And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the 27th day of September, 1921, the first day of October, 1921, was fixed to be the appointed day for the purposes of the provisions of the Act (including the Seventh Schedule) relative to matters relating to the Supreme Court of Judicature in Ireland or the Supreme Court of Judicature of Southern Ireland or of Northern Ireland, or the High Court of Appeal for Ireland, or the Judges or Officers thereof (including the Master of the Rolls in Ireland), except the Central Office established under the Local Registration of Title (Ireland) Act, 1891:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:-

The fifteenth day of December, 1921, is hereby fixed to be the appointed day for the purposes of the provisions of the Act (including the Seventh Schedule) so far as they relate or are applicable to the Central Office established under the Local Registration of Title (Ireland) Act, 1891, and for the purposes of the definition of the expression "existing" in its application to the officers employed therein.

HEREAS there was this day read at the WW Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 18th day of October, 1921 (E. 8352/21), in the words following, viz.:

"Whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 27th day of May, 1915, a Scheme of pensions, grants and allowances in the nature thereof was framed in pursuance of Section 1 of the Injuries in War (Compensation) Act, 1914, for the benefit of persons, not being Officers or Seamen of the Royal Navy, or Officers or Soldiers of any of Your Majesty's Land or Marine Forces, in respect of injury or disablement whilst employed afloat by, or under, the Admiralty or Army Council, in connection with warlike operations in which Your Majesty is engaged, and in the case of their death for the benefit of their widows and other dependants:

"And whereas by Orders of Your Majesty in Council bearing dates the 8th day of June, 1916, the 11th day of March, 1920, and the 3rd day of December, 1920, the said Scheme

was modified in certain respects:
"And whereas we are of opinion that it is

desirable further to vary the said Scheme:
"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to direct that the Regulations appearing in the Schedule attached hereto shall be deemed to be incorporated in the above cited Orders in Council dated the 27th day of May, 1915, the 8th day of June, 1916, the 11th day of March, 1920, and the 3rd day

of December, 1920, and to have effect from the 25th October, 1920, and that any provision of the said Orders which is inconsistent with the Regulations attached hereto shall be void and of no effect, without prejudice however to the validity of any award thereunder made prior

to the date of this Order: "The Lords Commi Lords Commissioners of Majesty's Treasury have signified their con-

currence in these proposals.

" SCHEDULE.

"1. The rate of pay upon which disablement allowances are calculated in accordance with the provisions of Order in Council dated the 27th day of May, 1915, shall be increased

by forty per cent.
"2. If in any case the pension which may be awarded under the Order in Council dated the 27th day of May, 1915, as modified by the Orders in Council dated the 8th day of June, 1916, the 11th day of March, 1920, and the 3rd day of December, 1920, in respect of an injury or disablement resulting in total destruction of earning capacity is less than a weekly sum of £2 it shall be lawful for the Admiralty or the Army Council at their discretion to award such weekly sum not exceeding £2 as may in the circumstances of each case be deemed appropriate.

"3. The maximum allowance for each child (other than a motherless child) shall be £36 per annum or one-sixteenth of pay whichever may be the greater."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF FEMALE WORKERS IN THE RETAIL BRANCH OF THE TRADE IN CERTAIN AREAS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, and the Trade Boards (Women's Clothing) Order, 1919, for the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Trade in Scotland, as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 29th March, 1920, as varied by the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking Order), 1920, hereby give notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to vary the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Certain Classes of Female Workers in the Retail Branch of the trade at present fixed and set out in the Schedule to their Notice W.D.S. (6) dated 28th September, 1921, in their application to certain areas, the proposed General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for such Female Workers in the areas specified in Part I of the Schedule to this Notice being as shown in such Schedule

Workers commencing employment in the Hat, Cap and Millinery Trade for the first time at and over the age of 19 may serve a period of six months at 7d. per hour, and thereafter a period of six months at 84d. per On the expiration of one year's service in the trade, these workers shall receive such rates as their age may entitle them to under the foregoing provisions.

PART IV.

Piece-work Basis Time Rates.

SECTION I.—Female Workers.
(a) All Female Workers Workers other than Homeworkers, 91d. per hour.

(b) Homeworkers, 93d. per hour.

In the case of all female workers employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 91d. per hour to an ordinary worker, i.e., a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question.

SECTION II. - Male Workers.

All Male Workers, 1s. 3½d. per hour.

In the case of all male workers employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 1s. 31d. per hour to an ordinary worker, i.e., a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question.

PART V.

Overtime Rates-Male and Female Workers (all Ages).

Section I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board hereby declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:

In any week, 46.

On any day (other than Saturday), 81. On Saturday, 5.

Provided that any other day (not being Sunday) may be substituted by an employer for Saturday as the weekly short day, and in such case the normal number of hours of work on such substituted day shall be five, and the normal number of hours on Saturday shall be

Provided also that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as overtime to which the overtime rates shall apply.

Section II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker, whether engaged on Time-work or on Piece-work, in excess of the declared number of hours, shall be as follows:—

(1) For the first two hours' overtime on any day, except Saturdays (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be one-and-aquarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-quarter.

(2) For overtime after the first two hours of overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all overtime on Saturdays (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), the Overtime Rate shall be one-and-a-half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-half.

(3) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Double

Time.

Provided-

(4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 46, the Overtime Rate shall be Time-and-a-quarter, except in so far as higher overtime rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 of this Section. The Overtime Rate shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday), the number of hours worked exceeds 8½ or, in the case of Saturday (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), exceeds five, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 46.

(a) That where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week, the Overtime Rate shall only be payable on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.

(b) That where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the overtime rate shall only be payable in the week in which attendance on Saturday is required after 50 hours have been worked.

(c) That where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime as set out above shall apply in like manner as if in the provisions of this Notice as to Overtime, the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday" and the word "Sunday" for " Saturday."

Note. - The hours which female workers, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART VI.

For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions shall apply:

SECTION I.—A Female Learner is a worker who:

(a) Is employed by an Employer who provides such Learner with reasonable facilities for practically and efficiently learning the branch of the Trade as carried on by him and the various processes involved in the making of any of the articles specified in the definition of the trade referred to in Part VII of this Schedule; and

(b) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, and held subject to compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, or has made an application for such certificate or registration, which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a Learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an Employer may employ a Female Learner on her first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such Learner being continued thereafter at her employment, the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

Provided that, notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, a person shall not be deemed to be a Learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes, and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

Section II.—The expression "Homeworker" means a worker who works in her own home or any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

PART VII.

SECTION I.—Subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts the respective Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule shall apply to all workers in Scotland in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the Hat, Cap and Millinery Trade as specified in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, dated 31st March, 1920. The Trade as specified in the above-mentioned Regulations is as follows:

SECTION II.—The making from any material of men's, women's or children's headgear, or the trimming thereof;

Including:-

Warehousing, packing or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the making or trimming of men's, women's or children's headgear;

But excluding:—

(1) The casting and making of solid metal helmets:

(2) The making of rubberised or oilskin headgear where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of other rubberised or oilskin articles;

(3) The making of nurses' or servants' caps, chefs' caps, hospital ward caps, or similar

articles;

(4) The making of field bonnets, sunbonnets, boudoir caps, or infants' millinery where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of dresses, nontailored skirts, wraps, blouses, blouse-robes, jumpers, sports coats, neckwear, tea-gowns, dressing gowns, dressing jackets, pyjamas, underclothing, under-skirts, aprons, overalls, nurses' and servants' caps, juvenile clothing, baby linen or similar articles;

(5) The making of fur hats, where made in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of furs or furriers' skins into garments, rugs, or similar articles;

(6) The making of knitted headgear and the making of headgear from knitted fabrics where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of the

knitted fabric;

(7) Warehousing and packing of men's, women's and children's headgear and other similar operations carried on in shops mainly engaged in the retail distribution of articles of any description that are not made or trimmed on the premises.

PART VIII.

Section I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are to be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

Section II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of the Minimum Rates.

The form of this consolidating notice has been approved by the Minister of Labour in accordance with Paragraph 8 of the Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st

October, 1918.

RIULES PUBLICATION ACT, 1893.

In conformity with the provisions of the Statute 56 and 57 Victoria, Chapter 66, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for India in Council proposes, with the advice and assistance of the Civil Service Commissioners, at the expiration of 40 days from the date of this Gazette, to make the following regulations for the examination of candidates for the Indian Civil Service under section 97 (1) and (2) of the Government of India Act:—

Examinations for the Indian Civil Service. Regulations.

- 1. An examination for admission to the Indian Civil Service, open to all qualified persons, will be held in London in July and August of each year for such number of appointments to that Service as the Secretary of State may on each occasion determine. The date of the examination will be announced beforehand by the Civil Service Commissioners.
- 2. Save as hereinafter provided a candidate must be a British subject. If the candidate (being a British subject) or his father or his mother was not born within His Majesty's Dominions and allegiance then at the time of his birth his father must have been a British subject or the subject of a state in India and such father must be or must have continued to be until his death a British subject or the sub-

ject of such State in India. Provided that a ruler or subject of any state in India in respect of whom the Governor-General in Council has made a declaration under section 96 A of the Government of India Act, 1915, as amended by section 3 of the Government of India (Amendment) Act, 1916, may be considered eligible.

- 3. A candidate must have attained the age of twenty-one, and must not have attained the age of twenty-four on the first day of August of the year in which the examination is held, or must be in a position to claim such a concession under the provisions of the Appendix to these Regulations as will render him eligible.
- 4. A candidate who is a native of India must obtain a certificate of age and qualification under Regulations 2 and 3 issued under Notification of the Government of India, No. 1114, dated 12th September, 1918, and signed, should he be a resident in British India, by the Secretary to Government of the Province, or the Commissioner of the Division within which his family resides, or, should he reside in a Native State, by the highest Political Officer accredited to the State in which his family resides.
- 5. A candidate must be free from disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity, unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Indian Civil Service.
- 6. A candidate must be of good moral character.
- 7. No person will be eligible for admission to the Indian Civil Service who has made before any Tribunal established under the Military Service Acts, 1916, an application for the issue to him of a certificate of exemption from the provisions of those Acts on the ground of a conscientious objection to the undertaking of combatant service.
- 8. No person who, in a previous year, accepted the offer of a nomination as a Selected Candidate for the Indian Civil Service, and subsequently resigned his position as a Selected Candidate, will be admitted to the examination.
- 9. Should the evidence upon the above points be prima facie satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners, the candidate, on payment of the prescribed fee, will be admitted to the examination. The Commissioners may, however, in their discretion, at any time prior to the grant of the Certificate of Qualification hereinafter referred to, institute such further inquiries as they may deem necessary; and if the result of such inquiries in the case of any candidate should be unsatisfactory to them in any of the above respects he will be ineligible for admission to the Indian Civil Service, and, if already selected, will be removed from the position of a Probationer.

otherwise accruing to him.

15. Where alternative languages are given, the candidate is at liberty to choose between the alternatives.

24. Candidates who at the Final Examination in riding satisfy the Commissioners that they are sufficiently at home in the saddle for the efficient performance of all the duties of the Indian Civil Service will be awarded marks ranging between 101 and 200 according to the

degree of proficiency displayed.

Candidates who fall short of this adequate proficiency but show such minimum proficiency as is evidence that with a moderate amount of practice they can attain full proficiency will receive marks ranging between I and 100; they will be allowed to proceed to India, and will on their arrival there be subjected to such further tests in riding as may be prescribed by their Government, and shall receive no increase to their initial salary until they have passed such tests to the satisfaction of that Government.

A Candidate who fails at the end of the period of probation to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that he has reached the minimum standard of proficiency in riding will be liable to have his name removed from the list of Selected Candidates.

Selected candidates will also be examined in riding at such time or times as the Commissioners may appoint during the course of the

probationary period.

- 25. As in the open competitive examination deductions will be made from the marks assigned to Candidates at the Final Examination, and, in the case of two-year probationers, at the Intermediate Examination, in order that superficial knowledge may receive no credit.
- 26. The Civil Service Commissioners will prepare lists of the Candidates in order of merit; the order for the one-year probationers being based on the sum of the marks obtained by the Candidates at the Open Competitive and Final Examinations, the order for the two-year probationers being based on the sum of the marks obtained by the Candidates at the Intermediate and Final Examinations.
- 27. The Selected Candidates whose performance in the compulsory subjects of the prescribed examinations, namely, the Final Examination for one-year men and the Intermediate and Final Examinations for two-year men, is such as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners, and who have also satisfied the Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of nationality, age, health, character, and conduct during the period of probation, shall be certified by the Commissioners to be entitled to be appointed to the Indian Civil Service provided they shall comply with the regulations in force, at the time, for that Service.

If any Candidate is prevented by sickness or any other adequate cause from attending the Final Examination, the Commissioners may, with the concurrence of the Secretary of State for India in Council, allow him to appear at the Final Examination to be held in the following year, or at a special examination.

A two-year probationer absent for such adequate cause from the Intermediate Examination may under similar conditions be allowed to appear at the Intermediate Examination a year later, or at a special examination, or may be excused the Intermediate Examination and allowed to appear for the Final Examination in regular course.

28. Persons desirous to be admitted as Candidates must apply on Forms, which may be obtained from "The Secretary, Civil Service-Commission, 6, Burlington Gardens, London, W. 1," at any time after the 1st December in the year previous to that in which the Examination is to be held. - 1. Any person who has joined since the 4th. August, 1914, the Army or Navy, or Royal.
