the perinission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued by or under the authority of the Army Council.

No person actually serving in the Navy will be eligible unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to da so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued by or under the authority of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

Persons comprised in classes (c), (d) must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition.

Persons comprised in class (e) will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education foi Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

Candidates who do not take two living languages in Section Bi will be required to satisfy the Commissioners in Subject 5.
