COAL MINES ACT.

THE EXPLOSIVES IN COAL MINES ORDER OF THE 5TH OCTOBER, 1921.

In pursuance of the power conferred upon them by Section 61 of the Coal Mines Act, 1911, (a) and under the provisions of the Mining Industry Act, 1920, (b) the Board of Trade hereby make the following Order:—

(1) The Explosives in Coal Mines Order of the 1st September, 1913, (c) as amended by the Explosives in Coal Mines Orders of subsequent dates, shall be amended and shall take effect as if the explosive named and defined in the Schedule to this Order were named and defined in the First Schedule to that Order, and in all respects as if the Schedule to this Order formed part of the First Schedule to that Order.

(2) So much of the Schedule to the Explosives in Coal Mines Order of the 25th August, 1920, (d) as relates to the Explosive Super-Excellite No. 4 is hereby repealed.
