**W**HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 14th day of September, 1921 (N.13529/21), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas we consider that the rates of pay of Seedie and Kroomen ratings of Your Majesty's Navy should be increased to meet present conditions:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by

Your Order in Council to sanction payment as from the dates indicated of the rates of pay indicated in the attached schedule, power being reserved to us to vary the rates within the scale laid down or to associate payment with such conditions as may be deemed necessary.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 27th day of September, 1921 (N. 10756), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions and other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we consider that a system of Continuous Service should now be established for the Officers' Steward and Cook Branch of Your Majesty's Navy:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the following proposals:—

"(1) The pay and titles of the new Continuous Service ratings to be the same as those already approved for the present Non-Continuous Service Officers' Stewards and Cooks, except that in future the grade equivalent to Ordinary Seaman will be entitled Officers' Steward or Cook, 4th Class, and that Officers' Stewards or Cooks, 3rd Class, will be eligible for pay at 4s. 6d. and 4s. 9d. a day after 3 and 6 years' man's service respectively.

"(2) The men of the present Branch, who so desire, to be permitted to transfer to Continuous Service under such conditions and exceptions as we may direct and subject to the proportion of Continuous Service ratings in the Branch not exceeding ninety per cent.

"(3) Former Non-Continuous Service time served to count equally with Continuous Service time towards advancement and increase of pay, subject to the regulations already laid down regarding the forfeiture of time.

"(4) Continuous Service not to be extended to Maltese or Native ratings.

"(5) In order to enable Petty Officer ratings (present system) with long service, who desire to transfer to Continuous Service to have their Petty Officer Service doubled for pension purposes, former Non-Continuous Service time to be allowed to count as from the date of Your Order in Council, as service rendered under a Continuous Service engagement, breaks in service due to discharge to Shore for reasons other than misconduct not to be deemed to disturb the continuity of service.

"(6) Similarly men transferred to Continuous Service and discharged in due course to pension as Chief Petty Officers to obtain the advantages conferred by Chief Petty Officers' service from the date of Your Majesty's Order in Council, or from the completion of twelve years' pensionable service whichever may be the later.

"(7) In the event of any difficulty arising over such men who volunteer to transfer, but who are unable to complete time for pension before the prescribed age for compulsory discharge, the age limit to be waived, where the man has over 12 years' service to his credit on transferring, subject to his continuing fit for duty.

"(8) The Senior Steward (not employed as Messman) to receive the prescribed allowance for Mess Traps (except in Flag and Commanding Officers' Messes).

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we consider that certain changes are desirable for the greater efficiency of Your Majesty's Naval and Royal Marine Forces:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased to sanc-

tion as from the dates indicated the proposals contained in the attached schedule.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

#### " SCHEDULE.

##### " SECTION A.

" To take effect as from the 5th August, 1920.

" 1. While employed on Fire Control duties Bandsmen to be eligible for the allowance of 3d. a day instituted by Order in Council of the 9th October, 1919.

" 2. The Instructional Allowance of 1s. a day payable to Bandmasters at the R.N. School of Music under the Order in Council of 13th October, 1910, to be extended to Non-Commissioned Officers employed as Instructors in the various instruments at that Establishment.

" 3. The following scale of allowances to ratings employed as Engineers' Yeomen of Stores to be substituted for the allowances authorized by the Order in Council of 2nd November, 1907, viz.:—

" 4. The allowance to Royal Marines doing duty as Butchers instituted by Order in Council of the 19th January, 1886, and extended to Naval ratings by Order in Council of the 9th May, 1892, to be increased to 3d. a day.

" 5. C.P.O. Cooks in charge of Instructional Gallies in Cookery Schools to be paid 1s. a day while actually employed in charge; the allowance not to be paid concurrently with any other allowance for Cooks.

" 6. Sick Berth Attendants passed for Leading Sick Berth Attendant when employed in ships allowed one Sick Berth rating to be paid the Dispensing Allowance of 2d. a day instituted by Order in Council of the 5th July, 1911.

##### " SECTION B.

" To take effect as from the 24th December, 1919.

" The allowances of 6d. a day to Sick Berth ratings qualified and employed as:—

" (a) Masseurs (authorized by Order in Council of the 5th July, 1911);

" (b) Operating Room or Laboratory Attendants (authorized by Order in Council of the 10th November, 1911);

" (c) X-Ray Attendants authorized by Order in Council of the 18th December, 1918);

to be paid continuously to qualified ratings so long as they remain efficient and continue to be available under the following conditions:—

" (a) No rating to be paid for more than one of these non-substantive ratings.

" (b) Arrangements to be introduced for ratings to be regularly employed on their specialist duties.

" (c) Ratings who revert to the ordinary Roster in order to qualify for advancement

and so cease to become available for such regular employment, to cease to draw the pay of the non-substantive rating.

##### " SECTION C.

" To take effect as from the 1st April, 1919.

" Warrant Officers, Class II, Royal Marines, to continue to receive the higher pension increments allowed for their service before the revised pension rates authorized by Order in Council of 7th February, 1921, came into force, viz., 2d. per diem for Company Serjeant-Majors and Quartermaster-Serjeants, and 3d. per diem for Staff Clerks in London, for each year's service in these ranks."

WHEREAS by Section 13 of the Air Force (Constitution) Act, 1917, it is provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council apply, with the necessary modifications and adaptations in relation to the Air Council, the President of the Air Council, and the Air Force and the officers and men thereof, and Air Force property or institutions, any of the enactments relating to the Army Council, the Secretary of State for the War Department, the Army or the officers and soldiers thereof (including enactments conferring any powers, rights, exemption or abatement from taxation or immunities or imposing any duties or disabilities on any such officers or soldiers) or to military property or institutions:

And whereas, by certain Orders made under the said section certain enactments have been applied in relation as aforesaid, and it is expedient to apply the further enactment mentioned in the first column of the Schedule to this Order:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The enactment mentioned in the first column of the Schedule to this Order, being an enactment relating to the Army or the officers and soldiers thereof, shall apply in relation to the Air Force and the officers and airmen thereof, subject to the modifications and adaptations specified in the second column of that Schedule.

2. This Order may be cited as "The Air Force (Application of Enactments) (No. 2) Order, 1921."

## PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS by section 91 of the Patents and Designs Act, 1907 (7 Edw. 7, c. 29), as amended by the Patents and Designs Act, 1914 (4 & 5 Geo. 5, c. 18), and the Patents and Designs Act, 1919 (9 & 10 Geo. 5, c. 80), it is enacted as follows:—

"91.—(1) If His Majesty is pleased to make any arrangement with the Government of any Foreign State for mutual protection of inventions, or designs, or trade marks, then any person who has applied for protection for any invention, design, or trade mark in that State, or his legal representative or assignee, shall be entitled to a patent for his invention or to registration of his design or trade mark under this Act or the Trade Marks Act, 1905, in priority to other applicants; and the patent or registration shall have the same date as the date of the application in the Foreign State.

"Provided that—

"(a) The application is made in the case of a patent within 12 months, and in the case of a design or trade mark within 4 months, from the application for protection in the Foreign State; and

"(b) Nothing in this section shall entitle the patentee or proprietor of the design or trade mark to recover damages for infringements happening prior to the actual date on which his complete specification is accepted, or his design or trade mark is registered, in this country.

"(2) The patent granted for the invention or the registration of a design or trade mark shall not be invalidated:—

"(a) In the case of a patent, by reason only of the publication of a description of, or use of, the invention; or

"(b) In the case of a design, by reason only of the exhibition or use of, or the publication of a description or representation of the design; or

"(c) In the case of a trade mark, by reason only of the use of the trade mark, in the United Kingdom or the Isle of Man during the period specified in this section as that within which the application may be made.

"(3) The application for the grant of a patent, or the registration of a design, or the registration of a trade mark under this section, must be made in the same manner as an ordinary application under this Act or the Trade Marks Act, 1905:—

"Provided that—

"(a) In the case of patents the application shall be accompanied by a complete specification, which, if it is not accepted within the 12 months from the application for protection in the Foreign State, shall with the drawings (if any) be open to public inspection at the expiration of that period; and

"(b) In the case of trade marks, any trade mark the registration of which has been duly applied for in the country of origin may be registered under the Trade Marks Act, 1905.

"(4) The provisions of this section shall apply only in the case of those Foreign States with respect to which His Majesty by Order in Council declares them to be applicable, and so long only in the case of each State as the Order in Council continues in force with respect to that State.

"(5) Where it is made to appear to His Majesty that the Legislature of any British Possession has made satisfactory provision for the protection of inventions, designs, or trade marks, patented or registered in this country, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to apply the provisions of this section to that Possession, with such variations or additions, if any, as may be stated in the Order":

And whereas by Section 103 of the Patents, Designs, and Trade Marks Act, 1883, as amended by Section 6 of the Patents, Designs, and Trade Marks Act (Amendment) Act, 1885, and by Section 1 of the Patents Act, 1901, and since repealed by Section 98 of the said Patents and Designs Act, 1907, provisions were made to the same or like effect as those above set forth as contained in Section 91 of the last-mentioned Act, and by the said Section 98 it was provided that "this repeal shall not affect any Convention, Order in Council, Rule, or Table of Fees having effect under any enactment so repealed, but any such Convention, Order in Council, Rules, or Table of Fees in force at the commencement of this Act shall continue in force, and may be repealed, altered or amended, as if it had been made under this Act":

And whereas it pleased Her late Majesty Queen Victoria to make an arrangement of the nature contemplated by the said Section 103, and in virtue of a Declaration signed and sealed by Her Majesty's Ambassador at Paris, on the 17th March, 1884, duly conveying the accession of Great Britain and Ireland to the International Convention and Protocol for the Protection of Industrial Property, signed by Representatives of certain Powers on the 20th March, 1883, and duly ratified on the 6th June, 1884, power being reserved to Her Majesty to accede thereafter to the provisions



of the said Convention and Protocol on behalf of the Isle of Man, the Channel Islands, and any of Her Majesty's Possessions, which Declaration of Accession was duly accepted by the French Government on behalf of the Signatory Powers by and in virtue of a Declaration dated the 2nd April, 1884:

And whereas on the 14th December, 1900, at Brussels, an Additional Act was agreed upon between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and the Heads of the Foreign Countries parties thereto for the purpose of modifying certain of the provisions of the said International Convention and the Protocol annexed thereto, the ratification of which Additional Act was duly effected:

And whereas by a Convention signed at Washington on the 2nd June, 1911, His Majesty and the Heads of the Foreign States named therein agreed to make certain modifications in and additions to the said Convention dated 20th March, 1883, as revised at Brussels on the 14th December, 1900, the ratification of which Convention was duly effected by Great Britain and certain other States:

And whereas by various Orders in Council Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and His late Majesty King Edward VII and His present Majesty have been pleased to declare that the hereinbefore mentioned provisions of the said Patents, Designs, and Trade Marks Act, 1883 (as amended), should apply to the several Foreign Countries named in the said Orders parties to the said Convention and Protocols:

And whereas Finland has acceded to the said International Convention, Protocol and Additional Act as revised at Washington on 2nd June, 1911:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers in Him vested by the above-recited provisions, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth declare, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

1. The provisions of Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Act, 1907, as amended by the Patents and Designs Act, 1914, and the Patents and Designs Act, 1919, shall apply to Finland.

2. This Order shall take effect from the 20th September, 1921.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the 16th and 17th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 50, and of the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 124, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 9th day of June, 1921, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 16th and 17th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 50, and of the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 124, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the follow-

ing Scheme for effecting a transfer of so much as is hereinafter mentioned of the ownership of the Advowson or right of Patronage of and presentation to the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Saint Chad, Haggerston, situate in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London, by way of exchange for so much as is hereinafter mentioned of the Advowson or right of Patronage of and presentation to the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Saint Columba, Haggerston, situate in the same County and Diocese:

"Whereas under the provisions of the 21st section of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, the right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Saint Chad, Haggerston, and Saint Columba, Haggerston, is at present exercised alternately by Your Majesty and Your Successors and by the Bishop of London for the time being:

"And whereas it has been proposed to us that the patronage of the said two Benefices of Saint Chad, Haggerston, and Saint Columba, Haggerston, should be assigned and transferred by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said two Benefices and of the Patronage thereof respectively, and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said two Benefices are as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed:

"And whereas the said two Benefices are of modern origin, and are in consequence not entered in Your Majesty's Books:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable David Lloyd George, now First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty as the alternate Patron of the said Benefice of Saint Columba, Haggerston (in testimony of which consent he, the said David Lloyd George, has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, now Bishop of London, as the alternate Patron of the said Benefice of Saint Chad, Haggerston (in testimony of which consent he, the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, has signed this Scheme and has affixed thereto his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the alternate right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Chad, Haggerston, which now, as aforesaid, belongs to and is exercised by the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, shall be transferred from him, the said Bishop, and from his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth belong to Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors for ever, and may from time to time be exercised by Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors for ever, in such manner that the whole Advowson of the said Benefice of Saint Chad, Haggerston, shall hereafter belong to Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors for ever, and that in exchange

for the same the alternate right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Columba, Haggerston, which now, as aforesaid, belongs to and is exercised by Your Majesty shall be transferred from Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors, and shall thereupon and thenceforth belong to and may from time to time be exercised by the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, and his successors, Bishops of London, for ever in such manner that the whole Advowson of the said

Benefice of Saint Columba, Haggerston, shall hereafter belong to the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, and his successors, Bishops of London for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately

from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 28th day of July, 1921, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Representation, as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint

Ambrose, Bournemouth, situate in the New Parish (sometime Particular District) of Saint Peter, Bournemouth, in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Ambrose, Bournemouth, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Bournemouth, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Ambrose, Bournemouth, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Ambrose, Bournemouth.'

"And with the like consent of the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Henry Luke, Bishop of Chester (testified by his having affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorized to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above mentioned Acts any sum not exceeding £900 and that as a security for the same the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands, tenements and hereditaments and endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to the said Governors by Deed for the term of 30 years or until the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid with the interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof shall be fully paid and satisfied and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in the manner following; that is to say, during and in respect of the first period of 12 months of the said term, computed from the day of the date of the Mortgage, no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable, but the said Bishop or his successors shall yearly, at the end of the second period of 12 months so computed and at the end of every such like period of 12 months thereafter, pay to the said Governors, their successors or assigns, one twenty-fifth part of the said principal sum until the whole thereof shall be repaid and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding period of 12 months, computed as aforesaid, pay interest at the rate of £4 per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid. And that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of 40 days after the same shall become due, it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors, their successors and assigns, to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale and that such mortgage deed

shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and shall bind as well the said Henry Luke, now Bishop of the said Diocese of Chester, as every succeeding Bishop of the same Diocese until the principal money and interest, costs and charges shall have been paid off and discharged.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 142, and of the Act of the 61st and 62nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 23, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting an Union of two contiguous Benefices situate within the Metropolis, and within the Diocese of Southwark, namely, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Saint Mary (the Less), Lambeth, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Saint James, Kennington, and for effecting certain other measures incidental to or arising out of such union:

"Whereas the right Reverend Cyril Forster, Bishop of the said Diocese of Southwark, has caused proposals for a Scheme for effecting an union of the said two Benefices to be laid before us which proposals were prepared under the 7th and 8th Sections of the firstly mentioned Act, and were approved by the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of the said Diocese of Southwark, and were assented to by the Patrons of the two Benefices to be affected thereby, that is to say, by the Reverend Frederick Ochterloney Taylor Hawkes, Rector or Incumbent of the Rectory of the Parish of Lambeth, in the County of Surrey and in the said Diocese of Southwark, and, as such Rector or Incumbent, the Patron of the said Benefice and Vicarage of Saint Mary (the Less), Lambeth, and by the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of Southwark, as the Patron in right of his See of the said Benefice and Vicarage of Saint James, Kennington, and the same proposals were also assented to by the Vestries of the Parishes concerned, that is to say, by the Vestry of the Parish of Saint Mary (the Less), Lambeth, and by the Vestry of the Parish of Saint James, Kennington:

"And whereas it appears to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, to be expedient that the said proposed union of the said two Benefices should be effected, and that such arrangements relating thereto and to the other matters hereinafter contained should be made as are hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Saint Mary (the Less), Lambeth, is now full, the Reverend Ellis Foster Edge Partington, Clerk in Holy Orders, being the present Incumbent thereof, and the said Benefice of Saint James, Kennington, is now vacant:

"And whereas the said Ellis Foster Edge Partington has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

"And whereas the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of the said Diocese of Southwark, as such Bishop, and also as the Patron of the said Benefice of Saint James, Kennington, and the said Frederick Ochterloney Taylor Hawkes, as the Patron of the said Benefice of Saint Mary (the Less), Lambeth, and the Vestries of the said Parishes respectively, are willing that the Scheme for effecting the said union should embody certain modifications of the said proposals, and this present Scheme does embody the same modifications accordingly, but otherwise is based upon the said proposals:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of Southwark, (in testimony whereof he has to this Scheme set his hand and Episcopal Seal), and with the consent of the said Frederick Ochterloney Taylor Hawkes, (in testimony whereof he has to this Scheme set his hand and seal), and with the consents of the Vestry of the said Parish of Saint Mary (the Less), Lambeth, and of the Vestry of the said Parish of Saint James, Kennington, (in testimony of which consents this Scheme is signed in the case of each of the said Vestries by the Chairman of a meeting of the same Vestry duly convened for the purpose of giving such consent), we, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council all that is in this Scheme contained under the several parts or headings hereinafter mentioned, as follows:—

#### "PART I.

"As to the proposed union itself and certain immediate incidents thereof we recommend and propose:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Saint Mary (the Less), Lambeth, and the said Benefice of Saint James, Kennington, be united into one Benefice under the style of 'The Benefice of Saint Mary (the Less), Lambeth,' which said United Benefice is hereinafter called 'the United Benefice.'

"3. That upon the union taking effect the Table of Fees used in the Church which will become the Church of the United Benefice shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the table of fees for the United Parish.

"4. That upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages, and burials of the Parish of Saint James, Kennington, shall be placed in the custody of the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

## "PART III.

"As to the endowments and the Parsonage House of the United Benefice, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose:—

"1. That upon the union taking effect all the endowments of the Vicarage of Saint Mary (the Less), Lambeth, and one moiety of the endowments of the Vicarage of Saint James, Kennington, shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice and the remaining moiety of the endowments of the said Vicarage of Saint James, Kennington, shall be transferred and annexed to the said District of Saint Anselm, Kennington Cross, by way of augmentation of the endowments of that District.

"2. That upon the union taking effect the present Parsonage House of the Benefice of Saint Mary (the Less), Lambeth, shall be the Parsonage House of the United Benefice and the present Parsonage House of the Benefice of Saint James, Kennington, shall be transferred and annexed to the said District of Saint Anselm, Kennington Cross, as part of the endowments of that District.

## "PART IV.

"Upon the subject of Patronage, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose:—

"That the Patronage of the United Benefice shall be vested in the said Frederick

Ochterloney Taylor Hawkes, as Rector or Incumbent of the said Rectory of the Parish of Lambeth, and in the Rectors or Incumbents of the same Rectory.

## "PART V.

"As to the Church of Saint James, Kennington, and the site and appurtenances thereof and as to the proceeds of any sale or sales of the materials, site, furniture or fittings of the same Church, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose:—

"All which we humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council."

## TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

BOOT AND FLOOR POLISH TRADE  
BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).PROPOSAL TO FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES  
FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with the Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Boot and Floor Polish Trade, as specified in the Trade Boards (Boot and Floor Polish) Order, 1920, hereby give notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to fix General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers, and to declare the normal number of hours of work in the Trade for the purpose of the application of the Overtime Rates, as shown in the Schedule set out below.

## SCHEDULE.

## PART I.

*Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates for  
Male and Female Workers.*

## SECTION I.—Male Workers:

Workers of 14 and under 15 years of age,  
14s. per week.

Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age,  
18s. per week.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age,  
22s. per week.

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age,  
28s. per week.

Workers of 18 and under 19 years of age,  
34s. per week.

Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age,  
40s. per week.

Workers of 20 and under 21 years of age,  
47s. per week.

Workers of 21 years of age and over, 60s.  
per week.

## SECTION II.—Female Workers:

Workers of 14 and under 15 years of age,  
13s. per week.

Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age,  
17s. per week.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age,  
22s. per week.

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age,  
28s. per week.

Workers of 18 years of age and over, 32s.  
per week.

## PART II.

SECTION 1.—In the application of the proposed General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Part I of this Notice, the following provisions shall apply:—

(a) In the case of classes of whole-time workers employed by the week or longer period whose usual working week, as agreed between the employer and the workers, consists of a number of hours less than 48 but not less than 44, "a week" means a week of the number of hours usually worked by the class in question as so agreed;

(b) In all other cases "a week" means a week of 48 hours.

SECTION II.—For the purpose of calculating the hourly rate applicable in respect of each hour of employment, the weekly rates set out

in Sections I and II of Part I of this Notice must be divided:—

(a) In the case of the workers referred to in Section I (a) above, by the number of hours constituting the usual working week as agreed between the employer and the workers;

(b) In all other cases by 48.

SECTION III.—Payment at not less than the hourly rate calculated as described in Section II must be made for *all* hours of employment (not merely for those constituting "a week," as described in Section I), except in so far as higher overtime rates are payable under the provisions of Part IV of this Schedule.

## PART III.

*Proposed Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for  
Male and Female Workers.*

A. Male Workers, 1s. 6½d. per hour.

B. Female Workers, 10d. per hour.

In the case of all workers employed on Piece-Work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than the equivalent of the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate to an Ordinary Worker, that is, a worker of ordinary skill and experience.

## PART IV.

*Proposed Overtime Rates for Male and Female  
Workers.*

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (i) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board propose to declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any Week ... ..	48
On any Day (other than Saturday) ...	9
On Saturday ... ..	5

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as overtime, to which the overtime rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The proposed Minimum Rates for overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the trade shall be as follows:—

(a) For the first two hours of overtime on any day except Sundays and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, that is to say, Time-and-a-quarter.

(b) For the second two hours' overtime on any day except Sundays and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, that is to say, Time-and-a-half.

(c) For all hours in excess of the first four hours of overtime on any day except Sundays and Statutory Holidays and for all hours worked on Sundays and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable, that is to say, Double Time.

(d) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the Overtime Rate shall be Time-and-a-quarter for the first two hours, Time-and-a-half for the second two hours, and Double Time thereafter, except in so far as higher overtime rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (b) and (c) of this Section.

The Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or Statutory

Holiday), the number of hours worked exceeds 9 or in the case of Saturday, 5, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

*Note.*—The hours which Female Workers, Young Persons and Children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshops Acts, and also to the provisions of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

#### PART V.

The above proposed minimum rates of wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Boot and Floor Polish) Order, 1920, that is to say:—

(1) the manufacture of boot and shoe polish or cream; blacking; dubbin or floor polish or cream; and

(2) the manufacture of stain for leather or of polish for leather or furniture, when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of any of the articles specified in paragraph (1) above;

Including the following or similar operations when incidental to operations included in paragraph (1) or (2) above:—

(i) Checking, testing, grading, weighing, measuring;

(ii) Filling, lidding, boxing, bottling, packeting, labelling;

(iii) Packing, unpacking, despatching, warehousing, portering, time-keeping, storing, stock-keeping;

But excluding the manufacture of boxes, canisters, or other containers.

#### PART VI.

SECTION I.—The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Health Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these minimum rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above proposals to fix which may be lodged with them within two months from the 13th October, 1921. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Boot and Floor Polish Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4. It is desirable that the objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

#### TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

#### THE LACE FINISHING TRADE BOARD.

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS VARIED) IN THE MACHINE-MADE LACE AND NET FINISHING TRADE, EFFECTIVE AS FROM 14TH OCTOBER, 1921.

Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in no case later than 20th October, 1921.

#### SCHEDULE.

##### PART I.

##### *General Minimum Piece-Rates.*

For the following Processes in Machine-made Lace and Net Finishing other than the Finishing of the Product of Plain Net Machines.

##### A.—Lace other than Warp Lace.

##### 1. Drawing.

(a) For one thread drawing, 6½d. per gross yards.

Provided that in cases where there are not more than 12 tyes of the draw-thread to the inch (tyes on both sides of the draw-thread being counted) the General Minimum Piece-Rate shall be 5½d. per gross yards.

(b) For two thread drawing, 8½d. per gross yards.

(c) For three thread drawing, 10½d. per gross yards.

(d) For drawing four or more threads, 3d. per thread per gross yards.

Provided that in Maltese, Honiton, Clunies and similar classes of lace where there are laced out purl effects in the body of the pattern and where such lacers are of finer count than 80/2, the General Minimum Piece-Rate shall be for all such fine threads, 3½d. per thread per gross yards.

##### 2. Roving.

(a) For one Rover, or for two Rovers which come out together, 1½d. per gross yards.

(b) For each Rover subsequent to the first, or to the first two which come out together, ½d. per thread per gross yards.

When drawing is done, all Rovers lying with the Draw-threads if removed, whether according to instructions or not, to be paid for at the above General Minimum Piece-Rates. The expression "Rover" includes "Drop-thread."

##### 3. Ripping and Roving.

(a) For Ripping and one Rover, 1½d. per gross yards.

(b) For Ripping and two Rovers, 2½d. per gross yards.

##### 4. Clipping other than Frame Clipping.

(a) For Lace up to and including 8 inches wide, 2½d. per 1,000 clips.

(b) For Lace over 8 inches and under 12 inches wide, 3d. per 1,000 clips.

(c) For Lace over 12 inches and under 18 inches wide, 3½d. per 1,000 clips.

(d) For Lace of 18 inches wide and over, 4d. per 1,000 clips.

Two cuts shall count as one clip.

5. Scolloping, or Cutting and Scolloping, or Ripping and Scolloping.

I. Scolloping other than Scolloping which involves more than four cuts to the Scollop:—

(a) For Ripping and Scolloping in cases where there are no parting or purl threads, and where the scollop is single,  $1\frac{1}{2}$ d. per dozen yards.

(b) For Cutting and Scolloping Crossband Laces, 2d. per dozen yards.

(c) For Cutting and Scolloping Laces stiff dressed,  $2\frac{1}{2}$ d. per dozen yards.

(d) For Scolloping Lace of 40 inches and over to the double rack, 2d. per dozen yards.

(e) For Scolloping Lace of 24 inches to 40 inches to the double rack,  $2\frac{1}{2}$ d. per dozen yards.

(f) For Scolloping Lace finer than 24 inches to the double rack,  $3\frac{1}{4}$ d. per dozen yards.

II. Scolloping involving more than four cuts to the Scollop:—

(a) For Lace of 40 inches and over to the double rack,  $2\frac{3}{4}$ d. per dozen yards.

(b) For Lace of 24 inches to 40 inches to the double rack,  $3\frac{3}{4}$ d. per dozen yards.

(c) For Lace finer than 24 inches to the double rack,  $4\frac{1}{4}$ d. per dozen yards.

In the application of the above General Minimum Piece-Rates for Scolloping the following provisions shall apply:—

(1) The General Minimum Piece-Rates shall not apply to any scollop more than 1 inch deep from purl edge to the dip of the scollop.

(2) Where the lace has 72 or more scollops to the yard the above General Minimum Piece-Rates for ordinary scolloping shall be increased by  $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per dozen yards.

(3) The General Minimum Piece-Rates shall not apply to the scolloping of vandykes, galons and fancy shapes.

(4) Scolloping shall be held to include all cutting other than straight cutting.

(5) Where one cut clears two edges it shall count as one scollop.

The above General Minimum Piece-Rates for Scolloping include the necessary work of Drawing, up to and including two thread drawing. A third thread shall be paid for extra at  $\frac{1}{4}$ d. per dozen yards.

6. Cutting.

(a) For cutting lace up to 50 inches to the double rack,  $2\frac{3}{4}$ d. for 60 yards.

(b) For cutting lace over 50 inches to the double rack,  $2\frac{1}{2}$ d. for 60 yards.

7. Straight Snicking or Slotting.

(a) For slots up to and including 1 inch in width (inside measurement),  $4\frac{1}{2}$ d. per 1,000 slots.

(b) For slots over 1 inch and not exceeding  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches in width (inside measurement),  $5\frac{1}{4}$ d. per 1,000 slots.

*B.—Lace which is the Product of Warp Machines.*

1. Drawing.

(a) Bar Warps:—

(1) For widths not exceeding  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches,  $1\frac{1}{4}$ d. per thread for 12 breadths of 12 yards.

(2) For widths exceeding  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches:—  
(i) One thread drawing,  $1\frac{1}{4}$ d. per thread for 12 breadths of 12 yards.

(ii) For drawing two or more threads,  $1\frac{3}{4}$ d. per thread for 12 breadths of 12 yards.

(b) String Warps:—

(1) Up to and including 16 gauge:—

(i) For widths not exceeding 7 inches,  $1\frac{3}{4}$ d. per thread for 12 breadths of 12 yards.

(ii) For widths exceeding 7 inches, 2d. per thread for 12 breadths of 12 yards.

(2) Over 16 gauge—all widths,  $2\frac{1}{4}$ d. per thread for 12 breadths of 12 yards.

2. Plain Cutting:

(a) Bar Warps,  $1\frac{1}{2}$ d. per 12 breadths of 12 yards.

(b) String Warps:—

(1) Up to and including 16 gauge,  $1\frac{1}{4}$ d. per 12 breadths of 12 yards.

(2) Over 16 gauge,  $1\frac{3}{4}$ d. per 12 breadths of 12 yards.

Provided that in the case of all operations on Black Lace, the General Minimum Piece-Rates as specified in this Part of this Schedule shall be subject to the addition of a 1d. in the shilling.

## PART II.

### *General Minimum Piece-Rates.*

For the following processes in the Finishing of Hair Nets, whether they are the Product of Plain Net Machines or not:—

1. Threading Hair Nets:

A.—Hair Nets which are the product of Warp Machines:

(a) Hair Nets up to and including  $12\frac{1}{2}$  inches, with 38 holes or less,  $8\frac{3}{4}$ d. per gross nets.

(b) Hair Nets of over  $12\frac{1}{2}$  inches but under 18 inches, with 48 holes or less, 11d. per gross nets.

(c) All sizes of 18 inches and over, with 50 holes or less, 1s.  $1\frac{1}{4}$ d. per gross nets.

(d) For every 8 holes additional to those above specified,  $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per gross nets.

B.—Hair Nets which are the product of Levers or Plain Net Machines:—

The General Minimum Piece-Rates for Threading Hair Nets which are the product of Levers or Plain Net Machines shall be higher by 25 per cent. than the General Minimum Piece-Rates for threading Hair Nets which are the product of Warp Machines as specified in A. above.

2. Carding Hair Nets (whether the product of Plain Net Machines or not):

All sizes of cards,  $1\frac{1}{4}$ d. per gross nets.

The above General Minimum Piece-Rate shall apply also to bundling in dozens without cards.

When Threading and Carding are done at the same time the General Minimum Piece-Rate shall be the sum of the respective General Minimum Piece-Rates specified in this Part of this Schedule.

3. Ticketing Hair Nets (whether the product of Plain Net Machines or not):

For all Ticketing done at the same time as Threading, 1d. per gross nets.

## PART III.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the application of the General Minimum Piece-Rates set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule shall be subject to the following conditions:—

SECTION I.—The General Minimum Piece-Rates shall not apply in any case where special difficulty is caused by bad cotton, making or

dressing. In all such cases each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker at least the equivalent of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate.

SECTION II.—Workers who fetch their own work from the Warehouse, and do not receive it through a Middlewoman or Middleman, shall be entitled to a Minimum Rate not less than 15 per cent. above that otherwise payable.

SECTION III.—The General Minimum Piece-Rates set out above apply to the actual workers and not to Middlewomen or Middlemen; the practice of good employers is to pay Middlewomen or Middlemen in addition to such Rates a commission of 25 per cent.

NOTE.—As regards all work for which no General Minimum Piece-Rates have been made effective, each piece-rate paid by the employer must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker at least the equivalent of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate.

## PART IV.

*General Minimum Time-Rates.*

For the Trade of Machine-made Lace and Net Finishing, including the Finishing of those Hair Nets, Veilings and Quillings which are the product of Plain Net Machines, but excluding the Finishing of all other products of Plain Net Machines.

(A).—Workers (other than Learners, as defined in Part V of this Schedule), 7d. per hour.

Provided that:—

(a) In the case of workers specified in Section II of Part III of this Schedule the General Minimum Time-Rate shall be 8d. per hour.

(b) In the case of workers entering the trade for the first time after the age of 18, the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable during the first six months of their employment shall be 3d. per hour, and thereafter the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable shall be the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate for workers other than Learners.

(B).—Learners as defined in Part V. of this Schedule:—

(1) Learners not working on Frame Clipping:—

The General Minimum Time-Rates for Learners are weekly rates based on a week of 48 hours, but they shall be subject to a proportionate increase or decrease according as the number of hours of employment in any week is more or less than 48.

In reckoning the period of employment for the purpose of determining the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to a Learner, previous experience in any section of the trade

covered by this Notice must be included, except (1) that experience in finishing Hair Nets shall be included only in cases where the worker is employed in that section of the trade, and

(2) in the Hair Net section of the trade no experience except in finishing Hair Nets shall be included.

It shall be optional to the employer to place the Learner on piece-rates during this period of learnership.

#### PART V.

For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions of Learners shall apply:—

I. Learners *not* working on frame clipping are persons who:—

(a) Are definitely and effectively employed in the practical learning of the trade and have not been definitely employed in learning the trade more than four years;

(b) Are under 18 years of age,

(c) Are working in a warehouse and regularly engaged upon work other than Clipping, Scolloping, Drawing or Roving. Provided that this clause shall not apply in respect of Warp Drawing during the first twelve months of a Learner's employment, and provided also that the Trade Board are satisfied that there is an intention to afford the worker reasonable facilities subsequently to learn other processes,

(d) Hold a certificate from the Trade Board issued on an application made at the commencement of the employment or within such period thereafter as the Trade Board may in any case or class of cases allow. Provided always that in granting or withholding such certificate the Trade Board may take into consideration whether, having regard to the number of Learners employed in any factory or workshop or under any journeyman or worker, the Learner proposed to be certificated has a reasonable prospect of receiving due instruction. Provided also that any certificate may be withdrawn if the Trade Board consider that the conditions of employment have ceased to be such as would have originally justified the grant thereof.

II. Learners working on frame clipping are persons who:—

(a) Are definitely and effectively employed in the practical learning of this branch of the trade and have not been definitely employed more than two years;

(b) Are under 18 years of age;

(c) Are working on frame clipping in either a warehouse or a workshop;

(d) Hold a certificate from the Trade Board issued on an application made at the commencement of the employment or within such period thereafter as the Trade Board may in any case or class of cases allow. Provided always that in granting or withholding such certificate the Trade Board may take into consideration whether, having regard to the number of Learners employed in any factory or workshop or under any journeyman or worker, the Learner proposed to be certificated has a reasonable prospect of receiving due instruction. Provided also that any certificate may be withdrawn if the Trade Board consider that the conditions of employment have ceased to be such as would have originally justified the grant thereof.

#### PART VI.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made

from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the power to make such Regulations has been transferred to the Minister of Transport,

And whereas the County Council of Southampton have applied for the issue of a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising part of the main Lyndhurst-Southampton Road at Totton;

Now, therefore, the Minister of Transport, in pursuance of the powers given to him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall, during the period of twelve months from the date on which these Regulations come into operation, apply and have effect within the limits comprising so

much of the main Lyndhurst-Southampton Road at Totton as extends from the northern extremity of the Police Station on Redbridge Causeway to the junction of Brokenford Lane and Rumbidge Street.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the twenty-fourth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.
