A PROCLAMATION

REVOKING A PROCLAMATION, DATED THE 10TH DAY OF MAY, 1917, AS AMENDED AND ADDED TO BY SUBSEQUENT ORDERS OF COUNCIL AND BY THE PROCLAMATIONS DATED RESPECTIVELY THE 18TH DAY OF DECEMBER, 1918, AND THE 12TH DAY OF MARCH, 1919.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, made in pursuance of Section 8 of "The Customs and In-

land Revenue Act, 1879," and Section 1 of "The Exportation of Arms Act, 1900," and Section I of "The Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914," and Section 1 of "The Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914," We thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to prohibit the Exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles:

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of "The Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914," that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of "The Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879," as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of "The Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914," that any Proclamation made under Section 1 of "The Exportation of Arms Act, 1900," may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by subsequent Orders of Coun-

oil, and by Proclamations dated respectively the 18th day of December, 1918, and the 12th day of March, 1919, the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars:

And whereas it appears expedient to Us that the said Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council, and by the Proclamations dated respectively the 18th day of December, 1918, and the 12th day of March, 1919, should be revoked:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby proclaim, direct and ordain that the said Proclamation of the 10th day of May, 1917, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council and by the Proclamations dated respectively the 18th day of December, 1918, and the 12th day of March, 1919, shall be, and the same is hereby, revoked.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this Eleventh day of *October*, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and in the Twelfth year of Our Reign.

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the payment as from the 7th August, 1919, of the following non-substantive rates of pay to Naval Ratings and Royal Marines qualified as Photographers:—

WHEREAS by an Order made by the late King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council, on the 19th March, 1908, His Majesty was pleased to order (amongst other things), that, where any property belonging to or held for the benefit of a unit of Volunteers or Yeomanry mentioned in the first column of the Schedule to that Order was vested in or held by any Trustees other than the Commanding Officer of such unit, those Trustees should, until otherwise directed by Order in Council under Section 29 of the Territorial and Reserve Forces Act, 1907, be appointed in regard to the property so vested in or held by them to be special Trustees, to the exclusion of the Association, and should continue to hold such property in trust for the corresponding unit of the Territorial Army (then known as the Territorial Force) in like manner in all respects as they previously held it for the unit of the Volunteers or Yeomanry, and that the corresponding unit should, notwithstanding any trust, limitation, or condition affecting any such property, continue entitled to the benefit thereof in like manner as the unit was entitled thereto before it became a unit of the said Territorial Army:

And whereas by virtue of the above-recited provisions of the said Order in Council the Trustee named in the first column of the Schedule to this Order holds the property described and set opposite to his name in the second column of that Schedule in trust for the unit of the Territorial Army mentioned in the third column of that Schedule, and it is expedient that such property should be transferred from that Trustee to the County Association mentioned in the fourth column of that Schedule:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that as from the date of this Order the said property shall be by virtue of this Order transferred from the said Trustee to and vested in the said County Association, subject to any charges thereon and to any liabilities in or towards the discharge of which the said property is properly applicable, and shall be held by the said County Association for the benefit of the said unit of the Territorial Army or for such other purposes as the Association with the consent of the said unit (to be ascertained in manner prescribed by regulations of the Army Council) shall direct, but so that the interest of any beneficiary other than the said unit or the unit of the Volunteers or Yeomanry with which it corresponds shall not without the consent of such beneficiary be affected.

WHEREAS a majority of the whole Council of the Borough of Bangor on the 13th day of April, 1920, agreed to petition, and the said Council thereupon, on the 24th day of March, 1921, petitioned His Majesty under and in pursuance of the provisions of Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by Section 2 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, for an alteration of the Boundaries of the Wards of the said Borough:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 22nd day of April, 1921, to refer the said petition of the said Council of the Borough of Bangor to a Committee of His Privy Council:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 27th day of May, 1921, to approve the Report of the said Committee, to the effect that, no petition having been presented against a compliance with the prayer of the said petition of the said Council of the Borough of Bangor, within the time limited by Statute in that behalf, it rested with the Secretary of State to appoint a Commissioner in accordance with the provisions of the said Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, to prepare a Scheme for carrying into effect the prayer of the said Petition:

And whereas the Right Honourable Edward Shortt, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did by warrant, given under his hand and seal at Whitehall on the 15th day of July, 1921, appoint Samuel Pope, Esquire, Barrister at Law, a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for carrying into effect the prayer of the said Petition:

And whereas the said Commissioner has, in pursuance of the powers given him by virtue of the said appointment, prepared the following Scheme, dated the 5th day of September, 1921, accordingly:

"BOROUGH OF BANGOR.

"Scheme for the alteration of Ward Boundaries made in pursuance of Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and Section 2 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893.

"Article I.—For the purposes of the Election of Councillors, the Borough shall continue to be divided into Four Wards, which shall

continue to be termed respectively, the North or Upper Bangor Ward, the South or Town Ward, the East or Hiraal Ward and the West or Glanadda Ward.

"Article II.—Each of the said Wards shall comprise the portion of the Borough indicated by a separate colour and distinguished by the name of the Ward on the maps, each marked 'Map of the Wards of the Borough of Bangor as altered 1921,' which are signed by me as constituting an integral part of this Scheme and annexed hereto the boundary of each ward being clearly delineated and set forth thereon. One of the said maps shall be sent herewith to the Secretary of State to be submitted by him to His Majesty in Council for approval, and the other shall be deposited with the Town Clerk of the Borough. In the event of any discrepancy between the map and the textual description, the ordnance survey map (Edition of 1920) shall prevail.

"Article III.—The Boundaries of the said Wards in terms of description shall be as follows:—

"THE NORTH OR UPPER BANGOR WARD.—Commencing at the most westerly point of the Borough Boundary on the Menai Straits near the George Hotel, thence following the line of the Borough Boundary southward to the boundary of the West or Glanadda Ward in the centre of Ffriddoedd Road, thence north-eastward along the centre of Ffriddoedd Road as far as the fenced path on the south side leading to the Railway cottages, thence southward along the centre of the said path to a point above the tunnel of the London and North Western Railway Line which would be intersected by a prolonged line drawn along the centre of the said Railway Line, thence eastward along such prolonged line and the centre of the said Railway Line as far as the Bangor Railway Station to a point which would be intersected by a prolonged line drawn along the centre of Deiniol Road, thence along the said line and the centre line of Deiniol Road and Garth Road to the junction of Garth Road and Beach Road, thence along the centre of Beach Road to the river Adda, thence along the river Adda to the Sea and thence in a straight line in a north-easterly direction to the Borough Boundary at low-water mark and thence following the line of the Borough Boundary northward and westward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"THE SOUTH OR TOWN WARD.—Commencing at a point in the centre of Garth Road near Number 5 Erw Fair which would be intersected by a prolonged line drawn along the centre of

Glynne Road and an occupation road leading to the river Adda, thence south-eastward along such prolonged line and the centre line of the said occupation road and Glynne Road to High Street, thence north-eastward along the centre of High Street to the Borough Boundary on the river Cegin, thence following the line of the Borough Boundary southward and then westward to the boundary of the West or Glanadda Ward in the centre of Pentir Road, thence along the centre of Pentir Road and the centre of the Maes Footpath to a point above the East Tunnel of the London and North Western Railway at Bangor Railway Station which would be intersected by a prolonged line drawn along the centre of the said Railway Line, thence westward along such prolonged line and the centre of the said Railway Line through Bangor Railway Station to the boundary of North or Upper Bangor Ward, thence in a north-easterly direction along the last-mentioned boundary as hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement.

"THE EAST OR HIRAEI WARD.—On the north and north-west the boundary of the North or Upper Bangor Ward, from the point in the centre of Garth Road near Number 5 Erw Fair, where the North or Upper Bangor Ward and the South or Town Ward boundaries meet, and thence in a north-easterly direction along the said boundary of the said North or Upper Bangor Ward as hereinbefore described to the Borough Boundary. On the west and south, from the point last mentioned where the said North or Upper Bangor and the South or Town Ward boundaries meet, and thence in a south-eastward and north-eastward direction along the boundary of the said South or Town Ward as hereinbefore described to the Borough Boundary on the river Cegin. On the east and north-east, the boundary of the Borough.

"THE WEST OR GLANADDA WARD.—On the north and north-east the boundary of the North or Upper Bangor Ward from the point on the Borough Boundary in the centre of Ffriddoedd Road and thence north-eastward, south and south-eastward along the boundary of that Ward as hereinbefore defined to the boundary of the South or Town Ward on the London and North Western Railway Line hereinbefore described, thence continuing south-eastward and southward along the boundary of that Ward, as hereinbefore defined to the Borough Boundary. On the south, south-west and west the boundary of the Borough, from the point on the said Borough Boundary last mentioned in the Pentir Road at the most south-westerly point of the said South or Town Ward, thence south-westward, north-westward, north-eastward and north-westward along the said Borough Boundary to the boundary of the North or Upper Bangor Ward at the point of commencement aforesaid.

"And when in the foregoing descriptions of the ward boundaries (so far as such descriptions do not refer to the Borough Boundary) a street, road or footpath is given as the boundary of a Ward, the boundary is to be taken as the centre of such street, road or footpath, and when any street or road is described as joining another street or road, the point of junction is to be taken as the point at which lines drawn along the centres of the two streets or roads, and continued, would intersect each other.

"And when a river or stream is given as the

boundary of a Ward, the boundary (except when it refers to the Borough Boundary) is to be taken as the medium filum of such river or stream.

"And where reference is made to the Borough Boundary, the already determined boundary line of the Borough is meant.

"Article IV.—The North Ward shall continue to be represented by Six Councillors, the East Ward shall continue to be represented by Three Councillors. The South Ward shall henceforth be represented by Six Councillors, and the West Ward by Three Councillors.

"Article V.—The existing Councillors of the said Borough of Bangor shall be assigned to and apportioned among the said Wards as hereinbefore determined as follows:—

RETAIL BESPOKE TAILORING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS VARIED AND FIXED) FOR MALE AND FEMALE LEARNERS AND CERTAIN OTHER CLASSES OF MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS IN THE RETAIL BESPOKE SECTION OF THE TAILORING TRADE.

Effective as from 10th October, 1921.

Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days the rates become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 16th October, 1921.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

General Minimum Time-Rates for Male and Female Learners and a Certain other Class of Male Workers.

SECTION I.—(A) Male Learners (as defined in Part III of this Schedule):—

For the 1st year of Learnership, 12s. per week of 48 hours.

For the 2nd year of Learnership, 15s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.

For the 3rd year of Learnership, 21s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.

For the 4th year of Learnership, 30s. per week of 48 hours.

For the 5th year of Learnership, 40s. per week of 48 hours.

(B) Female Learners (as defined in Part III of this Schedule):—

For the 1st year of Learnership, 10s. per week of 48 hours.

For the 2nd year of Learnership, 15s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.

For the 3rd year of Learnership, 21s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.

For the 4th year of Learnership, 27s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.

In the application of the above General Minimum Time-Rates the following provisions shall apply:—

(a) In determining the year of learner-ship of a Male or Female Learner all employment of the Learner prior to the age of 14 shall be disregarded. The General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to a Learner under 14

shall be the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate for the first year of learnership.

(b) Any Male or Female Learner who has been previously employed in (i) any branch of Retail Bespoke Tailoring as defined in Section II of Part V of this Schedule or (ii) any branch of Ready-Made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring coming within the scope of the Ready-Made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain), or (iii) any branch of the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Trade coming within the scope of the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Trade Board (Great Britain), shall be entitled subject to the provisions of paragraph (a) of this Section, to count the whole period of such previous employment.

(c) In the case of a Male Learner who, prior to being registered as a Learner under the provisions of this Notice, has received continuous instruction in Retail Bespoke Tailoring at any School or Institution where there is a class for Retail Bespoke Tailoring which is approved by the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain), every two School or Institutional years during which the Learner has been so instructed at any such School or Institution shall, for the purposes of this Notice and subject to the provisions of paragraph (a) of this Section, be reckoned as one year of Learnership.

(d) (i) A Female Learner shall cease to be a Learner and shall be entitled to the Minimum Rate applicable to her under the provisions of the Notice R.B. (7) issued by the Trade Board and dated 8th October, 1920, upon the completion of four years' learnership.

(ii) A Male Learner shall cease to be a Learner and shall be entitled to the Minimum Rate applicable to him under the provisions of the Notice R.B. (4) issued by the Trade Board and dated 4th June, 1920, upon the completion of five years' learnership. Provided that in determining whether for the purposes of Section I of Part I of the Trade Board's Notice R.B. (4), dated 4th June, 1920, a Male Worker has completed a period of five years' learnership, any previous experience in Retail Bespoke Tailoring in any School or Institution specified in paragraph (c) of this Section, shall be reckoned in accordance with the provisions of such paragraph.

SECTION II.—All Male Workers employed in any branch of Retail Bespoke Tailoring specified in Section II of Part V of this Schedule *Excluding* (i) Cutters and Trimmers, (ii) Workers specified in Part I of the Trade Board's Notice R.B. (4), dated 4th June, 1920, (iii) Apprentices whose indentures (a) were made prior to the 10th October, 1921, and (b) provide for the Apprentice being supplied by the employer with board or with board and lodging, (iv) Apprentices specified in the Trade Board's Notice R.B. (11), dated 8th October, 1921, and (v) Learners specified in Section I (A) of this Part of this Schedule, 1s. 2d. per hour.

SECTION III.—The General Minimum Time Rates for Learners set out in Section I of this Part of this Schedule are weekly rates based on a week of 48 hours, and shall be subject to a proportionate decrease according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 48.

PART II.

Overtime Rates for Male and Female Learners and a Certain other Class of Male Workers.

Overtime Rates, calculated on the General Minimum Time Rates set out in Part I of this Schedule as follows:—

(a) For Male Learners and the class of Male Workers specified in Section II of Part I of this Schedule, in the manner specified in the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice R.B. (6), dated 15th July, 1920,

(b) For Female Learners, in the manner specified in Part II of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice R.B. (7), dated 8th October, 1920,

shall apply in substitution for the rates set out in Part I of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in their said Notices R.B. (6) and R.B. (7) respectively to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART III.

For the purpose of this Notice, and subject to the provisions of Section I of Part I of this Schedule, the following definition shall apply:—

A Male or Female Learner is a worker who, in the case of a Male Learner, has not been employed for more than five years, and in the case of a Female Learner has not been employed for more than four years, in the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade as specified in Section II of Part V of this Schedule, and:—

(a) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of his or her time in learning any branch or process of Retail Bespoke Tailoring as specified in Section II of Part V of this Schedule by an employer who provides the Learner with reasonable facilities for such learning, and

(b) Has received a certificate, or has been registered in accordance with Rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made an application for such certificate or registration, which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration.

Provided that the certification or registration of a Learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided also that an Employer may employ a Learner on his or her first employment in any branch of Retail Bespoke Tailoring, as specified in Section II of Part V of this Schedule without a certificate or registration for a probationary period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such Learner being continued thereafter at his or her employment the probation period shall be included in his or her period of learnership.

Notwithstanding compliance with the conditions specified in this part of this Schedule, a person shall not be deemed to be a Learner if he or she works in a room used for dwelling purposes, and is not in the employment of his or her parent or guardian.

PART IV.

The Trade Board have Varied the Minimum Rates of Wages at present effective for Male

and Female Workers in their application to certain classes of workers as follows:—

(a) By excluding Packers from the operation of the Minimum Rates of Wages for Male and Female Workers set out in the Schedules to the Trade Board's Notices R.B. (4), R.B. (5), R.B. (6) and R.B. (7) respectively dated the 4th June, 1920, the 19th June, 1920, the 15th July, 1920, and the 8th October, 1920, except where they are employed on Packing operations which are performed in a workroom.

(b). By excluding from the operation of the General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Section III (a) of Part I of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice R.B. (7), dated 8th October, 1920, Female Apprentices specified in Sections I and III of Part II of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice R.B. (11), dated 8th October, 1921.

(c) By excluding Learners from the operation of Section II of Part IV of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice R.B. (7), dated 8th October, 1920, so that the provisions of such Section shall apply only to Female Apprentices who have entered or shall enter the trade under 21 years of age, and who are employed under a contract in writing entered into prior to the 10th October, 1921, providing for their effective instruction for a period of not less than three years by a fully qualified tailor or tailoress in making a bespoke garment throughout and by including such Learners within the scope of the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate for Female Workers set out in Section III (c) of Part I of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice R.B. (7), dated 8th October, 1920.

PART V.

SECTION I.—Subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, the respective Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule apply to all Male and Female Workers in Great Britain of the classes specified in this Schedule in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of Retail Bespoke Tailoring, as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 12th December, 1919, and set out below.

SECTION II.—The Section of the Tailoring Trade specified in the above-mentioned Regulations is as follows:—

Those branches of Men's, Women's, Boys' and Girls' Bespoke Tailoring in which the tailor supplies the garment direct to the individual wearer and employs the worker direct.

A worker shall be deemed to be employed by the tailor direct if employed by another worker in the employ of the tailor to whom a Minimum Rate of Wages fixed under the Trade Boards Acts is applicable, or if employed by a sub-contractor engaged in cutting, making or finishing garments exclusively for the tailor in the tailor's shop, or in a building of which the shop forms part or to which the shop is attached;

Including:—

(1) (a) The altering, repairing, renovating, or re-making of Men's, Women's, Boys' or Girls' Tailored Garments where carried out for the individual wearer by a tailor who employs the worker direct as defined above.

(b) The cleaning of such garments where carried on in association with, or in conjunc-

tion with, the repairing, renovating, or re-making of the garments.

(2) The lining with fur of the above-mentioned garments where carried out in association with, or in conjunction with, the making of such garments;

(3) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried out in association with, or in conjunction with, the above-mentioned branches of tailoring;

(4) The packing and all other operations incidental to, or appertaining to, any of the above-mentioned branches of tailoring.

But excluding:—

(1) All or any of the above-mentioned operations where carried on in a factory where garments are made up for three or more retail establishments;

(2) The making of headgear.

NOTE.—The employment of Women, Young Persons and Children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and to the provisions of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART VI.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made, or that may be made, between Employers and Workers for the payment of wages in excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.

Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days the rates become effective as from the beginning of the

next full pay period, but in any case not later than 16th October, 1921.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

For the purpose of the application of the Minimum Rates of Wages for Male and Female Apprentices set out in this Schedule, the following Definition shall apply:—

A Male or Female Apprentice is a worker who:—

(a) Is employed during the whole of his or her time under an Indenture of Apprenticeship in the form set out in Part IV. of this Schedule, or in such other form as is in general conformity therewith, which provides for the Apprentice being taught to make throughout the following garment or garments for not less than the appropriate period specified below:—

Male Apprentices.

Female Apprentices.

(b) Has been registered with the Trade Board in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made application for such registration,

which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration.

Provided that:—

(i) The registration may be cancelled if the other conditions of apprenticeship are not complied with.

(ii) An employer may employ a worker at the rates and under the conditions specified in this Schedule for apprentices without registration for a probationary period not exceeding three months, but in the event of such worker being continued thereafter at his or her employment as an apprentice, the probationary period shall be included in his or her period of apprenticeship.

Provided also that:—

If a Male Apprentice, prior to being registered as an Apprentice under the provisions of this Schedule, has received continuous instruction in Retail Bespoke Tailoring at any Institution or School where there is a class for Retail Bespoke Tailoring which is approved by the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain), the period of apprenticeship applicable as specified in this part of this Schedule shall, in such a case, be reduced by one year for every two School or Institutional years during which the Apprentice has been so instructed subsequent to his attaining the age of 14 years, and that every two School or Institutional years during which the Apprentice has been so instructed at any such School or Institution shall be reckoned as one year of apprenticeship for the purpose of ascertaining the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to him under the provisions of this Notice during the period of his apprenticeship. In determining whether for the purposes of Section I of Part I of the Trade Board's Notice (R.B. 4) dated 4th June, 1920, a male apprentice has completed a period of five years' apprenticeship any such previous experience in Retail Bespoke Tailoring in any such School or Institution shall be reckoned in accordance with this proviso.

This Indenture made the _____ day of _____, One Thousand nine hundred and _____ between _____ of _____, a minor of the age of _____ years (hereinafter called the "Apprentice") of the first part, _____ of _____, the parent or guardian of the Apprentice (hereinafter called the "Guardian") of the second part, and carrying on business as Retail Bespoke Tailors at _____ (hereinafter called the "Employers") of the third part;

Witnesseth as follows, that is to say:—

1. The Apprentice of his/her own free will and with the consent of the Guardian hereby binds himself/herself to serve the Employers as their Apprentice in their trade of Retail Bespoke Tailoring for the term of* _____ years from the date of these presents.

2. In consideration of the covenants entered into by the Guardian and the Apprentice the Employers hereby covenant with the Guardian and the Apprentice and with each of them severally as follows:—

(a) That they will keep the Apprentice as their Apprentice during the said term and to the best of their power, skill and knowledge instruct the Apprentice or cause him/her to be instructed by a fully-qualified tailor or tailoress in the making throughout of the following garment/garments, namely,** _____ and in everything relative to the work of making and completing the said garment/garments.

(b) That they will pay to the Apprentice every week during the said term wages at not less than the appropriate Minimum Rates of Wages fixed or as varied from time to time by the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain) for Male/Female Apprentices and made effective.

(c) That during the first three years of apprenticeship they will not require the Apprentice to work in excess of the number of hours declared by the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain) to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

(d) That during the said term of apprenticeship they will not put the Apprentice on piece-work.

(e) *** That if the Employers [or the survivor of them shall die or become perma-

nently incapacitated through illness or injury to be certified by a duly-qualified medical practitioner or] shall cease to carry on the said trade of Retail Bespoke Tailoring before the expiration of the said term of apprenticeship the Employers [or the survivor of them or their/his Executors or Administrators as the case may be] shall if requested so to do by the Guardian and the Apprentice find another suitable Employer for the Apprentice to take over this Indenture.

Provided that in the case of the retirement or death of a partner in a firm the surviving partner or partners shall be deemed to be the employer or employers of the Apprentice for the purpose of this Indenture.

(f) That they will not hold the Apprentice liable to make good the value of any work which the Apprentice may spoil, except in the case of wilful or malicious damage.

(g) That they will afford facilities for the Apprentice to attend during the term of this Indenture such Technical Classes as may be agreed by the parties hereto for the instruction of the Apprentice in the art craft or trade of Retail Bespoke Tailoring and that if such classes occur during the ordinary working hours the hours so spent shall be reckoned as hours of employment under this Indenture.

(h) That they will not cause the Apprentice to suffer any loss of wages by reason of his/her attendance at any Technical Classes as aforesaid.

(i) That they will grant to the Apprentice without loss of wages the customary Public and Statutory Holidays.

(j) † That they will provide the Apprentice with good and sufficient † full board and lodging.

‡ Dinner and tea.

(j)/(k) That they will supply to the Apprentice forthwith upon the execution of these presents a true copy of this Indenture.

3. In consideration of the premises the Guardian and the Apprentice respectively severally covenant with the Employers as follows:—

(a) That the Apprentice shall truly and faithfully during the said term serve the Employers as their Apprentice, and their secrets keep and shall diligently attend to the work to which he/she is apprenticed and at all times willingly obey the lawful and reasonable commands of the Employers, and shall not wilfully absent himself/herself from the Employers' service without leave.

(b) That the Apprentice shall not do any wilful damage or knowingly suffer any damage to be done to the goods or other property of the Employers.

(c) That the Apprentice shall willingly perform all workshop duties as are usually done by apprentices.

(d) That the Apprentice shall attend such Technical Classes as may be agreed as provided in paragraph 2 (g) of these presents provided that he/she suffers no loss of wages by so doing.

(e) That save as otherwise provided in this Indenture, if the Apprentice shall at any time be absent from his/her duties (whether by reason of sickness or any other cause

whatsoever) without the consent of the Employers, the Apprentice shall not be deemed to be employed during the period of such absence and shall not be entitled to any wages for such period.

(f) That the Guardians will during the term of Apprenticeship provide the Apprentice with suitable clothes and all other necessities (except board and lodging). §

(g) That in case the Apprentice shall at any time during the said term be wilfully disobedient to the lawful orders or commands of the Employers, or be slothful or negligent or shall otherwise grossly misbehave himself/herself towards the Employers or their other employees, then it shall be lawful for the Employers on notice in writing addressed to the Guardian of their intention so to do to discharge the Apprentice from their service.

4. In the event of any dispute arising involving allegations of unsuitability on the part of the Apprentice or of failure on the part of the employers to instruct the Apprentice as provided for in this Indenture which cannot be settled between the parties hereto, the Employers, the Guardian and the Apprentice respectively hereby severally and mutually covenant that the matters in dispute shall stand referred in the first instance to the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain), and any recommendations made by the Trade Board shall be considered by the parties hereto with a view to effecting a settlement thereof.

Rates of Wages, set out in this Schedule, apply to all Male and Female Apprentices in Great Britain of the Classes Specified in this Schedule in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of Retail Bespoke Tailoring as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 12th December, 1919.

SECTION II.—The Section of the Tailoring Trade specified in the above-mentioned Regulations is as follows:—

Those branches of men's, women's, boys' and girls' bespoke tailoring in which the tailor supplies the garment direct to the individual wearer and employs the worker direct.

A worker shall be deemed to be employed by the tailor direct, if employed by another worker in the employ of the tailor, to whom a minimum rate of wages fixed under the Trade Boards Acts is applicable, or if employed by a sub-contractor engaged in cutting, making or finishing garments exclusively for the tailor in the tailor's shop or in a building of which the shop forms part or to which the shop is attached;

Including:—

(1) (a) The altering, repairing, renovating or remaking of men's, women's, boys' or girls' tailored garments where carried out for the individual wearer by a tailor who employs the worker direct as defined above.

(b) The cleaning of such garments where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the repairing, renovating or re-making of the garments;

(2) The lining with fur of the above-mentioned garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of such garments;

(3) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the above-mentioned branches of tailoring;

(4) The packing and all other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the above-mentioned branches of tailoring;

But excluding:—

(1) All or any of the above-mentioned operations where carried on in a factory where garments are made up for three or more retail establishments;

(2) The making of head-gear.

NOTE.—The employment of Women, Young Persons and Children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, and to the provisions of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART VI.

SECTION I.—The General Minimum Time-Rates set out in this Schedule are weekly rates based on a week of 48 hours, and shall be subject to a proportionate decrease according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 48.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule shall be paid direct to the Apprentice by the Employers.

SECTION III.—The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions

under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or under the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION IV.—Subject to the provisions of Section II of Part II of this Schedule, nothing in this Schedule shall apply to Apprentices employed under an Indenture or Contract in writing respectively entered into prior to the 10th October, 1921, providing for the effective instruction of the Apprentice in making one or more of the garments specified in Part I of this Schedule.

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in England and Wales under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Aerated Waters Trade, as specified in the Trade Boards (Aerated Waters) Order, 1919, hereby give notice as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to vary the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers as set out in the Schedule to their Notice A. (2) dated 30th April, 1920, and effective under an Order of the Minister of Labour dated 26th April, 1920, and to declare the Normal Number of Hours of Work in the trade for the purpose of the application of the Overtime Rates in substitution for those declared and set out in the Notice A. (2) referred to above, the variations proposed and the proposed Normal Number of Hours of Work in the trade being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

(A) General Minimum Time-Rates at Present Effective.

SECTION I.—Male Workers.

Workers of 15 years and under 16 years of age, 25s. per week of 47 hours.

SECTION III.—The above General Minimum Time-Rates are weekly rates based on a week of 47 hours and shall be subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours spent by the worker in the factory or workshop under contract of employment in any week is less than 47.

(B) *General Minimum Time-Rates Proposed.*

SECTION I.—(a) *Male Workers.*

Workers of 15 years and under 16 years of age, 20s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 16 years and under 17 years of age, 24s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 17 years and under 18 years of age, 30s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 18 years and under 19 years of age, 34s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 19 years and under 20 years of age, 40s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 20 years and under 21 years of age, 47s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 21 years of age and over, 58s. per week of 48 hours.

(b) *Female Workers.*

Workers of 15 years and under 16 years of age, 17s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 16 years and under 17 years of age, 20s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 17 years and under 18 years of age, 25s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 18 years of age and over, 31s. per week of 48 hours.

Provided that a Male or Female Worker who enters the trade for the first time at the age of 15 years or over and is employed on Time-Work shall until the expiry of two months' employment in the trade be paid at the rate of not less than three-quarters of the General Minimum Time-Rate which would otherwise be applicable according to his or her age under Sub-Sections (a) and (b) of this Section.

SECTION II.—The above proposed General Minimum Time-Rates are Weekly Rates based on a week of 48 hours, and shall be subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours spent by the worker in the factory or workshop under contract of employment in any week is less than 48.

PART II.

Proposed Variation of Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates.

SECTION I.—*All Male Workers.*

At present fixed, 1s. 7½d. per hour.

Proposed, 1s. 6½d. per hour.

SECTION II.—*All Female Workers.*

At present fixed, 10½d. per hour.

Proposed, 10d. per hour.

In the case of all Workers employed on Piece-Work each Piece-Rate paid shall be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate to an Ordinary Worker, i.e., a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question.

PART III.

Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates—Male and Female Workers—(all ages).

SECTION I.—In substitution for the declared Normal Number of Hours of Work in the Trade, as set out in Section I. of Part III. of the Trade Board's Notice A. (2), dated 30th April, 1920, the Trade Board propose to declare, in accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any week, 48.

On Saturday, 4½.

Provided that any other day, not being Sunday, may, by agreement in writing between an employer and a worker, be substituted in the place of Saturday, as the weekly short day, and in such case the normal number of hours on such substituted day shall be 4½.

Provided also that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and on Statutory Bank Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—In lieu of the Minimum Rates for Overtime set out in Section II. of Part III. of the Trade Board's Notice A. (2), dated 30th April, 1920, and effective under an Order of the Minister of Labour, dated 26th April, 1920, Overtime Rates for all Male and Female Workers, whether employed on Time-Work or on Piece-Work in excess of the normal number of hours of work in the trade proposed to be declared by the Trade Board in Section I. of this Part of this Notice shall be as follows, that is to say:—

(1) For all time worked on Sundays and Statutory Bank Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Double Time, that is to say, twice the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable.

(2) For all time worked in excess of 4½ hours on a Saturday (or on the weekly short day substituted therefor under the terms of the first Proviso to Section I. of this Part of this Notice) the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Time-and-a-Half, that is to say, one-and-a-half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, notwithstanding that the total number of hours worked in the week may not exceed 48.

(3) For all time worked in excess of 48 hours in any week the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Time-and-a-quarter for the first two hours and Time-and-a-Half thereafter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (1) and (2) of this Section.

PART IV.

The above proposed variations shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards

Acts, to all workers in England and Wales who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Aerated Waters) Order, 1919, and set out in Part IV. of the Trade Boards Notice A. (2), dated 30th April, 1920.

Note.—The employment of female workers, young persons and children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, and to the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

(ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with the licence under this Order.

(iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

2. A copy of a licence issued under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

3. A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the above-mentioned Orders be treated as a licence under those Orders.

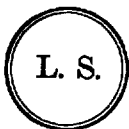
