent.
