The following Addresses were laid before the King on the 24th August, 1921:—

CONVOCAION OF CANTERBURY.

TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

We, Your Majesty's loyal and faithful subjects, the Archbishop, Bishops and Clergy of the Province of Canterbury in Convocation assembled, approach Your Majesty with the dutiful assurance of our devotion to Your Majesty's Throne and Person.

It is less than three years since we last had the privilege of presenting an Address to Your Majesty at the opening of a new Convocation. On that occasion we ventured to make special reference to an important scheme, then under consideration, by which we hoped to secure for the Church a larger liberty of action and a greater capacity for adjusting its organisation to the opportunities of the new age. Within a year that scheme was transformed into actual fact. In December, 1919, the Church of England Assembly (Powers) Act received Your Majesty's gracious assent, and took its place upon the Statute Book. The National Assembly of the Church of England was

called fully into being, and the very first duty which the Act laid upon the Assembly was the passing of a measure declaring that the Convocations of Canterbury and York have power, by canon lawfully passed and promulged, to amend the constitution of the Lower Houses thereof. And it is as the outcome of that measure and the large reforms in our constitution undertaken in accordance with that measure that we have the honour to address Your Majesty to-day.

The new Canon has been lawfully enacted and promulged. The old Convocation has been dissolved under Your Majesty's writ and a new body, with a Lower House of a different composition, enters upon its task. It is our earnest hope and prayer that the reformed Convocation, with its far larger representation of the parochial clergy, may be enabled to set forward the glory of God more faithfully, and to render more vigorous service to our brethren.

When two years ago we addressed Your Majesty our minds were centred upon the Peace Conference assembled in Paris. With high hopes we, and our fellow countrymen, looked forward to the new and better world, the new and better England, which were to be created out of the war. These hopes have

not yet been fulfilled. We have, alas, to confess that in almost all parts of the world Statesmen are faced with confusion and difficulty. The presence in England of the Prime Ministers of Your Majesty's Dominions overseas reminds the whole Nation of the largeness of our outlook and of our responsibilities.

With regard to Ireland we look forward eagerly to the issue of the deliberations between Your Majesty's Government and the representatives of the Irish people, initiated as a result of Your Majesty's gracious speech in opening the North of Ireland Parliament in Belfast. But we cannot fail to realise that these deliberations can only succeed in restoring peace to Ireland after the most searching thought, and patience, and self-sacrifice on both sides, and a genuine determination by all sections alike to secure a true and generous reconciliation between all classes and all counties.

Again, with heartfelt thankfulness we welcome the recent settlement of some of our most urgent industrial disputes. But we cannot forget that much yet remains to be done, and that before permanent peace can be achieved a new spirit must be breathed into our industrial system, and the sense of a new comradeship must inspire the relations of employer and employed, of class and class.

So, too, in international affairs. We rejoice with our whole souls in the establishment of the League of Nations, of which we spoke when we were last allowed audience of Your Majesty, and we desire to give it all the support we may, as a great means of international co-operation, and a great instrument of international peace. But here, perhaps, most of all it is borne in upon us that the most vital factors are moral and spiritual: and that it is only as the world is filled with the Spirit of God that peace can be established among men, or the nations dwell together in unity and love.

At such a time and with such needs before us it is, we believe, pre-eminently the task of the Church of God to set before mankind the eternal truths, to bear witness to the Spirit of God, to plead with men and nations to be reconciled to one another in the Name of God, and to proclaim that only those plans for international or economic well-being can prosper which are fashioned according to His will. In all our deliberations we shall seek to recollect how weighty a responsibility is laid upon us for the discharge of this task. We shall also remember that so great a task cannot be discharged by ourselves alone. The Church of Christ should bear its witness, if it may be, with one voice, and should work and act as one united Church. It is the spiritual leadership of the Catholic Church as a whole for which the world is waiting—so we are reminded by the great gathering of Bishops assembled in conference at Lambeth last year. It will be one of our chief endeavours in this Convocation to learn how best we may join with other Christian disciples in bearing our witness to the things of the Spirit, and how best we may respond to the vision, outlined in the Bishops' appeal, of the reconciliation of all Christian people, and the reuniting in one visible fellowship of all the followers of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

We would conclude, as always, with the humble prayer that the blessing of Almighty God our Heavenly Father, through our Lord

Jesus Christ, may rest upon Your Majesty and upon every member of the Royal House.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious answer:—

I am grateful for your loyal and dutiful Address, and for the blessings which you invoke upon Myself and My House.

I note with satisfaction that the new Canon to which I was pleased to assent for giving a larger representation to the parochial clergy in convocation has been lawfully enacted and promulged, and I trust that this wise and statesmanlike reform will enable the Church to supply with a fuller measure of authority the moral and spiritual needs of this Country.

Two years ago, when I received your last Address, we hoped that with the coming of Peace we should see the advent of a new and better world. With sadness we have to recognise that there are nations still at war and many areas of the globe still unpacified. In this Country the inevitable crisis of a severe depression has brought grave burdens which it is difficult for us to bear. But as history repeatedly teaches us peace has its victories to win no less than war, and it is with enduring patience and unabating faith that we must hold to our determination to create a happier earth. I feel a just pride to have seen the Prime Ministers of My Dominions beyond the seas assembled together, and I rest assured that their broad and representative statesmanship will prove equal to the great tasks before them.

Let us thank God that some measure of response has been vouchsafed to My appeal to My Irish People. With a full heart I pray that their reconciliation may be consummated by the deliberations now proceeding, and that they may be united in making a new era for their native land.

I welcome with you the recent settlements in the industrial affairs of this Country. Without them we could not advance the rebuilding of our commercial prosperity. That rebuilding is a paramount duty on which depends the very life of this Country and to that duty in the spirit of sacrifice every citizen and worker in every rank and class of the State must willingly contribute his or her portion even as he or she did nobly in the war. I feel confident that in this task you will worthily perform your share by preaching the doctrine of comradeship and good fellowship in Christ.

I do not doubt that there is a growing body of opinion which believes that a new strength and vitality would flow from the union of all Christian people in a visible fellowship. Great I know are your difficulties, but I shall watch with interest and intense sympathy your coming endeavours to explore this matter, and I pray that they may receive the blessing of the one Almighty God in whose service you are working.

CONVOCATION OF YORK.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY.

We the Archbishop and Bishops and Clergy of the Province of York in Convocation assembled desire to offer to Your Majesty an humble

and dutiful assurance of our Loyal devotion to Your Majesty's Throne and Person.

In accordance with a long and valued custom it is the duty and privilege of a new Convocation to present a loyal Address to the Sovereign. The Convocation now assembled is new in a very special and indeed unprecedented sense. The Convocations of the Clergy Measure, 1920, to which Your Majesty was pleased to give Your Majesty's Royal Assent, declared that the Convocations of Canterbury and York had power by Canon lawfully passed and promulgated to amend the constitution of the Lower Houses thereof. The Convocation of York thereupon petitioned Your Majesty to give Your Majesty's Assent and Licence to make, promulge and execute a Canon to effect the amendment of the constitution of its Lower House. Your Majesty graciously gave this assent and Licence, and after full consideration the late Convocation duly promulgated and executed the Canon. By virtue of its provisions, the Convocation now assembled is more truly representative of the whole Clergy of the Province than at any time in the long history of the Convocations of the Church. It is our earnest hope that this reform may enable us with a fuller measure of authority to take counsel for the welfare of the Church and People of this Realm.

Your Majesty's reign has been made illustrious by the great Victory, which under the favour of God, rewarded the long efforts and sacrifices of Your Majesty's Forces and Peoples in the war which for four years desolated the world. But the task of establishing peace has proved to be scarcely less anxious than the task of waging war. The restoration of a world torn by the ravages of the most terrible war in history calls for the highest gifts of wisdom, patience and courage. We fervently pray that these gifts may be abundantly bestowed by Him from whom cometh every good and perfect gift upon Your Majesty and upon all the Statesmen and peoples of Your Majesty's Empire.

The one pressing need of the world is a stable peace, and we pray that Your Majesty's constant efforts to attain this end may be crowned with success. We hope that increasing trust and power may be given to the League of Nations, wherein lies the surest hope of abiding peace among the nations of the world.

We rejoice that at this anxious time Your Majesty has had the counsel of Statesmen gathered from all parts of Your Majesty's Empire. We would offer our tribute of gratitude to the Prince of Wales for the brilliant services which His Royal Highness has rendered to the British Commonwealth by giving new warmth and strength to the Union under one Throne of all the Nations who are within that Commonwealth.

With all our hearts we share the hope to which Your Majesty has given noble expression that a new day of peace and goodwill may dawn upon the darkness of distrust and confusion in Ireland and pray that God may be pleased to guide the hearts and minds both of leaders and peoples towards the fulfilment of this hope.

We who in this Convocation are deeply concerned with the life and labour of a vast industrial population welcome the signs now appearing in the realm of industry that suspicion and struggle are giving place to a new spirit of trust and co-operation. We most

earnestly desire that the national Church may be inspired and empowered by the Holy Spirit to help forward every movement making for the fellowship of all classes and nations and by its faithful proclamation of the Gospel of Jesus Christ may be an instrument in the hands of God for cleansing and enlightening the hearts and minds of men.

That God may give His continued blessing to Your Majesty, to Her Majesty the Queen, and to all the Royal Family is the heartfelt and constant prayer of the Members of this Convocation.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious answer:—

It is a sincere pleasure to Me to receive your loyal and dutiful Address. I thank you for your prayers that blessings may be bestowed upon Myself, the Queen and all the Royal Family.

The recent Canon to which I was pleased to assent will give to Convocation a more representative character and a greater strength and breadth of counsel in forwarding the interests of the Church and People of this Realm.

It is right that you should recall that, though nearly three years have passed since the Armistice, the thoughts of men are still chastened by the depression that has followed the period of war and by the anxieties and burdens that still beset them. A stable peace is the goal towards which we must unceasingly labour, and I feel confident that My Ministers at home and from My Dominions beyond the seas will keep it unwaveringly before them. I thank you for your graceful tribute to My beloved son. His visits to different parts of My Empire have, I hope and believe, done much towards strengthening the bonds of fellowship. I am deeply touched by the signs of generous and whole-hearted loyalty with which he has everywhere been welcomed by the most diverse and distant of My subjects.

It is a cause of deep and sacred relief for which we owe thanks to God that in answer to My appeal a new sign of hope has arisen in Ireland. I pray that the promise of a new era now held out may be realised and that My Irish People may be united one to another in peace and goodwill.

I recognise fully the great duty that you perform amidst a vast industrial population. We are confronted with the supreme and vital task of rebuilding our commerce and prosperity, and in that task we need the goodwill and active co-operation of every citizen. I welcome with satisfaction your assurance, which I am confident you will fulfil, that you will labour to exhort each man to work in fellowship and love with his neighbour for the advancement of the State. We can remember also that goodwill amongst citizens is the first and in the end the surest foundation of peace among nations, and in labouring for the one you will be labouring for the other. I pray that the blessing of Almighty God may rest upon your efforts.

TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 23rd September, 1921, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877; the National Debt Act, 1889; and the War Loan Acts, 1914 to 1919, to the amount of £60,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any date from Monday, the 26th September, to Saturday, the 1st October, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London banker, discount house or broker.

6. The persons whose tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a banker's draft on the Bank of England not later than two o'clock (Saturday twelve o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 26 of the Finance Act, 1915, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any tenders.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 13TH SEPTEMBER 1921.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Authorisation of Landing of Animals for Exceptional Purposes.

1. The landing of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto, which are intended for exceptional purposes, is hereby allowed sub-

ject to the provisions of Part II. (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896, and of this Order.

Definition of Quarantine Station.

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the landing and detention of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto.

Examination before Landing.

3. The animals shall not be landed unless and until they have been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry and certified by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease.

Regulation Applicable to the Animals on Landing.

4. (i) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.

(ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

2.—(1.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under this Order to the show and sale, the Licence shall be delivered up in exchange for the Licence for movement of the swine from such premises.

(2.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under this Order to any premises other than the show and sale, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at or sent by post to the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

3. A copy of a licence issued under this Order authorising the movement of swine into the district of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

4. A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the above-mentioned Orders be treated as a licence under those Orders.
