UNIVERSITY OF LONDON.

Notice is hereby given, in pursuance of the University of London Act, 1898, that the following Amendment of No. 24 of the Statutes for the Management of the University of London, University College, has been made by the Senate of the University of London, and that copies of the amended Statute can be obtained on application to "The Secretary to the Senate, University of London, South Kensington, S. W. 7."

To substitute for No. 24 of the existing Statutes the following Statute:—

24. The Board shall consist of the Provost and of the following persons whilst holding office in the College:—

(1) The Professors who held office immediately before the day appointed for incorporation of the College in the University, *i.e.*, January 1st, 1907.

(2) All persons subsequently appointed to hold office as Professors in the College.

(3) The Librarian.

(4) All such persons appointed as Readers or Lecturers or Assistant Professors, or granted the title of Assistant Professor, as the Senate, having regard to the importance of their work in the College, shall, after receiving a report from the Professorial Board, nominate to be members of that Board.

(5) Such other persons (not exceeding six in number and being either Assistant Lecturers, Senior Assistants, Lecturers, Senior Lecturers, Senior Demonstrators in Anatomy, Assistant Professors, or Readers) as the Senate, on the nomination of such teachers in the College as are not by virtue of the preceding Sub-sections members of the Board, shall annually appoint to be members of the Board.

UNIVERSITY OF LONDON.

Notice is hereby given, in pursuance of the University of London Act, 1898, and the King's College London (Transfer) Act, 1908, that the following Amendment of No. 22 of the Statutes for the Constitution and Management of University of London, King's College, has been made by the Senate of the University of London, and that copies of the amended Statute can be obtained on application to "The Secretary to the Senate, University of London, South Kensington, S.W. 7."

To substitute for No. 22 of the existing Statutes the following Statute:—

22. There shall be a Professorial Board of University of London King's College (hereinafter called "the Professorial Board of King's College") for the purpose of advising and making suggestions to the Delegacy of King's College on all academical matters and the general management of University of London King's College. The following persons, whilst teachers in University of London King's College, shall be members of the Professorial Board of King's College:—

(1) The professors and assistant professors holding office under the Council immediately before the appointed day other than and except those persons who, by order of the Commissioners or otherwise, are assigned to the faculty of Theology;

(2) All persons subsequently appointed as professors in University of London King's College;

(3) All such persons being or subsequently appointed as readers or lecturers, or subsequently appointed as assistant professors, or granted the title of assistant professor in University of London King's College as the Senate, having regard to the importance of their work in University of London King's College, shall nominate to be members of the Professorial Board; and

(4) Such other persons (not exceeding six in number and not being by virtue of the preceding sub-sections members of the Professorial Board) as the Senate, on the nomination of the faculties of the College, shall annually appoint to be members of the Professorial Board.

And for the better effecting the purpose of this Our Commission, We do by these Presents give and grant unto you, or any three or more of you, full power to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission; to call for information in writing; and also to call for, have access to and examine all such books, documents, registers and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever.

And We do by these Presents authorize and empower you, or any one or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid.

And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And We do further ordain that you, or any three or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission

from time to time, if you shall judge it expedient so to do.

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you, your opinion upon the matters herein submitted for your consideration.

Given at Our Court at *Saint James's*, the twenty-fourth day of *October*, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, in the twelfth year of Our Reign.

His Majesty the KING has been pleased to award the Edward Medal to Jacobus Lowies van Heerden and a native of Bulawayo named Mwene in the following circumstances:—

On the 28th November, 1920, a white man named Goode and two natives descended to the

lowest level of the Lonely Mine, Bulawayo, too quickly after the conclusion of some shotfiring operations, and were overcome by carbon monoxide gas. Mr. Van Heerden, who was at the next level, heard groans, and, descending, found the two natives dead and Goode unconscious. After three attempts, during each of which he was partially overcome, Mr. Van Heerden managed to effect Goode's rescue, himself collapsing immediately afterwards.

In his last attempt he was assisted by two natives, one of whom (named Zamane) was affected by the gas and failed to return from the danger zone. The native Mwene thereupon, on his own initiative, though well aware of the effect of the gas on those who had previously entered the level, descended single-handed to the rescue of Zamane, whom he discovered in a state of collapse and carried up a ladder to a place of safety. He then returned and endeavoured to recover the bodies of the other natives, but, failing to do this unaided, he went for assistance, once again returned, and, with the help of others, brought the bodies of the dead natives out.

Both Mr. Van Heerden and the native Mwene knowingly risked their lives to rescue others.

FLAX AND HEMP TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS, EFFECTIVE AS FROM 24TH OCTOBER, 1921.

Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in any case not later than 30th October, 1921.

General Minimum Time-Rates.

Female Workers.

Spinners and Card-cutters of 18 years of age and over, 32s. per week.

Weavers, Winders and Warpings of 18 years of age and over, 32s. per week.

All other Female Workers of 18 years of age and over (except Learners), 28s. per week.

Learners (as defined in Section III (iv) of Part I of the Schedule below), see Part I, Section III below.

Workers under 18 years of age (other than Learners). See Part I, Section IV below.

Male Workers.

Tenters of 21 years of age and over with a recognised full charge, 63s. per week.

Under-Tenters of 21 years of age and over. See Part III, Section II, below.

Dressers, Mounters, Card-cutters and Hacklers (Hand-Dressers) of 21 years of age and over, 58s. 6d. per week.

All other Male Workers of 21 years of age and over, 48s. 6d. per week.

Workers under 21 years of age. See Part III, Section IV, below.

(NOTE.—For definition of term "week" see Part V of the Schedule below.)

Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates.

Female Workers of all ages, 8d. per hour.

Male Hose-pipe Weavers employed on power or hand looms, 1s. 4d. per hour.

General Minimum Piece-Rates.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

General Minimum Time-Rates for Female Workers.

SECTION I.—For Spinners and Card-cutters of 18 years of age and over, 32s. per week.

SECTION II.—For Weavers, Winders and Warpings of 18 years of age and over, 32s. per week.

SECTION III.—For Learners (as defined in Sub-Section (iv) of this Section):—

(i) Learners employed in Weaving, Warping, Winding or Spinning:—

Workers commencing learnership at:—

18 years of age and over, 24s. per week.

17 and under 18 years of age, 20s. per week.

16 and under 17 years of age, 16s. per week.

15 and under 16 years of age, 12s. per week.

Provided that the above General Minimum Time-Rates for Learners shall be payable only in respect of one period of learnership not exceeding six months.

(ii) Learners employed in Card-cutting:—

Workers commencing learnership at:—

18 years of age and over, 24s. per week during first six months of employment as Learners; 26s. per week during second six months of employment as Learners.

17 and under 18 years of age, 20s. per week during first six months of employment as Learners; 22s. per week during second six months of employment as Learners.

16 and under 17 years of age, 16s. per week during first six months of employment as Learners; 18s. per week during second six months of employment as Learners.

15 and under 16 years of age, 12s. per week during first six months of employment as Learners; 14s. per week during second six months of employment as Learners.

Provided that the above General Minimum Time-Rates for Learners shall be payable only in respect of one period of learnership not exceeding twelve months.

(iii) A Learner who has completed any one of the periods of learnership specified in Sub-Sections (i) or (ii) of this Section shall cease to be regarded as a Learner, and shall receive not less than the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate for workers other than Learners.

(iv) For the purpose of this Notice, a Female Learner shall be deemed to mean a female worker who is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning weaving, warping, winding, spinning or card-cutting by an employer who ensures that she shall receive reasonable and proper facilities for such learning.

SECTION IV.—For all other Female Workers:—

Workers of 18 years of age and upwards, 28s. per week.

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, 23s. per week.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, 18s. per week.

Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, 14s. per week.

Workers under 15 years of age, 10s. per week.

PART II.

Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate for Female Workers.

Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate.

SECTION I.—For Female Workers of all ages, 8d. per hour.

SECTION II.—In cases where a worker is employed on Piece-Work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 8d. per hour to an Ordinary Worker, *i.e.*, a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question.

PART III.

General Minimum Time-Rates for Male Workers.

SECTION I.—For Tenters of 21 years of age and over with a recognised full charge, 63s. per week.

SECTION II.—For Under-Tenters of 21 years of age and over:—

(i) During the first year of employment at or after the age of 21 years, as an Under-Tenter, 43s. 3d. per week.

(ii) During the second and third years of employment after the age of 21 years, as an Under-Tenter, 48s. 6d. per week.

(iii) For all subsequent employment as an Under-Tenter, 54s. per week.

SECTION III.—For Dressers, Mounters, Card-Cutters and Hacklers (Hand-Dressers) of 21 years of age and over, 58s. 6d. per week.

SECTION IV.—For all other Male Workers:—

Workers of 21 years of age and upwards, 48s. 6d. per week.

PART IV.

Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate for Male Hose-Pipe Weavers employed on Power or Hand Looms.

SECTION I.—For Male Hose-Pipe Weavers employed on Power or Hand Looms, 1s. 4d. per hour.

SECTION II.—In the case of Male Hose-Pipe Weavers employed on Power or Hand Looms on Piece-Work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 1s. 4d. per hour to an Ordinary Worker, *i.e.*, a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question.

PART V.

Definition of "Week."

SECTION I.—(a) In the case of classes of whole-time workers employed by the week or longer period, whose customary working week consists of a number of hours less than 48 but not less than 44, "a week" means a week of the number of hours customarily worked by the class in question;

(b) In all other cases "a week" means a week of 48 hours.

SECTION II.—For the purpose of calculating the hourly rate applicable in respect of each hour of employment the rates set out in Parts I and III of this Schedule must be divided:—

(a) In the case of the workers referred to in Section I (a) of this Part by the number of hours per week customarily worked by the class in question;

(b) In all other cases by 48.

SECTION III.—Payment at not less than the hourly rate calculated as described in Section II of this Part must be made for *all* hours of employment whether in excess of the customary working week or not, except for those hours in respect of which a higher rate is payable under the overtime provisions specified in Part VII below.

PART VII.

*Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers
(All Ages).*

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the Trade to be:—

In any week, 48.

On any week day other than Saturday, $8\frac{3}{4}$.

On Saturday, $4\frac{1}{4}$.

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays, Statutory Holidays, and any days which are Customary Holidays in the district in the Flax and Hemp Trade (but so that the total number of such days, including Statutory Holidays, but excluding Sundays, shall not exceed 11 working days in any one year) shall be regarded as Overtime, to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—Male and female workers employed on Time-Work:—

The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a Male or Female Worker employed on Time-Work in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows:—

(1) For all time worked on any of the days mentioned in the proviso to Section I of this Part of this Schedule, twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Double Time.

(2) For all time worked in excess of $4\frac{1}{4}$ hours on Saturday, One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Half.

(3) (a) For the first two hours worked in excess of $8\frac{3}{4}$ hours on any other day, One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter.

(b) For all time worked in excess of $10\frac{3}{4}$ hours, One-and-a-half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-half.

Provided that in the case of workers who, in accordance with the practice of the establishment, attend for nine hours per day on five days of the week, and for three hours on Saturday, the Overtime Rate fixed by Sub-Section (3) (a) of this Section shall not be payable in respect of the first quarter of an hour in excess of $8\frac{3}{4}$ hours, but shall be payable thereafter till 11 hours have been worked, and the Overtime Rate payable fixed by Sub-Section (3) (b) of this Section shall apply in respect of all hours worked after 11 hours.

Provided also that to workers who, in accordance with the practice of the establishment, attend only on five days a week, the said rates fixed by Sub-Section 3 (a) of this Section shall not be payable in respect of the first three-quarters of an hour in excess of $8\frac{3}{4}$ hours, but shall be payable thereafter until $11\frac{1}{4}$ hours have been worked; and the said rate fixed by Sub-Section 3 (b) of this Section shall be payable for all time worked in excess of $11\frac{1}{4}$ hours.

Provided also that in the case of workers

who, in accordance with the practice of the establishment, attend for $8\frac{3}{4}$ hours or less on the five days Monday to Friday inclusive, the Overtime Rate fixed by Sub-Section (2) of this Section shall not be payable in respect of the first quarter of an hour in excess of $4\frac{1}{4}$ hours on Saturday, but shall be payable thereafter.

(4) For all time worked in any week in excess of 48 hours One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter, except where a higher amount is payable in respect of Overtime under Sub-Sections (1), (2) and (3) (b) of this Section with regard to Overtime Rates.

SECTION III.—All Male and Female Workers employed on Piece-work:—

(a) All Female Workers employed on Piece-work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, or One-Quarter of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable if the worker had been employed on Time-work were Double-Time, Time-and-a-Half, or Time-and-a-Quarter respectively.

(b) Male Hose-pipe Weavers employed on Piece-work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker, not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate specified in Part IV. of this Schedule, the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, One-half of the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, or One-Quarter of the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable if the Worker had been employed on Time-work were Double-Time, Time-and-a-Half, or Time-and-a-Quarter, respectively.

(c) Male Canvas Weavers employed on Piece-work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to the General Minimum Piece-Rate applicable, as set out in Part VI. of this schedule, or where no General Minimum Piece-Rate has been fixed and made effective, to Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker not less than the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, or One-Quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable if the worker had been employed on Time-work were Double-Time, Time-and-a-Half, or Time-and-a-Quarter respectively.

(d) All other Male Workers employed on Piece-work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker not less than the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, One-

Half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, or One-Quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable if the worker had been employed on Time-work were Double-Time, Time-and-a-half, or Time-and-a-Quarter respectively.

SECTION IV.—The provisions set out in this Part of the Schedule are without prejudice to any agreement between an employer and his workers, providing for the payment at Overtime Rates of all hours in excess of the normal number of hours in the establishment, notwithstanding that such normal number of hours is less than 48 per week.

Note.—The hours which female workers, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART VIII.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male and Female Workers in Great Britain, in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Flax and Hemp) Order, 1919, namely:—

The preparing, spinning and weaving (*a*) of scutched flax, (*b*) of hemp, (*c*) of a mixture of scutched flax and any other fibre, or (*d*) of a mixture of hemp and any other fibre.

Including:

(1) The preparing and spinning of waste reclaimed at any stage; and

(2) All packing, despatching, warehousing, storing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the above-mentioned work;

But excluding:—

(1) The calendering, bleaching, dyeing or finishing of any of the above-mentioned materials; and

(2) The preparing or spinning of materials required for the making or re-making of (*a*) rope (including driving rope and banding), (*b*) cord (including blind and window cord, but excluding silk, worsted and other fancy cords), (*c*) core for wire ropes, (*d*) lines, (*e*) twine (including binder and trawl twine), (*f*) lanyards, (*g*) net and similar articles when such spinning or preparing is carried on in the same factory or workshop as the said making or re-making; and

(3) The making or repair of sacks or bags; and also

(4) The weaving of carpets, rugs and mats.

PART IX.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are to be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who

are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of the Minimum Rates.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF ASSISTANTS IN THE VICTORIA AND ALBERT MUSEUM, BOARD OF EDUCATION.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. *Age.*—Candidates must have attained the age of 22 and must not have attained the age of 24 on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part. In exceptional cases the Board will be prepared to consider the appointment of persons above the age of 24.

2. *Nationality.*—Candidates must be natural-born British subjects and born of a father also a natural-born British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, and provided that exception may be made as to the father in the case of candidates who have served in His Majesty's Armed Forces during the War.

3. *Military Service.*—Until further order, special consideration will be given to candidates who have served in His Majesty's Forces during the War.

4. *Publicity.*—The Board of Education will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy

or vacancies which they desire to fill on any one occasion, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

5. *Application.*—Application shall be addressed in the first instance to the Director of the Victoria and Albert Museum, and shall be made on the appropriate form. The Director will examine the candidates' credentials, and after a personal interview will submit the names of such candidates as appear to have the requisite qualifications for any of the existing or prospective vacancies to the Board of Education for approval of their candidature. Candidates thus approved shall be submitted to the Civil Service Commissioners, who, if dissatisfied with the number or quality of candidates for any vacancy, may require further search to be made for qualified candidates.

6. *Education.*—Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have received such systematic education, general or technical, or general and technical together, as in their opinion fits them for the post. In general, candidates should possess a university degree or other equivalent qualifications. The Commissioners may submit any or all the candidates to a qualifying examination to test such education, or any part of it.

7. *Health and Character.*—Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

8. *Competitions.*—Candidates who are recommended by the Board of Education and are accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners as possessing the requisite qualifications will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, and their decision will be final. The Selection Board shall be nominated by the Commissioners in consultation with the Board of Education, who shall be represented on the Selection Board, and, when practicable, one of the Commissioners shall be the Chairman. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidate's record of experience and education, any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by any candidate as having direct knowledge of his work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidate as shown at this interview; and on their estimation of all the above evidence they will frame their decisions.

9. *Warning.*—Any attempt on the part of a candidate to enlist support for his application through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify him for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the University, in the Forces, or otherwise.

10. *Fee.*—A selected candidate before certification shall pay the regulation fee of £6.

1. The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 and the Norfolk (Swine-Fever) Order of 1915 shall not apply to the movement of swine from the sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being a Swine-Fever Infected Place, if the Swine are accompanied by a licence in the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the said Order of 1908, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Norfolk, and the following conditions, which shall be specified in the licence, are complied with:—

(i) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.

(ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

2. A copy of a licence issued under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

3. A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the above-mentioned Orders be treated as a licence under those Orders.
