"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

" SCHEDULE.

" SECTION A.

" To take effect as from the 5th August, 1920.

" 1. While employed on Fire Control duties Bandmen to be eligible for the allowance of 3d. a day instituted by Order in Council of the 9th October, 1919.

" 2. The Instructional Allowance of 1s. a day payable to Bandmasters at the R.N. School of Music under the Order in Council of 13th October, 1910, to be extended to Non-Commissioned Officers employed as Instructors in the various instruments at that Establishment.

" 3. The following scale of allowances to ratings employed as Engineers' Yeomen of Stores to be substituted for the allowances authorized by the Order in Council of 2nd November, 1907, viz.:—

" In Battleships, Battle Cruisers, Repair Ships and Depot Ships for Destroyers	1 0

" In other vessels the rate payable to be at Admiralty discretion.	

" 4. The allowance to Royal Marines doing duty as Butchers instituted by Order in Council of the 19th January, 1886, and extended to Naval ratings by Order in Council of the 9th May, 1892, to be increased to 3d. a day.

" 5. C.P.O. Cooks in charge of Instructional Gallies in Cookery Schools to be paid 1s. a day while actually employed in charge; the allowance not to be paid concurrently with any other allowance for Cooks.

" 6. Sick Berth Attendants passed for Leading Sick Berth Attendant when employed in ships allowed one Sick Berth rating to be paid the Dispensing Allowance of 2d. a day instituted by Order in Council of the 5th July, 1911.

" SECTION B.

" To take effect as from the 24th December, 1919.

" The allowances of 6d. a day to Sick Berth ratings qualified and employed as:—

" (a) Masseurs (authorized by Order in Council of the 5th July, 1911);

" (b) Operating Room or Laboratory Attendants (authorized by Order in Council of the 10th November, 1911);

" (c) X-Ray Attendants authorized by Order in Council of the 18th December, 1918);

to be paid continuously to qualified ratings so long as they remain efficient and continue to be available under the following conditions:—

" (a) No rating to be paid for more than one of these non-substantive ratings.

" (b) Arrangements to be introduced for ratings to be regularly employed on their specialist duties.

" (c) Ratings who revert to the ordinary Roster in order to qualify for advancement

and so cease to become available for such regular employment, to cease to draw the pay of the non-substantive rating.

" SECTION C.

" To take effect as from the 1st April, 1919.

" Warrant Officers, Class II, Royal Marines, to continue to receive the higher pension increments allowed for their service before the revised pension rates authorized by Order in Council of 7th February, 1921, came into force, viz., 2d. per diem for Company Serjeant-Majors and Quartermaster-Serjeants, and 3d. per diem for Staff Clerks in London, for each year's service in these ranks."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by Section 13 of the Air Force (Constitution) Act, 1917, it is provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council apply, with the necessary modifications and adaptations in relation to the Air Council, the President of the Air Council, and the Air Force and the officers and men thereof, and Air Force property or institutions, any of the enactments relating to the Army Council, the Secretary of State for the War Department, the Army or the officers and soldiers thereof (including enactments conferring any powers, rights, exemption or abatement from taxation or immunities or imposing any duties or disabilities on any such officers or soldiers) or to military property or institutions:

And whereas, by certain Orders made under the said section certain enactments have been applied in relation as aforesaid, and it is expedient to apply the further enactment mentioned in the first column of the Schedule to this Order:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The enactment mentioned in the first column of the Schedule to this Order, being an enactment relating to the Army or the officers and soldiers thereof, shall apply in relation to the Air Force and the officers and airmen thereof, subject to the modifications and adaptations specified in the second column of that Schedule.

2. This Order may be cited as "The Air Force (Application of Enactments) (No. 2) Order, 1921."
