## GAS REGULATION ACT, 1920.

Notice of Application by the Bromsgrove Gaslight and Coke Company for an Order under Section 1 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Bromsgrove Gaslight and Coke Company (hereinafter referred to as the Undertakers) have applied to the Board of Trade under the provisions of Section 1 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920, for an Order providing for-

(a) the repeal of any enactments or other provisions requiring the Undertakers to supply gas of any particular illuminating value, and the substitution therefor of power to charge for thermal units supplied in the form of gas; and
