Provided that workers who commence employment in the trade at or over the age of 19 shall receive for a period of 12 months a General Minimum Time-Rate of 32s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., 8d. per hour. Provided also that this General Minimum Time-Rate shall be increased by 5s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., 14d per hour, in the case of any such worker who is 22 years of age or over. Workers to whom this provise applies shall, on the expiration of 12 months' employment in the trade, receive such General Minimum Time-Rates as they may be entitled to under the provisions of this Part of this Schedule.

SECTION VII.

The weekly rates set out in Section VI. of this Part of this Schedule are based on a week of 48 hours and are subject to a proportionate decrease according as the number of hours of en ployment in any week is less than 48.

SECTION VIII.-

In cases where a worker is employed on piece work, each piece-rate paid much be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary worker an amount not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate applicable. Provided that in determining as to whether any piece-rate satisfies this condition, regard shall not be had to the earnings of workers under 22 years of age.
