PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is provided by the Government of Ireland Act, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as the Act), that the Act shall, except as expressly provided, come into

operation on the appointed day, and that the appointed day for the purposes of the Act shall be the first Tuesday in the eighth month after the month of December, 1920 (being the month in which the Act was passed), or such other day, not more than seven months earlier or later, as may be fixed by Order of His Majesty in Council either generally or with reference to any particular provision of the Act, and that different days may be appointed for different purposes and different provisions of the Act:

And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the 24th day of March, 1921, appointed days were fixed for the purposes of the provisions of the Act, other than provisions thereby excepted (hereinafter referred to as the excepted provisions):

And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the 25th day of July, 1921, it was ordered that the appointed day for the purposes of any of the excepted provisions which should not have come into operation prior to the second day of August, 1921 (being the first Tuesday in the eighth month after the month in which the
