WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred on Him by the Treaty of Peace Act, 1919, and the Treaties of Peace (Austria and Bulgaria) Act, 1920, His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Treaty of Peace Order, 1919, the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1920, and the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Order, 1920, and various Orders amending the aforesaid Orders:

And whereas it is expedient that the aforesaid Orders as amended should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas in pursuance of the powers conferred on Him by the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Act, 1921, His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921, and it is expedient that that Order should be amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The provisions of the Treaty of Peace Order, 1919, the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1920, and the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Order, 1920, as amended, and the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921, mentioned in the first column of Part I, Part II, Part III, and Part IV of the Schedule to this Order, shall be amended in the manner shown in the second column of the several parts of that Schedule.

2. This Order may be cited as the Treaties of Peace Orders (Amendment) Order, 1921, and shall be included amongst the Orders which may be cited as the Treaty of Peace Orders, 1919 to 1921, the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Orders, 1920 to 1921, and the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Orders, 1920 to 1921; and the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921, and this Order may be cited together as the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Orders, 1921.

The following Statutes made by the Governing Body of Merton College, Oxford, on the 7th day of October, 1921, and sealed on the 14th day of October, 1921, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the

provisions of The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 :—

THE Warden and Fellows of Merton College, Oxford, respectfully submit for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council the following two new Statutes which were duly made in accordance with the provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, sec-

tion 54, each Statute being passed by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College, specially summoned for the purpose, and held on the 7th day of October, 1921.

I.

"The College may grant a pension out of the Corporate Revenues to any person who at the time of the approval of this Statute by the King in Council has served as Tutor or Lecturer for not less than thirty years and who is not entitled to a pension payable out of the Pension Fund, subject to the following conditions:—

"(1) Not more than one person shall be in receipt of such a pension at any one time, and no pension shall exceed £300 a year;

"(2) No pension shall be granted except by a Resolution of which not less than four weeks' notice has been given and which is carried by the votes of two-thirds of the Warden and Fellows present and voting at a Stated College Meeting;

"(3) So long as any pension is being paid under the provisions of this Statute, the maximum amount of £1,500 a year which may be contributed out of the Corporate Revenues into the Pension Fund under clause 8 of the amended Statute VIII. shall be reduced by the amount of such pension, and clause 8 aforesaid shall be read accordingly."

II.

"The College may pay an additional sum of £100 a year out of the Corporate Revenues to any person who at the time of the approval of this Statute by the King in Council is in receipt of a pension under the provisions of the Commissioners' Statutes relating to pensions."

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme, bearing date the 28th day of July, 1921, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd

and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a Separate District for spiritual purposes out of the Parish of Southchurch, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Southchurch is a Parish wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said Parish of Southchurch which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed Separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purpose of Divine Worship:

"And whereas by a certain Indenture bearing date on or about the 28th day of July, 1921, and made or expressed to be made under the authority of the 'New Parishes Acts, 1843, 1844, and 1856,' or some or one of them, between the Reverend Edward Ashurst Welch, Rector or Incumbent of the Rectory of the said Parish of Southchurch, of the first part, the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, as the Patron in right of his See of the said Rectory of Southchurch, of the second part, the Right Reverend John Edwin, Bishop of Chelmsford, the Ordinary of the said Rectory of Southchurch, of the third part, and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, of the fourth part (which Indenture is intended to be enrolled in the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice), the said Edward Ashurst Welch did, with the consents of the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, as such Patron as aforesaid, and of the said John Edwin, Bishop of Chelmsford, as such Bishop as aforesaid, grant and confirm unto the Minister of the District hereinafter recommended to be constituted and to his successors, and when such District shall have become a New Parish then to the Vicar or Incumbent of such New Parish and to his successors for the time being, a clear yearly rentcharge or net annual sum of £100 to be payable quarterly on the usual quarter days in every year free from and clear of all charges for First Fruits and Tenths and of all deductions, taxes, charges, rates, assessments and outgoings whatsoever (except on account of the tax on income or property, if any), the first of such quarterly payments to be made on such of the said quarter days as shall happen next after the date of the licence of the first Minister of the said proposed District, and to be a proportionate part of the said quarterly payment calculated from the date of the said licence to the said quarter day, such yearly rent charge to be for ever issuing and payable out of and charged upon the said Rectory of Southchurch, and the tithes or tithe commutation rentcharges, glebe lands, hereditaments, and all

other the endowments and emoluments for the time being to the said Rectory belonging:

“ And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the endowment of the said proposed District or New Parish (as the case may be) and towards the maintenance of the Minister or Incumbent thereof for the time being, and we have in respect of such sum agreed and have undertaken to provide and pay by equal quarterly payments on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August, and the first day of November, in each and every year to such Minister or Incumbent as aforesaid when duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, the sum of £100 per annum so long as the said capital sum shall remain in our hands:

“ And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that we should grant out of the Common Fund created by the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act a capital sum of £1,000, in respect of which there shall be paid by us to the Minister or Incumbent for the time being of the said proposed District or New Parish when duly licensed as before mentioned a yearly sum of £50:

“ And whereas the said Grant of £1,000 will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

“ And whereas the said yearly rentcharge of £100 has been so granted and confirmed as aforesaid and the said capital sum of £2,000 has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said intended District and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

“ And whereas the said Edward Ashurst Welch and the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 have nominated the Bishop of Chelmsford for the time being as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish (as the case may be) should be assigned:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said John Edwin, Bishop of Chelmsford (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Southchurch, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme become and be constituted a Separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named ‘The District of Saint Augustine, Thorpe Bay.’

“ And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said

District so recommended to be constituted and when such District shall have become a New Parish then of such New Parish and of the nomination of a Minister or Incumbent thereto, shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said John Edwin, Bishop of the said Diocese of Chelmsford, and his successors for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ The Schedule to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

“ The District of Saint Augustine, Thorpe Bay, being:—

“ All that part of the Parish of Southchurch, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford, which is bounded upon the south by the Estuary of the River Thames, upon the east partly by the Parish of South Shoebury and partly by the Parish of North Shoebury, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of North Shoebury from the said Parish of Southchurch crosses the middle of the London, Tilbury and Southend Line of the Midland Railway, and extending thence westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 46½ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the said line of railway across the road known as Thorpe Hall Avenue, and extending thence southward along the middle of Thorpe Hall Avenue for a distance of 45 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Burges Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Burges Road for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Lynton Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Lynton Road for a distance of 6½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the Esplanade, and extending thence southward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line to the southern boundary of the said Parish of Southchurch, in the Estuary of the River Thames.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the Parish out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly

published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chelmsford.

TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England on Friday, the 28th October, 1921, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877; the National Debt Act, 1889; and the War Loan Acts, 1914 to 1919, to the amount of £60,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any date from Monday, the 31st October, to Saturday, the 5th November, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than two o'clock (Saturday twelve o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 26 of the Finance Act, 1915, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 and the Suffolk (Swine Fever) Order of 1914 shall not apply to the movement of swine from the sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being a Swine-Fever Infected Place, if the swine are accompanied by a licence in the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the said Order of 1908, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the borough of Bury St. Edmunds, and the following conditions, which shall be specified in the licence, are complied with:—

(i) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine

for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.

(ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

2. A copy of a licence issued under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

3. A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the above-mentioned Orders be treated as a licence under those Orders.
