MIXED ARBITRAL TRIBUNAL BETWEEN THE BRITISH EMPIRE AND BULGARIA.

The following announcement is made by the Board of Trade:—

In pursuance of Article 188 of the Treaty of Neuilly-sur-Seine, the Mixed Arbitral Tribunal between the British Empire and Bulgaria has been constituted and is about to commence work in London. The President is Mr. B. C. J. Loder, LL.D., Judge of the Supreme Court of the Netherlands; the British Member is Mr. Heber Hart, K.C., LL.D., and the Bulgarian Member is Mons. Alexander Ludskanoff, Member of the National Assembly, and formerly Secretary of State in Bulgaria.

As the system of Clearing Offices has not been adopted between the United Kingdom and Bulgaria, claims in respect of disputed debts due by Bulgarians to British subjects will be dealt with directly by this Tribunal. It has also jurisdiction under Section IV ("Property, Rights and Interests"), Section V ("Contracts, Prescriptions, Judg-

ments"), Section VI ("Mixed Arbitral Tribunal"), and Section VII ("Industrial Property") of Part X of the above Treaty.

By the Treaty the High Contracting Parties have agreed that their courts and authorities shall render to the Tribunal direct all the assistance in their power, particularly as regards transmitting notices and collecting evidence; and they have also agreed to regard the decisions of the Tribunal as final and conclusive and to render them binding upon their nationals.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

**REGULATIONS RESPECTING COMPETITIVE
EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF
SHORTHAND TYPIST IN THE CIVIL SERVICE.**

1. Candidates must be not less than 19 years of age, and, in the case of persons other than established typists not more than 40 years of age, on the first day of the examination.

No exception on any grounds will be made to this rule.

2. No candidate will be eligible who has not rendered one full year's approved service prior to the first day of the examination in Government Departments, or in the War Department Establishments or in National Factories, Stores, Bonds, Dépôts, &c., where the services were remunerated direct from public funds, or as an enrolled member of a clerical section of Queen Mary's Army Auxiliary Corps, the Women's Royal Naval Service, the Women's Royal Air Force, or the Voluntary Aid Detachments General Service. She must have served for the year either as established Typist or as temporary Shorthand Typist or partly in each capacity.

3. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—

- (a) that they are unmarried or widows;
- (b) that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

No person will be eligible who is not a natural-born British subject, and the daughter of a father also a natural-born British subject.

4. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:—

- (1) English Composition.
- (2) Précis Writing.
- (3) Shorthand.

5. No candidate will be regarded as qualified who does not pass to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners in Shorthand and in the aggregate number of marks obtained in the examination as a whole.

6. It will rest with the Civil Service Commissioners to determine the Departments to which the successful candidates shall be assigned. In making the assignments the Commissioners will be guided by the require-

ments of the public service and will consult, so far as possible, the wishes of Departments for the assignment of particular candidates who have served under them. Subject to these conditions, the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be respected.

7. Persons who have entered upon or completed a course of education or training for the occupation of teacher, on account of which grants are payable from the Exchequer, will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

8. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

9. A fee of 10s. will be required from every candidate attending the examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that a Competitive Examination will be held under the foregoing Regulations in London, Edinburgh and Dublin, commencing on the 28th December, 1921.

No person will be admitted to Examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 10th November, an application, in the Candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

WEYMOUTH AND MELCOMBE REGIS.
